TIDES RETURN WINLESS FROM ROAD TRIP; ON THE MOVE IN JUNE

Home never looked so good to the Tacoma Tides as they return to Cheney Stadium from a winless 3 game road trip to play 2 league matches -- June 2 against Utah Golden Spikers and June 4 against Cork Hibernians and an exhibition match June 12 against players from the Canadian Olympic team.

CLEVELAND COBRAS The Tides opened the trip with a 0-0 tie against the Cleveland Cobras although they outshot the Cobras 25-13. In that game Jamil Canal, Tides starting goalkeeper, ranked fourth in the league in goals against average, damaged cartilage in his left knee seven minutes before the end of the first half. Bruce Arena, rookie goalkeeper from Cornell University who played pro lacrosse last year, kept the Tides' nets clear for the remainder of the game.

UTAH GOLDEN SPIKERS On to Salt Lake City and a rainy, muddy State Fairgrounds field where the Tides lost to the Utah Golden Spikers 1-0 on a goal by Tony Douglas 15 seconds before the end of the first half. The Tides played evenly with the Spikers except in front of the goal. Again they were unable to finish the scoring opportunities they created.

The game was physical to say the least Afterwards Coach Dan Wood said, "Utah took some of the cheapest shots I've ever seen in soccer. Charlie Myers went out with a vicious kick. Sure, (Vince) McCarthy was cautioned, but we lost our center forward." The Spikers received two yellow card cautions during the game.

"Utah has a couple of marked men," defender Wayne Cegielski remarked. "It should be interesting when they come to Tacoma (June 2)."

OAKLAND BUCCANEERS In Oakland it was another case of not enough goals for the Tides. Oakland scored first early in the second half as Franco Chirinos got a pass from Gerard Hylkema in spite of the defensive efforts of Mickey Rooney and Cegielski, and slipped it past Arena as he came out. Windsor Del Llano evened the score minutes later with a 35-yard chip over the head of Bucc's keeper Don Clark and just under the crossbar. One and a half minutes into overtime Bucc's Ron Watson took a 25-yard free kick to Victor Pires who headed the winning goal.

FERNANDEZ ON INJURED LIST

Adding to the Tides forward problems, Pepe Fernandez was placed on the injured list until June 17. According to Dr. Stanley A. Mueller, Jr., team orthopedist, Pepe is suffering from chronic hamstring injuries affecting their strength and flexibility. The biggest problem is in his left hamstring, injured in the Sounders' game with New York on April 9. Since then the leg has not had a chance to heal, and complete rest is the best remedy.

CRYDER SIGNED

To bolster the forward line, General Manager Stan Naccarato announced the signing of Brooks Cryder from the L.A. Skyhawks. Cryder was obtained in a straight trade for Tides defender Alty McKenzie. Cryder, 21, 5'9", 165 is from Philadelphia and attended Philadelphia Textile.

At Philadelphia Textile Cryder played under Walt Chysowych, U.S.S.F. staff coach, and scored 48 goals in 4 years -- 16 in 1975 when he was named All-America. He was starting center forward for the East team in the 1975 Senior Bowl. Cryder was drafted second by the Skyhawks and first by the Philadelphia Atoms of the NASL. He started against the Tides twice at right back but will get the chance to return to his more familiar forward position for the Tides.

Coach Dan Wood commented, "I've seen Brooks play several times in college and he should be able to get some goals for the Tides this year. It was a good trade for both LA and Tacoma since they needed defenders and we

Goals for the Hibs were from Damien Richardson, Carl Humphreys, and Patrick Kirby. The Hibs should have their Irish up by the time they reach Tacoma and the Tides expect a corker of a game. The game will count in ASL standings.

Again in addition to 90 minutes of super soccer there will be a fireworks extravaganza, and Ed Friel and Space featuring Stephanie Phillips, a contemporary band, will

perform before the game.

JUNE 8 CANADIAN NATIONAL CIXMPICS

Tacoma Mall Night at Cheney Stadium features an exhibition game between the Tides and the Canadian National Olympics, a team made up of the western half of the 1976 Olympic Team. Because of geographics the team is split participating they cannot be billed as the Canadian Olympic Team. However, about 10 members of the team plus top reserves will be on hand coached by Colin Morris, Canadian Olympic Coach. The team just completed an 11 game tour of English professional sides and finished with a more than respectable record of 6 wins, 3 losses, and 2 ties. Tickets are available free at all Tacoma Mall stores or at the gate on game night at reduced prices -- \$4.00 for adults, under 16 \$2.00.

ASL PLAYOFF DATES

In the ASL meeting May 15, the playoff system was determined. The top three teams from each division will play off, with the number three team playing away to the runner-up team on August 18. The winner of that game will play at the division champion's home field August 21 and the final match between divisions will be held August 28 at a site to be determined.
