The song concerns a ship called the Irish Rover, and while next week's visitors to Edwards Stadium came via Shannon Airport rather than Cork's coal docks, these Irish Rovers, THE CORK HIBERNIANS, will be carrying some symbolic bricks with them against our BUCCS. The "Hibs" have a fierce pride in their play, a rock-hard defense, and a couple of players from other teams in the Irish First Division.
