BAYS AND LIONS EMERGE AS THE WEEK'S BIG WINNERS; EVERY WIN A CRUCIAL ONE NOW

As the season heads into the stretch run, and teams battle with intradivisional opponents, every game carries great importance. The Northern Division features three great squads fighting it out for two playoff spots. It's a shame that one of these teams will miss out, because they are all capable of becoming

APSL champions if the breaks should fall their way.

In their quest to reach the APSL Championship game, September 22 in Boston, they've taken turns leapfrogging over one another all season long, and this week was no different. On Saturday, the Bays went to Boston's Nickerson Field, shut down the Bolts' attack, and shut the Bolts out by a score of 2-0. The quality of Maryland's league-leading attack is reflected in the fact that Boston keeper Jeff Duback fell one short of tying the league record for saves in a game. He came up with twelve, but still took the loss.

Charlie Arndt, one half of Maryland's dynamic goalkeeping duo, provided the goose egg, while Rob Ryerson provided both goals at the other end, to move into the league's top ten scorers, with seven goals and sixteen points. The win gave the Bays three

points, moving them past Albany into second place.

Half an hour later in Albany's Bleecker Stadium, the Capitals finished off their 1-0 victory over the Washington Stars, getting three points of their own, and were back in second. The game was a rough one, featuring twenty-seven Albany fouls, forty-three between both teams. Four Stars got yellow cards, and one, Bruce Murray, saw red.

Sunday the Bays went to Penn-Jersey, one point behind Albany and two behind the Spirit at the start of the game. Just prior to halftime, the Spirit took a 1-0 lead, and things were looking awfully good for them. It's easy to have confidence with Dale

Caya, he of the 0.53 goals-against average, in the nets.

But a Spirit win was not to be. Penn-Jersey was engulfed by the Bays, who put three goals in to win the game, the division and overall league lead, and some confidence. This time it was Steve Powers' turn to backstop the Bays to victory. Caya, who had previously allowed just seven goals all season, saw his GA average shoot up to 0.71, still easily the best in the ASL.

Things were also hopping down South, where the battle is among four teams for second place behind Ft. Lauderdale, which had the week off. The resurgent Orlando Lions did the most for their

cause, besting the Washington Diplomats on Friday, then the Miami Freedom the following day, by scores of 3-1 and 2-1. Paul Dougherty continues to lead the offense; he had a goal in each game, while Zoran Savic had the other two in the first win.

Also on Saturday, the Diplomats lost a second consecutive 3-1 game, this time to the Tampa Bay Rowdies. Rowdies' leading scorer David Byrne was tossed out of the match at 64:16, along with Washington's Marcelo Claros. Both players must sit out their teams' next games, but the loss of Byrne will hurt more. Tampa Bay's next game is July 22, a crucial meeting with Ft. Lauderdale.

Ft. Lauderdale will also visit Orlando next weekend. If the Lions win and the Rowdies do not, Orlando will claim second place, an amazing feat considering they were just recently 1-9 for three points. Also next week, Miami will visit the Diplomats. Neither team is out of the chase following their winless weekends, but can not afford to lose another one.

GYAU AND CAYA REMAIN ON TOP


Maryland's Phillip Gyau is still the league's leading scorer, as he has been for the better part of a month. He had a goal and an assist in weekend play. With Jean Harbor and Rob Ryerson, Maryland is the only team to have three players in the top ten scorers. Bays' Northern rivals Albany and Penn-Jersey each have two.

Dale Caya of the Spirit has sat on top of the goalkeeping leaderboard all season long, and remains there, though by much less than in the past. Bill Steffen of the Capitals had a shutout on the weekend, while Caya was giving up three goals. Orlando's Mark Simpson, meanwhile, continues to impress. He has been a huge factor in the Lions' turnaround.
