GAME NOTES

GREENIE, DURGAN READY; BRING ON THE COSMOS!

WASHINGTON, D. C., June 17 -- Alan Green is a full-timer and Jeff Durgan has been found guilty of a lesser crime.

What that means for Team America is bring on the New York Cosmos!

The Cosmos, fresh off one of the most impressive performances in their fabled history, invade RFK for the first time this season to take on high-flying Team America in an 8 o'clock North American Soccer League match.

New York comes to town off a devastating 7-2 shellacking of European Cup champion Hamburg two nights ago at Giants Stadium in East Rutherford, N. J. The defending NASL champion Cosmos blitzed Hamburg with six second half goals in an awesome display of power. Many called the performance the best in the team's history and also its most significant international victory.

In the NASL, the Cosmos are 7-3 and in second place in the Northern Division, three points (64-61) behind the Toronto Blizzard. A win tonight will give New York first place in the North and set up Sunday's Father's Day showdown with the Blizzard at Giants Stadium.

Team America comes into tonight's match 6-4 and on a three-game win streak, the club's longest of the season to date. Team America beat Tulsa 1-0 in double overtime at Tulsa June 4, then followed that victory with wins in the first two legs of the current three-game home stand, beating Tampa Bay 1-0 on Thursday, June 9 and Ft. Lauderdale 2-1 in a shootout before 50,108 soccer/Beach Boys fans at RFK last Sunday.

The two wins leaves Team America with 40 points and in a tie with Tulsa for second place in the Southern Division. Tampa Bay leads the division with 44 points.

Record-wise, however, Team America is the only team in the division with a .500-plus record. Tampa Bay and Tulsa are both 4-8 and Ft. Lauderdale, last in the division with 31 points, is 3-7.

This has been a week of good news for Team America.

Not only is the club revelling in its three wins and big crowd last Sunday, but its top forward found out this week that he can stay through the remainder of the 1983 outdoor season.

For the past six weeks, Alan Green has lived in limbo, wondering whether or not his parent club - Golden Bay - would recall him. That uneasy feeling ended this week when the Earthquakes said he could stay.

Green is one of the league's premier forwards. He has 74 career goals and had one last week against the Strikers in his first appearance since May 18. He had been sidelined with a hamstring strain.

An English citizen, Green is now eligible to apply for his American citizenship and he plans to do just that.

The second good piece of news concerned Durgan, Team America's team captain, who was ejected at 35:36 last Sunday by referee Dilvo DePlacido for violent misconduct - striking an opponent. Durgan was alleged to have hit Striker forward Branko Segota while coming to the aid of teammate Dan Canter, who had been kicked by Segota while on the ground.

Team America appealed the red card and won the protest. The NASL said that tapes of the game provided by Team America clearly shows that Durgan did not hit, but merely pushed Segota aside in an effort to prevent him from kicking Canter again. The red card was reduced to a yellow card for ungentlemenly conduct, thus clearing the way for Durgan to be included in the lineup for tonight's game.

So, with Durgan available, Green settled and the challenge of meeting one of the world's top club teams staring the team right in the face, Team America is ready for what it hopes will be another great night.

Here's the lineup Coach Alkis Panagoulis will likely use against the mighty Cosmos:

GK - Paul Hammond - #99 - Arnold Mausser won the Professional Soccer Reporters Association and Winston Team America Series Player of the Game awards for his spectacular 12-save effort against Ft. Lauderdale, but Hammond will get the call tonight as Panagoulis rotates his two fine keepers ... Hammond was the goalkeeper against Tampa Bay and recorded his third shutout of the season ... continues to be second to Vancouver's Tino Lettieri in goalkeeping stats with an 0.84 goals against ... is fifth in the overall Winston voting with 12 points

- RB - Bruce Savage - #2 - who else would play right back? ... with Durgan's ejection, only Savage, Dan Canter and Perry Van Der Beck have played every minute of every NASL match ... counting the two internationals, only Savage and Van Der Beck have gone all the way ... continues to play his steady, methodical game ... Panagoulas says there is none better anywhere ... assisted on game-winning goal at San Diego May 21
- CB - Jeff Durgan - #4 - no one wants to play against the Cosmos worse than Durgan and now, thanks to an NASL ruling, he'll get the chance ... a three-year starter as the stopper for New York, Durgan has been the leader for Team America this season ... is the leading vote getter in the Winston series with 22 1/2 points and has won two Player of the Game awards ... won one PSRA award and one NASL Player of the Week award ... has done everything but sell beer in the stands
- SW - Dan Canter - #5 - has had a tremendous season as the club's last line of defense ... a young Beckenbauer maybe? ... is third in the Winston voting with 13 1/2 points ... scored the winning shootout goal at Seattle April 23 and the first shootout goal against his old team - the Strikers - last Sunday ... scored the winning penalty kick at Tulsa June 4
- LB - Alan Merrick - #6 - one of the real unsung heroes in the Ft. Lauderdale game ... moved to the central defender's position when Durgan was ejected and had a marvelous game as the club's defensive leader ... helped stop one Striker thrust after another with superb defensive play ... was his best game by far ... has been primarily a left fullback this season, but has also seen some action as a defensive midfielder
- RMF - Pedro DeBrito - #16 - spends most of his time on the right side in Panagoulas' new midfield alignment which does not contain a true defensive midfielder ... has been one of the most versatile players on the team, playing in the midfield up front and in the back ... has three assists, most on the team, and two of them were on game-winning goals ... joined Savage in assisting Van Der Beck in San Diego and assisted Knight against Pedro's old team - Tampa Bay
- CMF - Perry Van Der Beck - #7 - has moved into the middle where he functions as both an attacking and defending midfielder ... can do both well ... has scored one goal and two assists going forward, including game-winning goal in 85th minute at San Diego and

Green's winning goal against Tulsa on May 8 ... has 26 fouls, most on the team, and most of them coming as he hustles back to defend

- LMF - Hayden Knight - #17 - had a great return to action last week ... out since March 25 with a broken foot, made first start against Tampa Bay and scored game winner at 21:57, a header off a DeBrito corner kick ... went the full 105 minutes against Ft. Lauderdale and played well ... originally targeted as the left fullback, broke into the lineup in the midfield and was so dangerous coming forward Panagoulis decided to leave him there ... has speed to burn
- S - Andrew Parkinson - #9 - continues to lead the team in scoring with five points (two goals and one assist) ... two goals came in 3-2 shootout loss to Seattle at RFK on May 18 ... assist came in 3-1 loss at Tampa Bay June 1 ... has started last four games up front, but has finished only one of the matches ... Panagoulis usually lets Andy run himself out, then substitutes ... a South African citizen eligible for citizenship in September
- S - Alan Green - #28 - came back in style against Ft. Lauderdale ... scored at 9:03 on his first shot since May 18 ... has two goals for the season in only five games ... the good news that he'll be here for the season should settle him and make him one of the top forwards in the league, as he's been throughout his career ... was second in the Winston voting
- LW - Boris Bandov - #8 - this is a big day for Bandov, another former Cosmos player who'll get a chance to play against his former teammates ... played four years with New York, but never got much playing time ... with Team America has played quite a bit in all positions - midfield, up front and in the back ... began the year as a left back, moved up to left midfield and now finds himself a winger ... moved to left back against the Strikers when Durgan was ejected ... has one assist and one shootout goal

ELIGIBLE RESERVES

Panagoulis hasn't tipped his hand as to who his three dressed reserves would be, but he has not dressed a second goalkeeper in the last few games and probably won't tonight.

That means Mausser probably won't play and means the following players probably will:

- M/D - Rudy Glenn - #10 - Rudy had been starting as a defensive midfielder, but asked out of the Strikers game because he felt burned out after playing a full indoor

schedule with Chicago ... if he still feels that way tonight, probably won't dress again, but the bet is that he will dress and be ready to fill in where needed ... can play in the midfield or in the back

F - Tony Crescitelli - #13 - maybe the long dry spell is over ... Crescitelli's goal in the shootout was his first goal of any kind this season, spanning 36 NASL game shots, two international game shots and one previous shootout attempt ... has been battling and playing his usual robust game, but can't buy a goal ... will likely dress and be used if Team America gets behind

M - Sonny Askew - #11 - has started one game this season and been an eligible reserve in two others ... has also played some in the back ... will likely dress if Greg Villa can't play. Villa has been sidelined with a groin strain and hasn't played since joining the team on loan from Chicago a couple weeks ago

INJURIES

Team America will be missing a couple standout players. Former Cosmos star Chico Borja is out with a hamstring strain and defender Tony Bellinger will watch from the sidelines because of a sprained knee. Villa's status is questionable because of his groin strain.

New York will have one top-notch player missing. He's Julio Cesar Romero, the talented Paraguayan midfielder. Romero suffered a severe thigh contusion in the Hamburg match and won't be available this evening.

THE LAST TIME OUT

Team America's lineup against Fort Lauderdale went like this:

Arnold Mausser, Bruce Savage, Dan Canter, Jeff Durgan, Alan Merrick, Pedro DeBrito, Perry Van Der Beck, Hayden Knight, Andrew Parkinson, Alan Green and Boris Bandov.

Against Hamburg, New York lined up like this:

Hubert Birkenmeier, Andranik Eskandarian, Franz Beckenbauer, Wim Rijsbergen, Johan Neeskens, Julio Cesar Romero, Ricky Davis, Vladislav Bogicevic, Roberto Cabanas, Giorgio Chinaglia and Steve Moyers.

Romero's injury will probably send Neeskens to midfield and bring on Darryl Gee of nearby Columbia, Md. Gee is a top-notch young American player.

Felix Fuksman (#19) of New York will be the man in the middle for tonight's match. Helder Dias (#77) of New Bedford, Ma. and William Mansmann (#97) of Lawrenceville, N. J. are the linesmen. Ulrich Strom (#59) of Hyattsville, Md. is the fourth official and Tony Stevens is the assessor.

THE ATTENDANCE

Last Sunday's big crowd boosted Team America's RFK attendance this year to 18,408 for five home dates.

On the road, Team America is averaging 10,999 for a like number of games.

RADIO/TV

Tonight's game is not only old home week for Jeff Durgan, Boris Bandov, but radio broadcaster Scott Morrison as well. Morrison used to serve the Cosmos as their play-by-play broadcaster and tonight he'll be behind the WWDC mikes for Team America, broadcasting the game at 7:50 p.m.

There will also be television tonight in the form of the Anheuser Busch/Team America network and also WOR TV from New York, which is sending the game home on a delayed basis. Two separate production crews are working this evening's game, a first for Team America this year.

WINSTON UPDATE

Durgan's ejection against Ft. Lauderdale didn't earn him any points in the Winston Team America Series Player of the Year voting, but he didn't need any to maintain his seven point lead over Chico Borja because Borja was injured and saw only 14 minutes of action.

Durgan, who has won two Winston awards, has 22 1/2 points to 15 1/2 for Borja, a three-time winner. Canter is third with 13 1/2 points and Van Der Beck is fourth with 12.

Mausser was the winner for the Fort Lauderdale game. Green finished second and DeBrito third.

The award is sponsored by R.J. Reynolds Tobacco, Team America's major corporate sponsor. Voting is done on a game-to-game basis by media covering the Winston Team America series matches. Votes are tabulated on a 5-4-3 point basis.

NEXT WEEK

Team America goes out west to begin a two-match road trip. The Golden Bay Earthquakes, who beat Team America 1-0 at RFK on May 27, will host Panagoulas and Co. on Wednesday, June 22 at 11 p.m. EDT at Spartan Stadium in San Jose.

From San Jose, Team America goes to the Windy City - Chicago - for the first of two visits this year. The Chicago Sting will provide the opposition at Soldier Field on Saturday, June 25 at 8:30 p.m.

Team America will have the following week off (except for a community game) and will then go to New York on July 6. The next home match will be against the powerful Toronto Blizzard on Friday, July 8.

FOR THE RECORD BOOKS

IF TEAM AMERICA WINS TONIGHT:

- it will be the club's fourth straight win, a team record;
 - it will move the team's record to 7-4, the best won-lost record in the Southern Division
