



#### Zach Heilman Ticket Sales Manager



#### Ted Garber Head Coach

Ted Garber led the Ohio Machine into its 2012 inaugural season as Head Coach.

Garber's professional coaching experience dates back to the creation of MLL, where he was a head coach during the 2000 MLL Summer Showcase Tour. Garber was also head coach of the then Bridgeport Barrage for the MLL's inaugural season in 2001. Garber's professional career also includes stints as an assistant coach in Boston,

Chicago and Rochester. In 2008, Garber reached a milestone and was recognized by U.S. Lacrosse for his 200th career victory. Prior to joining the MLL, Garber coached at the University of New Hampshire (UNH) for 13 seasons and led the team to five Northeast Championships. He also led UNH to its first and only Division-I NCAA tournament game. Garber was named New England Coach of the Year in 1986 and was also the recipient of the Vincent Lobello New England Sportsmanship Award for Coaching.

In 1991, Garber followed his father – legendary lacrosse coach Dick Garber – as head coach at the University of Massachusetts (UM). In his four seasons with UM, Garber compiled a 37-17 record and two NCAA Tournament appearances. Garber's winning percentage (.685) is tops in school history.

In addition to his MLL and collegiate experience, Garber has spent more than 15 years coaching at the high school level, where he has won numerous Western New England titles and Founder's League Championships. Garber played college lacrosse at UNH and graduated in 1975. He was the team's leading scorer from 1971-1975 and captained during his senior season. He was selected for both the All-New England Team and the East-West New England All-Star Game. Garber was inducted into the University of New Hampshire Hall of Fame in 2006.

Garber is currently the Varsity Lacrosse Coach and an Admissions Affiliate at the renowned Loomis Chaffee School in Windsor, CT, as well as an active regional and national lacrosse clinician and speaker. Garber and his wife, Deb, reside in Connecticut and have three children, Brooks, Brittany and Brett who currently plays midfield for the Ohio Machine.



#### PJ Kavanagh Assistant Coach

P.J. Kavanagh joins the Machine with more than 15 years of coaching experience, including his current tenure at the University of Mount Union where he was recently named the first-ever varsity men's lacrosse coach.

Prior to Mount Union, Kavanagh spent seven seasons with SUNY-Plattsburgh in New York as an assistant coach and head coach. During his five seasons as head coach, Kavanagh posted a 47-34 mark including the three best seasons in team history.

Kavanagh also served as an assistant coach for the Bridgeport Barrage during the MLL's inaugural season and has coached at two New England prep schools, as well as his prep alma mater of Henninger High School in Syracuse, NY.



#### Bill Wolford Assistant Coach

Bill Wolford, a Columbus, OH, native and a graduate of The Ohio State University, is currently director of Max Elite Lacrosse and co-director of the Max Elite 100 Lacrosse Camp, as well as assistant coach of the girl's lacrosse team at Worthington Kilbourne High School.

Wolford has coached boys' and girls' lacrosse for more than 20 years, including head coaching positions at Upper Arlington High School (1987-1991), Worthington Kilbourne High School (1992-2006) and for the 2003

Korean U-19 National Team. He has coached in three state championship games and has won more than 230 games as a head coach.

### Frank Baverso

Frank Baverso serves as team equipment manager overseeing maintenance of all team equipment/clothing. This includes the accountability for the distribution and inventory of equipment, loading and unloading of equipment for each home game and packing of game equipment and athletic clothing for all away games, as well as unpacks and organizes equipment/clothing upon return. Baverso also assisted with all game day operations from setup and breakdown of field and locker rooms to food and beverage needs of players, coaches and officials. Baverso graduated from Youngstown State University in 2011 with a Bachelor's in General Studies focus in Special Education and is currently attending Kent State University for his Master's in Sports and Recreation Management.

He has served as an athletic trainer for the annual North-South Ohio All-Star football game. Annually he works as an athletic trainer for the Tournament of Champions wrestling event held at Columbus Convention Center. Evans has a clinical interest in stretching and the effects it has on athletic activity and he is also interested in the ongoing research on head injuries among athletes.

#### Dr. Robert Green


#### Team Dentist



#### 2012 MLL Bio:

Greg Bice, 2012 co-captain, started in 13 of the 14 games in 2012 and tallied his first point of the season against the Charlotte Hounds (5/12). Against the Long Island Lizards (6/1), Bice scooped up a season-high four groundballs. Bice took his first shot of the season against the Denver Outlaws (6/9) and had two groundballs followed by his 15th groundball of the season against the Hounds (6/23). In his fourth All-Star Game (6/30), Bice scooped up three groundballs for Team Old School. A week later at Denver, Bice tied his season high in groundballs with four. Bice scored his first goal of the season against the Chesapeake Bayhawks (7/21) and picked up three groundballs. Bice recorded his second goal of the season in the team's first game against the Boston Cannons (8/4) and in his final game of the year against the Cannons (8/11), Bice had two groundballs. Bice was also named to the 2012 Team USA for the "Duel in Denver" exhibition.





For the Bayhawks, midfielders Ben Hunt and Steven Brooks had four goals apiece. Goalies T.C DiBartolo and Joey Kemp split time in the cage, combining for 16 saves.







#### **2013 DANCE MACHINE** Offical Dance Team of the Ohio Machine






#### **Ohio Machine Out in the Community**

The Ohio Machine not only fosters the growth of the sport of lacrosse in Ohio but also helps in the betterment of the community as a whole. The Machine has enjoyed various events from lacrosse clinics and Mainstreet Delaware's First Fridays to Midwest Lacrosse store appearances and non-profit appearances with The Salvation Army and Flying Horse Farms.







#### About Major League Lacrosse:

During the summer of 1998, Jake "Body By Jake" Steinfeld was inspired to start a professional outdoor lacrosse league after reading a magazine article about the growth of the sport of lacrosse. Steinfeld sought out a contributor to the article, Owner and President of Warrior Lacrosse Dave Morrow, a leading lacrosse equipment manufacturer, to discuss formation of such a league.

In February 1999 Steinfeld and Morrow joined forces with Steinfeld's friend and business associate Tim Robertson, Chairman of Bay Shore Enterprises and former CEO of the Family Channel, to form Major League Lacrosse, LLC, a Virginia limited liability company. In 2003, New Balance Athletic Shoe Inc. came on board as a Founding Member of Major League Lacrosse, as well as an Anchor Level League Sponsor.

Major League Lacrosse began play in 2001 to capitalize on the growing demand for world-class field lacrosse driven by dramatic growth in the U.S. lacrosse market. The MLL was praised and heralded for its on-field play, regarded as the best ever seen. With a year-on-year attendance increase, Major League Lacrosse has continued to lead the sport of lacrosse into the mainstream of competitive team sports.

#### MLL Teams:

MLL is comprised of eight teams across the US and Canada. The Boston Cannons, Chesapeake Bayhawks (formerly Baltimore and Washington), New York Lizards (formally Long Island) and Rochester Rattlers are original teams starting in 2001. The Denver Outlaws began play in 2006 as part of the League's western expansion. The Hamilton Nationals (formerly Toronto) joined MLL in 2009 as the League's first international team. The Charlotte Hounds and Ohio Machine began play in 2012 as a part of the League's expansion initiative to have 16 teams in the next decade.

#### 2013 Season:

The 2013 Major League Lacrosse season consists of a total of 56 regular season games running from April to August with the following league-run special events: The Major League Lacrosse Collegiate Draft (January 11), MLL All-Star Weekend (July 12-13), and the MLL Championship Weekend (August 24 & 25). The thirteenth season of MLL action begins April 27, 2013.

**OUR GAME**: Major League Lacrosse has implemented some innovative dynamics to the traditional game of field lacrosse that bring the sport into the next millennium. MLL rule changes include the addition of a two-point goal line located 16 yards from each goal and a 60-second shot clock.

**SPONSORSHIP**: A full range of integrated sponsorship packages are available. Partnerships can include league/team category exclusivity, special events rights, corporate branding on player uniforms, national TV commercial units and in-game TV features, field signage, SLASH Magazine ads, web site banners, tickets/hospitality, game footage, photo usages, player appearances, customized activation, and cross-promotional programs.

TELEVISION: Past Seasons: ESPN2 has been the national television home of Major League Lacrosse since 2003, when the two parties agreed on a two-year commitment. In 2004, ESPN aired the New Balance Championship Game, making it the first live national telecast of a Major League Lacrosse competition. Today, MLL and ESPN's relationship is the longest commitment that any television outlet has given to a lacrosse entity. The partnership between the MLL and ESPN continued to grow when on June 9, 2007, ESPN360.com, ESPN's signature broadband network, streamed its first MLL game live from Sports Authority Field at Mile High. ESPN360.com went on to stream 5 more MLL events that season. In 2008, all 64 MLL games, including the All-Star game, both, Semi-Finals, and the NB ZIP MLL Championship Game were streamed live on ESPN360.com. After airing live, the games were archived on the website for a period of one week. In 2008, MLL licensed its broadcast and digital media rights to Lax United Marketing (LUM). The 2008 season also marked the first time in League history that every regular season MLL game was broadcast live on regional sports networks throughout the country. Lax United Marketing syndicated every game not available on ESPN2. In 2010, ESPN2 aired a total of 6 MLL games, including live broadcasts of the All-Star Game (July 8) from Boston, as well as the first Semi-Final game (August 21) and the MLL Championship Game presented by Warrior (August 22) from Annapolis. In 2011, all 36 regular season games in addition to the 2011 Sports Authority MLL All-Star Game (July 9) and the 2011 Sports Authority MLL Championship Weekend presented by Warrior (August 27 and 28), were broadcast in syndication. Every MLL game was streamed live on ESPN3.com in HD, and a total of six MLL games including the All-Star Game and the Championship Weekend were broadcast live on ESPN2.In 2012, MLL announced a major television agreement with CBS Sports Network that brought 14 live games in HD to CBS along with all 18 episodes of "Inside the MLL." Six games also aired live on ESPN2, bringing the total number of nationally televised live games to 20 last season. ESPN3 also streamed 46 live games on ESPN3.com.

*This Season* MLL recently announced an increase to their television agreement with CBS Sports Network that will bring 20 live games, up from 14 in 2012, in HD to CBS along with all 18 episodes of "Inside the MLL," the league's 30-minute magazine show. Additionally, six games will again be aired live on ESPN2, which brings the total number of nationally televised live games to 26 in the 2013 season. 


