EARTHQUAKES VS COSMOS
GIANTS STADIUM 9:00 PM (EST)

EARTHQUAKES (7-16) AT NEW YORK (13-9)

GAME NOTES: The Earthquakes will close out their 1984 season tonight against the New York Cosmos at Giants Stadium in East Rutherford, New Jersey. The Quakes, 7-16, 88 points, are coming off a 2-1 loss to the San Diego Sockers last Saturday night in Spartan Stadium. The loss locked Golden Bay in the cellar of the North American Soccer League's Western Division for the fifth time in the last seven year's, but it put's the locals in the position to play spoiler. The Cosmos are embroiled in a heated battle with the Toronto Blizzard, Chicago Sting, Minnesota Strikers, Vancouver Whitecaps and the San Diego Sockers for the four playoff spots. The Earthquakes come into tonight's battle having lost four of their last five matches while the Cosmos are coming off a 2-0 loss to the Tulsa Roughnecks.

LAST GAME: The Earthquakes finished their 1984 home schedule the same way it began-a one goal loss to the San Diego Sockers. San Diego kept their playoff hopes alive with a 2-1 victory last Saturday night in San Jose's Spartan Stadium. Jean Willrich scored the games first goal and the score remained 1-0 until half. Ade Coker netted his 16th goal of the season at 59:12, assisted by Laurie Abrahams to make it 2-0 in favor of the Sockers. The Quakes got on the scoreboard at 85:20 when Leo Cuellar scored his first goal of the year but it wasn't quite enough as Golden Bay dropped their second game in three meetings with the Sockers in 1984. Bob Rigby was making his second appearance of the year and recorded three saves. Igor Vrablic, a member of the Canadian Olympic team, also chipped in with a assist. The Quakes, who finished 15-0 at home last year, saw their final '84 home mark fall to 3-9. The Quakes are 4-7 on the road.

QUAKES-COSMOS SERIES: This evening's game will mark the third time this year that the Earthquakes and the Cosmos will meet. The Cosmos have had the upper hand in '84, winning both matches, 3-1 in San Jose on June 13th, and 4-3 on September 3, also in Spartan Stadium. In the first game, Chico Borja scored two goals and a assist to aid the Cosmos cause, while in the Labor Day contest, the New Yorker's had to battle from a 3-0 deficit to win. Vladislav Bogicevic recorded a goal and two assists while Borja scored the game-winning goal with 42 seconds left in the game. Since the teams first locked horns in 1974, the Cosmos have had the upper hand, winning eight times while the Quakes have prevailed four times. Last Year the teams split their two meetings each club earning a "W" at home.

EARTHQUAKES OFFENSE: The Earthquakes remain the top offensive club in the NASL

OFFENSE (CON'T): with 60 goals in 23 games. The bread and butter of the Quakes attack is Steve Zungul and Branko Segota, the NASL's number one and two scorers. Zungul sits on top of the league with 20 goals and 10 assists for 50 points. His goal totals, along with his points are also new club records. He has scored on six of eight penalty kicks and is second on the team with 99 shots. He also has two hat tricks. Segota is number two in scoring with 18 goals and 10 assists for 46 points. He leads the team in shots with 118 and, like Zungul, has recorded two hat tricks. Segota recorded 11 goals and one assist in the month of August, and for his efforts was named the NASL Player of the Year. Igor Vrablic and Jan Goossens are tied for third in team scoring with 12 points apiece. Vrablic, who recorded a assist in the loss Saturday, has four goals and four assists while Goossens has three goals and six assists.

QUAKES DEFENSE: Although they lost 2-1 to the Sockers Saturday night, the defense played a good game. Bob Rigby was in goal for the second time this year and gave up only two goals while making three saves. The defensive line of Barney Boyce, George Katakaidis, Tim Schulz and Mihalj Keri also gave a good showing, keeping the ball of the feet of the Sockers high-scoring forwards Ade Coker and Jean Willrich. The Earthquakes however, have given up the most goals in the league with 62.

ZUNGUL NEARS MILESTONE: Steve Zungul, the Earthquakes dynamic forward and league's leading scorer is closing in on the 100 point mark for his career. Zungul, who has only played two seasons in the NASL, currently sits with 97 career points. In 1983 he recorded 47 points on 16 goals and 15 assists. This season show's him with 50 points on 20 goals and 10 assists. A look at Zungul these past two years:

Branko Segota is also nearing a milestone in scoring, although he probably won't get it this year. Segota, a six-year veteran of the NASL has 194 career points on 73 goals and 48 assists. Godfrey Ingram is also within sight of 100 points for his career, recording 92 on 36 goals and 20 assists.

THE RECORD FACTORY: Although the 1984 season has been somewhat disappointing for the Earthquakes, they have done their share to break some records along the way. Steve Zungul set a new club mark for most goals in a game (4) and in a season (20). He also ink's his name into the record book for points in a game (9), and in a season (50). His two hat tricks tie a club mark while establishing a new one for most in a

CLUB RECORDS (CON'T): career (4). His six penalty kicks also tie's him with George Best for most in a season. Branko Segota, Jan Goossens, and Charlie Fajkus all tied club marks with their three assists in one game. Team marks that have fallen in '84 include most fouls in a game (43), points (28) and consecutive games scoring a goal (35).

QUAKES .500 IN FINAL GAME: The Earthquakes sport a 5-5 record in the final game of the season. Last year the locals knocked off the Seattle Sounders 2-1 on a late Leo Cuellar goal, a goal that kept the Sounders out of the playoff's.

EARTHQUAKES 1, New York 3

June 13, 1984--Spartan Stadium (11,696)--The last two times the New York Cosmos have played in Spartan Stadium they had left beaten and beaten badly. In 1982 it was a 4-2 win by the Quakes and last year the locals kept their 1983 home record perfect with a 3-1 thumping. 1984 was a different year and the Cosmos proved it, winning 3-1 on June 13. It started off like history would repeat itself when Manny Rojas scored his third goal of the year, off a Jan Goossens assist, to give the Quakes a 1-0 lead at 35:22 and it remained that way at the half. The second half though became the Chico Borja show. At 48:22 he scored his first goal of the year to tie the game at 1-1. Former Earthquake Stan Terlecki gave Borja a pass at the 63:35 mark and the little forward slipped it past Earthquake goalkeeper Bill Irwin to make it 2-1 Cosmos. On the Cosmos third goal of the game Borja didn't score it but he helped set it up. Only 2½ minutes after he put the New Yorkers on top for good, he brought the ball down the field and fed another former Earthquake, Gerry Gray who shot it past the out-of-place Irwin for the final goal of the game. Despite outshooting the Cosmos, 26-13, the Quakes could not find the back of the net the rest of the night and lost 3-1.

September 3, 1984-Spartan Stadium(8,567)-- The Earthquakes jumped out to a 3-0 lead early in the game only to watch the Cosmos string together four straight goals and beat the Quakes 4-3 in a Labor Day contest. The Quakes jumped out to a 1-0 lead when Fernando Clavijo scored the first goal of his career at 27:55, unassisted. It went to 2-0 at 30:27 when Steve Zungul converted his sixth penalty kick of the year and his 20th goal of the season after George Katakalis was taken down in the box. Leo Cuellar fed Branko Segota a pass that the 23-year-old Canadian slammed past Cosmos goalkeeper Hubert Birkenmeier to give the locals a 3-0 lead. Only 1½ minutes after Segota's goal, Andrew Parkinson scored off a cross to put the New Yorker's on the board at the half, 3-1. The second half was all Cosmos. Vladislav Bogicevic followed in a missed Stan Terlecki shot at 76:03 and the Cosmos had cut the lead to one. No sooner had the fans seen "Bogie's" goal, than Terlecki tied it up at 80:04, and suddenly it was a ballgame. Chico Borja, who scored two goals and one assist that last time these two teams met, took a Bogicevic pass and slipped it past Bill Irwin with only 42 seconds left in the game.
