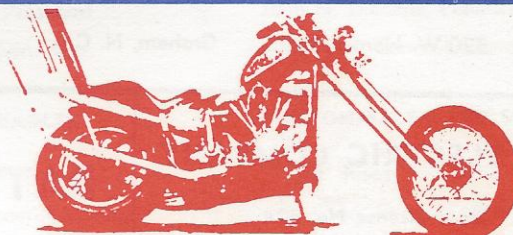

Burlington's Mr. Baseball retired this year. Who is he? If you asked that question to the thousands of fans in the Alamance area the answer is sure to be Brodie Hood.

Brodie's sports career started at Oak Ridge Military Academy in 1920 and continued through Wake Forest University. There he starred in baseball, football and basketball. Graduating in 1926 with a degree in law.

However, baseball's gain was the court room's loss. After serving as coach and teacher in several local high schools Brodie became General Manager of the Burlington Baseball Club in 1942. That was the year that his beloved city joined Leaksville, Sanford and Danville to form the Bi-State League.

Through the years of hard work he has seen many greats develop from the Burlington baseball scene. Gus Zernial, Indians; Tom Agee of the Mets, Duke Sims of the Dodgers, and Doc Edwards, coach of the Philadelphia Phillies have all placed their names on the contract with Brodie.

BOWIE KUHN

Bowie Kuhn, Commissioner of Baseball since February 4, 1969, is one of our special guests at Fairchild Park today. We all extend a warm welcome to the man who stands at the top of the baseball world.

Mr. Kuhn was a Wall Street lawyer before his appointment of commissioner. While working with the law firm of Willkie, Farr and Gallagher he had handled law matters for the Major Leagues.

From the start, Mr. Kuhn proved to be the dominant figure that baseball needed. Soon after his appointment the commissioner helped settle a prolonged and unprecedented pension dispute. Two controversial trades involving Ken Harrelson and Donn Clendenon were quickly settled by the new czar. Kuhn also handled the owners with more authority than they had previously been accustomed to. The Commissioner proved his ability as a public relations man for baseball by setting up a gala White House reception for 500 baseball celebrities in conjunction with baseball's centennial All-Star Game.

Since that first year the Commissioner has handled delicate situations involving Denny McLain, Jim Bouton, Marvin Miller, Curt Flood, franchise moves, player and umpire strikes, and many other less known problems. Baseball is fortunate to have a man of his caliber as its leader.

WALTER LEONARD

Today we also welcome Walter "Buck" Leonard of Rocky Mount, North Carolina. Buck this year will be honored by the baseball world as he has been voted to the Baseball Hall of Fame. Buck has been compared with Joe DiMaggio as he always was in the mid-.300's and occasionally in the .400 class and combined a sweet stroke with awesome power. Leonard, a smooth fielding first baseman, starred for a decade with another Hall of Famer, Josh Gibson, in the old Negro National League.
