KANSAS CITY BLADES GAME NOTES

Manitoba Moose at Blades November 28, 1997



TONIGHT'S MATCH-UP: The Blades and Manitoba Moose hook up tonight for the fifth of 10 regular season meetings and the third here at Kemper Arena. The Moose won the first three games of the series (one in a shootout) before the Blades picked up their first victory in the last meeting, November 10 in Winnipeg. Thus, KC stands 1-2-1 in the four games to date. In the end, six of the games will be staged in Manitoba, while the other four will take place at Kansas City's Kemper Arena. In fact, all 10 games will be played by the end of January, thus these Midwest Division rivals will not play at all during the final two and one-half months of the regular season.

1997-98 SERIES RECAP: OCT. 9, KC 3 at MANITOBA 4: KC surrendered a 3-2 third period lead as the Moose scored twice in the final 10:03. Brad Purdie tied the game at 9:57 on a long shot that took a crazy hop in front of Blades goaltender Jon Casey, and then Greg Pankiewicz scored a breakaway goal, his third of the game, with 4:03 remaining. The Blades outshot the Moose, 38-24, but Manitoba netminder Fred Brathwaite was outstanding. After a scoreless first period, KC broke on top early in the second on a Pat Ferschweiler lamplighter. The Moose responded with a pair of second period goals from Pankiewicz, the first on a power play at 8:08, followed by his second at 11:04. But the Blades took over the final seven minutes of the second period and moved back into the lead on goals by Dean Sylvester (15:27) and Iain Fraser (17:34). OCT. 29, MANITOBA 7 at KC 2: Greg Pankewicz scored 4 goals to lead Manitoba to their first-ever win at Kemper. The Moose converted two first period power plays in building a 3-0 lead, outshooting Kansas City 12-4. Manitoba chased starting goalie Jon Casey with their third goal at 15:34. Jeff Salajko faced 18 shots the rest of the way and surrendered 4 goals. KC got as close as 3-1 when Darin Kimble scored in period two, but the Moose would build a 5-1 advantage on their way to the victory. In the end, Manitoba was 3 of 7 on the power, while the Blades went 0 for 7. Manitoba was 0-3 in Kansas City where they had been outscored 20-6. NOV. 7, KC 4 at MANITOBA 5 SO: Kansas City's Brent Cullaton, Dean Sylvester and Pat Ferschweiler staked the Blades to a 3-0 lead after just 8:43, but the Moose staged a comeback to take a 3-0 lead in the season series. Manitoba outscored Kansas City 3-1 in the second frame to cut the deficit to one, before tying it on Randy Gilhen's goal at 2:39 of the third. In the shootout, John Purves and David Bruce gave the Blades an early 2-1 lead, but the competition would progress to a sixth shootout round, where Manitoba's Brad Purdie ended it. Despite outshooting the Moose 31-28, the Blades lost their second straight shootout decision. The Moose went 2 for 6 on the power play, while the Blades were 0 for 3. MONDAY, NOVEMBER 10, KC 4 at MANITOBA 3: A goal by Dean Sylvester with just 1:19 to play lifted KC to the victory at the Winnipeg Arena. Leading 2-1 entering the third period, the Blades watched Brad Purdie score a pair of goals in the first 1:20 to take a 3-2 lead. After a timeout call by coach Paul MacLean, Kansas City settled down and eventually tied the game on a John Purves one-timer from the slot at 13:22. Sylvester's game winner came during a scrum to the right of the Moose net. He pulled the puck free and beat Fred Brathwaite low to the ice from 15-feet away. KC again jumped on Manitoba early, taking a 2-0 lead by 5:38 of period one on goals by Cirone and Fraser. Brathwaite made 26 saves, while Jon Casey stopped 24

BLADES ALL-TIME VS. MOOSE: The Blades hold a 16-9-3 edge in the all-time series. The first two seasons of this series were contested when the Moose were based in Minnesota. Kansas City is 9-4 in Kemper Arena, 3-2-2 in the St. Paul Civic Center, 1-0 at Minneapolis' Target Center and 3-3-1 at the Winnipeg Arena. Broken down, here is the all-time won-loss against the Moose: 1994-95 (5-1-2); 1995-96 (5-4); 1996-97 (5-2); 1997-98 (1-2-1).

BLADES SNAP LOSING STREAK: Kansas City scored seven of the game's final nine goals to rally for a 7-5 victory at Long Beach on Wednesday, the finale of their 10-game road trip. After falling behind 3-0 at 13:55 of the opening period, the Blades trimmed the margin to 3-2 by the intermission. The Ice Dogs regained a two-goal advantage when they scored during a 5-on-3 advantage early in period two. KC would then reel-off four unanswered goals, taking the lead at 4:07 of the third when Mike Craig scored his first in a Blades uniform. The Dogs made it interesting with 3:08 to play when Russ Romanuik scored his second of the game to cut the lead to 6-5. But David Bruce tallied his 4th goal of the season into an empty net with :12 to play. It was a wide-open affair, with Long Beach outshooting Kansas City, 48-39. Jeff Salajko got the win, while Jamie Storr suffered the loss.

BLADES ACQUIRE DRAGONS DUO: The Blades orchestrated a 2-for-2 trade with the San Antonio Dragons late Tuesday evening (see enclosed release for additional information). They acquired wingers Reggie Savage and Mike Craig in exchange for right wingers John Purves and Darin Kimble. Savage was a first-round draft pick of the Washington Capitals in 1988. He is 27-years-old and in his eighth season as a pro. He was the Dragons second-leading scorer with 18 points (6 goals, 12 assists) in 22 games. Savage scored 186 goals in 324 American Hockey League games between 1990-97. Craig has spent each of the past seven seasons in the National Hockey League. He played three years with the Minnesota North Stars and was their "Rookie of the Year" in 1990-91. He went with the team to Dallas for a season and spent the past three seasons with the Toronto Maple Leafs.

ABOVE JOIN FRASER TO FORM TERRIFIC TRIO: Craig played right wing and Savage played the left side on a line with centerman Iain Fraser, and what a debut they had. The line combined for 12 points in leading the Blades to the 7-5 win at Long Beach Wednesday. Fraser led the way with 2 goals and 3 assists, followed by Craig with 1 goal and 3 assists, while Savage chipped in with a goal and 2 assists.

FRASER ENDS 0 FOR 5 WITH 5, ONE SHORT OF RECORD: Fraser's 5-point effort Wednesday was long overdue. He had been held without a point in each of the previous five contests. Prior to the drought, the Blades captain had points in 12 of the team's first 16 games. The 5-point game also fell one shy of tying the Blades record for most points in a game, held by Kip Miller (2 goals, 4 assists) during the 1993-94 season.

352 HIGHLIGHTS COMPLETED ROAD TRIP: The Blades averaged 35.2 shots a game in going 3-5-2 during the 10-game road trip. They scored 30 goals, helped along by the 7-goal burst in the finale at Long Beach Wednesday. The road trip started in positive fashion, as the Blades went 2-0-2 in the first four before dropping five straight in regulation.

NOVEMBER NOTES: With a 3-5-2 record during the completed trip, here is how it stack's up against past November road trips: 1990-91 (2-7-1); 1991-92 (9-4); 1992-93 (2-4-2); 1993-94 (6-3); 1994-95 (3-4); 1995-96 (3-4); 1996-97 (3-4-1). The lengthiest of November trips was in 1991-92 when they played 13 in a row in foreign cities. The shortest trip was in both 1994-95 and 1995-96 when seven games were scheduled during the American Royal.

OFFENSIVE OUTPUT IS SEASON HIGH: The seven goals in Long Beach established a new-season high for goal scoring by the Blades. Their previous high for most goals in a game was five, accomplished three other times.

BLADES IN 1997-98: Kansas City sits 8-11-3 in week nine. The Blades stand tied for third place in the Midwest Division with Manitoba (9-12-1). They trail first place Chicago (14-5-2) by 11 points, and second place Milwaukee (12-8-1) by 6 points **BLADES AT HOME**: 3-4-1. Before beginning the road trip, the Blades had played five straight at home and eight of nine on Kemper ice. Starting tonight, KC plays five straight again at home **BLADES ON THE ROAD**: 5-7-2. The Blades went 3-5-2 on their road trip, but just 1-5-1 in the last seven after going 2-0-1 in the first three. They don't return to enemy territory until Tuesday, December 9 in Milwaukee.

BLADES ALL-TIME RECORD: In their eighth season as members of the IHL, the Blades have now put together an all-time record of 288-250-57 in 595 regular season games. The best regular season record was in 1991-92 when they went 56-22-4 **BLADES ALL-TIME AT KEMPER**: In 295 games at Kemper, the Blades show a record of 159-109-27. Their best home record was in 1991-92 when they went 31-8-2 **BLADES ALL-TIME ON THE ROAD**: Kansas City has played 300 games in foreign buildings and possesses a record of 129-141-30. Their best road record was in 1991-92 when they went 25-14-2.

<u>AT THIS TIME IN PREVIOUS SEASONS</u>: Here is where the Blades stood after 22 games during their first seven seasons: 1990-91 (4-17-1); 1991-92 (16-5-1); 1992-93 (7-12-3); 1993-94 (13-7-2); 1994-95 (10-11-1); 1995-96 (10-11-1); 1996-97 (7-11-4).

BLADES NEAR 600: Tonight's game represents the 596th regular season contest for the Blades in this, their eighth year of operation. They will play game number 600 next Saturday, December 6 against Quebec. This past Wednesday's visit to Long Beach marked the 300th regular season road game in franchise history.

TOP GUNS: Pat Ferschweiler has 4 points (1 goal, 3 assists) in his last two games....Jason Cirone has points in 9 of the last 12 contests (3 goals, 8 assists).

FIRSCH(WOW)LER: Despite his team going 2-5-1 in the last eight games of the November road trip, Pat Ferschweiler registered a +7 in the plus/minus category and is now at the top of the team's list in that category at +6. He was even or better in each of the eight games and a plus player in six of the games. During those eight games, Ferschweiler contributed 3 goals and 5 assists.


RANKING THE BLADES: The Blades have killed 80.0% of their opponents' power plays while capitalizing on 15.2% of their own chances. They rank 14th in penalty killing and 16th in power play efficiency....Kansas City averages 32.64 shots per game, tops in the IHL, while allowing just 29.45 (9th). However, KC ranks 15th in goal scoring at 2.86 per game. They are 11th in goals against at 3.27....The Blades have 3 shorthanded tallies, tied for 7th in the league, and they've surrendered just two shorthanded goals, tied for 2nd.

STILL DOWN TO THE CUTICLE: Of the Blades' 22 games this season, 17 have been decided by two goals or less. They are 4-4-3 in one-goal decisions and 2-4 in two-goal games. Each of the first eight games had two goal or fewer margins, as had seven straight, prior to Saturday night's 5-2 loss at Las Vegas. In between those long streaks, KC was involved in three straight lopsided affairs.

BLADES INK BILODEAU: The Blades on November 21, signed defenseman Brent Bilodeau to a 25-game tryout, after he had been released by Las Vegas November 19. Bilodeau, who was Montreal's first choice, 17th overall, in the 1991 NHL Entry Draft, appeared in 15 games for Las Vegas this season, posting one assist and 39 penalty minutes. The fifth-year blueliner has 277 professional games under his belt with Las Vegas, San Antonio and San Francisco of the IHL, and Fredericton and Saint John of the AHL. He made his Blades debut Saturday night in Las Vegas, going scoreless. He picked up his first point Wednesday, assisting on a first-period goal by Dean Ewen.
