ABOUT

The Ohio Machine is one of the two latest additions to Major League Lacrosse and played its inaugural 2012 season at Selby Stadium at Ohio Wesleyan University. The Machine joined fellow newcomers the Charlotte Hounds and six other teams (Boston Cannons, Chesapeake Bayhawks, Denver Outlaws, Hamilton Nationals, Long Island Lizards and Rochester Rattlers) to play a total of 14 games during the 2012 MLL season.

The Machine is the first MLL team in Ohio and kicked off its season at home on May 19th in front of more than 6,100 fans in Delaware, Ohio. Every Machine game during the 2012 season, home and away, was broadcasted on national and/or regional television, including two games broadcasted live on CBS Sports Network and three games broadcasted live on SportsTime Ohio. SportsTime Ohio is the official regional television partner of the Ohio Machine.

The Machine is operated by President and General Manager John Algie and is coached by Head Coach Ted Garber and Assistant Coaches PJ Kavanagh and Bill Wolford.

STADIUM INFORMATION

Selby Stadium, located at 45 South Henry Street on the eastern edge of Ohio Wesleyan University in Delaware, OH, is not only home to the Machine, it is also home to the Battling Bishop's football, men's and women's track & field, men's and women's lacrosse and field hockey teams.

Selby Stadium hosted the 1988 NCAA Division III men's lacrosse championship game and has been the site of numerous playoff contests since.

The Machine's new home, which was built in 1929, seats approximately 9,100 and is an OmniGrass artificial playing surface. Selby Stadium most recently underwent a restoration project which included a new, two-level press box, new bleacher seats and refurbished locker rooms, as well as a state-of-the-art video board and sound system.



LACROSSE OPERATIONS



Ted Garber **Head Coach**

Ted Garber led the Ohio Machine into its 2012 inaugural season as Head Coach.

Garber's professional coaching experience dates back to the creation of MLL, where he was a head coach during the 2000 MLL Summer Showcase Tour. Garber was also head coach of the then Bridgeport Barrage for the MLL's inaugural season in 2001. Garber's professional career also includes stints as an assistant coach in Boston, Chicago and Rochester. In 2008, Garber reached a milestone and was recognized by U.S. Lacrosse for his 200th career victory. Prior to joining the MLL, Garber coached at University of New Hampshire (UNH) for 13 seasons and led the team to five Northeast Championships. He also led UNH to its first and only Division-I NCAA tournament game. Garber was named New England Coach of the Year in 1986 and was also the recipient of the Vincent Lobello New England Sportsmanship Award for Coaching.

In 1991, Garber followed his father – legendary lacrosse coach Dick Garber – as head coach at the University of Massachusetts (UM). In his four seasons with UM, Garber compiled a 37-17 record and two NCAA Tournament appearances. Garber's winning percentage (.685) is tops in school history.

In addition to his MLL and collegiate experience, Garber has spent more than 15 years coaching at the high school level, where he has won numerous Western New England titles and Founder's League Championships. Garber played college lacrosse at UNH and graduated in 1975. He was the team's leading scorer from 1971-1975 and captained during his senior season. He was selected for both the All-New England Team and the East-West New England All-Star Game. Garber was inducted into the University of New Hampshire Hall of Fame in 2006.

Garber is currently the Varsity Lacrosse Coach and an Admissions Affiliate at the renowned Loomis Chaffee School in Windsor, Connecticut, as well as an active regional and national lacrosse clinician and speaker. Garber and his wife, Deb, reside in Connecticut and have three children, Brooks, Brett and Brittany. Brett currently plays midfield for the Ohio Machine.



P.J. Kavanagh **Assistant Coach**

P.J. Kavanagh joins the Machine with more than 15 years of coaching experience, including his current tenure at the University of Mount Union where he was recently named the first-ever varsity men's lacrosse coach. Prior to Mount Union, Kavanagh spent seven seasons with SUNY-Plattsburgh in New York as an assistant coach and head coach. During his five seasons as head coach, Kavanagh posted a 47-34 mark including the three best seasons in team history. Kavanagh also served as an assistant coach for the Bridgeport Barrage during the MLL's inaugural season and has coached at two New England prep schools, as well as his prep alma mater of Henninger High School in Syracuse, NY.



Bill Wolford **Assistant Coach**

Bill Wolford, a Columbus, OH, native and a graduate of The Ohio State University, is currently director of Max Elite Lacrosse and co-director of the Max Elite 100 Lacrosse Camp, as well as assistant coach of the girl's lacrosse team at Worthington Kilbourne High School. Wolford has coached boys' and girls' lacrosse for more than 20 years, including head coaching positions at Upper Arlington High School (1987-1991), Worthington Kilbourne High School (1992-2006) and for the 2003 Korean U-19 National Team. He has coached in three state championship games and has won more than 230 games as head coach.

John Algie
President & General Manager

The Ohio Machine President and General Manager John Algie joined the Machine after working as an attorney for the international law firm of Jones Day where he focused on corporate transactional work including mergers & acquisitions and private equity transactions. Algie previously spent three years as MLL's Director of League Operations where his responsibilities included implementation and enforcement of the League's on-field and player personnel rules, college and pro player scouting, and game operations management.

Algie was also one of the primary catalysts for MLL's change from a 45-second to the 60-second shot clock that has been in effect since the 2005 season and currently serves as the Chair of the MLL's Rules Committee. Algie is also a Trustee for the Delaware Convention & Visitor's Bureau and the Chair of the Bureau's Marking Committee.

Algie graduated magna cum laude from the University of Pittsburgh School of Law. He also earned his Master of Business Administration from the Joseph M. Katz Graduate School of Business. A native of Long Island, NY, Algie played college lacrosse for the University of Pittsburgh while earning his BS in Finance. He currently resides in Upper Arlington with his wife, Danielle.



Matt Hastings
Director, Ticket Sales

Matt Hastings serves as the Ohio Machine's Director of Ticket Sales after spending two years with the Washington Stealth of the National Lacrosse League where he led the team in revenue generation and in ticket sales. Hastings graduated cum laude from Robert Morris University with a degree in Sport Management and was a four year letterman for its lacrosse team.

While at Robert Morris, Hastings also worked in the school's athletic department in various positions. After graduation, he traveled to the Pacific Northwest where he also spent time with the WNBA Seattle Storm's ticketing department and worked part time as a box office employee for the University of Washington athletic department before joining the Stealth.

2012 Ohio Machine Season in Review

- Ranked second in MLL for power-play percentage (38.30)
- Ranked second in MLL for two-point goals scored (15)
- Ranked fourth in MLL for shooting percentage (.284)
- Twenty four different Machine players registered a point throughout the season
- Six Machine players scored 10 or more goals throughout the season
- Nine rookies dressed this season (Steele Stanwick, Joe Cummings, Billy Eisenreich, Anthony Biscardi, Bobby Eilers, Marshall Burkhart, Kiel Matisz, Rob Rotanz, Keenan Ochwat) and six of them recorded at least one point
- Three Machine rookies had nine or more points - Steele Stanwick, Joe Cummings and Kiel Matisz
- Six Machine players who had played for previous teams set career highs in points, including Chazz Woodson (points, goals, assists and shots) and Connor Martin (goals, assists, points, groundballs and shots)

Greg Bice, 2012 co-captain, started in 13 games during the 2012 season and tallied his first point with an assist against the Charlotte Hounds (5/12). Against the Long Island Lizards (6/1), Bice scooped up a season high four groundballs. Bice took his first shot of the season against the Denver Outlaws (6/9) and had two groundballs. Bice recorded his 15th groundball of the season against the Hounds (6/23). In his fourth All-Star Game (6/30), Bice scooped up three groundballs for Team Old School. 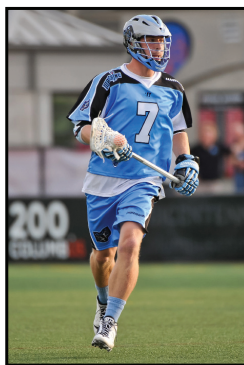

THE BASICS

POSITIONS

Each team is allowed a maximum of 10 players on the field at once.

Attack - Three (3) Attackmen play at a time. Like strikers in soccer, the Attack is counted on for most of the scoring. Unlike soccer however, the Attack must remain on its offensive side of the field.

Defense - The counterpart to the Attack, three (3) Defensemen play at a time. The Defense must remain on its defensive side of the field, covering the opponent's Attack.

Midfield - The workhorses of the team, the three (3) Midfielders aren't restricted to one side of the field and therefore are counted on to play offense and defense. Because teams are free to substitute on the fly, many teams rotate situational specialists at the Midfield.

Long-stick Midfielder - As a specialist Midfielder, the Long-Stick Midfielder is usually counted on to cover the opposing team's best Midfielder. So named because they play with a much longer defensive stick.

Faceoff Specialist - Another specialist, this Midfielder takes the majority of the team's face-offs and, upon securing possession for the team, usually leaves the field to be replaced with a more offensively-skilled Midfielder.

Goalkeeper - Perhaps the craziest job in all of sports, Goalkeepers are responsible for saving shots coming in at speeds of up to 111 mph while wearing a minimal amount of equipment. A Goalie's ability to direct the Defense, as well as make smart outlet passes to get the offense started, are often as important as his ability to make saves.



EQUIPMENT

“Crosse” - More commonly referred to simply as a lacrosse stick, comes in three (3) basic varieties, each with a metal shaft and a plastic head, which contains the pocket.

“Short Stick” - The most common stick on the field, the shaft measures up to 42 inches in length and is used by Attackmen and Midfielders.

“Long Pole” - These shafts can measure up to six feet in length and are used by the Defensemen and Long Stick Midfielders. Each team is permitted to have no more than four (4) Long Poles on the field at a time.

Goalie Stick - The Goalkeeper's stick has a much larger head to help make saves.

“Cradling” - This is the method used to keep the ball inside the pocket by rocking the stick back and forth to create centrifugal force.

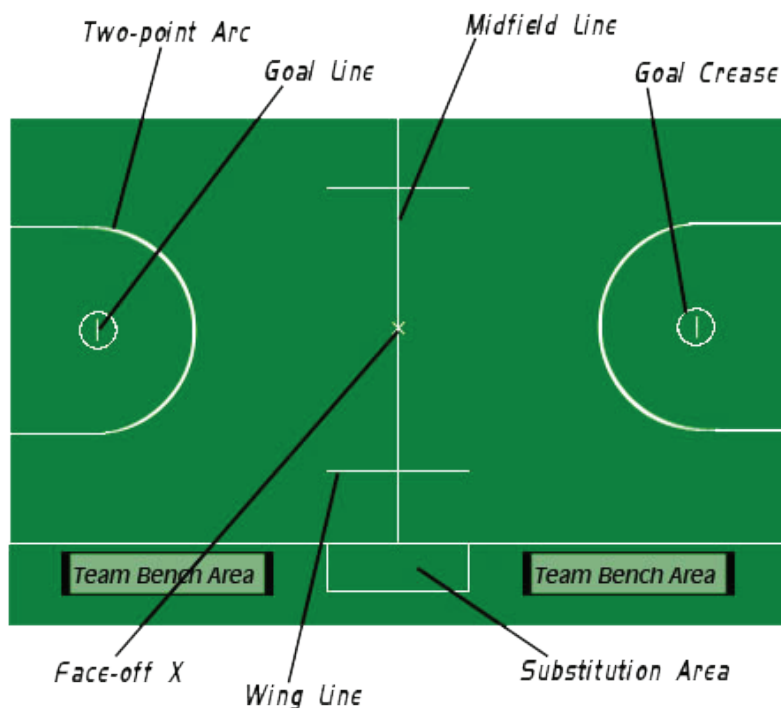
- The game is played over four (4) 15-minute quarters.
- Each quarter is "running time" - the game clock generally does not stop on whistles - except during the last two minutes of each quarter
- If the game is tied at the end of regulation, the teams play 10-minute overtime periods until a goal is scored; games do not end in a tie.

Differences from College:

MLL features several rule variations from the college game including:

- A 16-yard Two-Point Arc
- A 60-second Shot Clock
- Faster restarts of play after whistle
- Faster substitution rules, i.e. no "sideline horn"

PLAYING THE GAME



The Face-Off: Play begins each quarter at the Face-Off X with two (2) opposing players, usually "Face-Off Specialists," crouching down over the ball with their sticks parallel to the Midfield Line. Each team has two additional Midfielders lined up behind the Wing Lines. On the whistle, the players facing-off attempt to pick up the ball or direct it to a teammate. Once one team gains possession, the 60-second Shot Clock begins.

Scoring: The team in possession of the ball has 60 seconds to score a goal. The ball is usually shot from the stick but may also be kicked in or directed with any part of the body but the hands. The ball must completely cross the Goal Line to count as a goal. A goal shot from outside the 16-yard arc counts as two points, all others count as one point. A Face-Off occurs after every goal.

Resetting the Shot Clock: If the ball hits the goalkeeper or a goal post, the Shot Clock is reset back to :60. If the Shot Clock expires, the opposing team is awarded possession, with the Shot Clock beginning anew.

Clearing: If a team loses possession of the ball in the offensive zone (for example, a Goalkeeper save or a Shot Clock violation), the team gaining possession will immediately attempt to "clear" the ball over the Midfield Line. If the team fails to clear the ball within 20 seconds, possession is awarded to the other team.

Substitutions: Teams may substitute players at any time during play. All such substitutions must be made through the substitution box in a "one off" for "one on" fashion.





FAST FACTS

Common Penalties

Holding: Occurs when a player impedes the movement of an opponent or an opponent's crosse

Offsides: Occurs when a team does not have at least four (4) players on its defensive side of the midfield line or at least three (3) players on its offensive side of the midfield line

Pushing: Occurs when a player thrusts or shoves a player from behind

Slashing: Occurs when a player's stick viciously contacts an opponent in any area other than the stick or gloved hand on the stick

Illegal Body Check: Occurs when a player is hit above the shoulders, below the waist or from the rear

Enforcement of penalties can result in loss of possession and/or suspension from the game (usually for thirty seconds or one minute).

TERMINOLOGY

Backing Up: When the ball is shot out of bounds, the team whose player is closest to the ball is awarded possession; backing up is when an offensive player deliberately positions himself to be closest to the ball if it is shot out of bounds by a teammate

Body Check: Defensive move used to slow an opponent who has the ball; must be above the waist and below neck



Bull Dodge: Offensive power move in which the shooter pushes the defender towards the goal in an attempt to keep the defender off-balance and get a better shot on goal

Clear: An attempt by the team in possession to transition the ball from defense to offense

Cradle: Method used to keep the ball inside the pocket of the stick by rocking it back and forth

Crease: The nine-foot radius containing the goal in which offensive players cannot enter. Shooters and their teammates cannot stand on (or inside) the line or their goals won't count



Crosscheck: Defensive strategy using the shaft of stick to redirect an opponent

Face-Off: Takes place at the start of each quarter and after every goal. Two opposing players crouch down at midfield, hold their sticks flat on the ground and press the backs of their stick pockets together; the ball is then placed between the pockets and, when signaled to start, the players "rake" or clamp the ball to vie for control

Failure to Advance: Upon gaining possession of the ball and resetting of the Shot Clock, the failure of a team to advance the ball from its defensive end of the field within 20 seconds

Ground Ball: Occurs when there is no possession and the ball is bouncing, rolling or deflected off the goaltender

Power Play: When a team has a man advantage because the other team has at least one (1) player in the penalty box

Ride or Riding: Defending a clear; an attempt to stop the team in possession from clearing the ball

Roll Dodge: Offensive move in which the player with the ball rolls with his back to the defender to free his hands for a pass

Shorthanded: When one team has at least one more player serving time for a penalty than its opponent



Shot Clock Violation: Failure to get a shot on goal—whether it hits the post, rebounds off the goalkeeper or is saved by a defensive player in the crease—in 60 seconds

Split Dodge: When an offensive player with the ball changes direction by moving the stick from one hand to the other in a crossover motion

Takeaway Check: An attempt to strip the offensive player of the ball using the defenseman's stick

MAJOR LEAGUE LACROSSE

BACKGROUND

During the summer of 1998, Jake "Body By Jake" Steinfeld was inspired to start a professional outdoor lacrosse league after reading a magazine article about the growth of the sport. Steinfeld sought out a contributor to the article, Owner and President of Warrior Lacrosse Dave Morrow, to discuss formation of such a league. In February 1999, Steinfeld and Morrow joined forces with Steinfeld's friend and business associate Tim Robertson, Chairman of Bay Shore Enterprises and former CEO of the Family Channel, to form Major League Lacrosse. Major League Lacrosse began play in 2001, to capitalize on the growing demand for world-class field lacrosse driven by dramatic growth in the U.S. lacrosse market.

In 2003, New Balance Athletic Shoe Inc. came on board as a Founding Member of Major League Lacrosse, as well as an Anchor Level League Sponsor. MLL has been praised for its on-field play and is widely regarded as the pinnacle of the sport. Major League Lacrosse has continued to lead the sport of lacrosse into the mainstream of competitive team sports.

TELEVISION INFORMATION

ESPN2 has been the national television home of Major League Lacrosse since 2003, when the two parties agreed on a two-year commitment. In 2004, ESPN aired the New Balance Championship Game, making it the first live national telecast of a Major League Lacrosse competition. In 2007, Major League Lacrosse and ESPN reached an agreement that extended their relationship through the 2016 season, which is the longest commitment that any television outlet has given to a lacrosse entity.

In 2011, all 36 regular season games in addition to the 2011 Sports Authority MLL All-Star Game and the 2011 Sports Authority MLL Championship Weekend presented by Warrior are broadcast in syndication.

In 2012, CBS Sports Network broadcasted 14 live games in HD, along with all 18 episodes of "Inside the MLL," the league's 30-minute magazine show. Additionally, six games were broadcasted live on ESPN2. In 2012, a total number of 20 games this past season were nationally televised. ESPN3 also streamed 46 live games on ESPN3.com. The 2012 MLL All-Star Game presented by Moe's was broadcasted on ESPN2, as well the 2012 MLL Championship games.

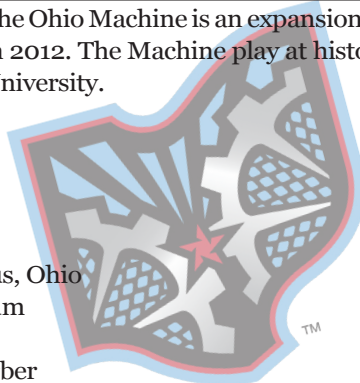
