East Providence, Rhode Island........... The Rhode Island Oceaneers will continue their current home stand this Saturday night at 7:45 PM when they meet the Cleveland Cobras at Pierce Field.

The Oceaneers suffered what was only their 2nd loss at home since the club became members of the American Soccer League three years ago.

The Oceaneers current record is 0 and 2, losing first at Connecticut on a rain-slicked field 2 - 1 and again to Chicago at Pierce Stadium in a torrential rain storm 1 to nothing.

The Cobras are currently boasting a record of 1 win and 2 losses and the Oceaneers are hoping a dry field will enable them to break out with a vastly improved scoring punch from Jose Neto and Mohammed Attiah.
