CHICAGO STING AT BALTIMORE BLAST/FOURTH OF SIX SCHEDULED THIS YEAR/FEB. 14, '86

TONIGHT THE BLAST/TOMMORROW THE STRIKERS IN CHICAGO/THIRD BACK-TO-BACK OF SIX

STING TIES ALL-TIME MISL RECORD FOR CONSECUTIVE SUDDEN-DEATH VICTORIES

Chicago, amidst a three-game win streak, equal to their longest previous win streak this season, has been working overtime the past week: a trio of consecutive sudden-death victories ties the League record for such accomplishment set by the 1983-84 MISL East Memphis Americans. Chicago defeated theazers, 6-5 in OT, in Chicago on Feb. 7; the Spirit in Pittsburgh, 4-3 in OT, two days later; the Force in Richfield, 6-5 in OT, two nights ago, Feb. 12.

NOT TOO MUCH OVERTIME THOUGH

Sudden-death tends to take its toll on the players both physically and mentally but the physical has not suffered much for the Sting in the past three matches as OT, all three, have lasted a total of only 2:20 minutes. Victory over L.A. took a total of :16 seconds (an all-time Chicago indoor record); the decision in Pittsburgh lasted 1:43 minutes of extra time (and it was a shorthanded and unassisted goal by Chico Moreira); Ben Collins took a square pass on the forehead from Karl-Heinz Granitza just :21 seconds into OT in Cleveland to end the contest. Granitza had the gamewinning assist in both the L.A. and Force games.

OVERTIME IN BALTIMORE TONIGHT TIES ANOTHER MISL ALL-TIME RECORD

Should the game tonight go into the extra time frame it will equal the League mark of four consecutive OT games played by a team in a single season. The 1983-84 Memphis Americans did it, winning three of the four, and earlier this season the Pittsburgh Spirit tied the Ams record of four consecutive OTs.

STING LOOKS FORWARD TO ALL-STAR BREAK/PLAYED FIVE GAMES IN EIGHT DAYS

Last Friday, February 7, the Sting had five games in eight days to look forward to but got off to a good start winning the weekend pair, both in sudden-death, one home and one on the road. On home turf, the Sting hosted the Los Angeles Lazers on Friday eve, February 7, and jumped to a very slow start despite the fact that the Lazers dressed only 13 players, probably an MISL record, which included three roster members signed to ten-day injury contracts. The slow start manifested itself in three-plus scoreless quarters for Chicago and a 5-0 lead for the depleted Lazers. 3:39 minutes into the final period Sting indoor history, a comeback like none before, began. Chicago scored five unanswered goals in 11:16 minutes to tie at 5-5 scoring the tying goal just :05 seconds prior to the end of regulation time. Ricardo Alonso was in as ~~the~~ sixth-attacker and put a nice ball on the foot of Karl-Heinz Granitza who located from three feet in front of the surprised L.A. goalkeeper Mike Mahoney. The five goals in that quarter was the most for Chicago in a single 15 minute segment this season. OT began but lasted just :16 seconds when defender Bret Hall converted on a low roller, in and out of the gloveless hands of Mahoney, receiving the helper from current League All-Star selection K-H Granitza. The contest was over, the crowd was dancing (many back from the parking lot where they had heard the developing onslaught on radio) and the Sting had set an all-time team record for the shortest overtime in their history, 16 clicks of the sudden-death clock.

AS IF THE COMEBACK WASN'T ENOUGH/GK NOGUEIRA SPARKS THE SQUAD SETTING A PERSONAL RECORD

The action taken by Sting goalie Victor Nogueira, who entered the game for GK Hubert Birkenmeier after 38:53 minutes and four L.A. goals, eventually won him this week's MISL Defensive Player of the Week Award. Sensing momentary bewilderment on the part of the Lazers defense and adhering to the belief that "the best defense is a good (and surprisingly explosive) offense," Nogueira, presently ranked #5 in League GK stats with a 3.86 GAA and a 9-9 record, pitched the ball out in front of himself and kept it on his own foot for the length of the field shooting point blank, from 35', at an unbelieving Mahoney. The rocket-red sphere hit the silk, Mahoney anticipating right and Nogueira firing opposite. Nogueira became the eighth MISL goalie to score in as many years and only the third to actually kick the ball past his opposing peer. Needless to say, the place went crazy.

SUDDEN-DEATH IN PITTSBURGH GOES THE WAY OF CHICAGO

Home victory over L.A. had been the Sting's first OT win in five tries this season. Sunday in Pittsburgh Chicago added another OT victory to the left side of the hyphenated and lopsided sudden-death stat record. Regulation time ended deadlocked at 3-3 and Chicago entered the extra period with a one-man disadvantage suffering a six-foul penalty :15 seconds prior to the final buzzer. After a little give and take Chicago's Pat McGauley stole the ball and passed through the legs of Pittsburgh's Godfrey Ingram to a darting Chico Moreira who pushed the ball past Spirit GK David Brcic to end the contest at 1:43 of OT on a short-handed score.

WHAT HAPPENED IN CLEVELAND/ANOTHER OVERTIME

Chicago scored first, they are 4-2 on the road when doing that, 10-3 in that situ overall, but Cleveland answered with three consecutive to end the half up 3-1. Chicago outscored the Force 4-1 in the third but Craig Allen added one for the Force in the final quarter to tie the game 5-5 and that is the way regulation time ended. Chicago outshot Cleveland, 39-27, during reg. time and out fouled them 19-16, Chicago's six fouls in the second brought two minutes, the only penalty of the contest. Cleveland converted the power-play attempt. Ben Collins scored the gamewinner at :21 seconds of OT on a helper from Granitza

FORWARD DRAGO DUMBOVIC IS HOT

Acquired from the Strikers for cash on 1/30, Drago has scored eight goals and and assist in five games for a total scoring record of 24 goals and six assists in 27 games this year. He had three gamewinners in Minnesota.

1984/85 MISL: Drago joined the Strikers midway through the season and finished sixth in scoring with 28 points in 24 games ... the speedy, dangerous forward added much needed quickness to the Strikers' front line ... possesses unmatched footwork and is capable of beating any defender at any given moment ... had the fifth most assists (17) ... shares club record assisting on goals in four consecutive games ...
