

The Cleveland Force (10-7) will be looking to bounce back from its worst defeat of the year this afternoon by hosting the Chicago Horizons (7-10). The Force was shutout 10-0 by the Wichita Wings on Friday night and Chicago was defeated in Buffalo by the score

Even though the Force outshot the Wings 63-52, they could not hit the Wichita net. Wing's goalkeeper Mike Dowler made 27 saves and was helped by five Force shots that hit the post. Dowler set an MISL record with back-to-back shutouts (the previous Sunday he shutout the Fog 8-0). Wichita is 8-1 at home this season with their only loss coming at the hands of the Force 6-5 in overtime.

"The score is the most important thing and so it is a bad result for us," said Eddie McCreadie following the game," but I don't feel as bad as I did after the loss to Philadelphia (7-6 in shootout) Actually, we didn't play that bad, we were a bit slow picking up, but everything just went perfect for them."

"I said it when we won and I'll say it again now, this team has tremendous spirit!" McCreadie stressed, "If anyone had come into the Coliseum in the second half they would have thought it was a one-goal game. We went down fighting." The Force dominated play in the fourth period but Wichita held on to perserve the shutout.

"We can't wait 'till Chicago to get it out of our system." McCreadie concluded.

Notes: The Force defeated the Horizons 9-6 at the Coliseum earlier this season in the only other meeting between the two teams. Ian Anderson chipped in two goals and seven other Force players scored the remaining goals. Paul Kitson had two goals for the Horizon.

The Force has won 5 of the last 7 games but has dropped 2 of the last 3. Chicago has lost 8 of their last 10 games after a good start.

The Force did not drop in the standings after Friday's loss because St. Louis and Chicago also lost.

Ruben Astigarraga(flu) and Simon Look(back) did not play in Wichita and are doubtful this afternoon. Tony Simoes (foot) is out and Gino Schiraldi(knee) is doubtful for the Horizons.

Chicago has never lost by more than 3 goals but they were defeated by the Force (9-6) and the Stallions (10-7).

The Force lost by the biggest margin of the year on Friday following their biggest margin of victory last Sunday against Baltimore(10-3).

Cleveland has hit the crossbar 9 times in the last two road losses.

This afternoon is the beginning of a 3 game homestand. Next Friday, the Force host the San Francisco Fog on Cleveland Press night. The game will also be the MISL Game-of-the-Week. Next Sunday the improving Buffalo Stallions are in town at 2:05pm.
