

LAST MEETING vs. METROSTARS:

Burn 2, MetroStars 0 June 5 @ Giants Stadium

The Dallas Burn received second-half goals from forwards Eddie Johnson and Toni Nhleko as the Burn used a lethal counterattack on both occasions to snap a team-record-tying four-game losing streak with a 2-0 victory against the MetroStars at Giants Stadium on June 5. The Burn sought to catch the MetroStars back line off balance with quick counters, with two crosses from the right side headed down in the box to Burn attackers, but they could not find the target. Simo Valakari's left-footed volley in the 22nd minute from the penalty spot finished over the bar and three minutes later midfielder Carey Talley couldn't find an unmarked Jason Kreis.

The MetroStars then nearly went ahead in the 39th minute when a looping Jeff Parke header on a corner kick beat Garlick, but Jason Kreis was perfectly placed on the line to head the ball away.

Just seconds into the second half Dallas had three golden opportunities to take the lead but was stoned by three amazing saves by the MetroStars. First goalkeeper Jonny Walker used a reflex save to parry a point-blank Johnson header, and the rebound fell to Talley, but his shot was cleared off the goal line by MetroStars captain Eddie Pope. That clearance bounced to the top of the box where Valakari fired a shot that was blocked on its path to goal by a lunging Parke.

But in the 51st minute, the Burn went ahead. Johnson and O'Brien played a nice 1-2 on the right flank to free O'Brien to the byeline before he cut back a cross to the center of the area. A wide-open Johnson swept the ball first-time inside the left post from the top of the six-yard box for his third goal of the year.

Johnson nearly doubled his output and the lead in the 58th minute when he hit a powerful drive when completely unmarked in the box, only to see it come back off the right corner of the woodwork.

As the MetroStars pressed to score the equalizer with little success, it was Burn substitute striker Nhleko who was presented with two scoring opportunities. First, in the 87th minute a rare mistake by Parke allowed a ball to filter through to Nhleko who broke in alone on goal but Walker blocked the South African's shot in a one-on-one opportunity.

However, Nhleko was not forgiving on a second one-on-one opportunity in the 90th minute as O'Brien sprung him inside Dallas' half. The second-half substitute outran Vaca and after rounding Walker to the right, Nhleko knocked the ball into an empty net for his third goal of the year.

August 11@ Cotton Bowl

With a strong defensive showing and an impressive effort by goalkeeper Matt Reis, the New England Revolution made a third-minute Pat Noonan goal hold up and added some late insurance for a 3-0 win against the Dallas Burn at the Cotton Bowl on Wednesday night. Just four days after getting a miracle 1-0 win over the Colorado Rapids with a stoppage-time penalty kick after having two men sent off, the Burn piled on the pressure late in the match in search of an equalizer. But it wasn't to be as the Revolution grimly held on before getting goals from Taylor Twellman and Andy Dorman over the final minutes.

Before either team broke a sweat, the Revolution pulled ahead, again proving their prowess on set pieces. After just three minutes, midfielder Jose Cancela slipped a free kick along the right flank to Steve Ralston, who got behind the defense and drove the ball across the goalmouth. All Noonan had to do was tap the ball into the open net for his eighth goal of the year.

In the 12th minute, MLS career goal-scoring leader Jason Kreis nearly slipped one in from a sitting position when Eddie Johnson's pass through the box squeezed through Ralston's legs, but Reis slapped the ball wide. Six minutes later, Eric Quill had a golden opportunity when Kreis sent him free down the left, but Reis was quick off his line to block that effort.

After the interval, the visitors' defending was more organized and more resolute. The Burn exercised patience, working the ball around the edge of the attacking third in search of gaps in the Revolution rearguard. But the Revs, gave nothing away and in fact had the first sign of danger in the second half, when defender Rusty Pierce went just wide in the 60th minute.

Burn head coach Colin Clarke brought on Bobby Rhine in the 72nd minute to spice up the home side's attack, and within five minutes, Rhine proved dangerous, darting down the middle of the field before launching a shot that went just wide. In the 78th minute, Rhine -- who won the penalty kick that gave the Burn the win on Saturday -- won a free kick that Kreis pounded toward the near post, forcing Reis to make another fine save.

Rhine and Kreis teamed up again three minutes later, as Rhine served in a cross that Kreis headed toward goal, and Reis again did well to save the effort.

But after weathering the late storm the Revs broke through on the counter, and the 83rd-minute substitution by Revolution head coach Steve Nicol, bringing on fresh legs in the form of rookie midfielder Andy Dorman, soon paid dividends.

First in the 87th minute he fed Twellman with a low cross to finish off a 3-v-2 that gave Twellman his fourth goal of the season, then streaking into the box to turn home his first MLS goal off a Noonan cross from the right deep into stoppage time.

MISCELLANEOUS TEAM NOTES:

BURN AT METROSTARS TONIGHT

The Burn will play their second match of the week as they face the MetroStars tonight at Giants Stadium in a match that will be televised live on Fox Sports Net Southwest. The Burn (7-8-5) is currently tied for third in the Western Conference with 26 points while the MetroStars (9-6-5) are in first in the East with 32 points.

BURN/METROSTARS SERIES NOTES

Dallas leads the all-time series vs. the MetroStars 11-10-1...in the only meeting between the two clubs this year, the Burn posted a 2-0 victory at Giants Stadium on June 5...that victory snapped a Burn four-match winless streak vs. the Metros...prior to that four-game winless streak, the Burn had won the previous four matches...the MetroStars have not scored in their last two meetings vs. the Burn, a span of 180 minutes...their last goal was a John Wolyniec overtime winner on July 19, 2003...Dallas has lost just once in the last five visits to Giants Stadium, posting a 3-1-1 record over that span...Jason Kreis has 11 goals and six assists for 28 points in 21 career matches vs. the MetroStars.

BURN ANNOUNCES TEAM WILL BE KNOWN AS FC DALLAS FOLLOWING 2004 SEASON

A new tradition of professional soccer began on Thursday as Hunt Sports Group (HSG) and the Dallas Burn announced that, upon the completion of the 2004 Major League Soccer season, the Dallas Burn will now be known as FC Dallas.

Major League Soccer, the team currently known as the Dallas Burn, along with HSG founder Lamar Hunt, announced in June that the team would change its name and image to coincide with the organization's move to the sparkling new Frisco Soccer & Entertainment Complex's 20,000-seat soccer specific stadium in 2005. The change is being made to create a fresh, new, vibrant team identity that parallels the image of the new facility and the history of the game in North Texas, the United States and around the world.

JOHNSON SURPASSES POINT TOTAL FROM LAST THREE YEARS COMBINED

In only 17 matches played this year, forward Eddie Johnson has already surpassed his total points output from the previous three years combined. Johnson currently has seven goals and three assists for 17 points, which is seventh in the league in overall scoring. Through his first three years of league play (43 matches) he had seven goals and one assist for 15 points.

THREE STARTERS RETURN AFTER MISSING WEDNESDAY'S MATCH, ANOTHER OUT

The Burn will welcome the return of three starters when they face the MetroStars tonight. Midfielders Simo Valakari and Brad Davis both received red cards on August 7 vs. Colorado and served one-game suspensions on Wednesday. Additionally, midfielder Carey Talley missed Wednesday's match after surpassing the 21-point caution plateau.

The Burn will, however, be without the services of All-Star defender Cory Gibbs as he was called up to the US National Team for their World Cup qualifying match in Jamaica on Wednesday.

BURN SURPASSES LAST YEAR'S WIN TOTAL

With 10 matches still remaining in the 2004 season, the Burn has already surpassed last year's total in both wins and points. With their 1-0 victory over Colorado on August 7, the Burn reached seven victories on the year and 26 points. The team's final record in 2003 was 6-19-5 for 23 points.

BURN NOTES

- The Burn's goal in stoppage time last Saturday vs. Colorado marked only the fourth goal in MLS history scored by a team playing two men short and was the second game-winner in league history by a team with a two-man deficit.
- Dallas' 1-0 victory on Saturday was the team's sixth shutout of the year, two more than the team had all of last year.
- Five of the Burn's 24 goals this year have come in the final 15 minutes of the match, with two of those being game-winners. Conversely, the defense has conceded only six goals in the final 15 minutes (with two of those coming in last Wednesday's match). In 2003, the team conceded a league-high 15 goals in the final 15 minutes of matches, with eight of those proving to be game-winners.
