The Miami Freedom have won four of their last five, and sit in second place in the American Soccer League southern division. This road trip marks the second meetings of the year for the Freedom and the Capitals and Eagles respectfully.

The Capitals have the distinction of being the only team to beat the Freedom at the Orange Bowl in 1990, (a 1-0 win in the season opener for both teams April 14th). Miami then went on to win three in a row including a 1-0 shootout win against the Fort Lauderdale Strikers at Joe Robbie Stadium, before suffering their second loss at Maryland May 19th.

KINSEY JOINS MIAMI ATTACK:

Agreeing to terms during the past week, 27 year old scoring ace Steve Kinsey is the newest player to wear the orange and green this year. Acquired from the Major Indoor Soccer League's Dallas Sidekicks, Kinsey is no stranger to the American Soccer League. In 1988, he joined the Fort Lauderdale Strikers and in his two years with the Strikers, became the leagues 2nd highest leading scorer of all time with 18 goals and four assists during the regular season. His efforts were appreciated most last year when the Strikers captured both the ASL, and American Professional Soccer League titles. He recently became available when Dallas was eliminated from the MISL playoffs by the San Diego Sockers. Kinsey will wear number 8.

The New Jersey Eagles can remember the Freedom best since it was just a week ago when the Eagles came to the Orange Bowl and fought the Freedom to the end. The end was through two overtimes and with just 55 seconds left in a scoreless match, Miami's Fernando Ramos scored the sudden death game winner to give Miami their fourth win in six tries. Despite a steady rain and chances both ways, no team could score during regulation; a possibility that could exist through this encounter as well.

Miami can tie Fort Lauderdales win/loss record and be only one point behind with wins on the road this weekend against both the Capitals and Eagles.

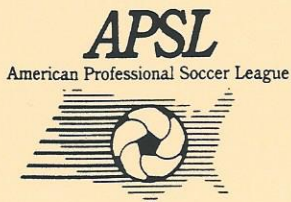
INJURY UPDATE: None Reported
