Goalkeeper Hubert Birkenmeier, who is retiring after tonight's game, will be honored in a pre-game ceremony. Birkenmeier will receive a rocking chair from his teammates and a plaque recognizing his contributions to the Eagles from team management.

Birkenmeier has been hampered by a groin pull recently, but is expected to start and play one half of tonight's game against the Maryland Bays. He joined the Eagles in May 1989 and played in 26 of the team's next 28 games, posting a 1.81 goals against average, before yielding his starting spot to Mario Pava last month. He recorded three shutouts and was in goal for five of the Eagles' six wins last year, and added a shutout and four victories this season.

During six seasons with the Cosmos from 1979 through 1984, Birkenmeier played in 168 games, posted a 1.55 goals against average, and was chosen to the North American Soccer League all-star team four teams. After the Cosmos ceased operations, Birkenmeier played in the Major Indoor Soccer League with the Chicago Sting, New York Express and Los Angeles Lazers. Born on May 24, 1949, Birkenmeier started his professional career in West Germany with hometown Hartheim S.C. and also played with Tennis Borussia and Freiburg.

Sean Crowley, who served a one-game suspension after collecting two yellow cards in the Eagles 1-0 penalty kicks tiebreaker win over the Boston Bolts last Friday, will return to the lineup tonight. Andy Bakun, who has missed four games with a groin pull, is also expected to be available. Dino is recovering from a hamstring injury, but is expected to be available tonight.

The Eagles have activated midfielder Pete Tadrick from the emergency list in an effort to help offset the losses of sweeper Paul Kitson and midfielder Adrian Gaitan. Kitson was red carded in the closing minutes of last Saturday's game in Boston, while Gaitan collected his fourth yellow card.

Fans producing ticket stubs from tonight and the three previous Friday night games this summer at the souvenir stand will receive a free Eagles t-shirt. All fans entering the game will receive a free color poster courtesy of the Marlboro Cup, which is being played next weekend at Giants Stadium between the U.S. national team, Flamengo (Rio de Janiero, Brazil), Alianza (Lima, Peru), and Sporting Lisbon (Portugal).

A win tonight will enable the Eagles (6-13) to improve on last year's 6-14 record. If Maryland (13-5) wins, the Bays will advance to the playoffs at the expense of the Penn-Jersey Spirit (13-7). Maryland plays the first place Albany Capitals (14-5) in Albany on Saturday night, and needs two points from the two games in order to clinch a playoff spot. If Maryland finishes in second place in the APSL East Northern Division, they will face the Southern Division and defending APSL champion Fort Lauderdale Strikers next weekend. Second place in the Southern Division is being contested by the Tampa Bay Rowdies and Orlando Lions.


The Eagles beat the Bays, 3-2, in overtime in Columbia, Maryland on July 21 on Paul Riley's second goal of the game.

Winston Buddle 9, Midfielder 5' 8" 160 11/1/56


The Eagles are hoping that Winston Buddle's quickness and experience will boost the team's attack during the balance of the 1990 season.

Winston joins the Eagles from Vasco Da Gama, which just completed its inaugural season in the North Eastern Super Soccer League.

Winston's professional career includes a stint in Cyprus with Anorthosis F.C. He also played for the New York Nationals of the United Soccer League and the Connecticut Yankees of the old American Soccer League.

While at Westchester Community College, Winston was selected a first team All-American. He also played soccer at Port Chester High School in New York.

Born in Jamaica, Winston is a U.S. citizen.



Sean Crowley 4, Defender5' 10" 170 11/8/66


There aren't many fullbacks in the APSL that can give their team the strong overlapping play that the Eagles are hoping from Sean Crowley this year.

Sean concluded his collegiate career at Old Dominion University in 1988 as the school's all-time leading scorer, with 36 goals and 32 assists in 79 games over four years.

Sean was the Sun Belt Conference Player of the Year as a senior, when he finished third among all collegiate scorers with 18 goals. He was also selected Male Athlete of the Year by the Old Dominion alumni association.

During his four years at Old Dominion, the team won a Sun Belt Conference championship once and finished runnerup twice. Extremely durable, Sean never missed a game while at Old Dominion.

An Academic All-American, Sean holds a degree in economics. He is a native of Coventry and once had a trial with the England Under-18 national team.

Adrian Gaitan's signing with the Eagles represents a sort of homecoming for the Oceanside, N.Y., native.

Adrian returns to familiar territory after a few years in the Washington, D.C., area. Most recently, he spent two seasons with the Washington Stars as a defensive midfielder.

Before beginning his professional career, Adrian played with the American University team that reached the NCAA championship game in 1985 against UCLA.


Adrian has also been selected to various U.S. national youth teams.

Dan Hatter 17, Defender6' 1" 185 5/10/67


Dan Hatter is the newest former Fairleigh Dickinson University soccer star to join the Eagles.

In 1989, Dan's play at sweeper earned him first team All-Region and All-Northeast Conference honors for a third straight year. He captained the school to a second consecutive NCAA tourney appearance.

He was recently named Fairleigh Dickinson's Male Athlete of the Year, and honored by the East Coast Athletic Conference for being the athlete with the highest grade point average.

Dan played 73 games in four seasons at Fairleigh Dickinson, and proved himself an offensive force as well as a defensive anchor by netting three game winning goals in 1989.



Aidan McCluskey 8, Midfielder 5' 11" 170 12/9/59

Aidan McCluskey's presence promises to add some offensive punch to the left side of the Eagles midfield this year.

Aidan is the fourth leading scorer in Fairleigh Dickinson University history, with 47 goals and 25 assists in 65 games between 1981-84.

As a senior in 1984, Aidan earned first team All-American honors with 18 goals and 11 assists in 22 games as the Knights appeared in a third consecutive NCAA tournament.


Aidan's most productive season was 1983, when he finished with 22 goals and 13 assists in 24 games.

He was the third player selected in the 1985 Major Indoor Soccer League draft when the Pittsburgh Spirit tabbed him in the first round.

Aidan joins the Eagles from the Kearny Scots of the Garden State League. He resides in Lincoln Park, N.J., with his wife and infant daughter.

Nelsi Morais 3, Defender 5' 9" 165 10/22/51

The most familiar new face to longtime soccer fans is that of Nelsi Morais, who brings his vast experience and ability to read a game to the Eagles defense this season.

Nelsi is best known to area fans for his stint with the Cosmos from 1976-80. In five North American Soccer League seasons, Nelsi played in 63 regular season games, 14 playoff matches, and appeared in exhibitions all over the world.

The Cosmos won three NASL championships with Nelsi, who also played indoor soccer with the Cosmos during the 1981-82 season.

Nelsi is one of only a select few (Carlos Alberto is another) to have played alongside Pele on both Santos of the Sao Paulo league in Brazil and the Cosmos.

Nelsi, who currently resides in Bayside, N.Y., has kept his soccer skills sharp the past eight years by playing with G.H. Metros of the Long Island League. The Eagles have added Richard Schiffman, Len Bilous and Doug Jacobs to their staff.

Richard Schiffman is chief executive officer of the Eagles and Soccerplex operations. Len Bilous is now director of operations for the team and manager of Soccerplex operations. Doug Jacobs is assistant director of operations and manager of team operations.

Richard joins the Eagles after a distinguished career on Wall Street. He was a corporate vice president at Drexel Burnham Lambert, where he worked for 20 years. He also spent 18 years at Stern Lauer & Co., where he was a head trader. In the newly created position of CEO, Richard concentrates on raising revenues and other business issues.

Len now adds team-related responsibilities to his existing duties as manager of the Soccerplex operation. In his new position, Len manages player contracts and various other logistics pertaining to the team.

Len has an extensive background in soccer. He coached the Cincinnati Kids, Pittsburgh Spirit, and Philadelphia Fever in the Major Indoor Soccer League, and played professionally in the old American Soccer League with the Philadelphia Spartans and Delaware Wings.

He also starred at Temple University, where he earned a bachelor's degree in business administration.

Doug joins the Eagles on a full-time basis after being involved part-time since 1987. He now manages stadium operations and handles other team-related work, including special ticket promotions. Doug received a bachelor's degree in Television/Radio/Film Management from Syracuse University this spring. His background includes a sports internship at WWOR-TV.

ALBANY: INTO THE PLAYOFFS; PENN-JERSEY: ON THE VERGE OF ELIMINATION; SOUTHERN DIVISION: STILL WIDE OPEN

The Albany Capitals became the second American Soccer League team to clinch a playoff berth, beating second-place Penn-Jersey 4-2 and 2-1 on consecutive nights to ensure their place and put the Spirit into the most fragile of positions.

The Maryland Bays, currently sitting third in the Northern Division, are just one point behind the Spirit with two games to play, while Penn-Jersey's season is finished. They can only hope for a pair of Maryland losses.

Should Maryland win the first of those games, against the cellar-dwelling New Jersey Eagles, they would meet Albany on the final day of the regular season with first place on the line.

Before Penn-Jersey had lost either game, they took a tremendous blow when league-leading goalkeeper Dale Caya was taken to the hospital with a broken leg, suffered in a collision with Albany striker Mike Masters in the forty-fourth minute of the first meeting.

Down only 1-0 at the time, the Spirit's flood gates opened in the second half. Neither John Doran in the remainder of that contest, nor Nick Broujos the following night, could provide the same quality of stellar goalkeeping Penn-Jersey has gotten from Caya all season long. With him in the nets, they were 13-3; without him: 0-4.

The Bays did their part to stay in contention, dispatching the Washington Stars by a 2-0 count, despite having to play without star forward Phillip Gyau, on loan to the U.S. National Team. Albany's Masters was able to take advantage of Gyau's absence, picking up four points to move past the Bay into the league scoring lead, with 28 points.

In the Southern Division, where Ft. Lauderdale has long been assured of first place, three teams remain in the fight for second as the final weekend of the season approaches. Tampa Bay, with 26 points, controls their own destiny. They meet the Miami Freedom on August 4 in the season's last match, when a win will put them into the playoffs.

A Miami win, coupled with a Freedom victory over the Washington Diplomats one day earlier, would give Miami 27 points, one better than the Rowdies. The Orlando Lions can also reach 27 points, by beating the frontrunning Strikers when they meet on August 4. Should the Lions and Freedom be deadlocked for the
