Today's game matches the 1984 Cosmos against an all-star selection of international players. The game is being played with unlimited substitutions by agreement of the coaches. Should the game be tied after ninety minutes, it will remain as such. The Professional Soccer Reporters Association will select the 3 Stars of the Game.

TONIGHT'S RADIO/TV: This evening's game is being cablecast live on SportsChannel. Bob Ley will handle the play-by-play, with Seamus Malin supplying the color commentary. The game is also being broadcast live over WMCA Radio (570 AM) with Jim Karvellas describing the action.

COSMOS INJURY/STATUS: Dan Canter (severe left ankle sprain) is out for 2-3 weeks. Doctors have placed the defender's ankle in a cast to facilitate the healing of torn ligaments. Darryl Gee (dislocated pelvis) is also out, but he has begun training after five months of inactivity.

ANTHEM/HALFTIME: The National Childrens Choir will sing our National Anthem this evening. The Skyliners Senior Drum and Bugle Corp will entertain at halftime.

AHEAD: The Cosmos will take on the San Diego Sockers here in Giants Stadium in N.A.S.L regular-season play this Wednesday night at 9 pm. It's the first visit to the Meadowlands by the Sockers since the 1983-84 Indoor Championship series. After that match, the Cosmos Olympians will return to their respective (USA & Canada) training bases to prepare for gold medal bids, while the rest of the Cosmos will take a two-week mid-season hiatus from competition.

NOTES: Bogie reached 200-point milestone with six points last week. The Cosmos captain has scored 30 goals and assisted on a league-record 140. He's the 11th the player in league history to reach 200-point mark... Birkenmeier leads league with 8-3 record... Cosmos undefeated softball team takes on WNEW-FM All-Stars in West New York, N.J. on Monday, July 30th... Cosmos bring a 2-0 international ledger into their third of five international games this season... Cosmos-Metropolitan Youth Cup final scheduled for 7/29 is now 9/12 preliminary game in Giants Stadium... Rescheduled games against Golden Bay on 9/12 and in Chicago 9/15 can be seen live on SportsChannel.

## WORLD ALL-STARS PLAYER BIOGRAPHIES

21 Jean-Marie Pfaff - Started his career with Beveren of the Belgian first division. Was a member of the Belgian National Team that played so well in the 1980 European Championship. Attracted world-wide attention in the 1982 World Cup Finals in Spain with excellent performances between the posts. Signed from Beveren by Bayern Munich of the West German Bundesliga. Most recently starred for Belgium in the 1984 European Championships in France. An all-around goalkeeper and considered one of Europe's best.

1 Peter Shilton - One of the finest goalkeepers in the world at the moment. Finally established himself as number one goalkeeper after years of battling it out with Ray Clemence for the starting position on the English National team. Started his career with Leicester City of the English first division, moved on to Stoke City, then Nottingham Forest in 1977, and led the team to the League Cup and the League Championship. Was a member of the Nottingham Forest team that won the European Cup back-to-back in 1979 and 1980. Also played for England in the 1982 World Cup finals in Spain. Currently playing for Southampton of the English First Division.

5 Rudi Krol - Joined Ajax of Amsterdam as a 17-year old and made his first team debut two years later. Playing along side Johan Cruyff and Johan Neeskens on Ajax, he became extremely successful and the team won the European Cup three successive years ('71,'72,'73). Also a member of the Dutch National team that played 'total soccer,' appearing in two World Cup finals ('74,'78). Captained the '78 team that eventually lost to host Argentina. Is always an offensive threat. His cool, calm and collected style make him one of the all-time great modern day sweepers. Played in the N.A.S.L. for the Vancouver Whitecaps in 1980, then joined Napoli of the Italian First Division, where he played for four years. Recently signed by Cannes F.C. in France.

2 Jaime Duarte - A rugged hard-tackling defender who loves to go forward. Called the Iron Man of the Peruvian National team, playing in every game of the 1978 World Cup in Argentina. Was also ever-present in Peru's games in the 1982 World Cup held in Spain. Last appeared in Giants Stadium in 1982 when he played in the FIFA World All-Star Game for the benefit of UNICEF.

6 Franz Beckenbauer - The greatest name in European soccer history. Made world-wide headlines when he signed with Cosmos to join Pele in May 1977, after winning every possible championship available as captain of Bayern Munich and West German National Team, highlighted by World Cup crown in 1974. Signing at the peak of his career (31) added immeasurable credibility to Cosmos' world-wide image. Won N.A.S.L.'s Most Valuable Player Award as a midfielder for Cosmos, and helped club to three championships ('77,'78,'80) in four seasons. Named All-N.A.S.L. First Team all four years. Major factor in club's emergence into the world's most famous sports team, Cosmos became in demand all over the world. Left to a gala Farewell Game here on 9/24/80 to return to West Germany and S.V. Hamburg. After Midas championship touch helped new club to Bundesliga crown in 1982, returned to Cosmos last summer to close out career. Is active as a world-wide spokesman and consultant for Cosmos' parent company



Warner Communications and for Adidas. Recently named Technical Director of the West German National Team.

3 Rick Davis - Considered the finest American player ever produced by the Cosmos. Signed in November 1977 just before his 19th birthday and remained until last November. Tough and versatile midfielder, saw spot action in 1978, but cracked star-studded lineup in 1979 and responded with banner season. Named North American Player of the Year, had 6 goals 13 assists playing alongside idol Beckenbauer in midfield. Suffered through series of foot injuries in '80 and '81, still played key role in '80 championship. Bounced back to consistent form in '82, named as only native American to F.I.F.A. World All-Star spectacular at Giants Stadium, turned in brilliant effort in Soccer Bowl '82 victory over Seattle. Enjoyed his greatest season in 1983, named league's 3-Star Player of the Year based on individual Star-of-the-Game voting. Was named to 3-Star ballot 13 times in 29 regular-season games, and was voted Player of the Game in 7-2 victory over European champion Hamburg as well. Signed 3-year contract with St. Louis Steamers of M.I.S.L.

4 Oscar - Heralded as the greatest Brazilian defender since Carlos Alberto. Played for Ponte Preta Club where he started his career. Was then signed by the Cosmos in 1979, where he played for the 1980 season. Was a member of the Brazilian National Team in 1978 and 1982 World Cup. Was named to the '78 World Cup All-Star team. Also played in the 1978 Cosmos vs. World All-Stars game and Pele's Farewell Game in 1977. Now plays for Brazilian powerhouse Sao Paulo.

10 Felix Magath - Retired from the West German National Team even though he could still command a place on the team. Led Hamburg to the 1983 European Cup Final where he scored the only goal in a 1-0 win over Juventus of Italy. Currently playing for Hamburg in the German Bundesliga. Immaculate ball passer and a player of exceptional ability.

12 Thomas Mavros - Captain of the Greek National Team. Currently playing for AEK Athens. Was captain of the 1983 National Team that stunned the world and tied England (1-1) in Wembley Stadium. Also played for Greece in the 1980 European Nations Cup final. Has won 2 championships and one F.A. Cup while playing for AEK. In 1979, he was the second-leading goal scorer in Europe, and won the Silver Boot award.

15 Giuseppe Damiani - Starred for Napoli in the 1982 Trans-Atlantic Challenge Cup playing against the Cosmos in a 2-2 tie. Now plays for A.C.Milan and is the only player representing Italy on the World All-Star team.

13 Vasilis Hatzipanagis - Born in Russia of Greek parents. Played in the Russian First Division with Pakhtakor Tashkent and also played twice with the Soviet Junior National Team. Moved on to Iraklis in Greece and was virtually unknown before establishing himself as one of the most exciting players in the country. Because he played for the Soviet junior team, he is ineligible to play for the Greek National Team although he is now a Greek citizen. His performances in Greece have brought him world-wide acclaim.



9 Charlie Nicholas - Played for the Celtic Boys Club as a youth and eventually went on to star for their premier team. Broke his leg in 1982 but battled his way back to fitness and a first team position. Finished the season the following year as Scotland's leading goal scorer. Nicknamed Champagne Charlie while he was being sought by many English and Continental clubs when his contract expired. Race to sign him included such teams as Liverpool, Manchester United and Tottenham. Arsenal of London finally won and got his signature in time for the 1983-84 season. Got off to a slow start but eventually settled down, and finished the season by scoring a spectacular goal for Scotland in his debut (a 2-2 tie with Switzerland) in 1983. Played in the 1981 Trans-Atlantic Challenge Cup in Giants Stadium for Celtic, and scored 2 of Celtic's 3 goals.

7 Kevin Keegan - Began his professional career with Scunthorpe United of the English Fourth Division. Was scouted by Liverpool manager Bill Shankly and then brought to Liverpool. A player with limited natural skill ability, who by sheer hard work and determination, became the star of English soccer. Helped Liverpool to three English league championships and two European Cups. Then moved on to West German club Hamburg in 1978. Won the German league in 1979 and was twice chosen as European Footballer of the Year (1978, 1979). In 1980 he returned to England to play for Southampton. Missed most of the 1982 World Cup with a back injury, playing only 27 minutes against Spain. Then signed with Newcastle of the English Second Division, where he finally finished out his career, leading the team to promotion to the First Division. Throughout his career, Keegan has been a great ambassador of soccer.

11 Dominique Rocheteau - Discovered by Saint-Etienne, though a pre-season injury against Leeds United delayed his first team explosion. But he eventually came on like a ball of fire. Labeled the George Best of France. In 1980 he signed for Paris St. Germain and moved from right wing to center forward. Scored two spectacular goals against Northern Ireland in the 1982 World Cup. A fine dribbler who also possesses finishing power, is a pleasure to watch and a favorite of soccer fans world-wide.

14 Fernando Gomes - Won the coveted Golden Boot award given to the leading goal-scorer in Europe. His 36 goals put him on top of the heap of Europe's marksmen. Started with Oporto at age 15. Was the league's leading goal-scorer three years running, with 26 in 1977, 24 in 1978 and 27 in 1979. Then moved to Gijon in Spain but while there he suffered a string of injuries and after two years he moved back to Oporto and his native Portugal. Promptly regained his fitness and form to lead them to the Cup winners' Cup final, scoring three goals in the competition. Currently the captain of Oporto.

19 Rui Jordao - Born in Angola when it was still a Portuguese colony. Began his career with Benifica and then spent two years with Zaragoza in Spain. Moved on to Sporting and where he has remained for the last six years. Trouble with his transfer fee and two broken legs prevented him from re-establishing himself for a period of time. Since then he has led Sporting in scoring twice. A big, strong player who has the knack for scoring goals. Most recently scored two goals in Portugal's semi-final match vs. France in the 1984 European Championships (which Portugal lost 3-2 in overtime).



17 Paulo Futre - Rated as one of the most promising young Portuguese players to come along in 20 years. Plays for Portugal at senior and youth level. Recently caused an argument among his coaches over which level he should represent. Joined Sporting Lisbon at age 12 and made his first team debut on a tour of Brazil last year. Four months later he made his full international debut in a 5-0 win over Finland. Was 17½ years old, making him the youngest player ever to play for Portugal.

16 Willington Ortiz - Plays with a typical South American style. Close ball control and deft moves enable him to deceive defenders. A Colombian National Team standout and currently playing with Cooperacion Deportiva of the Colombian First Division.

8 Mario Kempes - Rose to world prominence in the 1978 World Cup, scoring 6 goals to lead Argentina to a championship win over Holland. Currently playing for Valencia in Spain, is easily recognized on the field by his long, flowing black hair. Couples direct runs into the opponent's penalty area with a blistering shot. On his best days, could be considered one of the most dangerous forwards in world soccer.

20 Hugo Sanchez - Played in the N.A.S.L. for the San Diego Sockers in 1979-80. Considered one of the finest players to emerge from Mexico. Played for Universidad Nacional Autonoma in 1978-79. Was named Mexico's player of the year for that season, scoring 26 goals, which also made him the league's leading goal scorer. Became a professional with Universidad in 1976. Was a Mexican National Team member, just recently transferred to Barcelona F.C. (Spain) for \$1.25 million.

18 Roberto Figueroa - Nicknamed 'Macho' by Honduran fans. Was outstanding in the CONCACAF 1982 World Cup qualifying games, scoring a brilliant right-footed goal against Canada. Went on to play superbly in the '82 Finals in Spain. Combines power and speed with tight ball control and fine passing. Noted for his ability to score from free kicks. Played for Vida in Honduras and was sold to Real Murcia of Spain following his success in the World Cup Finals.

Prof. Mazzei - Accompanied the great Pele here in 1975, has been an invaluable asset to the organization ever since. Served two tenures coaching the Cosmos among a wide variety of positions he's held with the club. Took charge of the team as Technical Director midway through 1979, and guided them to a 15-4 record the remainder of the season. Continued to run team into '80 until Hennes Weisweiler arrived from West Germany in May. Was named coach on an interim basis for the 1982 season and went on to lead club to a 23-9, 203 point regular-season and back to the North American championship throne. Was renamed coach for 1983 and led club to a sixth straight regular-season championship (22-8, 194 pts.) before stunning first-round playoff upset to Montreal. Enjoyed more success in international games than any Cosmos coach. Led team to unbeaten international season at home in '82 and to the best international tour (6-1) in club history. In '83, guided club to Trans-Atlantic Challenge Cup title and to big 7-2 Giants Stadium victory over European champion Hamburg. Long-time friend and advisor of Pele, involved in pro soccer for 19 years as coach, clinician, lecturer and physical education specialist. Currently works as a consultant for the Cosmos and runs the Professor Mazzei Soccer Schools.
