REMAIN OFF THE PLAYING FIELD: Spectators are not allowed on the playing field at any time. Violators will be asked to leave the stadium.

RETURN SOCCER BALLS: All balls kicked into the stands must be returned to the officials.

LOST AND FOUND: Lost articles may be claimed at the lost and found table in the press box.

EMERGENCIES: In the event of an emergency, notify the nearest security guard. They are instructed as to further procedures.

REST ROOMS: The rest rooms are located under the North side of the press box.

The All-Star Game

This is the first annual American Soccer League All-Star game. Although previous years have seen the ASL select first and second team all-star squads, no actual game between the players has ever been played. The game marks the first time 32 of the best soccer players have ever been assembled into two teams, playing on the same pitch.

The players in tonight's match have been carefully selected by league officials, with each club being fairly represented. The combination of world class players with American stars should pave the way for a classic soccer confrontation.

This evening's exhibition is being played at Hofstra Stadium in Uniondale, New York, the home of the defending American Soccer League champions, the New York Apollo.

From the time the New York Cosmos won their first championship playing at Hofstra, to last year's third Apollo title, this New York City suburb has been a hotbed of great soccer.

The American Soccer League takes great pride in presenting this spectacular event, and hopes it is the prelude to many all-star classics to come.

In his first year as Head Coach of the New York Apollo, Jimmy led his team to the ASL championship. A native of Ireland, "Jimmy Mac" played and coached professionally in his homeland. Having turned pro 18 years ago, he is the only player to ever represent both Northern Ireland and Ireland on over 30 occasions. Aside from his coaching skills, Jimmy is also an excellent midfielder and fullback.

Geoff Davies

After being named Assistant Coach of the Skyhawks last season, Geoff took over as Head Coach of the team in the early part of 1979. Geoff has a United States Soccer Federation "B" license in coaching, and is also a strong defensive midfield player. Prior to joining the Skyhawks, he played for the San Jose Earthquakes and the Chicago Sting of the NASL.

New York Apollo Ht: 5'10" Wt: 160 Age: 30 Pos: GK

Jamil can do little more to improve his soccer credentials. He is the longest active ASL player, he's participated in six ASL Championships, and was a first team ASL All Star three times.



Chris Tyson

New York Apollo Ht: 5'11" Wt: 160 Age: 26 Pos: DEF

Chris is a Long Island product. Having grown up in the soccer hotbed of Northport, he is the pride of the Apollo. The head coach at Stony Brook University has turned a number of defenders in the ASL for spin, scoring some goals early in '79.



Dan Mammana

Columbus Magic Ht: 6'4" Wt: 195 Age: 27 Pos: DEF

Dan was born in Buenos Aires, Argentina. His big size made him a valuable asset to the Sacramento Gold in 1978, and this year for Columbus he has been "magical". This is Dan's fourth selection to the ASL All Star team.



Tino Domingues

N.J. Americans Ht: **5'9"** Wt: **160** Age: **25** Pos: **DEF**

Tino hails from Newark, New Jersey and has been an American for three years now. In 1978 Tino got his just reward, having been selected New Jersey's Defensive Player of the Year.



Scott Manning

Penn. Stoners Ht: 5'11" Wt: 170 Age: 23 Pos: GK

Scott is a native of Rochester, New York, and a graduate of soccer power Cortland State. He is only in his first year in the ASL, but his goalkeeping acrobatics assure a long career.



Andjelko Tesan

N.Y. Eagles Ht: 5'10" Wt: 150 Age: 29 Pos: DEF

Andjelko is now the captain of the Eagles for the second year. No one played more minutes than him last year. Before joining the ASL, he played on the back line for Sarajevo FK for 11 years.



John Brooks

Cleveland Cobras Ht: 6'4" Wt: 190 Age: 22 Pos: DEF

John is no stranger to playing with a winner, having played with the University of San Francisco's national championship team of 1976. Last season John wore the ASL jerseys of Sacramento and Southern California.



Dan McCrudden

New York Apollo Ht: 6'4" Wt: 180 Age: 24 Pos: DEF

Dan is a Long Island native, having grown up in Kings Park. "Sudden" went to the University of Rhode Island, where he was named All Yankee Conference four years in a row, and wore a Chicago Sting uniform last year.





Jeff Tipping

Penn. Stoners Ht: 6'0" Wt: 160 Age: 23 Pos: DEF

A member of the national champion team from Hartwick College, Jeff was the MVP of that year's championship. Jeff arrives in the Lehigh Valley after playing with the N.Y. Eagles in '78.



Branko Samatovic

N.Y. Eagles Ht: 5'11" Wt: 160 Age: 29 Pos: FWD

Branko is spending his first year in the United States in fine style. After playing for FK Sutjeska and the Yugoslavian Jr. National Team, he has been helping the Eagles with his scoring consistency.



Dave Power

N.Y. Apollo Ht: 5'7" Wt: 155 Age: 25 Pos: MF

Dave was born in Liverpool, England and later spent 4 years living in Australia. In his fifth Apollo season, Dave has started in every regular season game. This makes two seasons in arow that Mr. Power has been selected to the ASL All Star team.



Mike Mancini

New York Apollo Ht. 6'4" Wt: 195 Age: 25 Pos: FWD

"Mick" hails from England and was a surprise walk on to the Apollo in 1978. 17 goals and 40 points made Mike the third leading scorer in the ASL for 1978. That and his sense of humor make him a valuable team asset.



Clyde Watson

N.Y. Eagles Ht: 5'5" Wt: 135 Age: 23 Pos: MF

Clyde was the No. 1 draft choice of the Eagles in 1978, and saw action in 23 games. Scoring five goals, he was second on the team in minutes played. Very few players are as active on the field.



Jose Cristaldo

N.Y. Eagles Ht: 5'8" Wt: 150 Age: 23 Pos: FWD

Jose is in the U.S. for the first time. This ASL newcomer hails from Argentina where he played for the famous River Plate team, and also was selected to the Rosario All Stars.



Emilio Romero

Columbus Magic Ht: 5'8" Wt: 150 Age: 24 Pos: FWD

Emilio is a native American, born in Denver, Colorado. His spectacular scoring ability placed him on the U.S.A. National Team in 1976, and for the past two seasons he played for the Minnesota Kicks of the NASL.



Roman Urbanczuk

Penn. Stoners
Ht: 5'9" Wt: 165
Age: 20 Pos: FWD

At 20, Roman is one of the youngest All Stars. He is a native of Poland, and a big favorite of Stoner's fans, having played for the local Ross Bike team before joining the ASL expansion squad.

Bob Nash is in his second year as trainer for the New York Apollo. A certified athletic trainer, Bob was an assistant at the United States Merchant Marine Academy and a Graduate of the New England School of Athletic Training. He is presently on the training staff at Adelphi University and co-trainer for the prestigious Five Star Basketball Camp.

Glenn Lowenberg

Glen Lowenberg is also in his second season as trainer for the Apollo. The 26 year old also serves as trainer for Adelphi University. His past credits include trainer for Stony Brook, Kings Point and the Millrose games at Madison Square Garden. He is a certified athletic trainer with a degree in physical education.

Tom Reynolds

Calif. Sunshine Ht: 5'11" Wt: 180 Age: 23 Pos: GK

1978 saw Tommy miss out on winning the ASL goalkeeping title because he was four minutes shy of the league minimum for minutes played. Tom played collegiate soccer at Cal. State Hayward and his team finished second in the region to eventual NCAA champ, USF.



Tom Redmond

Indy Daredevils Ht: 6'2" Wt: 175 Age: 25 Pos: DEF

A former All-American with Indiana University, Tom is in his second season with the Daredevils. In 1976 and 1977, "Red" played for the Chicago Sting of the NASL. The pillar of the Daredevil defense last season, Tommy is also a dangerous offensive threat.



Carlos Zavaleta

L.A. Skyhawks Ht: 5'10" Wt: 162 Age: 24 Pos: DEF

Carlos played varsity soccer at UCLA for three years before being drafted by Oakland. The native of El Salvador was a member of his country's Junior National Team and can also play midfield if necessary.



Bobby Arber

Sacramento Gold Ht: 5'9" Wt: 160 Age: 28 Pos: DEF

Bobby was known as one of Europe's quickest and most intelligent defenders. He has played on some of the United Kingdom's top teams, and likes to charge and take over the ball.



Pete Mannos

Indy Daredevils Ht: 5'11" Wt: 170 Age: 24 Pos: GK

Last season's MVP on the Daredevils, Peter is in his fourth pro season. The veteran played for San Antonio, Team Hawaii and Dallas of the NASL before joining Indianapolis. In his first NASL season, Pete shutout Pele and the Cosmos.



Ramon Moraldo

Calif. Sunshine Ht: 6'1" Wt: 165 Age: 27 Pos: DEF

An original member of the California Sunshine, Ramon has now been selected to the first-team All-Stars two straight years. Ramon was a member of the Los Angeles Aztecs when they won the NASL championship in 1974.



Mauro Bencivenga

Las Vegas Seagulls Ht: 5'9" Wt: 168 Age: 26 Pos: DEF

Mauro, a native of Italy, is currently on loan from the Fiorentina team. The nine year veteran is in his first American Soccer League season. Mauro is a crafty heady performer.



Raul Carrizo

Las Vegas Seagulls Ht: 5'9" Wt: 155 Age: 27 Pos: MF

A first year ASL player, Raul began his career with first division Velez Sarsfield in his native Argentina. He also played with Ferro Carril Deste and then spent five years with Marconi Soccer Club in Australia.





Keith Walley

Calif. Sunshine Ht: 6'1" Wt: 165 Age: 24 Pos: MF

In 1975, Keith played first division soccer in South Africa. He then returned to his native England for a year with Blackpool and then played in Norway. Keith is in his first Sunshine season, after making second team All-Stars with the Lazers in 1978.



Dan Payne

Sacramento Gold Ht: 5'7" Wt: 150 Age: 22 Pos: MF

Dan has made the ASL All-Star Team in his rookie season. An All-American at Chico State, Danny was a Senior Bowl member last January. He led his West squad to a win with a goal and an assist.



Poli Garcia

Calif. Sunshine Ht: 5'8" Wt: 150 Age: 21 Pos: FWD

Poli began his career in Mexico City at 15 and was discovered by the Sunshine playing semipro ball in San Juan Capistrano. A second team All-Star last season, Poli led the Sunshine with 93 shots. He was born in San Diego.



Colin McLocklan

Indy Daredevils Ht: 6'1" Wt: 180 Age: 26 Pos: FWD

Colin is a veteran who played pro soccer in England and Holland. He also played for Connecticut and Chicago of the NASL prior to joining the Daredevils in mid-season in 1978. The native of England is a dangerous striker and a precise passer.



Don Tobin

Calif. Sunshine Ht: 5'9" Wt: 150 Age: 23 Pos: MF

Don, a native of Liverpool, England, was a second team All-Star last season. While in England, he spent two years at Everton before starting for Rochdale at 18. He then played for 1977 Irish Cup winners, Sligo.



Jim Rolland

L.A. Skyhawks Ht: 5'7" Wt: 155 Age: 30 Pos: FWD

Now in his fourth season with Los Angeles, the team captain was the ASL's Most Valuable Player and leading goal scorer in 1978, scoring 17 goals and 10 assists. Jim once scored a hat trick within eight minutes.



Bill McNicol

L.A. Skyhawks Ht: 5'9" Wt: 155 Age: 24 Pos: FWD

Billy is in his second year with the Skyhawks. Originally from Dunoon, Scotland, "Tosh" turned professional at 16 with Glasgow. Now living in Utah, he began his ASL career with San Antonio in 1976.



Joe Fink

Calif. Sunshine Ht: 5'11" Wt: 162 Age: 27 Pos: FWD

Drafted by the New York Cosmos in 1973, Joey was runnerup to Kyle Rote Jr. for NASL rookie-of-the-year that season with 11 goals. In 1976, the former All-American was sold to Tampa Bay. Last winter, Joe made the MISL All-Star team with the Philadelphia Fever.

American Soccer League (FIRSTS)




The American Soccer League is proud of its "firsts" in the promotion of soccer in the United States. Here are a few of them.

- The American Soccer League was the first league in the United States to televise scheduled games. This occurred in October, 1952, at Yankee Stadium, New York, over Station WPIX, Channel 11. These A.S.L. games were the first ever staged at Yankee Stadium.
- Indoor soccer, inagurated by the American Soccer League, first in the United States, at Madison Square Garden, New York, in 1939, again in 1940, and again in the 1950's.
- First night game, International "dream" match in the United States staged by the American Soccer League, June 15, 1948, at Ebbets Field, Brooklyn, New York between Liverpool, of England, and Djurgaden, of Sweden; with the English team winning 3-2. This was also the first game staged in the United States by two visiting foreign teams.
- The American Soccer League is the only soccer league in the United States to stage its foreign tour games at major baseball parks. Ebbets Field, Brooklyn, New

York; Polo Grounds and Yankee Stadium, New York. Other major stadiums have been Soliders Field, Chicago; Coliseum, Los Angeles; and Connie Mack Stadium, Philadelphia.

- An attendance record of 24,800 was set as far back as 1953 at Randalls Island Stadium, New York, when Liverpool, of England, edged Nuernberg, of German, 4-3. This game was also sponsored by the American Soccer League. (Note: Capacity of Randalls Island Stadium is 22,000 and the gates were closed by order of the police.
- A night attendance record was broken, also at Randalls Island Stadium, in a game sponsored by the American Soccer League, when Milan A.C., of Italy played Santos, of Brazil, on June 11, 1965. An attendance of 24,500 was recorded, and the gates were again closed by police, when the latter estimated there were more than 12,000 automobiles in the parking lots.
- Other attendance records have also been made at Yankee Stadium with over 45,000 fans on hand viewing Pele and his Santos Club in competition against visiting Italian clubs.


