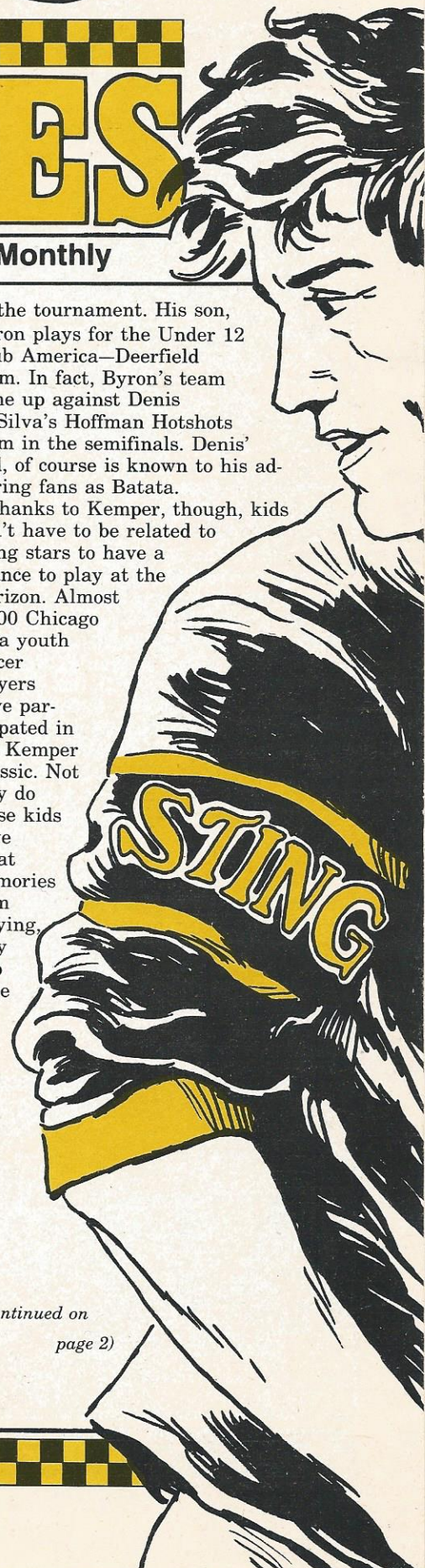

In Under 14 girls play, Sparta, from Wheaton, defeated the St. Charles Streak in the finals. The 4-3 contest was decided on penalty kicks after the teams played to a 1-1 tie in regulation time. The Under 16 girls championship was also a one-goal contest, with the St. Charles Celtics defeating the Hoffman Estates Hustle, 1-0.

The victorious coaches, Sparta's Liz Wheelles and the St. Charles Celtics' Barbara Huntley, received team championship trophies. Their players received individual trophies and Sting jackets. Dick Marty of the St. Charles Streak and Mike Crowe of the Hoffman Estates Hustle received runner-up team trophies. Their players also received individual trophies, along with Sting sweatshirts.

The boys finalists will be doing battle for the same rewards. The Under 10 finals will have Pete Padjen's Maroons (Elmwood Park) playing Darien Arsenal, coached by Chuck Collar. In Under 12 action, Club America—Deerfield, coached by Dr. Wesley Barnett, battles Ramon Travieso's Lombard Rowdies. The Under 14 championship matchup is between Klaus Ruege's Chicago Pegasus and Danny Dragic's Northwest Indiana Tigers.

The Sting salutes not only these champions and runners-up, but also every team that participated in the First Annual Kemper Financial Services Youth Indoor Soccer Classic. Kemper, kids, and the Sting have teamed up for another winning season.

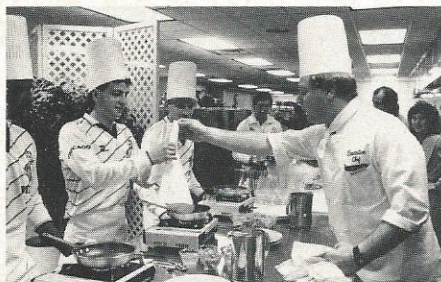

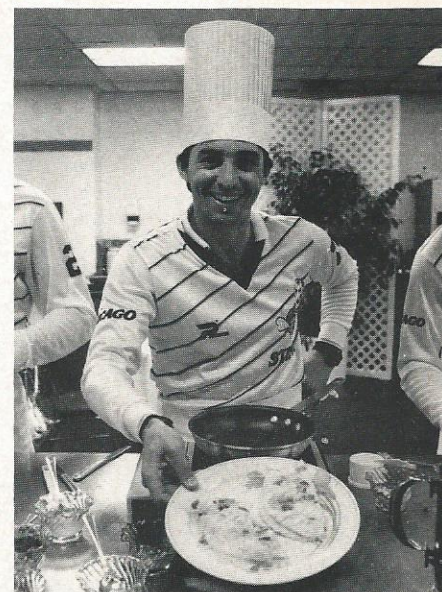


Frankie Klopas getting a pointer or two in the Hyatt kitchen from the great chef.

VICTOR NOGUEIRA: THE STING'S MAN BETWEEN THE BALL AND THE GOAL

No one said a soccer goalie's life was without excitement. Deflecting 60-70 mile per hour shots for 60 minutes is a tough way to make a living. Yet that has not stopped Sting goalkeeper Victor Nogueira from having a very successful career in the Major Indoor Soccer League. For four years, the 27 year old Nogueira has been entrusted with the job of putting himself between the ball and the goal. More often than not with Victor as keeper, the ball hasn't quite made it into the goal.

This year Nogueira has been a rock for the Sting. At the time of this writing Victor has seen over 1800 minutes of action, leading the Sting to 14 victories. Last year his 4.31 goals against average and 17-14 record were good enough to make him the #7 ranked goalkeeper in the league. In recognition of his efforts, he was selected Jim Beam Sting Star of the Year by the Chicago Chapter of the Professional Soccer Reporters of America.

An American citizen born in Mozababique, Africa, Nogueira has been playing soccer since he was eight years old. He signed as a free agent on December 13, 1982. Besides his tenure with the Sting, Nogueira has played in South Africa, Britain and with the Montreal and Atlanta franchises of the old North American Soccer League. No matter what league he has been in, Victor has always been rated near the top.

"I've always worked hard, no matter where I played," said Nogueira. "I love the game of soccer and it has been very good to me. The odds of

becoming a professional athlete no matter which sport it is are very slim, so if you can get a break or two and make it to the major leagues, then you make the most of the opportunity. That's what I feel I have done in soccer."

Nogueira managed to get on the other side of the ball against the Los Angelesazers on February 7, 1986, when he became the eighth goalkeeper in MISL history to score a goal. Coupled with three assists, Victor has a total of four points. Despite his offensive heroics, Nogueira is content to leave the

scoring to the likes of Batata and Frank Klopas while he continues to be the man between the ball and the goal for your Chicago Sting.

Married to Pamela, the Nogueiras have one child named Daniel Paul, who was born last summer. Nogueira likes to play golf and keep tabs on his investments. He is also looking to completing his education and going into business after his soccer career is finished. Victor admires Muhammad Ali and enjoys pizza. In fact, he has his own special recipe, but he won't let the secret out.

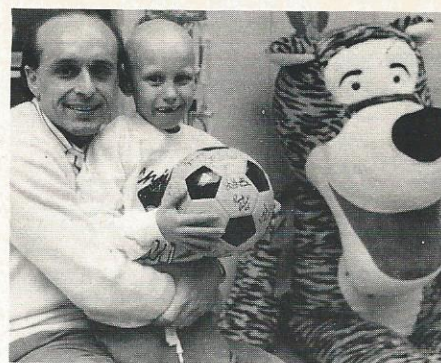

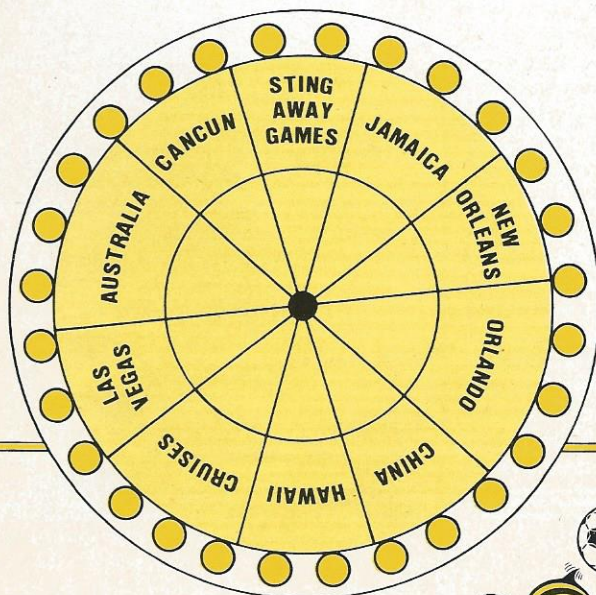
ners and weekend packages from the Hyatt Regency O'Hare.

IT'S MISL PLAYOFF TIME!!!

The Major Indoor Soccer League's "Second Season" begins this next week as Playoffs '87 kickoff with a field of eight teams from both the Eastern and Western Divisions.

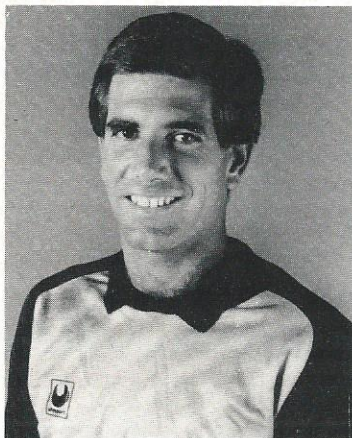
The top four teams in each division qualify for the Division Semifinals, which will be a best-of-five series. In each division, the first place team plays the fourth place team and the second place finisher meets the third place team.

The Division Finals, a best-of-seven series, will have the two winners from the Semifinals squaring off.

Then, the divisional winners will meet for the MISL Championship. The finals will be a best-of-seven series.

This year there are as many as seven teams that could win the league title. In the East, the Baltimore Blast and the Cleveland Force have to be considered strong favorites to reach Championship '87. After finishing a disappointing fourth last season with a 24-24 record and losing to Cleveland in the quarterfinals, Kenny Cooper's troops regrouped and

have led the MISL East for most of the season. The Blast own the best home record in the league and the fourth best road record. Although the Blast is ranked second in goals scored in the Eastern Division and fourth in the league, Baltimore has the lowest goals against average in the MISL. Plus, Baltimore has the second best penalty killing unit in the league behind the Chicago Sting.

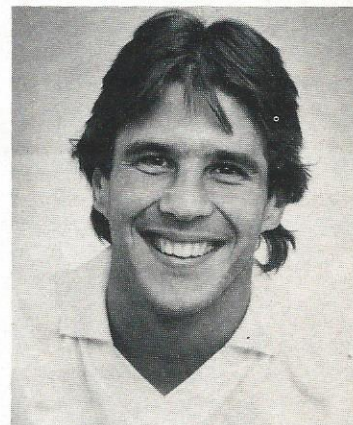

Drago leads the team in scoring with 34 goals and 28 assists followed by Richard Chinapoo (38-21) and Keith Furphy (29-26). Goalkeeping is a very strong area for Baltimore. Scott Manning is ranked second in the league with a 3.43 goals against average, while Keith Van Eron is fifth at 3.82. The Cleveland Force has stayed close to Baltimore for most of the season and flirted with first place a few times late in the season. The Force has to be considered a solid favorite because of the play Kai Hasskivi and Carl Valentine. After having two average seasons in scoring, the Finnish native could have his best season scoring since 1983-84 when he had 88 (37-51) points. Valentine is also enjoying his finest season with 31 goals and 33 assists for 64 points. Defender Bernie

James, who leads the league in block shots with 127, has given Tino Liekoski's team a solid defense that has kept Cleveland in many close games.

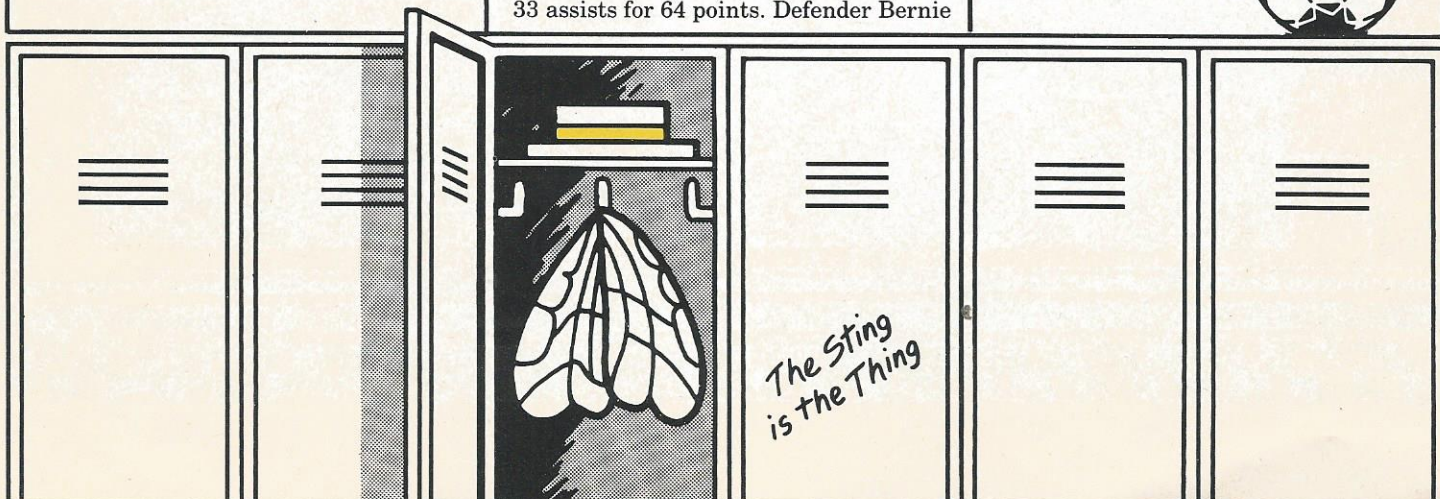
When you talk about the Dallas Sidekicks, only one name comes to mind—Tatu. The "Little Armadillo" is the leading scoring in the MISL with 70 goals and 36 assists. But another Sidekick has been making news in the Dallas camp. Goalkeeper Kryz Sobieski is having his finest season ever as he owns a 3.47 GAA and the best won-loss record in the league at 23-18. If Tatu can continue his scoring brilliants and the Sidekicks can get some solid defense in front of Sobieski, Dallas could be a darkhorse for the MISL title.

After fighting it out with the Sting for the last playoff spot in the MISL East, the Minnesota Strikers will have a tough time in post-season play. The Strikers' defense is solid with Tino Lettieri having

an exceptional year as the MISL's top goalkeeper, but Minnesota has had trouble scoring goals. Minnesota has the third worst goal production average in the league. The Strikers will have to score more if they want to advance beyond the quarterfinals.

The MISL West has seen one of the most exciting races in years. The Tacoma Stars, which won their first Western Division title on April 18, had to battle the San Diego Sockers much of the season before San Diego was hit with a rash of injuries to win the divisional title by more than six games. When MISL fans talk about who the top scorers in the league are, the name Steve Zungul is always mentioned. The seven-year veteran, who joined the Stars in the second half of last season in the biggest deal in MISL history, has led Tacoma in scoring all season with 38 goals and 43 assists. But right on Zungul's heels in the team scoring race is Preki (39-41-80) and Godfrey Ingram (46-29). Consistency has been the key work for Alan Hinton's team. But the goalkeeping will have to improve if the Stars want to add another banner to the rafters of the Tacoma Dome.

The Kansas City Comets have to be considered as one of the most improved teams in the MISL in '86-'87. After finishing last season with an 18-30 record for fifth place, the improved Comets were led in scoring by Jan Goossens (44-39-83) and Dale Mitchell (44-21-65). Also Alan Mayer's consistent play in goal has kept the Comets in several close games.

The San Diego Sockers could open a M.A.S.H. unit. The Sockers have been plagued by injuries that have claimed leading scorers Branko Segota and Hugo

Perez as well as Brian Quinn and Brian Schmetzer. The injuries have resulted in San Diego having a difficult time fighting for the Western Division title with Tacoma.

Wichita is one of those teams you hear very little about, but when you look at the standings, they are in contention. Chico Borja has been the mainstay of the Wings this season. His 47 goals and 34 assists is good for fifth in the MISL scoring leaders. The Wings have to be considered a good contender for the championship if they can get a break or two in the playoffs.

Prediction: This seems to be Baltimore's and Tacoma's year and they will meet in the finals with Baltimore winning in seven games. But look for Cleveland, Kansas City and San Diego to put up a good fight. Dallas and Wichita are considered longshots.

MISL MILESTONES

Baltimore's 6-4 win over Chicago on April 18 was the 200th in Blast history... The San Diego Sockers lost their last six games, a team record... Tacoma set a new MISL stan-

dard for blocked shots in a season as they now have 671, breaking the old mark of 651 set by the 1983-84 Cleveland Force... Baltimore's Andy Chapman, who has 248 career MISL goals, will soon be joining Steve Zungul (580), Fred Grgurev (331), Branko Segota (278) and Craig Allen (25) as members of the 250 goal club... Teammate Keith Furphy is not far behind with 245 career goals... Kai Haaskivi needs just three points to become just the fourth player in MISL history to reach the 500-point plateau, his numbers are 233 goals and 264 assists... Haaskivi will be joining Zungul (973), Grgurev (544) and Segota (503)... Cleveland's Bernie James with 127 blocked shots and Tacoma's Neil Megson, who has 124 blocks, are battling it out for the MISL single season record of 136 blocked shots set by Oscar Pisano during the 1983-84 MISL campaign... With 98 and 96 career victories respectively, Baltimore's Scott Manning and Cleveland's Chris Vaccaro will soon join the MISL 100 victories club.

LINE CHANGES IN INDOOR SOCCER

Spectators at an indoor soccer game, as played by the Sting in the MISL, are sometimes amazed or sometimes confused by a hectic pace of substitutions. At times, it doesn't look like anyone knows where they are going, but, in most cases, it is quite a smooth process. Except for a few minor technicalities, substitution in an indoor game is easily understood. Players can change at either "Dead Ball" times (i.e. when the ball leaves the field of play, when a goal is scored, etc.) or when the ball is in play ("Changing on the Fly"). These changes are a one-for-one switch and therefore, only the allowable number of players (five field players or four if one is in the penalty box) can be on the field at any one time.

The execution of proper changes is a priority in the indoor game. A quick dash in one gate and a subsequent burst out of the other by a player can definitely mean the difference in gaining a 10 step advantage on a opponent. This could lead to a clean counter-attack and goal or a surprise

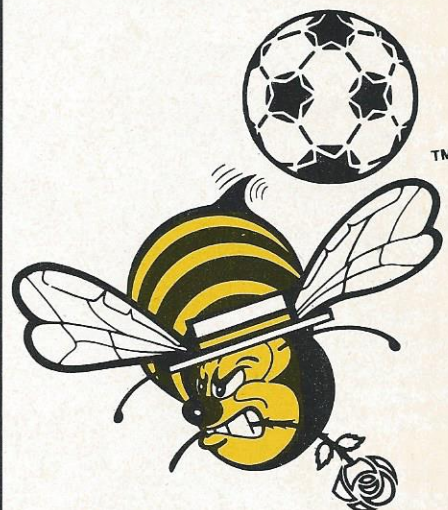
defensive position that allows a player to easily win the ball.

The change or substitution itself is basically a coordination between line partners. This pattern is set up by the coach before the game begins and each player knows his "Change-Up" partner. For instance, Heinz-Wirtz and Chico Moreira play the same defender position. If Heinz is on the field, Chico is resting on the bench and preparing to change. When Heinz is tiring, or sees a prime opportunity to change with Chico, he does. This happens with five sets of partners (or

three's sometimes) throughout the game. Usually, two-minute shifts are common, but sometimes shorter periods are required.

Special situations, such as power plays and sixth attacker, also have predetermined line changes and at times require a coach to alter his regular line-up or insert a player that is in one of the regular shifts.

Coaches and players of the indoor game must always be alert and concentrating on their substitutions. They can ultimately determine the outlook and eventually the winner of many indoor games.

"A ROLLER-COASTER KIND OF A YEAR FOR THE STING"

Despite the frustrations of a roller-coaster season and the agony of far too many defeats, the Chicago Sting 1986-87 MISL season still had its share of excitement. There were, of course, some disappointments too. The biggest being eliminated from play-off contention. Let's take time to remember the headlines and happenings of the season.

★ With the move to the Horizon, the Sting introduced totally clear glass boards, giving fans a unique total view of everything happening on the playing field.

★ Prior to the season, the Sting pulled off a major deal, acquiring high-scoring, playmaking Nilton DaSilva, affectionately known as Batata, from the Los Angeles Lazers.

★ Batata immediately went to work and put together a Sting record 33-game scoring streak.

★ Other new faces in Sting black and gold included goalkeeper Scoop Stanistic, defender Nicky Klincarski, and midfielder Teddy Krafft.

★ Later in the season, Scoop Stanistic would be named Met Life defensive player of the month, while the popular Krafft polished his skill in the indoor game so well he was named MISL offensive player of the week.

★ For the first time in several seasons, three rookies made the club roster . . . Paul Krumpe, Randy Prescott and Elias Zurita.

★ Despite a disappointing start, Sting fans could sense that returning young veterans like Frankie Klopas and Ben Collins were on the brink of noteworthy seasons.

★ With the resignation of Willy Roy, new assistant coach Erich Geyer was named to the top spot. Geyer named coaching veteran Gary Hindley to the post of Sting assistant coach, and things started to turn around.

★ The Sting carved out a seven-game winning streak and served notice that Chicago was a team that had to be taken seriously!

★ Some of the credit for the winning streak must go to a major deal engineered by Sting

president Kenny Stern and coach Geyer which sent Drago to Baltimore in exchange for All-Star defenders Ernie Buriano and Frantz Mathieu.

★ As the season hurried on, Chicago won its first games ever in the indoor arenas of Dallas, St. Louis and San Diego.

★ Just when things were rolling, Sting fans were shocked and saddened by season-ending injuries to Frantz Mathieu and Manny Rojas.

★ To fortify the roster, coach Geyer signed former Golden Bay Earthquake and Mexican Soccer League veteran Edgardo Lopez. That was followed by the addition of Mickey "Boom-Boom" Zyayo, a standout goal scorer from the Yugoslavian first division. As Zyayo has learned the indoor game, he has shown Sting fans speed, maneuverability and scoring touch which promises an outstanding future for Mickey and the Sting.

★ So many exciting games and last minute victories, such as Paul Krumpe's game winner at 14:49 of the game at Minnesota, Chico Moreira's goal with only seven seconds left to send the Sting into overtime against Wichita . . . then Frank Klopas's game winner, Batata's overtime goal to lift the Sting over the Steamers in Chicago's first win ever at the St. Louis Arena, Frankie Klopas again with overtime goals against San Diego and Los Angeles, giving Klopas three overtime game winning goals in all.

★ How about the emergence of the MISL's top penalty-killing team, The Killer Bees!

★ No highlight remembrances would be complete without the delicious visions of the Chicago Sting, before a packed house of delirious fans, totally dismantling Dynamo Moscow at the Horizon!

★ And wasn't it great to get back to the post-game parties. This year the gatherings at the Hive were highly successful, especially when Dapper Davey Huson greeted the fans and conducted player interviews.

Let's hope next season will have so many highlights, it'll take a whole newspaper to print them all.

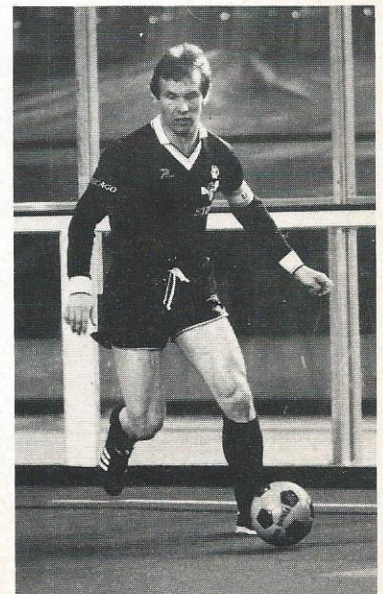
