Matt Bocklet, Team President

"I am excited by the opportunity to lead an organization that has had such a profound impact on my career and my life."



Matt Bocklet took over as team president in 2020 after an illustrious career playing and working in the front office for the Outlaws.

Bocklet previously ran Outlaws Academy, managing all levels of the valuable revenue generating venture and community engagement outlet for the Outlaws. He also served as the team's Defensive Coordinator in 2019. Outside of the Outlaws, Bocklet is an owner of X10 Lacrosse, serves as the Director of Team 91 Colorado, and coached Cherry Creek High School, winning the 2019 State Championship. Bocklet spent 6 years as the Head Coach at Highlands Ranch High School, where he was named CHSAA Coach of the Year in 2014. He also serves on the Young Professionals Board for Denver City Lax.

A Johns Hopkins University graduate, Matt Bocklet takes over one of the most successful MLL teams in the league's history. The Outlaws have competed in nine MLL Championships, most recently in the 2019 season. The Outlaws have won three Championships while Bocklet served as team captain ('18, '16 and '14). The Outlaws have won 124 games in their fourteen-year history. Bocklet will leverage his leadership experience on the field, in the community and from past business ventures to build on the franchise's success.

Before retiring from play in 2018, Bocklet served as a star defenseman for the Outlaws. He was a captain for all three of the team's Championship titles, is the franchise's all-time leader in games played (144), appeared in five(5) All-Star Games, is ranked third all-time in MLL for ground balls, and in recognition of such a prestigious career, had his number (#7) retired by the Outlaws in 2019.



Jon Cohen, General Manager

"The Outlaws have had a ton of success over the last couple decades and a championship is always the expectation. That is the hope this year."



Jon Cohen enters his 14th season with the Outlaws in 2020 and second as general manager.

Cohen, the Outlaws' longest tenured coach, has served as Director of Player Personnel (2018), Assistant GM/Coach (2013-18), Head Equipment Manager (2008-12) and Visiting Team Liaison (2007) for Denver.

Denver boasts a 114-60 (.655 pct.) record in Cohen's time with the club, which represents the best record in the league in that span. In his six years as Assistant General Manager, Denver amassed a 55-29 (.655 pct.) record and won the major League Lacrosse Championship in 2014, '16 and '18.

In 2016, Cohen helped lead the Outlaws to its tenth MLL Playoff appearance, sixth MLL Championship appearance, and second MLL Title in franchise history.

He helped lead the 2013 Outlaws to becoming the first team in MLL history to finish a season undefeated. Denver set 21 team records and 10 MLL records in 2013 on its way to become the first team in MLL history and just the fourth team in North American major pro sports to finish a regular season undefeated.

Cohen graduated from the University of Nevada Las Vegas in 2009, majoring in Hospitality Management. He played lacrosse at UNLV where he was an All American and Academic All-American defender.

Before moving to Colorado, Cohen was a two-time Nevada high school state champion coach at Bishop Gorman in 2008 and 2009.



Tony Seaman, Head Coach



Seaman enters his ninth overall season with the Outlaws and second as head coach. Serving as the team's general manager from 2012-18, Seaman assembled rosters that featured 43 MLL All-Stars, 13 All-MLL selections and seven year-end MLL award winners. Seaman is also the most recent winner of the MLL Coach of the Year award (2019). As head coach, the Outlaws have earned a 17-13 (.567 pct.) record, making it to the Championship game in both 2018 and '19.

In his seven years as the team's general manager, the Outlaws amassed a league-best 66-32 (.673 pct.) record and won three MLL Championships.

Seaman joined the Outlaws after spending the previous 28 years coaching at the collegiate level. He currently serves as a member of the prestigious NCAA Division I Men's Lacrosse Committee. In his first five years as GM, the Outlaws set a league record for wins in a five-year span and delivered Denver its first and second MLL Championships.

Seaman helped lead the Outlaws to their third Steinfeld Trophy win in five seasons in 2018, thanks in large part to his success in that season's supplemental and collegiate drafts.

Seaman tutored 85 All-Americans during coaching career at the University of Pennsylvania (1983-91), Johns Hopkins University (1991-99) and Towson University (1999-2011). He registered a 247-153 (.618 pct.) career coaching record at the college level and his teams reached the NCAA Tournament 19 times during his career.

He is the only coach to be named the NCAA National Coach of the Year at two different schools (Penn – 1983, '84 and Towson – 2001), and is the only coach in NCAA Division I lacrosse history to lead three different schools to the NCAA tournament (Penn – 6 times, Johns Hopkins – 8 times and Towson – 5 times).

In 1994, Seaman coached the United States National Team in the 1994 ILF World Championships in Manchester, England, leading the U.S. to the gold medal.

Seaman and his wife Guri have a daughter, Barb, who played lacrosse at Penn and a son, Greg, who played for Princeton University.

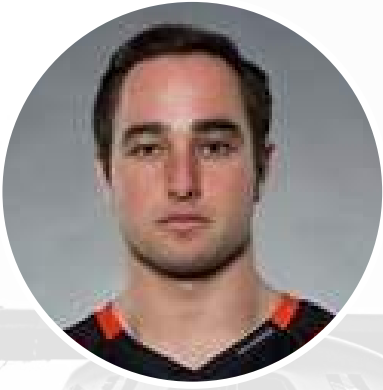

A fourth-year faceoff specialist from Bentley University that's won 177-of-310 (57.1%) of faceoffs taken in 10 career games played.

Played in seven regular season games in 2018 and ranked third in MLL by winning 57.9 percent of faceoffs (131-of-227).

Won a career-high 71.8 percent of faceoffs (28-of-39) in a matchup against Trevor Baptiste on July 4, 2018.

Played for Team Israel in the 2018 FIL World Lacrosse Championship and served as the team's primary faceoff specialist.

Made his professional debut on July 15, 2017 at Ohio.

Finished fourth in Division II in faceoff-win percentage (67.9 percent) as a senior at Bentley and ranked third in ground balls per game (9.54).

Drafted by Denver in the seventh round (61st overall) of the 2017 MLL Collegiate Draft.

2019: Adler played in 15 regular-season games for Denver, winning a league-best 58.3% of faceoffs (256-of-439) while adding 110 ground balls and eight points (5 goals, 3 assists)... Played in both postseason contests, winning 28-of-56 faceoffs (50%) and corralling 17 ground balls... Named to the MLL All-Star Game for the first time in his career.

2018: Played in seven regular season games and ranked third in MLL by winning 57.9 percent of faceoffs (131-of-227)... Led the Outlaws with 48 ground balls and ranked 10th in MLL, despite playing in just seven games.

2017: Played in three games as a rookie, recording one goal and 19 ground balls while winning 46-of-83 faceoffs (55.4%)... Recorded 13 ground balls at Chesapeake (8/3), an Outlaws season-high.

College: Dominated in the face-off circle during his career at Bentley, finishing fourth in Division II in face-off winning percentage (67.9%) as a senior and ranking third in ground balls per game (9.54)... Ranked third in face-off winning percentage (.728) and fourth in ground balls per game (9.15) as a junior.
