GAME NOTES

TONIGHT'S GAME

Tonight's playoff game opens a best-of-three game set between the Roughnecks and Cosmos. Tulsa (16-16, 151pts) finished second in the Southern Division, 12 points behind frontrunner Ft. Lauderdale. New York (23-9, 203pts) won the Eastern Division crown and is the 1st seed in the playoffs with the highest point total in the NASL. The teams will travel to Tulsa for a 2nd game on Saturday, 8/28, and if necessary, will return to New Jersey for a third game the following Wednesday.

THE SERIES In regular season play, the Cosmos hold a 7-1 series The teams met twice this season, most recently advantage. on 8/18 at the Meadowlands, with New York winning on both occasions. In playoff competition, the teams have met five times and the Cosmos have won four, including a mini-game win to decide the best-of-three series in Tulsa has never beaten the Cosmos in their own park--during the regular season or playoffs.

5-8-82

New York won a thrilling shootout match at Skelly Stadium, 3-2, on Richard Chinapoo's conversion in the fifth round. Tulsa's Don Droege (since traded to Tampa Bay for Terry Moore and Njego Pesa) headed in the equalizer with six seconds left in regulation to send the game into overtime. Steve Moyers scored twice late in the second half for New York (at 73:12 and 81:46); Dave Huson scored early (6:05) for Tulsa's first goal.

8-18-82

Despite a first score by the Roughnecks on Barry Wallace's penalty kick at 24:27, the Cosmos won their seventh home game in a row over Tulsa on goals by Roberto Cabanas, Giorgio Chinaglia, and Steve Moyers. Cabanas' controlled chip shot over Winston DuBose's head tied the score just two minutes after Wallace's penalty conversion; Chinaglia's patented bicycle kick in the goalmouth gave New York the lead four minutes into the 2nd half; Moyers' exciting second-effort header off a rebound of his own shot added an insurance goal at 80:55.

LAST TIME

Tulsa outshot the San Jose Earthquakes 25-11 and received consistently close coverage from its defense to win at home on 8/21, 2-0, and clinch a tie for goalkeeper Winston DuBose in the NASL's shootout standings. DuBose's 9 scoreless outings matched the performance of Seattle's Paul Hammond.

The Roughnecks' second largest home crowd this year, 16,256, saw Tulsa score with just 2:55 gone in the match. Billy Caskey, the Roughnecks' leading career scorer, was the final link in a nice combination from Dave Huson and Franz Gerber. While Tulsa came close to scoring again on numerous occasions -- Njego Pesa twice hit the crossbar and had a third shot slapped away by a diving Billy Phillips--its second goal didn't hit the net until 81:50 when Franz Gerber

finished a perfect set-up from Njego Pesa and David Bradford.

The Roughnecks pushed forward in the final eight minutes in pursuit of a goal that would have assured Tulsa of a playoff ranking over Toronto. With two minutes left, a 2nd effort shot by Tasso Koutsoukos did find the mark, but well-positioned referee Dante Maglio over-ruled the linesman and called Tulsa for offsides. San Jose managed to sidestep the Roughneck attack the rest of the way.

TULSA IN THE PLAYOFFS

The Roughnecks have never missed qualifying for the playoffs in their five year history... Tulsa's best year was 1979 when it beat Minnesota twice in overtime and then beat the Cosmos at home, 3-0, on 8/26/79. The Roughnecks ultimately lost to the Cosmos in their park, 3-0 in a conventional game and 3-1 in the deciding mini-game...The Roughnecks' win over the Cosmos on 8/26/79 was their most recent playoff win outdoors...The club lost two straight to New York in 1980 and again to Minnesota in 1981... Billy Caskey is the leading Roughneck in playoff goal scoring with four.

ROUGHNECK SPOTLIGHT

FRANZ GERBER

11 goals, 10 assists overall in 1982, scored 10 of his goals and 8 assists since 7/4.

LAURIE ABRAHAMS

Set a new team record for goals in a season with 17. Finished with 17G, 10A, 44pts, 5th best in the NASL.

BARRY WALLACE

The versatile, young player had an outstanding year-his best as a Roughneck. Scored 8 goals and 10 assists. Played striker, sweeper, and midfielder. Team's leading scorer indoors.

DAVE HUSON

An unsung defender who makes the plays but receives little publicity. Played for Chicago in Soccer Bowl Scored goal against New York on 5/8/82.

WINSTON DUBOSE

Nine shutouts, 1.67GAA (eighth best). Played every minute this year (2960:3 Only Roughneck to do so.

4 goals, 8 assists since joining club on 7/4. Has assisted Franz Gerber on 4 NJEGO PESA goals.

DAVID BRADFORD Led club in assists with 11, had 5 goals.

TERRY MOORE

Solid central defender plays alongside Victor Moreland. A Canadian by birth, moved to Ireland at 4 and went to school and played soccer with Moreland and David McCreery.

SOCCER IN 1982

A roller coaster year for the Roughnecks, but one ROUGHNECKS, in which the team has shown character and resiliency to come back from defeat... Tulsa had a 5-9 record going into its match at Edmonton on 6/16, yet by 7/24 was 13-11 and had won 5 straight at home and outscored opponents 16-2 during the stretch...Addition of Njego Pesa and Terry Moore on 7/3 sparked club at both ends of the field...With Moore teaming with Moreland in the middle of the defense, Tulsa was 8-6 and allowed just 19 goals while scoring 34...The team lost 9 one-goal games but finished fourth in scoring in the league... Laurie Abrahams, in just a season and a half, is the

club's 2nd leading all-time scorer...He scored 7 goals in 4 games against his former team, the Teamen...Despite some early and mid-season drop-off in attendance, Tulsa averaged 14,502 at home and remains one of the league's steadiest and best-drawing franchises--despite being its smallest market...Alex Skotarek, a former player, coach and Assistant General Manager, became General Manager late in the season and helped boost attendance with his "Fan is Back" program and warm relations with Tulsa's fans and media...Skotarek earlier played an instrumental role in helping youth soccer grow to its present membership of 25,000 in the Tulsa area...It is more common to see kids in soccer uniforms in Tulsa than little league uniforms...Tulsa has become a soccer city...The University of Tulsa's soccer team is entering its third year and growing in popularity...The Golden Hurricane has drawn many of its players--and its coach--from Tulsa's Green Country Soccer Association, an organization that both Skotarek and Roughneck players have been involved with.
