## RECORDS AND STANDINGS

The San Diego Sockers shoot for their third consecutive win under Coach Ron Newman tonight when they meet the Cosmos... This evening's game is the first of a three game road swing which takes the Sockers to New England (July 26) and finally Rochester (July 30)... The Socks, under Newman's guidance, enter tonight's game in second place in the Western Division of the American Conference with a 12-11 record and 101 points...San Diego has won five of its last six games including its two most recent outings against the Atlanta Chiefs and the Tampa Bay Rowdies... Newman took over the club for the Atlanta game and the Sockers responded with their biggest win of the season, 4-0. In that contest, Manu Sanon, who was brought to San Diego and signed by Newman just prior to the trading deadline, netted two goals to pace the Socks. Most recently, San Diego downed the Rowdies, 3-0, led by another two goal performance from Sanon. The other goalscorer in the Rowdies contest was Hugo Sanchez, Mexican's Golden Boy, who received his clearance to play at 11 AM on the morning of the contest... The Sockers, who have a 3-8 road record, have lost eight of their last nine games away from home.

... The Sockers have already tied their record for consecutive road losses. five, and would break that record with a loss tonight. Their last road victory was against Vancouver 1-0 in a shootout on June 4.

#### READING THE FUTURE

Upon Ron Newman signing as Sockers Vice-President/Head Coach, he was quoted as saying that we will play all-out attacking soccer and that Manu Sanon would solve the Sockers scoring problems.

A Hollywood script writer could not have come up with a better opening for Newman's first week in San Diego. The Socks, winner of two straight under Newman, scored a total of seven goals in the two games. Up until Newman's and Sanon's arrival, San Diego had only scored 23 goals in regulation time in 21 matches. The Socks recent success can be directly attributed to Sanon, who came through with two consecutive two goal games.

#### DEFENSE NUMBER ONE IN ASC

Anchored by the American Conference's number one goalkeeper, Volkmar Gross, the Sockers have allowed fewer goals than any other team in the American Conference. Gross, who is in his second season in San Diego, currently sports a 1.13 goals against average with seven shutouts. He will enter the game on Wednesday against the Cosmos with 255:49 consecutive shutout minutes to his credit. Gross is now only one shutout shy of the club record of eight, which was set in 1977 ( seven by Alan Mayer - one by Peter Thomas).

#### SANCHEZ DEBUTS - CUELLAR TIES ASSIST MARK

Hugo Sanchez, who had been waiting in the wings for the past two weeks for clearance from the Mexican Federation and the North American Soccer League, made his debut against the Tampa Bay Rowdies last Saturday and responded with the Socks third goal of the night.

Sanchez, the NASL's leading scorer in the playoffs last season (6 goals, 3 assists, 7 games), coupled with Sanon, gives the Sockers one of the most potent offensive lines in the league says Ron Newman.

Leonardo Cuellar, who currently leads the club with six goals and 13 assists, set up two of the Sockers' goals against Tampa Bay. Those assists, his 12 and 13 of the season, tied the club record which was set in 1978 by Julie Veee and Jean Willrich.

## SANON SELECTED NASL PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Manu Sanon, who was signed by the Sockers just prior to the July 13 trading deadline, has been named the North American Soccer League Player of the Week by the Professional Soccer Reporters Association.

The Haitian International made his NASL debut last Wednesday against the Atlanta Chiefs in spectacular fashion. He netted two goals including the game winner to pace the Sockers to a 4-0 victory over the Chiefs.

Sanon duplicated his two goal performance in the Sockers' next outing against Tampa Bay. The former Belgium First Division player scored his third and fourth goals for the Socks in their 3-0 win over the Rowdies.

Sanon was brought to the United States by Newman to play for the Miami Americans of the ASL before joining the Socks new mentor in San Diego.
