Pittsburgh Power Football 2014 Game Notes



Ron James

Ron James was named the third head coach in Pittsburgh Power history on March 21, 2014. He joined the team just one game into the Power's 2014 season.

James has compiled a 49-52 record in the regular season during his seven-year head coaching career. Prior to coming to Pittsburgh, James spent the past four years as the head coach of the Utah Blaze where in 2012 he was named the Arena Football League Coach of the Year.

The 29-year coaching veteran got his start in the League as an assistant coach for the Albany Firebirds in 1990. He later joined the staff of the Houston ThunderBears in 1999, serving as the Director of Player Personnel and coaching the offensive and defensive lines.

From 2002-04, James was the assistant head coach for the Las Vegas Gladiators coaching both the offensive and defensive lines and the special teams unit. In 2005, he was promoted to head coach of the Gladiators. That year the team led the AFL in total offense and total defense. With James at the helm, the Gladiators broke 14 team records, including new franchise season-highs for passing yards and total yards.

James began his time with the Utah Blaze in 2007, coaching the offensive and defensive lines. After a dismal 1-6 start in 2010, he was promoted to head coach. It was under his leadership that the Blaze quickly became one of the AFL's elite teams. In 2012, Utah produced the most successful season in franchise history with a 12-6 record.

Steve Thonn

Steve Thonn enters his fifth season with the Gladiators where he has compiled a 29-42 record. Thonn was named head coach and director of football operations of the Cleveland Gladiators on December 23, 2009.

Last season, after losing veteran QB John Dutton in the offseason, the Gladiators struggled to find consistency and finished 4-11 under Thonn.

2012 saw the Gladiators finish 8-10 and second in the division, falling just short of a second-straight trip to the playoffs with Thonn at the helm.

In 2011, Thonn's Gladiators finished with an overall record of 10-8 and claimed the East Division crown.

In his first season with the Gladiators, Thonn compiled a 7-9 record. Despite the sub-.500 finish, the Gladiators outscored opponents 938-906 on the year.

Last Time Out...

- The Power came away with a one-point victory on the road over the South Division-leading Orlando Predators on Saturday night, 62-61.

-Power QB Tommy Grady connected with WR Hank Edwards with one second remaining to tie the game up at 61. Pittsburgh kicker Julian Rauch split the uprights on the PAT to give the Power the victory.

-Power QB Tommy Grady finished the contest with 306 yards and eight touchdowns which gives him the most passing yards and passing touchdowns in a season in Power franchise history.

-In his first game back from injury, WR Prechae Rodriguez hauled in 13 passes for 148 yards and four touchdowns.

Scouting Cleveland...

-The Gladiators are one of two remaining undefeated teams left in the AFL (Arizona)

-Cleveland is led offensively by former Power QB Shane Austin. On the season, Austin has thrown for 1,925 yards and 41 touchdowns. In one game against the Power this season, he has completed 59.2% of his passes for 201 yards and 6 touchdowns

-6-foot-3 WR Thryon Lewis will provide a challenge for the Power secondary. He is 8th in the AFL with 20 touchdown receptions.

-Cleveland WR Dominick Goodman is fifth in the AFL with 71 receptions. Goodman has 681 yards leading all Gladiator WRs.

-Marrio Norman is Cleveland's defensive leader with 52 total tackles, 3 tackles for loss, 1 forced fumble and a league-leading 8 interceptions.

- Linebacker LaRoche Jackson leads Cleveland with 68.5 tackles.

-Cleveland has won three games this season on last-second plays beating Spokane with a touchdown pass off the nets as time expired, LA with a last-second field goal and last week defeated Philadelphia with a touchdown pass from Austin to Lewis to overcome a 17-point deficit.

-The last time Cleveland has lost a regular season game was July 27, 2013 when they lost to Tommy Grady and the Utah Blaze, 48-46 to end the 2013 season.

Power Beat Predators 62-61 on the Road - May 24, 2014

In a back-and-forth affair, the Pittsburgh Power (7-3) beat the South Division-leading Orlando Predators (6-4), 62-61, tonight at the CFE Arena in front of a crowd of 5,002.

Pittsburgh and Orlando traded scores throughout the first half, as the score was tied 28-28 at halftime. The Power captured their first lead of the game in the third quarter when quarterback Tommy Grady and wide receiver Prechae Rodriguez hooked up for their second touchdown connection of the night. After Orlando tied the game up at 35, Rodriguez and Grady connected again to put Pittsburgh up 41-35 entering the final frame.

In his first game back after suffering a high ankle sprain in Week 3 of AFL play, Rodriguez finished the contest leading Pittsburgh's receiving corps with 13 receptions for 148 yards and four touchdowns.

After former Power quarterback Bernard Morris hit Larry Brackins for a touchdown strike to start the fourth quarter, the back-and-forth scoring ensued once again. With things all tied up at 48, Orlando put themselves in a position to turn the tides when defensive back Tracy Belton picked off a Grady pass and returned it eight yards for a score to give the Predators the lead.

With just under 13 minutes to play, Grady bounced back and tied the game back up with a touchdown pass to wide receiver Hank Edwards. Orlando quickly responded with a 45-yard Morris strike to Greg Carr to regain the lead. Kicker Mark Lewis' extra point was no good. Grady then orchestrated a nine-play drive that ended with a bullet pass to Edwards in the end zone with :01 second remaining in the game. Kicker Julian Rauch split the uprights to give the Power the 62-61 victory.

In the win, Grady finished completing 29-of-48 passes for 306 yards and eight touchdowns, making him the all-time leader in single-season passing yards and touchdowns in franchise history, moving past his counterpart in tonight's battle, Bernard Morris.

Morris finished the game connecting 16-of-26 passes for 230 yards and five touchdowns. On the ground, he chipped in three scores for Orlando.

With a four-game winning streak under their belt, Pittsburgh returns to CONSOL Energy Center next week hosting the undefeated Cleveland Gladiators on Saturday, May 31. Kickoff at is set for 5:00 pm ET.
