

LYNN SWANN

OWNER



Lynn Swann was born in Alcoa, TN, to Willie and Mildred Swann. At the age of two, Lynn and his family moved to California.

Lynn starred in football at the University of Southern California, playing for the legendary John McKay and was an All-American for the Trojans, including the 1972 undefeated and National Champion squad. Lynn also earned his degree in Public Relations from USC's renowned School of Journalism and was inducted into the College Football Hall of Fame in 1993.

Lynn was drafted with the 21st pick in the first round of the 1974 NFL draft by the Pittsburgh Steelers, remaining with the team for his entire eight year NFL career. The Steelers draft class of '74 is considered one of the best in NFL history and included 4 eventual Hall of Famers: Swann, John Stallworth, Mike Webster, and Jack Lambert. As a rookie, he led the NFL with 577 punt return yards, a franchise record and the fourth most in NFL history at the time. He went on to be a cornerstone of the Steelers' dynasty, winning four Super Bowls and making the Pro Bowl three times (1975, 1977 & 1978). Lynn retired after the 1982 season and his outstanding achievements led to his induction into the NFL Hall of Fame in 2001.

Even during his playing days with the Steelers, Lynn began a successful broadcasting career with ABC Sports and stayed with the network through 2006.

Lynn currently sits on the board of directors of H.J. Heinz Company, Hershey Entertainment and Resorts, Harrah's Entertainment, Empower Software, and Transdel Pharmaceuticals. He is also the Managing Director of Diamond Edge Capital Partners, a financial marketing firm.

Since 1980, Swann has been a National Spokesman for Big Brothers Big Sisters of America. He now serves on their National Board of Directors and was President of the National Board from 1993 to 1995. He has travelled across the country, visited with the U.S. Congress, and has appeared at The White House on behalf of the nation's premiere one-to-one mentoring organization.

It is his community leadership, along with other qualities, that led President George W. Bush to ask Swann to serve as the Chairman of the President's Council on Physical Fitness and Sports from 2002-05.

In 2006, Swann ran for the Governor of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. He did not win the contest, but ran an extremely strong and popular campaign.

PRESIDENT



Peter Hill is the President of the Pittsburgh Power and played an integral role in bringing the team to Pittsburgh. Since the team's inaugural year in 2010, Peter has overseen ticket sales, marketing, brand development, and worked to develop the team's corporate partnerships. Peter is also the President for Shaner Investments L.P., a hotel and real-estate development company.

Peter is a decorated Veteran of both Operation Iraqi Freedom and Operation Enduring Freedom As a Non-Commissioned Officer of the United States Marine Corps, he was in charge of the personnel department for Marine Aircraft Group 16's Operations Center during the two tours in Iraq. During his second tour in Iraq, Peter was selected as a Security Liaison for the Department of Defense and was awarded the Joint Service Commendation Medal.

After receiving an honorable discharge from the United States Marine Corps in December of 2004, Peter owned and operated Diversified Media Inc., a book distribution company that serviced private and public libraries throughout the Eastern United States.

Rob oversees all aspects of the Power's marketing, promotions, sponsorships, sales and media relations efforts. Prior to joining the Power in September, 2012, Rob spent 6 ½ years as the Asst. General Manager/Director of Marketing of Pittsburgh's CONSOL Energy Center and Mellon Arena.

A native of the Philadelphia, PA area, Rob received both his Bachelors and Masters degrees from Temple University. PITTSBURGH POWER COACHING STAFF

DEREK STINGLEY

HEAD COACH



This season will be Derek Stingley's first full season as the Head Coach of the Pittsburgh Power. Derek joined the Power in 2012 as the Defensive Coordinator in the team's second season. In week 11, Stingley was promoted to Interim Head Coach, taking over a 2-8 team. Prior to the conclusion of the season, the Power named him Head Coach for 2013.

Derek's AFL coaching career began in the AF2 league in 2005 as the defensive coordinator for the Macon Knights. The Knights promoted Stingley to head coach that May, and he turned the season around for the slow-starting squad, eventually leading his team to the playoffs. During his two-year tenure with the Knights, Derek had a total of 18 players named to the All-AF2 team. His success was noticed throughout the AF2 ranks, and it didn't take long for the AF2's South Georgia Wildcats to recruit coach Stingley. In three years with the Wildcats, Stingley posted a 30-13 record and was named "AF2 Head Coach of the Year" in 2008. In 2009, Derek moved up to the AFL, serving as the defensive coordinator for New Orleans VooDoo, before eventually being named Head Coach . The Voodoo struggled in his inaugural year, but under Stingley's tutelage, wide receiver/kick returner and current Power standout PJ Berry was named JLS Ironman of the Year after setting an AFL record in all purpose yards.

A heralded two-sport athlete, Stingley first chose a different career path: baseball. Stingley was an outstanding centerfielder and played collegiately at Purdue University. Derek was drafted by the Philadelphia Phillies in 1993, and spent three seasons in the club's minor league system before following his true passion for football. Stingley has nine years of playing experience in the Arena Football League, starting with the Albany Firebirds in 1996. After four years and one Championship with the Firebirds, Stingley's was selected to the AFL First Team at defensive back, and the AFL 15-year Anniversary Team. After spending time on the New York Jets roster, Stingley then went to play for the Chicago Rush, Arizona Rattlers, Carolina Cobras and the Dallas Desperados.

MIKE TOMCZAK

OFFENSIVE COORDINATOR



Now in his first full season as Offensive Coordinator of the Power, Mike was named to the position late last season when Derek Stingley was promoted to the head coaching position. Mike brings 16 seasons of National Football League experience as quarterback for the Chicago Bears, Green Bay Packers, Cleveland Browns, and Pittsburgh Steelers. Before his NFL career, Tomzcak played collegiately at Ohio State University, leading the team to two Big Ten championships.

Tomczak was and undrafted free agent with the Bears, and won a ring in Super Bowl XX in 1986 against the Patriots. Tomczak started 31 games and threw for 31 touchdowns with Chicago. He spent the next two seasons with the Packers and the Browns. The Steelers then signed Tomczak and he spent seven seasons in Pittsburgh. Mike was a member of the 1996 Steelers Super Bowl Team. He signed with the Lions for the 2000 season, but suffered a broken right tibia in an exhibition game and was out for the entire year, ultimately forcing Tomczak to retire from the NFL.

Tomczak won his first 10 starts at quarterback with Chicago, which set an NFL record. He started 78 NFL games, appeared in 112, and completed $53.4\,\%$ of his passes for 88 touchdowns.

In 2009, Tomczak was a Offensive Assistant at Ohio Dominican University. He is the Proud Father of two children, daughter Bryn and son Beau.

PITTSBURGH POWER COACHING STAFF

BRIAN BASILE

LINEBACKERS COACH



Brian Basile has served as the Linebackers Coach for the Pittsburgh Power since the team's inaugural season in 2011. He returns for his third year with the Power, assisting with both the linebackers and the defensive lines.

Brian is also entering his sixth season as a member of the Frostburg State (MD) football staff. In his first three years coaching the defensive backs, Frostburg posted 32 interceptions and 90 pass breakups.

Prior to Frostburg State, Brian gained over three decades of coaching experience at a number of Pennsylvania high schools, including stints at Central Cambria in Ebensburg (1981-86), Johnstown (1987-92), Richland in Johnstown (2002), and Conernaugh Township in Davidsville (2003-07).

Brian's Arena Football coaching experience also includes serving as Head Coach of the Johnstown Riverhawks of the AFL in 2005 and 2006, doubling as their General Manager during the 2006 season. He also has experience in the Indoor Football League as the Defensive/Recruiting Coordinator for the Johnstown Jackals in 2000 and in 2001 as the Defensive Coordinator for the Johnstown J-Dogs.

Brian was a defensive back for Indiana (PA) and graduated in 1981. He currently resides in Elton, PA, with his wife Carrie and his two daughters, Bella (age 2) and Brianna, a sophomore at Pitt-Johnstown.

JOHN SIKORA

LINE COACH



John Sikora returns to the Power as Line Coach for a third year and will to continue to build on his already impressive offensive and defensive lines.

John began his professional career in the AFL playing for the Albany Firebirds. With the Firebirds, he was a member of their 1999 Arena Bowl Championship team. Sikora played "ironman" football in Albany, starting on both the offensive and defensive lines and also served as the teams long-snapper. After leaving Albany, John went to Chicago for three years anchoring the offensive line for the Rush. He was also named the team's lineman of the year in 2006 and set personal records on both the offense and defense.

John played collegiately at Slippery Rock University, setting records and earning accolades as a four-year started on both the football and lacrosse teams. He was a two-time All-American selection for the Pride and was named First Team All-Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference for two years in a row.

John also coaches football at Central Cambria High School and is married to wife, Stephanie. The couple has three children, Jaylee, Jewel, and Jemma.

PITTSBURGH POWER HISTORY

Pittsburgh's Prior AFL History

Prior to the announcement of Pittsburgh's 2011 expansion team, the city was the home to the Pittsburgh Gladiators, one of the four original franchises of the Arena Football League in 1987. The AFL's very first league game (not counting the practice games held at Rockford MetroCenter and the Rosemont Horizon), was held at the Pittsburgh Civic Arena between the Gladiators and the Washington Commandos.

That same year the Gladiators went on to lose ArenaBowl to the Denver Dynamite, 45-16, at the Civic Arena. Two years later the squad made it to ArenaBowl III, held at Joe Louis Arena. The Gladiators lost to the Detroit Drive 39-26.

In 1990, was the Gladiators' fourth and last in Pittsburgh. Following the conclusion of the season Co-Owner Bob Greis re-located the franchise to Tampa, Florida. The team was re-named the Tampa Bay Storm. Greis, who had several business interests in Florida, sold the franchise a few years later. During the Storms' first year in Tampa, the team defeated the Detroit Drive, 48–42, to win ArenaBowl V. The Storm has remained in Tampa and has reached the playoffs in 15 seasons, winning four AFL titles.

In 2011, Jerry Kurz, the Commissioner of the AFL, stated to the Pittsburgh Tribune-Review that the Gladiators move to Tampa had nothing to do with the attendance for the games. The issues that prompted the team to relocate had more to do with the lack of additional amenities at the Civic Arena, such as updated luxury suites.

2011 AFL Expansion

The current AFL policy is to give expansion teams in markets previously served by AFL teams the same name as their predecessor, since the league owns almost all rights to all of the team names in the league's history. However, because the unrelated Cleveland Gladiators already use the "Gladiators" name, that required the adoption of a new franchise name. Incidentally, the Power's logo is a thunderbolt, the same as a previous Cleveland AFL team, Cleveland Thunderbolts.



Franchise ownership

On August 20, 2010, Matt Shaner was announced as the Principal Owner and General Manager of the team. His father Lance, as well as former Pittsburgh Steelers wide receiver Lynn Swann, an NFL Hall-of-Famer and part of the team's ownership group.

Including the Colorado Crush, Kansas City Command, and Philadelphia Soul, the Power are the fourth team in Arena Football League history to have a former NFL player as part of its ownership group.

PITTSBURGH POWER HISTORY

The Pittsburgh Power kicked off their innaugural season in Pittsburgh, PA, in March of 2011. The team plays their home games at CONSOL Energy Center, sharing the \$321 million facility whiched opend in August of 2010 with the NHL's Pittsburgh Penguins. The Power plays in the Arena Football League's American Conference East Division. The team shares the same color scheme (black & gold) as Pittsburgh's other professional sports teams the Pittsburgh Steelers of the NFL, the Pittsburgh Pirates of the MLB, and the Penguins.

The Power were the fourth franchise added for the 2011 AFL season, joining the San Jose SaberCats, Kansas City Command, and Philadelphia Soul.

The team's first game at CONSOL Energy Center drew a franchise record of 13,904 fans. The Power finished their inaugural AFL campaign wiht a record of 9-9, barely missing the AFL Playoffs. The Power franchise won the 2011 AFL Commissioner's Award.

The 2012 season started with promise after an opening night win for the Power in Orlando. Game number five on April 14, 2012, saw the Power orchestrate the largest comeback in Arena Football League history. Down 48-17 in the third quarter to the Orlando Predators, backup quarterback Derek Cassidy led the team on a 34-3 run, taking the game into overtime. After the Predators kicked a field goal to make it 54-51, P.J. Berry returned the ensuing kickoff 38 yards to the Predators' 19-yard line. On the very next play, Cassidy connected with Christian Wise for a touchdown to win the game 57-54 as the CONSOL Energy Center crowd erupted in a frenzied celebration.

Unfortunately the excitement form the historic comeback win did translate into many more wins for the 2012 team. Midway through the season Head Coach Chris Siegfried was replaced by Defensive Coordinator, Derek Stingley and the Power finsihed the seaosn with a 5-13 record.



Historic Footnote to the 2012 Season: On June 16, 2012, Power kicker Geoff Boyer successfully converted a two-point drop kick against the Milwaukee Mustangs. It was the first successful drop kick in the Arena Football League since 1997.



Jerry B. Kurz returns for his 27th season of Arena Football and fourth season as the AFL's Commissioner. Out-tenured only by the creator of Arena Football, Jim Foster, Kurz has dedicated his life to furthering the sport with a strong business ethic and core values meant to bring the highest quality product to the ever-growing fan base of Arena Football fans.


In his time as the president of the af2, the League saw extensive growth in small-to-midsized markets, building an extremely dedicated fan base across the country. That foundation helped to fuel the return of the Arena Football League in 2010 after a year on hiatus due to financial instability. Kurz and a group of enthusiastic investors arranged the acquisition of the AFL's assets in bankruptcy court in late 2009 and revived the League in early 2010, fulfilling the promise that Arena Football would be played in 2010.

Kurz has also served as the AFL's Vice President of International Development, where he was in charge of the League's international exposure. During his tenure, he was responsible for administering the H3 Visa program, allowing international players to play for AFL teams stateside. He also arranged and executed all internationally played games for the Arena Football League.

Arena Football isn't Kurz's only claim to fame. He is also a founding member of Gridiron Enterprises, Inc., a sports consulting firm based out of Chicago. Gridiron Enterprises, consisting of Kurz, Foster and attorney William Niro, is the original founder of the AFL. Kurz has been a player, coach, general manager and owner during his lifelong involvement with the game of football. He is also a member of four football Halls of Fame, including membership in the first class of the Arena Football Hall of Fame as well as membership in the arenafootball2 Hall of Fame.

AFL 101

RULES OF THE GAME



FIELD

- An indoor padded surface 85 feet wide and 50 yards long with eight-yard end zones.
- Goal posts are nine (9) feet wide with a crossbar height of 15 feet (NFL goal posts are 18-1/2 feet wide with the crossbar at 10 feet).
- The goal-side rebound nets are 30 feet wide by 32 feet high. The bottoms of the nets are eight (8) feet above the ground.
- Sideline barriers are 48 inches high and made of high-density foam rubber.

EQUIPMENT

• The official football is the same size and weight as the National Football League ball. Each ball is manufactured by Spalding, a division of Russell Corporation.

PLAYERS AND FORMATIONS

- Eight players on the field; 21-man active roster; three-man inactive roster.
- · Players may play both offense and defense.
- Substitution: Coaches are permitted to substitute players at will.
- Four (4) offensive players must line up on the line of scrimmage.
- Three (3) defensive players must be down linemen (in a three- or four-point stance). One linebacker may blitz on either side of the center. Alignment is two-or-more yards off the line of scrimmage. No stunting or twisting.
- Offensive motion: One receiver may go in forward motion before the snap.

TIMING

- Four (4) 15-minute quarters with a 15-minute halftime.
- The clock stops for out-of-bounds plays or incomplete passes only in the last minute of each half and when the referee deems it necessary for penalties, injuries or timeouts.
- Each team is allowed three (3) timeouts per half.

AFL GLOSSARY

GLOSSARY OF TERMS

BALL IN THE STANDS -

When a ball is thrown or bounces into the seats surrounding the playing field, the "lucky" fan that catches the ball keeps it.

DROP KICK -

A drop-kicked FG is worth 4 points. A drop-kicked extra point is worth 2 points. Spokane Shock kicker Taylor Rowan was the last man to connect on a two-point dropkick (7/22/2011 vs. Jacksonville).

IRONMAN -

Signifies participants playing both offense and defense.

FANS -

More than 26 million fans have experienced an AFL game in the League's 24-year history. Last year, in 2011, the AFL drew 1,338,544 fans in the regular season.

"MAC" AND "JACK" LINEBACKERS -

"Mac" may rush the QB straight on without stunting, twisting or drop-back coverage. "Jack" must stay within an imaginary box behind the line of scrimmage. Either LB may cover the fullback or tight end.

OFFENSIVE MOTION -

Unlike stadium-played football, one offensive back may go into forward motion prior to the snap of the ball.

OVERTIME -

Arena Football has a unique overtime rule: If a contest is tied after regulation, teams will play a 15-minute overtime. Each team will have one opportunity to score. If, after each team has had one chance to score, the game is tied, the first team to score is crowned the winner.

REBOUND NETS -

Goal-side rebound nets extend outward from each upright. The nets are 30-feet wide, 32-feet high and extend to 40 feet above the playing surface. The bottom bars of the frames are positioned eight (8) feet above the surface. The "scoring area" is nine-feet wide and 15-feet high. Nets are stretched taut so that a missed kick attempt will rebound off the net and back into the field of play. Once the ball caroms off the net, it's live.

SIDELINE BARRIERS -

Similar to the sideboards that surround a hockey rink, the sideline barrier encircles the playing surface. The barrier is made of a high-density foam pad, measuring four (4) inches thick.

STUNTING OR TWISTING -

When a defensive lineman is rushing the passer, there's no "stunting" or "twisting." In other words, linemen are required to power past offensive linemen.

TIGHT END -

One offensive lineman must declare himself a tight end prior to the snap by simply raising his arm and "declaring" himself a tight end. The Mac (rush-eligible) linebacker must line-up on the opposite side of the center from the tight end.

TWO-WAY PLAYERS -

One of the most "throwback" features of the Arena Football League is the fact that the game features eight-on-eight football, where at times, some players will play both
