JIM FERRARO - Owner

Longtime trial lawyer Jim Ferraro purchased the Arena Football League's New Jersey franchise in 2000, and relocated the team to Las Vegas in December of 2002. Following the 2007 season, Ferraro, along with new business partner Bernie Kosar, relocated the Gladiators to Cleveland. The 2008 season marks Ferraro's eighth season in the Arena Football League.

Mr. Ferraro is President of The Ferraro Law Firm based in Miami and a founding owner of the Cleveland-based firm Kelley & Ferraro, LLP. Mr. Ferraro has fashioned his law practices in the areas of product liability, wrongful death, catastrophic personal injury and medical malpractice. He has specialized in asbestos litigation for over 15 years and currently represents more than 40,000 asbestos victims.

In 1997, Mr. Ferraro was one of ten finalists for Trial Lawyer of the Year. Mr. Ferraro invested his money and more than 10 years of his time to win the first-ever verdict in the world against a chemical company for causing a birth defect. In *Castillo v. E.I. DuPont de Nemours and Company*, the manufacturer of the fungicide Benlate, Mr. Ferraro proved that DuPont produced a chemical that caused severe microphthalmia (a defect that causes infants to be born without eyes). The 1996 trial resulted in a \$4 million verdict, was covered in its entirety on Court TV and received worldwide attention.

Mr. Ferraro has negotiated settlements totaling close to \$1 billion. Mr. Ferraro is also a Certified Public Accountant and taught Accounting at the University of Miami while in law school. He is a member of the Florida, New York, Massachusetts and Ohio Bars; American Bar Association, Florida Institute of Certified Public Accountants; Association of Trial Lawyers of America; Academy of Florida Trial Lawyers, Florida State Coordinator for Trial Lawyers for Public Justice; and the Million Dollar Advocates Forum.

A native of Greenwich, Connecticut, Mr. Ferraro graduated from the University of Miami with a Bachelor of Business Administration in 1978 and a Master of Science in Accounting in 1979. He also received his law degree from the University of Miami School of Law in 1983.

Mr. Ferraro is a member of the Order of Saint John of Jerusalem Knights of Malta. He was a recipient of the prestigious Ellis Island Medal of Honor in May 2001 in the same class as former New York City Mayor Rudy Giuliani and Yankees great Yogi Berra. Mr. Ferraro is a Trustee of the William J. Clinton Presidential Foundation and serves on the Board of Directors for the Make-A-Wish Foundation of Southern Florida.



BERNIE KOSAR - President

One of the most prolific quarterbacks in Cleveland Browns history, minority owner Bernie Kosar will lead the Gladiators in their inaugural season, serving as President and CEO. Kosar will oversee the football operations aspect of the team, as well as a variety of strategic marketing opportunities.

Born in Youngstown, Ohio, Kosar was a Parade Magazine All-American football player as a senior in 1981 at Boardman High School. Kosar continued his education and football career at the University of Miami, leading the Hurricanes to the school's first football national championship in 1983, while being named MVP

of the Orange Bowl.

Kosar enjoyed a 12-year NFL career, spending time with the Browns, Dallas Cowboys and the Miami Dolphins. After being selected by the Browns in the 1985 NFL supplemental draft, Kosar made an immediate impact with the Browns, starting in 10 games in '85 season. He guided the Browns to an 8-8 record and a playoff berth: just one season after the franchise suffered a 5-11 record.

As a full-time starter in 1986 season, Kosar established himself as one of the premier quarterbacks in the NFL. In just his second season, Kosar threw for 3,854 yards and finished second in the league with 310 completions, leading the Browns to a 12-4 record and a top seed in the AFC playoffs. Kosar threw for a playoff-record 489 yards in a 23-20 double overtime victory over the New York Jets. The Browns eventually fell to the Denver Broncos a week later in the AFC championship game.

Kosar saw his finest statistical season as a professional in 1987. That year, he completed 62 percent of his passes (241-of-389) for 3,033 yards, threw for a career-high 22 touchdowns and tallied a career-best 95.4 quarterback rating.

In 1993, Kosar signed a one-year deal with the Dallas Cowboys. He appeared in four games with the Super Bowl Champion Cowboys, completing 36-of-63 passes for 410 yards and three touchdowns. Kosar spent the final three seasons of his career with the Miami Dolphins.

For his career, Kosar threw for 23,301 yards, 124 touchdowns and finished with an 81.8 quarterback rating. In 1986 he led the NFL with a 1.9% interception ratio, establishing his hallmark for accuracy as a passer and holds the NFL record set in 1991 for the most consecutive passes without an interception at 308

Personally, Kosar serves as Honorary Chairman of the Paula and Anthony Rich Center for the Study and Treatment of Autism at Youngstown State University and he is Trustee of The Bernie J. Kosar Charitable Trust. The trust allows him to assist in research and treatment of medical problems affecting young people.

In addition to overseeing the activities of a dozen corporations representing his diversified business and charitable interests, Kosar is currently President of BJK L.L.C., a real estate investment company that purchases and develops land. In addition, he opened "Bernie Kosar's Steakhouse" in South Miami.

MIKE WILPOLT - Head Coach

Mike Wilpolt will enter his second season as the head coach of the Cleveland Gladiators in 2009. One of the premier defensive minds in the Arena Football League, was named head coach of the Las Vegas Gladiators on September 9, 2007. Wilpolt made the transition to Cleveland with the team, and led the Cleveland Gladiators in their inaugural season of AFL action in 2008.

Wilpolt guided the Gladiators to a 9-7 regular season finish and the franchise's first playoff berth since 2003 (Las Vegas Gladiators). After winning the wild card and divisional round games, the Gladiators advanced to the National Conference Championship game in Philadelphia, where they lost to the Soul. Under his tutelage, the Gladiators posted one of the finest turnarounds in AFL history.

For his efforts, Wilpolt became the first coach in franchise history to be named the AFL's Coach of the Year.

Prior to Cleveland, Wilpolt spent three seasons as the defensive coordinator with the Los Angeles Avengers. In 2007, his defense ranked fifth in the league in rushing yards allowed with 231 and tied for third with an average of two yards per carry. The defense finished 10th with 848 yards

In 2006, the Avengers finished second in the AFL in defensive scoring percentage, allowing opponents to score on just 63.6 percent on their possessions. L.A. also ranked second in interceptions (22) and quarterback sacks (23).

Prior to joining the Avengers, Wilpolt dramatically turned around the fortunes of the Indiana Firebirds. He took over as the head coach of the Firebirds in March of 2004, after the team lost its first five games under the direction of Steve DeBerg. Wilpolt responded immediately by leading Indiana to six consecutive victories and into playoff contention. The Firebirds ended the 2004 season at 8-8, giving Wilpolt an 8-3 record and establishing him as a finalist for the AFL's «Coach of the Year» award.

Before assuming the reigns in Indiana, Wilpolt was the team's defensive coordinator for the previous three seasons. He continued in that role in 2004, which was his sixth year with the Firebirds, and also coached the defensive backs.

In 1999, when the Firebird franchise was still in Albany, Wilpolt was the special teams coordinator and helped the Firebirds capture the world championship at ArenaBowl XIII. The following season, he was promoted to defensive coordinator.

Wilpolt played four years in the AFL with the Charlotte Rage (1992), Las Vegas Sting (1994-95) and Anaheim Piranhas (1996). During his stint with Anaheim, he established a since-broken league record with 16 tackles in a single game.

Wilpolt was a two-sport athlete at Mesa State College (Grand Junction, Colo.). On the gridiron, he was a three-year starter as a defensive back. Wilpolt was named to the All-Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference team two times. As a senior in 1991, he was an NAIA All-America selection and earned the school's «Scholar Athlete of the Year» award. Wilpolt originally went to Mesa State on a wrestling scholarship and was a national qualifier in both of the seasons he competed in for the Mavericks (1988-89).

After concluding his playing career in the AFL, he returned to Mesa State to begin his coaching career, tutoring the defensive backs in 1998.

A native of Broomfield, Colo., Wilpolt was born on Jan. 4, 1968. He and his wife, Deseree, Rylie.

SEASON REVIEW

The 2008 Cleveland Gladiators season was full of highs and lows and was capped by a berth in the 2008 Arena Football League postseason. Advancing to the National Conference Championship game, where they lost to the eventual Virgin Mobile ArenaBowl XXII World Champion Philadelphia Soul, the Gladiators surprised the masses. Looking back, it was definitely a season to remember.



In their season-opener versus the New York Dragons, Cleveland came out on top of a 61-49 win in front of 17,391 fans, proving arena football's worth in Cleveland. A week later, the team improved to 2-0 as they beat not only the blizzard, but the Utah Blaze, improving to 2-0, matching the win total from a year ago when the team was located in Las Vegas. A Week 3 victory over the Columbus Destroyers put the Gladiators three games over .500 and gave the city something to cheer about.

All of a sudden, three straight losses to New Orleans, Dallas and a home loss to Colorado brought the team back to reality and evened the record at .500. As the Gladiators stared at two-week road trip that covered each coast of the United States, Cleveland hung 83 points on the Los Angeles Avengers in Week 8 but lost in New York a week later.

In Week 10, the Gladiators were the first team to knock off the eventual Virgin Mobile ArenaBowl XXII World Champion Soul, with a 67-55 win at Quicken Loans Arena. A week later, Cleveland won their second-straight game, taking down the Orlando Predators. A road trip to Denver, Colorado pitted the Gladiators and Colorado Crush – where Cleveland notched its second three-game win-streak of the season. Then it was on to Tampa, Florida. A close game with some key plays led to a Storm win, snapping the Gladiators win-streak.

A home loss to the Dallas Desperados in Week 14 saw the Gladiators slip to 7-6 before hosting the Chicago Rush at The Q. Chicago's offense never found a rhythm, as Cleveland rolled to a 65-44 win. In Week 16, trailing 61-62, head coach Mike Wilpolt opted for the two-point conversion try to win the game, but Raymond Philyaw's pass intercepted, as the Gladiators fell to the host Soul.



In the season finale, the Gladiators hosted the Columbus Destroyers, where a win meant a postseason berth. With their destiny in their own hands, Cleveland took home a 47-35 win and earned the right to host the Orlando Predators in the Wild Card Round of the AFL Postseason.

Postseason

Having qualified for the postseason just five previous times in franchise history, the Gladiators hosted the Orlando Predators in the Wild Card round. The fourth-seeded Gladiators managed to squeak out a 69-66 win and travelled on to face the Georgia Force in Duluth, GA. With a right to play for the National Conference Championship at stake, the Gladiators won another close game, this time taking home a 73-70 win over the Force, advancing to play the Soul just five days later. The Gladiators dream season came to an end in Philadelphia, as the home team slowed the Gladiators offense, and defeated Cleveland, 70-35. Cleveland finished 2008 with an overall record of 11-8 (9-7 regular season and 2-1 postseason).

OH WHAT A START

In front of over 17,391 fans in their Inaugural Game, the Gladiators wasted no time in giving their fans something to cheer about. On the team's first-ever play from scrimmage, QB Raymond Philyaw hit WR Andy McCullough for a 37 yard touchdown pass. It seems fitting that two of the players on the Gladiators with the most AFL experience (eight years for Philyaw and six for McCullough) would lead the team to its first touchdown. For McCullough, it marks the fifth different AFL franchise that he has caught a touchdown for, while Philyaw has thrown touchdowns for four different franchises. Philyaw finished the game with five touchdown passes, including two to WR Otis Amey and one each to McCullough, WR Robert Redd and FB/LB Marlion Jackson.

SET THE RECORD STRAIGHT

With the Inaugural Game complete, the Gladiators history books have now been started. Here is a look at some of the "firsts" in Gladiators history.

ROAD WARRIORS

In their inaugural season, the Gladiators travelled the country from coast to coast. Over the course of the season, the team will covered over 8,000 miles. With the exception of their game at Columbus on March 15 (142 miles), the next closest destination was 431 miles away in Philadelphia on June 14. The rest of the grueling road schedule included the March 21 contest at New Orleans (1,052 miles), April 5 at Dallas (1,183 miles), May 17 at Colorado (1,332 miles), and May 23 at Tampa Bay (1,096 miles). The longest trip of the year was when the Gladiators travel 2,347 miles to Los Angeles to take on the Avengers on April 19. With the following game 462 miles away at New York on April 26, the Gladiators will have traveled over 2,800 miles in one week, which was their longest back-to-back stretch of the season.

NO SOPHOMORE SLUMP



With a knack for getting off of blocks and into opponents backfields, Karon Riley was one of three players the Gladiators chose to keep in their move from Las Vegas to Cleveland. The second-year linebacker from Minnesota, and former fourth round draft pick of the Chicago Bears, is now having a standout season for the team and his skills were on full display in the Gladiators Week 13 contest against Tampa Bay. Riley finished the game with a career-high four tackles, including one for a loss. Closing out the regular season, Riley totaled 42.5 tackles, 8.0 tackles for loss, and 5.5 sacks on the year, leaving him second on the team behind Joe Minucci in both TFLs and sacks. Last season in Las Vegas, Riley finished the year with 22 tackles, two sacks and two TFLs. While he has already tripled his number of tackles for loss, Riley is also on pace to double the total number of tackles he put up in his rookie year with the Gladiators. In addition, Riley caught his first touchdown pass this season in the finale over the Destroyers.

REWARDED

Each week, the Arena Football League rewards individual performances with the Offensive Player of the Week, ADT Defensive Player of the Week and Ironman of the Week awards. These awards are based on individual statistics. DB Brandon Hefflin took home Defensive Player of the Week honors for his Wild Card Round performance on the defensive side of the ball, recording two interceptions and a key fumble recovery in the fourth quarter, leading to the Gladiators game-winning touchdown. Gladiators WR Otis Amey was named AFL Offensive Player of the Week for his Week 8 performance versus the Los Angeles Avengers. In that game, Amey set record-highs with 15 catches and 208 yards receiving. On top of that, he tied his career-best with six touchdowns - a record he set just a week earlier versus Colorado. Gladiators WR/DB Robert Redd put on quite a performance in the team's victory over Utah on March 9. The third-year man out of Bowling Green led all Gladiators receivers with 105 yards and three touchdowns on seven catches, including an impressive 34 yard touchdown reception. Redd also made 3.5 tackles on defense and made a momentum-swinging fumble recovery in the second quarter, making him the clear choice as the Gladiators Ironman of the Game. To add to his resume, Redd was named Ironman of the Week by the Arena Football League office. In the Divisional Round of the playoffs, FB/LB Joshua Rue was named Ironman of the Week for the Gladiators 73-70 win over the Force.

ON TOP OF HIS GAME

With his seven catch, 109 yard and four touchdown performance on May 2 against the Philadelphia Soul, Gladiators Otis Amey completed one of the best four game stretches in the franchise history. In the Gladiators four games between April 11 and May 2, Amey hauled in 35 receptions, 473 yards and 17 touchdowns. This includes back-to-back six touchdown games against Colorado and Los Angeles in Weeks 7 and 8. Perhaps even more impressive about those numbers is the fact that Amey had only four catches for 38 yards and one score at New York on April 26. Former Gladiators receiver and current Dallas Desperado Marcus Nash is the last Gladiator to put together such an impressive run. In 2005, Nash was unstoppable, going for 60 catches, 648 yards and 20 touchdowns in a four game stretch from March 12 through April 3. After tying Nash with his four touchdown grabs on June 14 at Philadelphia, Amey passed him with two more touchdown receptions in the regular season finale against Columbus on June 21.

RETURN TO GLORY

While the Gladiators put together a strong all-around team performance in their win over Chicago on June 7, it was two return touchdowns that marked the turning point of the game. The first came near the end of the first quarter, when WR Otis Amey returned a missed Paul Edinger field goal attempt and outran the entire Rush team down the sideline for a 50-yard touchdown. Not only was it the first missed field goal return touchdown in Amey's career, but it was also the first in the 12-year history of the franchise. On their very next offensive possession Chicago took seven plays to drive to the Gladiators 11-yardline, but had their scoring hopes dashed when DB Brandon Hefflin stepped in front of a Russ Michna pass and returned it 45 yards for a score. For Hefflin, it was the second interception he's taken all the way back in his career, but first since his rookie year in 2005. It marked the third time this season that a Gladiators defender has taken an interception back for a touchdown (Robert Redd and Sakeen Wright), and in both of those previous contests the Gladiators won as well.

CLIMBING THE LADDER

With his six catches in Week 15, WR Otis Amey joined WR Robert Redd as the first teammate duo to catch 100 passes in the same year in franchise history. In just their first season with the Gladiators, both men already rank in the top ten in career receiving yards in Gladiators history too. While Amey has surpassed the numbers he put up in his rookie campaign with Austin last year (88 receptions, 1,036 yards), Redd has bested the number of receptions (106) and yards (1,021) from his previous two years in the league combined. A LEG UP

The Gladiators boast one of the top offenses in the league, finishing up the regular season scoring 56.3 points per game. While most of the accolades have gone to QB Raymond Philyaw, FB Marlion Jackson, and WR "Otis" Amey, it seems that kicker Jason Ball's 147 points have gone unnoticed. Ball ranked third on the Gladiators with his point total, and third in the league in scoring for kickers. Ball also surpassed his career high for points in a season (141) that he set last year with Colorado. In addition, his 16 field goals were good for second-most in the AFL behind San Jose's A.J. Haglund. Ball made 99 extra points this year, breaking the franchise record of 92, set by Steve Videtich in 2003.

JACK OF ALL TRADES

Already known as one of the Gladiators top Ironmen, WR/DB Robert Redd proved there's even more to his game in the Gladiators win over Orlando on May 9. While Redd caught nine passes for 126 yards and three touchdowns in being named Offensive Player of the Game, he also threw a six-yard touchdown pass to QB Raymond Philyaw in the Week 11 contest. It was the second touchdown pass Redd has thrown in his three years in the league, and first since 2004 while with Colorado. Redd hit another career milestone in the May 9 win, going over 1,000 receiving yards in a season for the first time in his career. Prior to this season, Redd had recorded 1,021 yards receiving in his other two years combined. In addition to his outstanding offensive numbers, Redd has amassed 417 kick return yards, 14.0 tackles, an interception (which he returned 50 yards for a touchdown in Week 1 against New York), and leads the team with five fumble recoveries. Two of those recoveries came via net recoveries on kickoffs, which means Redd has now scored four different ways for the Gladiators this season.

RUNNING DOWN HISTORY

In Marlion Jackson's previous four years in the league, he totaled 391 rushing yards, with a single-season high of 192 in 2005. This year, Jackson has become only the 10th player in AFL history to reach the 300-yard mark in a season. The last player to accomplish this feat was Adrian McPherson, who gained 358 yards while splitting time with Grand Rapids and Austin last season. Not only did Jackson have one of the top rushing yardage seasons of all-time, but he also became just the ninth player in league history to run for more than 20 touchdowns in a season following Week 14. Here's a look at where Jackson's season falls amongst the top rushing seasons in AFL history.

JACKSON FIVE

Apparently leading the AFL in rushing wasn't enough for Gladiators FB Marlion Jackson, as he had perhaps his biggest impact in the team's 83-69 win over Los Angeles through the air. On the Gladiators first two possessions of the game, Jackson caught dump passes from Raymond Philyaw and raced untouched to the end zone for touchdowns. The first score covered 26 yards, while the second went for 39, tying the longest reception of Jackson's career. It marked the third time in his five AFL seasons that Jackson has caught two touchdown passes in a game. The fifth-year man out of Saginaw Valley did his usual ground damage as well, scoring on three separate one-yard runs. The three rushing touchdowns, a new career-high for Jackson, could have been four, but a questionable holding penalty called back a 45-yard run in the second quarter. The five total touchdowns were a new career-high for Jackson, and it was a first time he has scored more than two touchdowns in a game since 2004 when he was with the Philadelphia Soul.



JACKSON PT. 2

Once the Gladiators franchise knew they were coming to Cleveland at the end of 2007, they had to decide which players they wanted to keep from Las Vegas. One of those was FB Marlion Jackson, who has proven to be one of the most consistent rushers in the AFL over the past four years, averaging over three yards per carry during his career. Entering the playoffs, Jackson is in the midst of the best season of his career. He led the AFL in rushing yards and touchdowns.

FRANCHISE RECORDS

The fact that the Gladiators put an abrupt ending to Philadelphia's hope at a perfect season had to have been satisfying in itself for Marlion Jackson. Perhaps it was personal for the Gladiators FB, who was let go by the Soul early in his second season with the team in 2005. Jackson rumbled over and around his former team, carrying the ball eleven times for 49 yards and four touchdowns. The eleven carries and four scores were both career highs for Jackson. In the process, Jackson topped the 200-yard mark in a season for the first time in his career. His previous high for a season was 192 yards, which he did in 2005 while splitting time with the Soul and the Las Vegas Gladiators. The four rushing touchdowns topped the three Jackson ran for against the Los Angeles Avengers in Week 8 of this year. Through May 2, Jackson had 16 rushing touchdowns, which doubled the eight he had rushed for in his entire career prior to this season.

HIT KINGS

Part of the reason for the Gladiators failures in Vegas was due to a lack of intensity on the defensive side of the ball. That team had only two players with more than 45 tackles, and only one with more than 60 stops. Veteran DB Brandon Hefflin has gotten most of the credit, and rightfully so, with a franchise record 110.0 tackles and sixth in the league. However, it's was the hard-hitting style of two AFL rookies, DBs Alex Teems and Alphonso Hodge, that has helped give the Gladiators secondary a reputation for being one of the best tackling units in the league. Hodge, a former fifth-round draft pick of the Kansas City Chiefs, signed with the Gladiators midway through the season and made an immediate impact, registering 12 tackles and five pass breakups against Los Angeles in his debut on April 17. Despite missing the team's first six games, he finished third on the team with 60 tackles and second in pass breakups with eight. Teems came to the Gladiators after spending last year with the Spokane Shock of the af2, where he led the team with 98 tackles. He has continued his strong play this season, currently ranking second on the Gladiators with 82.5 tackles. Teems also recorded the first interception of his AFL career in Week 14 versus Dallas.

STILL STANDING

RUE-D AWAKENING

In preparation for their Week 15 game against the Gladiators, it can be assured that the Rush were prepared for a heavy dose of league-leading rusher Marlion Jackson. While Jackson did have a solid night against Chicago (29 yards on 12 carries), it was second-year FB/LB Josh Rue that provided a spark for the Gladiators in their victory. Rue, who was on injured reserve for the first six games of the season, broke through the line of scrimmage and plowed through the second line of defenders on a 28-yard run on his first carry of the game. He would add another yard to finish with a career-high 29 yards on three carries. The 28-yard run also bested his previous long run of 16 yards that he had in his rookie season last year with Las Vegas. Along with Jackson and LB Karon Riley, Rue was one of only three players to make the move to Cleveland from Las Vegas with the team. In addition to his increasing offensive role, Rue has also registered 9.5 tackles this season, mainly on special teams.

EVERYBODY LOVES RAYMOND

Raymond Philyaw was the artist behind the Gladiators offensive masterpiece in Los Angeles in Week 8, combining timely decision making with perfect touch passes in finishing the game 30-of-39 for 411 yards and nine touchdowns. The 411 yards tied for his career-high, and marks the fourth time in his nine-year career that he has gone over 400 yards in a game. Philyaw has thrown for 1,048 yards the past three weeks, good for a 349.3 yards per game average. It marks the first time his career that he has thrown for 300-plus yards in three consecutive games. The nine touchdown passes also left him just one short of his career-high in that category, while tying him for the highest individual single-game total in the league this year. Philyaw threw four touchdowns in both the first and fourth quarters, with his other coming in the second.

ALL CAUGHT UP

While Raymond Philyaw has spent his entire career throwing touchdown passes to 47 players with four different franchises, having never caught a touchdown pass himself in 96 games. That all changed in Week 11, when Philyaw caught his first career touchdown on a six-yard pass from WR Robert Redd in the Gladiators victory over Orlando. Fullback Marlion Jackson lined up as quarterback in the shotgun and tossed the ball to a reversing Redd, who hit Philyaw in the back left corner of the end zone for the score. It was the third catch of Philyaw's career, and coincidentally each one has been for six yards. In each of those three games, Philyaw's team has come out with the win.

YARDS 'R' US

Raymond Philyaw got off to a slow start in the Wild Card Round of the 2008 playoffs - a cold start that heated up fast. With eight minutes left in the third quarter, Philyaw had already thrown for over 300 yards and climbing. He finished the game with a grand total of 436 passing yards on 29-of-48 attempts and eight touchdowns. His 436 yards are the second-most in AFL Postseason history, second only to former New Jersey Red Dogs quarterback Rickey Foggie. Foggie tossed 446 yards at Albany on August 8, 1998. With that being said, Philyaw's fine performance ranks second all-time in franchise history behind Foggie. Unfortunately for Raymond, Foggie playing for the Red Dogs set a majority of the "Gladiators" franchise records while playing with the Red Dogs.

POSTSEASON SUCCESS

With their win over the Orlando Predators in the Wild Card game on June 30, the Gladiators won the first Wild Card game in franchise history. Previously, the Gladiators had played in one Wild Card game in 2003 when the franchise was in Las Vegas. They lost that game to the Arizona Rattlers 69-26. HIGH SCORING AFFAIR

A week removed from a 69-point output versus the Orlando Predators in the Wild Card round, the Gladiators posted 73 points on the Georgia Force, advancing them to the National Conference Championship game versus Philadelphia Soul. The Gladiators set a record with the 69 points and broke it a week later. In their eight total postseason games, the Gladiators have scored over 60 points in three, winning each of them.

ACCORDING TO JIM

Gladiators Owner Jim Ferraro named Mike Wilpolt head coach on September 9, 2007, just one month before he moved the franchise to Cleveland. Wilpolt guided the Gladiators to a 9-7 regular season record and earned a wild card berth in the AFL playoffs in just their first season. Two wins later, the Gladiators find themselves playing for the National Conference Championship and the right to represent the National Conference in Virgin Mobile ArenaBowl XXII New Orleans. Led by Raymond Philyaw, the Gladiators became the fourth team in AFL history to advance to an AFL conference championship game/semifinal after posting the League's worst record the year before. Of the four, Cleveland would become the third team to advance to the ArenaBowl with a win. No team in AFL history has won an ArenaBowl after posting the League's worst record the year before.

REDD-Y OR NOT

Robert Redd had a playoff game to remember on June 30 versus Orlando. The Bowling Green State University product caught 14 passes for 204 yards and four touchdowns. His 14 catches tied for second all-time in franchise postseason history, while his 204 yards and four touchdowns each set franchise postseason records. He shattered the previous record for receiving yards in a game by 27 (previously 177 by Larry Willis in 1998). His four touchdowns receiving also set a franchise postseason mark, topping Willis' three scores on August 8, 1998.

RETURN TO SENDER

With his 34 kickoff return yards in the 73-70 win over the Georgia Force, WR/LB Willis Marshall moved into fifth place all time in AFL postseason history with 646 return yards. Marshall has some work to do to move into fourth place, as former Detroit and Nashville return-man Ron Carpenter finished his career with 828 yards.

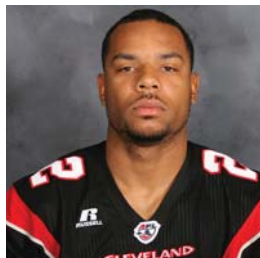

In his first season with the Gladiators, Philyaw started in all 16 regular season games and each of the three playoff games. During the regular season, completed 358-of-525 passes for 4,287 yards and 83 touchdowns. He was intercepted just 10 times. One of the most prolific quarterbacks in AFL history, Philyaw moved into 10th place all-time in the regular season with 3,179 career passing attempts, 9th place all-time in the regular season with 2,083 career passing completions, 9th place all-time in the regular season with 24,865 career passing yards and 9th place all-time in the regular season with 464 career touchdown passes. His 124.5 passer rating in 2008 was second in the league amongst quarterbacks with at least 300 pass attempts. Threw for 411 yards in Week 8 at Los Angeles, tying his career high. Broke that mark in the Wild Card round of the playoffs, throwing for 436 yards in the win over Orlando. His 436 yards were second-most in AFL postseason history, second only to former New Jersey Red Dog QB Ricky Foggie's 446 in 1998. Finished the regular season with 238 straight passing attempts without throwing an interception. In the Week 11 win over the Orlando Predators, Philyaw caught his third career touchdown pass on

the Gladiators opening drive.

CLEVELAND - In front of 17,391 screaming Clevelanders, the Gladiators opened their inaugural season in grand fashion, defeating the New York Dragons, 61-49 on Monday night. The Gladiators begin the 2008 regular season 1-0, while the Dragons slip to 0-1. Raymond Philyaw earned offensive player of the game honors for his five touchdown performance. Philyaw completed 18-of-23 attempts for 240 yards and the five passing touchdowns, including a 37-yard touchdown strike on the first play from scrimmage to Andy McCullough. The Gladiators led 7-0 after just 25 seconds into the game. Otis Amey was the beneficiary of two Philyaw touchdown passes while he also added one score on the ground. Amey led all Gladiators receivers with 101 yards and two scores. Ironman recipient Marlon Jackson carried the ball seven times for a game-high 62 yards and one score. His lone rushing touchdown was the result of a 32-yard scamper in the third quarter. Dragons quarterback Aaron Garcia left the game early in the second quarter and did not return. His replacement, Rohan Davey stepped in and completed 21-of-30 passes for 249 yards and five scores. He faced pressure from the Cleveland front three all night, and was taken to the ground on four separate occasions. Kevin Swayne paced the Dragons receiving corps with a game-high 10 catches for 130 yards and three touchdowns.

CLEVELAND - On a cold Cleveland winter afternoon, the Cleveland Gladiators hosted the Utah Blaze, defeating the visitors 66-63 in front of 14,765 fans at Quicken Loans Arena. The Gladiators improve to 2-0 while the Blaze remains winless on the young 2008 season. Gladiators quarterback Raymond Philyaw completed 24-of-38 passes for 297 yards, six touchdowns and no interceptions in his second straight Offensive Player of the Game effort. Philyaw connected with five different receivers on the afternoon, finding Robert Redd seven times for team-high 105 yards and three touchdowns. Otis Amey added two receiving touchdowns in the win. Blaze quarterback and former Ohio State Buckeye Joe Germaine completed 29-of-38 passes for a game-high 374 yards and eight touchdowns. He was intercepted twice. Sakeen Wright recorded one of those picks, returning Germaine's pass for a touchdown. Germaine hooked up with three receivers on the day, each recording over 100 yards. J.J. McKelvey led all receivers with 11 catches for a game-high 131 yards and three touchdowns. Aaron Boone grabbed 10 passes for 127 yards and two scores while Huey Whittaker contributed eight receptions for 116 yards and three scores. Redd was named Ironman of the Game for his offensive output, as well as his 3.5 tackles and one recovered fumble on defense. Wright garnered Defensive Player of the Game honors for his 3.5 tackles and interception return for a touchdown.

The Gladiators improve to 3-0 while the Destroyers fall to 0-3 on the season. Raymond Philyaw found Robert Redd on a 17-yard touchdown strike late in the game, giving the Gladiators a 59-51 lead. After Destroyers signal-caller Matt Nagy connected with Derek Lee on a 33-yard score, Columbus failed on the two-point conversion and the Destroyers trailed 59-57. The Gladiators recovered the Mark Lewis onside kick attempt with 20 seconds left in the game, preserving the victory. Philyaw finished 19-of-28 for 209 yards and five touchdowns in the win. Redd followed up his spectacular performance from a week ago, leading the Gladiators receiving corps with seven catches for 74 yards and two touchdowns. Otis Amey notched six receptions for 71 yards and three touchdown receptions. Marlon Jackson carried the ball eight times for 47 yards and two touchdowns. He also added one catch for 18 yards. Amey recorded a season-best 238 all-purpose yards with 71 receiving and 167 kick return yards. Nagy finished 24-of-35 for a game-high 351 yards and seven touchdowns for the Destroyers. His favorite target was James Jordan, who led the VooDoo receivers with 11 catches for a team-high 113 yards. DALLAS – The Dallas Desperados recovered a Jason Ball onside kick attempt with 1.8 seconds remaining, sealing the 58-51 victory over Cleveland on Saturday night in front of 11,497 at the American Airlines Center. Dallas remains a perfect 6-0 on the season while the Gladiators dropped their second straight game, slipping to 3-2. Clint Dolezel returned to the Desperados' lineup after being activated from the Injured Reserve list on Friday afternoon. After suffering a Week 1 shoulder injury, he missed the next four games before lining up under center against the Gladiators on Saturday night. Dolezel, the AFL's all-time leading touchdown passer, added five more to his career total (877), finding Marcus Nash for all five touchdowns. He finished the game 18-of-27 passing for 220 yards and the five scores and also added one rushing touchdown. Nash totaled eight catches for a team-high 118 yards. Raymond Philyaw, who was injured in the Week 4 loss to the New Orleans VooDoo, returned to action for the Gladiators. He set season-highs with his 25-of-49 passing for a season-high 321 yards and five touchdowns. The 321 yards passing are a single-game high for the Gladiators in 2008. Robert Redd led all receivers with 10 catches and a game-high 125 yards in the loss. Philyaw, who entered the game having thrown touchdown passes to 42 different receivers in his eight-plus seasons, added two more names to his list. Defensive end Joe Minucci and nose-guard Ramon Richardson each caught touchdown passes, bringing Philyaw's career number to 44. Newly signed wide receiver and former Desperado Willis Marshall was impressive in his Gladiators debut, totaling 117 yards on eight catches and 83 kickoff return yards. His 200 all-purpose yards marks the second time a Gladiator player has recorded 200 or more in a game this season.

CLEVELAND – The Cleveland Gladiators did what no other team has been able to do in 2008, defeating the Philadelphia Soul 67-55 in front of 13,721 fans at Quicken Loans Arena on Friday night. The Gladiators improve to 5-4 while the Soul slips to 9-1. No teams remain unbeaten. The Arena Football League's top rusher Marlon Jackson carried the ball 11 times for 41 yards and four touchdowns in the victory. His four rushing touchdowns set a single-game career high. Raymond Philyaw found Otis Amey with 42 seconds left in the game on a 23-yard touchdown pass, sealing the Gladiators victory. Graziani, despite being intercepted on his first attempt from scrimmage, finished 15-of-23 for 150 yards and three scores. Larry Brackins led all receivers with 14 catches and 146 yards. Chris Jackson became just the third player in AFL history to total over 300 receiving touchdowns following his second quarter touchdown. Jackson hauled in eight passes for 65 yards and three scores. Jackson earned Offensive Player of the Game honors, while Sakeen Wright nabbed ADT Defensive Player of the Game. Marshall's return yards plus 68 yards receiving earned him Ironman of the Game.

Toliver grabbed 185 yards on 11 catches and four touchdowns and added one kickoff return for a touchdown. Philyaw and Redd were named Co-Offensive Players of the Game for their performances, respectively. Brandon Hefflin intercepted two of Stafford's passes and recovered a key fumble late in the game, leading to a Gladiators score and a 69-60 lead. He was named Defensive Player of the Game for his efforts. Willis Marshall helped out on all sides for Cleveland, garnering Ironman of the Game honors.

July 7, 2008 - With a 73-70 win over the Georgia Force, the Gladiators earn a right to play in the AFL's National Conference Championship game at Philadelphia.

June 30, 2008 - Cleveland defeats the #5 Orlando Predators in front of 13,896 fans at Quicken Loans Arena in the Wild Card round.

June 21, 2008 - Having defeated the Columbus Destroyers, the Cleveland Gladiators qualified for the AFL playoffs for the first time since 2003.

May 2, 2008 - The Gladiators snapped the nine-game win streak of the Philadelphia Soul with a 67-55 win at Quicken Loans Arena. Philadelphia was the only remaining undefeated until playing the Gladiators.

March 3, 2008 - The Cleveland Gladiators defeated the New York Dragons 61-49 at Quicken Loans Arena in front of 17,391 for the first win in Cleveland Gladiators history.

February 5, 2008 - The Cleveland Gladiators open their inaugural training camp.

January 11, 2008 - The Cleveland Gladiators announce that ESPN 850 WKNR will be the official flagship station for the 2008 season.

December 7, 2007 - The Cleveland Gladiators move into their permanent home at 631 Huron Rd., Cleveland Ohio, 44115.

November 28, 2007 - At the Crown Centre Building in Independence, Ohio, Cleveland AFL owner Jim Ferraro and Bernie Kosar announce the "CLEVELAND GLADIATORS" will be Cleveland's newest professional sports franchise. The official colors of the Cleveland Gladiators will be red, black and silver. The Gladiators also name Mike Levy as General Manger & COO.

October 29, 2007 - Wilpolt makes a statement in AFL Free Agency, signing three of the league's top free agents. These include: QB Raymond Philyaw, DL Silas Demary and DB Brandon Hefflin.

October 26, 2007 - With the AFL's Austin Wranglers and Nashville Kats folding, Cleveland AFL acquired six players in the dispersal draft. Highlighting the day was the number one overall selection of DL Joe Minucci.

October 16, 2007 - Jim Ferraro, along with new business partner and team President & CEO Bernie Kosar announce the move to Cleveland at a press conference held at Quicken Loans Arena in Cleveland. Season Ticket deposits are accepted.

October 2007 - Jim Ferraro receives approval from the AFL Board of Directors to relocate the Las Vegas Gladiators to Cleveland, Ohio. The Cleveland AFL team will begin play starting in 2008 at Quicken Loans Arena.

BEFORE CLEVELAND

Jim Ferraro completed his purchase of the Arena Football League's New Jersey Franchise in 2000 - which was set to begin play in 2001. After naming the team the New Jersey Gladiators, the franchise played two seasons in New Jersey, compiling an 11-18 record in those two seasons. Just over two years after Mr. Ferraro took over control of the team, it was announced he would relocate the franchise to Las Vegas, Nevada and play their home games at the Thomas & Mack Center. The team remained in Las Vegas over the next five seasons, compiling an overall record of 31-50. The team played the 2007 season at the Orleans Arena, finishing with a 2-14 record. Before Mr. Ferraro took over, the franchise played in New Jersey from 1997 (New Jersey Red Dogs) until 2000, compiling a 27-29 record in four seasons. They qualified for the postseason in 1997 and 1998.
