In NASL rankings, Lettieri placed 6th with a season GAA of 5.68 while Gross finished in 7th position with an overall 6.00 GAA. Darryl Wallace compiled a 4.48 season average but did not have enough minutes to qualify for the final listings. Chris Turner's final average was 6.67. The NASL's leading Indoor goalkeeper was Blagoje Tamindzic of Toronto with a 5.17 GAA in 18 games.

SOX FEATURE NASL RECORD OFFENSE: San Diego's attack produced a new league record for goals scored with 147, breaking Chicago's old mark of 146. The 1980-81 Sockers scored 106 team goals, which ranked then 9th in the league.

VEEE FINISHES AS NASL'S BEST: Julie Veee finished the regular season as the league's leading goalscorer and pointscorer, with 51 goals, 38 assists, and 140 points. Both goal and point totals are new NASL records. Veee also led the league in shorthanded goals with 3. His 140 points were 34 points ahead of second place Karl-Heinz Granitza of Chicago, last season's point and goal champion.

Veee completed two perfect seasons of goalscoring, running his NASL record to 35 consecutive games. The streak began in Tulsa on November 15, 1980 when he scored 2 goals in the Sox first-ever Indoor game. His final game this season was a 6-goal performance against San Jose on February 14. Veee has scored 91 goals in those 35 games, and averaged 3 goals-per-game this season, and opponents did not hold him to less than 2 goals in any game this year.

VEEE SCORES 36 VS. VANCOUVER: In four games this season, Julie Veee has scored 14 goals, 8 assists, and 36 points against the Whitecaps, to include a 6-goal performance in Vancouver on January 12.

His highest production was against San Jose, having scored 15 goals, 9 assists, and 39 points in 4 games. His other totals are: Edmonton; 3 games, 7 goals, 19 points; Portland; 4 games, 10 goals, 31 points; Seattle; 2 games, 5 goals, 13 points.

GERRY GRAY PACES WHITECAPS SCORING: Vancouver finished the regular season with a 10-8 record, 8-1 at home and 2-7 on the road. The 'Caps have lost 6 of their last 8 games and will be playing their playoff games in a different arena from their regular season. Gerry Gray led the team in regular season scoring with 20 goals, 15 assists, and 55 points. Carl Valentine was second with 13 goals, 24 assists, and 50 points, and Anders Ohlsson third with 15 goals, 18 assists, and 48 points.

Valentine recently signed a new six-year contract with Vancouver, believed to be the longest termed contract in the NASL.

INJURIES: For San Diego, Jean Willrich most likely will not see any action in this playoff round, having pulled a hamstring muscle in Edmonton, February 10. Goalkeeper Chris Turner has a sprained thumb, but could play if needed. For the Whitecaps, defender Alan Goad is out with a knee injury and Anders Palmer has been hampered by a sprained ankle. Both injuries were received in San Diego on February 3.

GROSS, THE ATTACKING GOALKEEPER: In addition to his 7th place ranking among the NASL's Indoor goalkeepers, Volkmar Gross has the distinction of being an attacking netminder. Used in power play situations, Gross totaled 19 shots on the opposing goalkeeper, undoubtedly a new league record should the category exist. Gross did establish a new league mark for winning 7 consecutive games, erasing the record of 5 set last year by Lou Cioffi of Atlanta.
