YANKEES TO VISIT OCEANEERS ON SATURDAY

Connecticut Yankees Head Coach Bob Kratzer, like all coaches, hates to lose, esp--ecially two games in a row played in front of the home fans. Losing at home was something new to Kratzer for until two weeks ago, a Kratzer coached club had never been beaten at home. Ties, yes, but losses, there were none.
