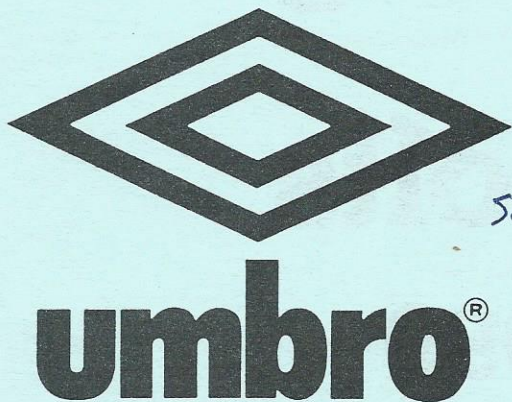

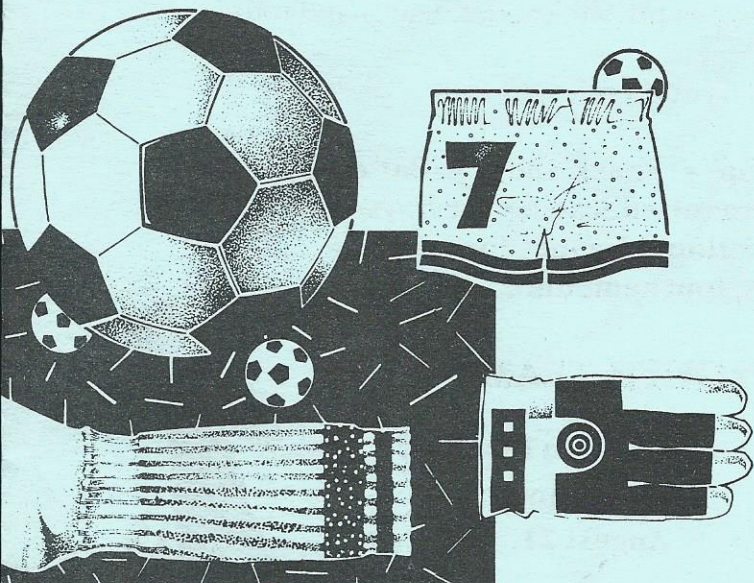

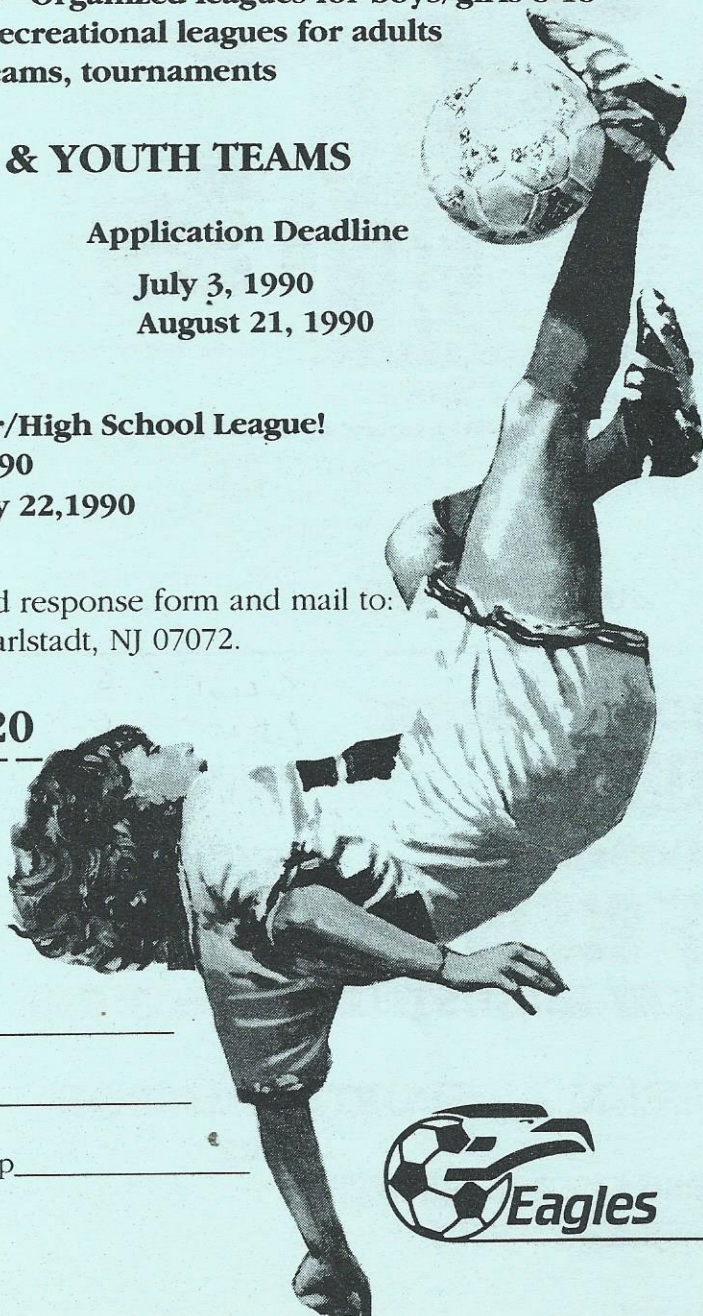

New Jersey Eagles day of game notes, July 27

The Eagles' 3-2 win in Maryland against the Bays last Saturday night was their third overtime victory of the year, all of them on the road. The Eagles have lost one game in OT, also on the road.

Paul Riley's two goals in Maryland last Saturday brought his season total to seven, which is fourth highest in the APSL East. Mike Masters (Albany Capitals) leads all goal scorers with 11, followed by Phil Gyau (Maryland Bays) with 10 and Michael Sweeney (Boston Bolts) with eight. Along with Riley, Jean Harbor (Maryland), Steve Pittman (Fort Lauderdale Strikers), Elvis Comrie (Albany), Bob Ryerson (Maryland), and Pat O'Kelly (Penn-Jersey Spirit) have netted seven goals.

Riley, who has played in 12 games since being re-signed five games into the schedule, also has one assist for a total of 15 points, which ties him for 10th place with O'Kelly among league leaders. Gyau is first with a total of 26 points, followed by Masters with 24. Boston's Sweeney is third with 19.

In 18 games with the Eagles last year, mostly as a midfielder, Riley scored one goal and added two assists. With Albany in 1988, Riley tallied two goals and one assist.

Midfielder Mark Shearer, recovering from ankle injury, is probable for tonight's game. He played 90 minutes in Maryland last Saturday, but a sore ankle prevented him from going all out in practice this week.

Andy Bakun is doubtful for tonight's game because of a groin pull. Bakun has played forward, midfield and defense this season for the Eagles, as has Paul Kitson.

Kitson, who has played at sweeper the last two games, must sit out tonight after collecting his fourth yellow card caution of the season in Maryland.

After meeting tonight for the first time this season, the Eagles and Bolts play again at Nickerson Field, Boston, 23 hours later.

The Eagles and Bolts split the six games they played during 1988 and '89. The Eagles won two of three in '88, the Bolts two of three in '89.

The Bolts roster includes former Eagles forward Ferdinando DeMatthaeis and goalkeepers Greg Kenney and Terry Higgins. U.S. national team midfielder Brian Bliss is also on the roster. Other familiar names include brothers Stan and Joe Koziol from Clifton, N.J., in the midfield and former Seton Hall University star forward Ian Hennessey.

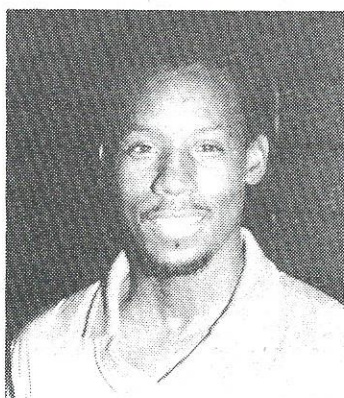

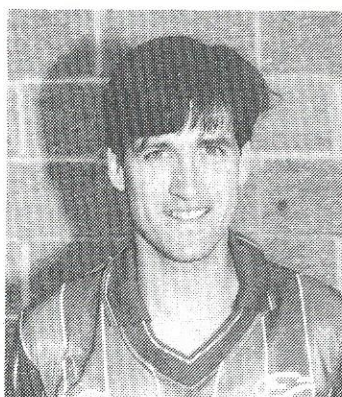
The Eagles are hoping that Winston Buddle's quickness and experience will boost the team's attack during the balance of the 1990 season.

Winston's professional career includes a stint in Cyprus with Anorthosis F.C. He also played for the New York Nationals of the United Soccer League and the Connecticut Yankees of the old American Soccer League.

While at Westchester Community College, Winston was selected a first team All-American. He also played soccer at Port Chester High School in New York.

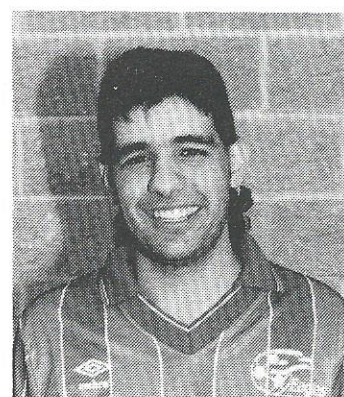
There aren't many fullbacks in the APSL that can give their team the strong overlapping play that the Eagles are hoping from Sean Crowley this year.

Sean concluded his collegiate career at Old Dominion University in 1988 as the school's all-time leading scorer, with 36 goals and 32 assists in 79 games over four years.

Sean was the Sun Belt Conference Player of the Year as a senior, when he finished third among all collegiate scorers with 18 goals. He was also selected Male Athlete of the Year by the Old Dominion alumni association.

During his four years at Old Dominion, the team won a Sun Belt Conference championship once and finished runnerup twice. Extremely durable, Sean never missed a game while at Old Dominion.

An Academic All-American, Sean holds a degree in economics. He is a native of Coventry and once had a trial with the England Under-18 national team.

Before beginning his professional career, Adrian played with the American University team that reached the NCAA championship game in 1985 against UCLA.

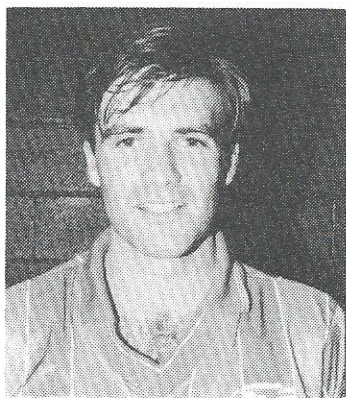
Adrian has also been selected to various U.S. national youth teams.

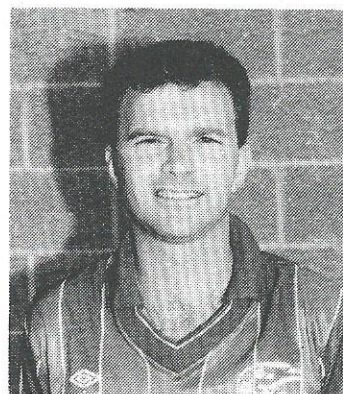

Aidan McCluskey's presence promises to add some offensive punch to the left side of the Eagles midfield this year.

Aidan is the fourth leading scorer in Fairleigh Dickinson University history, with 47 goals and 25 assists in 65 games between 1981-84.

As a senior in 1984, Aidan earned first team All-American honors with 18 goals and 11 assists in 22 games as the Knights appeared in a third consecutive NCAA tournament.

Aidan's most productive season was 1983, when he finished with 22 goals and 13 assists in 24 games.

He was the third player selected in the 1985 Major Indoor Soccer League draft when the Pittsburgh Spirit tabbed him in the first round.

Aidan joins the Eagles from the Kearny Scots of the Garden State League. He resides in Lincoln Park, N.J., with his wife and infant daughter.

The most familiar new face to long-time soccer fans is that of Nelsi Morais, who brings his vast experience and ability to read a game to the Eagles defense this season.

Nelsi is best known to area fans for his stint with the Cosmos from 1976-80. In five North American Soccer League seasons, Nelsi played in 63 regular season games, 14 playoff matches, and appeared in exhibitions all over the world.

The Cosmos won three NASL championships with Nelsi, who also played indoor soccer with the Cosmos during the 1981-82 season.

Nelsi is one of only a select few (Carlos Alberto is another) to have played alongside Pele on both Santos of the Sao Paulo league in Brazil and the Cosmos.

Nelsi, who currently resides in Bayside, N.Y., has kept his soccer skills sharp the past eight years by playing with G.H. Metros of the Long Island League.

The Eagles have added Richard Schiffman, Len Bilous and Doug Jacobs to their staff.

Richard Schiffman is chief executive officer of the Eagles and Soccerplex operations. Len Bilous is now director of operations for the team and manager of Soccerplex operations. Doug Jacobs is assistant director of operations and manager of team operations.

Richard joins the Eagles after a distinguished career on Wall Street. He was a corporate vice president at Drexel Burnham Lambert, where he worked for 20 years. He also spent 18 years at Stern Lauer & Co., where he was a head trader. In the newly created position of CEO, Richard concentrates on raising revenues and other business issues.

Len now adds team-related responsibilities to his existing duties as manager of the Soccerplex operation. In his new position, Len manages player contracts and various other logistics pertaining to the team.

Len has an extensive background in soccer. He coached the Cincinnati Kids, Pittsburgh Spirit, and Philadelphia Fever in the Major Indoor Soccer League, and played professionally in the old American Soccer League with the Philadelphia Spartans and Delaware Wings.

He also starred at Temple University, where he earned a bachelor's degree in business administration.

Doug joins the Eagles on a full-time basis after being involved part-time since 1987. He now manages stadium operations and handles other team-related work, including special ticket promotions. Doug received a bachelor's degree in Television/Radio/Film Management from Syracuse University this spring. His background includes a sports internship at WWOR-TV.

N.J. EAGLES VETERAN PAUL KITSON STILL LEARNING, TEACHING

JERSEY CITY, N.J. -- At a time when most 34-year-old soccer players would be thinking about a career change, Paul Kitson is continuing to learn new tricks on the field.

The New Jersey Eagles player/assistant coach recently began mastering a new position, sweeper, and is planning to continue his American Professional Soccer League career as the skilled veteran in head coach Terry Garbett's team.

"Paul is an extremely valuable part of our team," Garbett said. "As we've gone more and more with youth during the season, the presence of a veteran like Paul has become more important than ever."

Kitson began the year as an attacking midfielder, scoring a goal in the Eagles' 3-1 opening day win over the Orlando Lions. He also saw some action as a forward in mid-season. Now, he anchors the defense from the sweeper spot.

"It's an adjustment to play in the back when you've been used to being near the goal, looking for scoring opportunities," Kitson explained. "But my previous experience has helped me read the game, anticipate our opponent's moves, and still contribute to our attack."

goals and 155 assists.

In the 55th minute of the Eagles 3-2 APSL overtime
victory against the Maryland Bays, Kitson blasted a shot from
30 yards out into the net for a goal. Eight minutes later,
he assisted on a goal by forward Paul Riley. Throughout the
game, he was a major force in the Eagles defense.

"The game in Maryland was one of the highlights of the
season, both for the team and for me personally," Kitson
said. "I enjoyed being part of the Baltimore Blast team that
won an MISL championship, and it was nice to see that a lot
of people remembered me."

In recognition of his value to the Eagles' younger
players, Kitson was appointed assistant coach earlier this
month. He has experience coaching youth teams, and welcomes
the opportunity to help the Eagles both as a coach and player
in seasons to come.

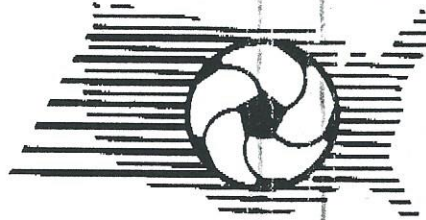
"It's been a tough year for us," Kitson said, "but I

**FT. LAUDERDALE CLINCHES SOUTHERN DIVISION TITLE,
 FINISHES A PERFECT 10-0 ON THE ROAD**

The Ft. Lauderdale Strikers are not just the only American Soccer League team to have clinched a playoff spot. They have clinched first place in the ASL's Southern Division. And the defending APSL champs didn't just clinch first, they did it in style.

By beating divisional foes Orlando Lions and Tampa Bay Rowdies at Orlando and Tampa Bay, the Strikers finished the away half of their season with a perfect 10-0 record. In league history, no team had ever before won more than seven games on the road.

It wasn't made easy for the Strikers, especially by the Lions, who on Friday outshot Ft. Lauderdale 15-7, and had seven corner kicks to their opponents' two. But national team midfielder Eric Eichmann scored with just one minute remaining to break a 1-1 deadlock.

Eichmann also assisted on Victor Moreland's opening goal. The Lions had tied it up with fifteen minutes to go despite the fact that they were playing with just ten men after Rod Castro's ejection. But Eichmann gave the victory to the visitors.

Next up was Tampa. One goal in each half was more than enough, as goalkeeper Arnie Mausser pitched a shutout to bring his season goals-against average below the 1.00 mark.

Elsewhere in the Southern Division, the battle rages on for the number two spot. Miami split their two games, thus gaining three points on the Lions and Rowdies. They too found success on the road, beating the Washington Diplomats 4-0 in RFK Stadium, behind Lazlo Barna's first two goals of the year. The loss eliminates the Diplomats from playoff contention.

At home, the Freedom's fortunes were not so sweet. David Banks' two goals led the visiting Penn-Jersey Spirit to a 3-1 win. The Spirit thus moved back into first place in the Northern Division, just ahead of the Albany Capitals and Maryland Bays.

Two days later the Spirit won at home, though they were forced to a tiebreaker to dispose of the Boston Bolts, thus gaining only two points rather than three. In the tight three team race, the point they dropped could turn out to be crucial.

The Bays, meanwhile, were another home loser. The New Jersey Eagles snapped a six game skid by beating Maryland 3-2 in overtime. Paul Riley scored his second of the match at 95:50 to give his side the victory and move himself into the top ten in ASL scoring.

Among the Northern leaders, only Albany was perfect. Mike Masters scored his tenth and eleventh goals of the year in pacing the Capitals to a 3-0 romp over Boston. Masters is second in scoring overall, and leads everyone in goals scored.

Both he and point leader Phillip Gyau of Maryland have a shot at the ASL records for most goals and points in one season. Both records were set by New Jersey's Jorge Acosta, who garnered 14 goals and 33 points in 1988. Masters and Gyau each have three games left to play.

The Capitals and Bays will be counting on their high-scoring strikers to help propel them into the playoffs. The Bays, though currently third, have a scheduling advantage. Penn-Jersey's final two games are against Albany, while Albany has those two plus one against Maryland. Maryland's other two games come versus the bottom of the division: the Washington Stars and New Jersey Eagles.

The top two teams from each division qualify for the playoffs, with the second-place Northern side meeting the Southern first-place team, and vice versa, in a home-and-home series. If the teams split the games, a thirty-minute "mini-game" will be played immediately following the second contest.

Divisional playoffs, to start at the home of the second-place side, will take place the weekend of August 10, with the ASL finals being contested under the same format on the following two weekends. September 22 in Boston, ASL and WSL Conference champions meet in the APSL final.
