



ANNE LEVINSON

A long-time resident of Seattle and former public official, Anne led the effort in 2007 to form a local ownership group and negotiate the purchase of the Storm to save women's professional basketball in the Pacific Northwest.

Anne began her career in public service in the City of Seattle, starting in the City's budget office, then serving variously as a special assistant to the Mayor, Chief of staff, Legal Counsel and Deputy Mayor. She was then appointed by Governor Locke as Chair of Washington State's Utilities & Transportation Commission, where she helped lead the state's fight against energy deregulation. After that she served as a judge, creating one of the nation's first mental health courts, to help ensure that persons with mental illness get appropriately diverted out of jail and connected with treatment, shelter and case management. Upon retiring from the bench she served as an advisor to governments and non-profits, leading several projects directed toward systemic improvements for the child welfare and juvenile justice systems.

She has founded or served on the board of directors for dozens of Seattle charitable organizations, and currently serves on the board of directors for the Center for Children & Youth Justice, on a national advisory panel for the MacArthur Foundation, and advisory boards for the Women's Funding Alliance and NEW (National Education for Women's) Leadership Puget Sound. In 2006, she chaired the statewide campaign to defeat the attempted repeal of the State's anti-discrimination law, protecting gay men and lesbians from job and housing discrimination.

Levinson played field hockey in college and as an athlete led a multiyear effort to secure equal funding for the women's teams, ultimately filing one of the country's first Title IX complaints, resulting in more equitable treatment for female athletes. As Deputy Mayor, she was instrumental in Seattle acquiring its first professional women's basketball team, the Seattle Reign. Ginny Gilder has started several entrepreneurial ventures, both businesses and non-profits. Today she is principal of her own investment business and president of one of her family's philanthropic entities, which invests in projects throughout the world that seek to level the economic playing field and promote social justice. She established Washington Works, a local non-profit dedicated to supporting welfare recipients obtain and retain livablewage employment, and served as its first Executive Director. She has also served on various non-profit boards, locally and around the country, all focused on education or sports.

A rower, she earned four varsity letters at Yale University, and was an All-lvy Champion twice. Her freshman year she helped usher in the post-Title IX era at Yale by participating in the now-famous women's crew strip-in protesting the lack of equal facilities. In addition, she represented the United States on four national teams, including two Olympic teams. She was named to the U.S. team which boycotted the 1980 Moscow Olympic Games and won a silver medal at the Los Angeles Olympic Games in 1984. She has helped launch two community rowing programs, one in Boston, MA and another in Derby, CT. She received an NCAA Silver Anniversary Award for community service in 2004. Ginny resides with her partner, Lynn Slaughter, an avid Storm fan, and has three children, all athletes themselves.

Lisa Brummel is the senior vice president for Human Resources at Microsoft, and a member of Microsoft's senior management team. During 14 years at Microsoft she held a variety of leadership positions, heading up divisions in Database and Development tools as well as Consumer Products. For the past twelve years she has helped emerging non-profits to develop the capacity to deliver their programs with maximum effectiveness.

She is the President of the Seattle Storm Foundation, chairs the Board of the Economic Opportunity Institute and is a member of the University of Washington Women's Center Advisory Board. She also serves on the Board of Social Venture Partners International and the Advisory Board of the Business Partnership for Early Learning.

Trudeau focuses her energies on early learning and social and economic justice programs that help provide equal opportunity for all people to develop economic security and personal success.

Karen Bryant has been involved with women's professional basketball for the past 14 years. She started her career in sports in 1996 as the Director of Operations for the American Basketball League's Seattle Reign. She then served as General Manager of the Reign before being recruited in June 1999 by the Seattle Sonics to lead the organization's effort to secure a WNBA expansion franchise.

Under Bryant's leadership the past ten seasons, the Storm has been recognized as one of the top franchises in the WNBA. Named the Storm's Chief Executive Officer in 2008, Bryant is responsible for overseeing business and basketball operations for the franchise.

Bryant was recognized as one of the *Puget Sound Business Journal's* Women of Influence in 2005. She is involved with several non-profit organizations and currently serves on the board of the Seattle Sports Commission.

Bryant was a standout athlete at Woodway High School in Edmonds before continuing her basketball career at Green River Community College, Seattle University and the University of Washington. She graduated from U.W. with a degree in Communications.

The 2010 WNBA season marks Brian Agler's third campaign as the Seattle Storm head coach, and his seventh year as a head coach in the WNBA. Agler was introduced as the Storm's head coach on Jan. 8, 2008 and is the third coach in Storm history. He also assumed the role of director of player personnel.

Prior to joining the Storm is 2008, Agler was the head coach and general manager of the expansion team Minnesota Lynx from 1999-2002, where he compiled a 42-54 (.438) record. Before being named the first coach of the expansion Lynx, Agler served as the head coach of the Columbus Quest of the ABL from 1996-1999, compiling an 82-22 record. He led the Quest to back-to-back ABL championships in 1997 and 1998 and was named the ABL Coach of the Year for the 1996-97 season.

Agler completed his third season as an assistant coach for the San Antonio Silver Stars in 2007. Prior to joining San Antonio, he served as assistant coach with the Phoenix Mercury and helped guide the team to a 17-17 record after the Mercury finished with an 8-26 record in 2003.

Agler spent 15 seasons coaching among the college ranks, including 13 seasons as a head coach. He posted an impressive collegiate record of 248-135 (.648 winning percentage). From 1993-96 he served as the head women's basketball coach at Kansas State.

In 1988, Agler took over as the head women's coach at the University of Missouri-Kansas City. In five seasons at UMKC, Agler was 85-54 and took the Kangaroos from a 9-16 record in 1988-89 to four straight winning seasons with 17 or more victories. Under his direction, UMKC led the NCAA in scoring defense three consecutive seasons from 1990-93. In 1991, UMKC set an NCAA team record, allowing 51.8 points per game.

As the head women's basketball coach at Northeast Oklahoma A&M Junior College from 1984-88, Agler compiled a 124-42 record (.747 winning percentage). In 1985-86, NEO A&M was ranked second nationally and posted a 30-2 record.



Agler attended Wittenberg University in Springfield, Ohio, where he starred on the basketball team for four seasons. He led the Tigers to their only NCAA Division III Championship in basketball as a freshman. He started all 112 games during his college career, leaving the school as the all-time assist leader (481). Agler helped lead his team to a 91-21 record during his four years with the Tigers, and was named most valuable player in the Ohio Athletic Conference and first-team All-America as a senior. In 1995, he was inducted into the Wittenberg Hall of Honor.

In 1980, Agler graduated with a degree in special education and physical education. He received his master's degree in education from Pittsburg State University (Pittsburg, Kansas) in 1985. Agler and his wife Robin, have one son, Bryce, and one daughter, Taylor.

NANCY DARSCH

**Assistant Coach** 

Nancy Darsch, in her third season as an assistant coach for the Seattle Storm, has coached women's basketball at both the professional and Division I college levels.

As head coach for the WNBA's New York Liberty during the inaugural season in 1997, she led them to the championship game and a 17-11 record. She compiled a 36-24 record with New York over two seasons. Darsch took over the reigns for the Washington Mystics in 1999. After two seasons as head coach of the Mystics, Darsch became an advance scout for the team for three seasons. She later joined the Minnesota Lynx as an assistant coach from 2003-2005.

In 2006 and 2007 Darsch was an assistant coach at Boston College, helping lead the Eagles to a 13-16 campaign in 2006-07, and a 20-11 record in 2007-08, including a berth in the post-season WNIT.

Prior to her WNBA experience, Darsch was the head coach at Ohio State University for 12 seasons. She compiled a record of 234-125 (.652) while at Ohio State. Darsch led the Buckeyes to four Big Ten Conference Championships and seven NCAA tournament appearances. In 1993, Darsch led Ohio State to an impressive 24-4 record, a Big Ten Championship and the NCAA championship game. Before her arrival at Ohio State, Darsch was an assistant coach at Tennessee for seven seasons under head coach Pat Summitt.

Darsch has also been involved with USA Basketball since 1984. She has won two Olympic gold medals as an assistant coach for the 1984 Olympic Games in Los Angeles and the 1996 Olympic Games in Atlanta.

A native of Plymouth, Mass., Darsch is a 1973 graduate of Springfield College. She earned her master's degree in physical education from the University of Tennessee.

Boucek joins the Storm in her first season as the director of player development and scouting. Boucek served as an assistant coach for the Storm under Anne Donovan during the 2003, 2004 and 2005 seasons and was an integral part of the 2004 WNBA championship team. Additionally, Boucek served as the head coach for the now-defunct Sacramento Monarchs and compiled a record of 40-41 during her two-plus seasons (2007-2009) with the organization.

After beginning her WNBA coaching career began in 1999 as an assistant with the Washington Mystics, Boucek spent three seasons as an assistant with the Miami Sol. She played professional basketball for two years before joining the coach ranks. In 1997, the WNBA's inaugural season, Boucek was a member of the Cleveland Rockers.

Boucek also played in Iceland in 1998 and was voted the country's best player after averaging 23 points, seven rebounds and six assists. She returned to Cleveland for the 1998 season but was forced to retire due to a career-ending back injury.

A four-year starter at the University of Virginia (1992-96), Boucek helped lead the Cavaliers to four regular-season ACC Championships and three NCAA Elite Eight appearances. She was a two-time GTE Academic All-America team member and two-time ACC selection. Boucek twice earned team Defensive Player of the Year honors and finished her career at Virginia as a member of the 1,000-point club. She also competed in the U.S. Olympic Festival in 1993.

A member of the 2000 inaugural Storm staff, Missy Bequette celebrates her 11th season with the club and has been the director of basketball operations since the 2001 season. She is responsible for all travel arrangements, housing and practice scheduling, in addition to assisting with the draft, scouting and player personnel.

A native of Crystal City, Mo., Bequette graduated from the University of Missouri-Columbia before earning a master's degree in education with an emphasis in sport management from the University of Arkansas. 

Lauren Jackson, Sue Bird and Swin Cash all were voted by fans as starters for the 2009 WNBA All-Star game.

Lauren Jackson reached her 5,000-career-point milestone Saturday, Aug. 15 in Atlanta, becoming the fastest in league history to reach the 5,000-points plateau. She also reached her 2,000-career-rebound milestone on Saturday, Aug. 1 at home vs. San Antonio.

Swin Cash also reached her 3,000-career-point milestone Saturday, Aug. 15 in Atlanta. Cash was also named the All-Star game MVP.

Sue Bird reached the 3,000-career point milestone at Sacramento on Friday, July 17, 2009. She passed Shannon Johnson on the career assists list this season, moving into the 2nd spot on the WNBA career list with 1,425.

Sue Bird won the 2009 WNBA Peak Performer Award for assists - she led the WNBA in assists, averaging 5.8 assists per game in 2009.

Lauren Jackson and Tanisha Wright were named to the 2009 WNBA All-Defensive First Team.

The first player chosen in expansion draft was Edna Campbell from the Phoenix Mercury.


The Storm played its inaugural regular-season game vs. the Sacramento Monarchs on May 31, 2000.

Jackson finished fourth in the WNBA in scoring (17.2 ppg) and third in blocks (2.89 bpg).



The Storm finished second in the Western Conference with a 20-14 record, setting the then franchise mark for regular-season wins.

Seattle won its first WNBA Championship, the city's first professional sports title in 25 years.

Betty Lennox, who was selected by the Storm in the 2004 WNBA Dispersal Draft, was named the WNBA Finals MVP after leading all players in the championship series by scoring an average of 22.3 points per game.

Lauren Jackson averaged 20.5 points per game to lead the WNBA in scoring for the second consecutive year.

Sue Bird and Jackson were named to the All-WNBA First Team. It was Bird's third year in a row and Jackson's second straight year receiving the honor.

Head Coach Anne Donovan became the first female coach to win the WNBA Championship. During the season, she also served as an assistant coach on the 2004 gold-medal winning U.S. Women's Senior National Team at the Olympic Summer Games in Athens, Greece. Bird was also a member of the Olympic-champion IU.S. souad.

Jackson won the silver medal, leading the Australian National Team to the Olympic final against the U.S.

## 2005 STORM SEASON NOTES

The Storm finished second in the Western Conference with a 20-14 record, matching the then franchise mark for regular-season wins.

Seattle made its third postseason appearance, falling 2-1 to Houston in the First Round.

The Storm set a club record by posting a 14-3 mark at KeyArena. The Storm finished the season with a nine-game home winning streak, the longest in team history.

Sue Bird and Lauren Jackson were both named to the All-WNBA First Team. Bird received the honor for the fourth consecutive year and Jackson for her third straight year.

Both Bird and Jackson were named as starters for the Western Conference in the 2005 WNBA All-Star Game.

Anne Donovan became the first female coach in WNBA history to win 100 games when the Storm beat the Minnesota Lynx

at KeyArena on Aug. 18. Donovan became the fourth coach overall to reach the 100-win plateau.

Sue Bird won the WNBA's assist title after finishing second the previous three seasons.



Jackson tallied her 3,000th career point on June 7 at Chicago, becoming the youngest (25 years, 33 days) and fastest (162 career games) player in WNBA history to reach the milestone.

The victory over Charlotte on Aug. 5 was the 120th of Anne Donovan's career, moving her past Michael Cooper and into third place on the league's all-time wins list.

Jackson was named to the 2007 All-WNBA First Team for the fifth consecutive season.


Jackson scored a league record tying 47 points at Washington on July 24.

## 2008 STORM SEASON NOTES

The Storm completed its 2008 regular-season home schedule 16-1, tying the most home wins for a WNBA team.

The Storm tied the franchise record for longest home winning streak with a pair of 10-game streaks, including the final 10 games at KeyArena from June 20-Sept. 12.

The Storm's 22-win season set a new franchise record.

Seattle's 3-0 start to the 2008 season was the first time in franchise history the team remained undefeated after its first three games.

The Storm dropped to 1-5 all-time in First Round playoff series and was eliminated in the semifinals for the fourth consecutive season. Seattle fell to Los Angeles 1-2 in the First Round of the WNBA Playoffs.

Sue Bird returned from the 2008 Beijing Summer Olympics with a Gold Medal, while Storm teammate Lauren Jackson finished with a Silver Medal.

Lauren Jackson was named to the 2008 WNBA All-Defensive Second Team.

Sue Bird and Lauren Jackson were both named to the 2008 All-WNBA Second Team.

The Storm's seven-game winning streak, from June 29 through July 18, was the longest in team history. Six of the seven wins came by double-figures.



KEYARENA is located on the grounds of the Seattle Center. From I-5 (north or southbound) take the Mercer Street exit and follow the signs marked "Seattle Center." The arena is approximately 25 minutes north of the airport.

MEDIA ENTRANCE is located through Parking Lot 4 on the south side of KevArena (corner of Warren Street and Thomas

**CREDENTIALS** may be requested by calling the public relations department 24 hours prior to the game. Credentials are issued to accredited members of the media who are on assignment to cover a specific game. Please confirm your credential request prior to arriving at the game. Credentials should be used for work at all times and are non-transferable. Unauthorized use of a credential may subject the bearer to ejection from the arena and forfeiture of the credential.

PARKING is available on a limited basis and may be arranged by phoning the public relations department.

TELEPHONES are provided in the media workroom and on a limited basis at courtside. If you need a dedicated phone line, call the public relations department to make arrangements.

SEATING is located at courtside, on the second level of the west side of the arena and in all media sections. Please do not switch seating without approval from a member of the public relations department. Seating charts can be found at the media entrance and in the media workroom.

PHOTOGRAPHERS can find photo charts with their assigned spots at the media entrance, in the media workroom and on the basket stanchions. All lanes are assigned and photographers are asked to not switch lanes without approval from a member of the public relations department. Please be considerate of season-ticket holders seated directly behind you. For the safety of players and in accordance with league rules, photographers must remain at least four feet behind the baseline at all times. Remote cameras and tripods are not permitted. Use of a flash is prohibited. Rubber lens shades are required on all lenses for still photographers. broadcasters, news and entertainment video and film crews.

THE MEDIA ROOM is located on the lower west concourse directly above the visitors' locker room. The room opens two hours prior to each game and is equipped with telephones, outlets, a fax machine. Storm game notes, league statistics and scores from other WNBA games.

LOCKER ROOMS are located on the west side at court level. In accordance with WNBA policy, locker rooms will be open for a 30 minute period ending one hour before the start of a game. Locker rooms are reopened to the media after the game no later than 10 minutes following the game's conclusion and remain open for a minimum of 30 minutes. Following the 30 minute media access period, locker rooms will be closed for a 20-30 minute period to allow players to shower and dress, and the locker rooms then may again be opened to the media.

GAME NOTES AND STATISTICS are available in the media room two hours before each game, during the game and postgame. Statistics are distributed to the media seating area after each quarter.

## WNBA HISTORY

On April 24, 1996, women's basketball announced "We Got Next" as the NBA Board of Governors approved the concept of a Women's National Basketball Association (WNBA) to begin play in June of 1997.

Since that day in 1996 there have been many firsts for the WNBA:

Val Ackerman — the first president of the WNBA

Sheryl Swoopes — the first player signed to the WNBA

Houston Comets — the first WNBA Champions

**Lisa Leslie** — the first WNBA player to dunk (7/30/02 vs. Miami)

**Lauren Jackson** — the first international player to win MVP (2007)

Candace Parker — the first rookie to earn the league's MVP honor (2008)

**Sylvia Fowles** — the first goaltending call (vs. LA 6/3/2008)

The inaugural WNBA season tipped off on June 21, 1997, with the New York Liberty taking on the Los Angeles Sparks at the Great Western Forum in Inglewood, California. A crowd of 14,284 watched as Sparks' guard Penny Toler scored the first basket in WNBA history. The Liberty defeated the Sparks. 67-57.

A Growing Game: The influence of the WNBA can be seen in the explosive growth of organized women's basketball over the past 12 seasons. An estimated 100 million women play basketball worldwide, and our league reflects this trend, featuring 23 international players from 16 countries and territories at the end of the 2008 season. Female AAU youth basketball participation has increased +277 percent since 1990 (from 28,840 to 108,758 players). Female high school basketball participation has increased 18 percent since 1990 (from 387,802 to 456,967 players). And female NCAA basketball participation has increased 43 percent since 1990 (from 10.551 to 15.096 players).

All-Star Game: This summer's marquee event "WNBA vs. USA Basketball: The Stars at the Sun" will showcase the world's best female basketball players under one roof when the WNBA's top talent faces the USA Basketball Women's National Team. This special event, hosted by the WNBA and the Connecticut Sun, will take place at the Mohegan Sun Arena in Uncasville, CT on Saturday, July 10. ESPN will broadcast the game with tip-off set for 3:30 p.m. ET. The USA Basketball squad will be coached Geno Auriemma.

The 2009 WNBA All-Star Game was held at Mohegan Sun Arena in Uncasville, Conn. on Saturday, July 25. It was the ninth such game in league history, and second played at Mohegan Sun, and was played in front of a sellout crowd of 9,518. The West beat the East 130-118 in the highest scoring All-Star Game in WNBA history. Swin Cash of the Seattle Storm claimed MVP honors. Cash, who tallied an All-Star record 22 points on 10-of-16, was one of five former UConn Huskies who were participating in the game.

Inspiring Coach: The Inspiring Coach Award is an annual honor introduced in 2007 to honor coaches who have positively influenced athletes across numerous levels and whose achievements leave an indelible mark on sports as a whole. The University of Tennessee's Pat Summitt earned the honor in 2009 for her profound impact on female athletes and her demonstrated commitment, passion, and dedication to work, family, and community. Previous winners include Kay Yow and Jody Conradt.

Inspiring Women: The Inspiring Woman Award is an annual honor that celebrates an individual who, on a daily basis, demonstrates her ability to inspire others through her commitment, passion and dedication to work, family, and community. Past honorees include Emmy-award winning journalist Cokie Roberts, Good Morning America's Robin Roberts, Secretary of State Condoleezza Rice, and the WNBA All-Decade Team.

Dawn Staley Award: The Dawn Staley Community Leadership Award was announced in 2006 and is now presented annually to the player who best exemplifies the characteristics of a leader in the community and reflects Staley's contagious leadership, spirit, charitable efforts and love for the game. Tamika Catchings won the inaugural award in 2007 while Tamika Raymond was named the winner for 2008. A member of the WNBA's All-Decade Team, Staley, who retired following the 2006 season, established herself as one of the greatest ambassadors in women's basketball history, while also demonstrating outstanding leadership qualities as a coach on the collegiate level and as a philanthropist and humanitarian

New partners in 2008 included such major companies as Kia Motors, IHOP and Pitney Bowes. HP, Starwood Hotels and Resorts and "Got Milk?" all joined the WNBA as partners for the 2009 season.

The WNBA's marketing partners utilize the league to support women's sports and reach its strong fan base of women, families, and young girls through advertising in WNBA nationally televised games, national promotions, player endorsements, and special events. Through the WNBA's extensive, highly integrated relationship with adidas, the sporting goods and apparel giant not only serves as the official outfitter of the WNBA — having unveiled new uniforms across the league in 2007 — but also as the presenter of the 2007, 2008, and 2009 WNBA Drafts and in 2008 became the first-ever presenting partner of the WNBA's entire postseason, including both the playoffs and finals.

Two WNBA teams entered the 2009 season as forerunners in the league's Marquee Partnership program, which includes multiyear deals featuring branded sponsorship of game jerseys — the Phoenix Mercury partnering with LifeLock, a giant in the identity theft industry, and the Los Angeles Sparks partnering with Farmers Insurance Group.

**TV Ratings:** The WNBA concluded the 2009 regular season with its third consecutive year of increased attendance and second consecutive year of increased viewership on ESPN2. The WNBA regular season on ESPN2 concluded with an average of 269,000 viewers, up 8 percent versus 2008 (248,000 viewers). Regular-season games on ESPN2 saw increases in key demographics, including men 18-34 (+9 percent), men 18-49 (+14 percent), and men 23-54 (+23 percent).

For the 2009 WNBA Finals presented by adidas, average viewership on ESPN2 jumped 76 percent from 2008. The five-game series featuring the Indiana Fever and Phoenix Mercury also featured three sellouts and the highest total attendance figure (82,018) in WNBA Finals history.

The WNBA has one of the top five Facebook fanbases among sports leagues, with more than 275,000 fans (www.Facebook.com/wnba).

The WNBA's broadcast coverage in 2009 included live national telecasts of 29 regular-season and postseason contests on ESPN2 and ABC, and another 50 games on NBA TV, as well as games streamed on ESPN360.com.

In addition, fans watched more than two million streams of live and archived games through WNBA LiveAccess, a new feature on WNBA.com that provided fans with free access to more than 200 live game Webcasts - the league's most comprehensive offering - throughout the season.

In July 2007, the WNBA signed a new, eight-year TV deal with ESPN that tips off in 2009 and runs through 2016, the WNBA's 20th season. The agreement, which calls for ABC, ESPN and ESPN2 to telecast WNBA games, includes rights fees, a first for any women's pro team sports league in the U.S.

Global Reach: Now in its second decade, the WNBA has a wide impact on overseas markets. In 2009, for the third straight year, WNBA games and programming reached a record 203 countries in 32 languages, surpassing the previous total of 198 countries. Included were television agreements in six new countries: Argentina, Bulgaria, Jamaica, Pan Africa, South Korea and China. In addition, for the fourth consecutive year, fans in China were able to view WNBA action via live Webcasts on NBA.com/china.

WNBA rosters for the 2009 season featured 18 international players from 11 countries and territories. Among the league's international contingent are the Seattle Storm's Lauren Jackson (Australia), Indiana Fever's Tammy Sutton-Brown (Canada), San Antonio Silver Stars' Sophia Young (St. Vincent), and Los Angeles Sparks' Ticha Penicheiro (Portugal).

Ownership: Seven WNBA teams now fall under the independent ownership model: the Atlanta Dream, Chicago Sky, Connecticut Sun, Los Angeles Sparks, Seattle Storm, Tulsa Shock and Washington Mystics.

With the announcement on Oct. 20, 2009 that the Detroit Shock would relocate to Tulsa, Okla., Tulsa Pro Hoops L.L.C. will begin play in 2010 and is led by Bill Cameron and David Box. Force 10 Hoops, L.L.C., the entity owned by Seattle businesswomen and civic leaders Anne Levinson, Ginny Gilder, Lisa Brummel and Dawn Trudeau, purchased the Seattle Storm on Feb. 28, 2008. In October, 2009, Kathy Betty purchased the Atlanta Dream. In addition, the Los Angeles Sparks opened the 2007 season with new ownership after Kathy Goodman and Carla Christofferson, two long-time season ticket holders, bought the Sparks on Dec. 7, 2006. They joined Sheila Johnson's Washington Mystics, Michael Alter's Chicago Sky, and the Mohegan Tribe's Connecticut Sun as independently owned WNBA franchises.

Seven women serve as owners of WNBA teams: Dr. Sheila Johnson (Washington Mystics); Kathy Goodman and Carla Christofferson (Los Angeles Sparks); Kathy Betty (Atlanta); and Anne Levinson, Ginny Gilder, Lisa Brummel and Dawn Trudeau (Seattle Storm). An eighth, musical artist Michelle Williams, formerly of "Destiny's Child," is a minority owner of the Chicago Sky.

**Key Highlights:** Diana Taurasi won both the 2009 WNBA MVP award and the 2009 WNBA Finals MVP award. Lisa Leslie of the Los Angeles Sparks became the first WNBA player to capture the regular-season, All-Star and Finals MVP awards during the 2001 season.

In 2008, Candace Parker became the first WNBA player to win Rookie of the Year and Most Valuable Player of the Year in the same season. The first selection in the 2008 WNBA Draft, she earned both honors after leading the league in double-doubles and rebounds per game, while also ranking second in blocks per game and fourth in points per game. She also became just the second player (Lisa Leslie). to dunk in a WNBA game.

While Diana Taurasi of the Phoenix Mercury won her first WNBA MVP award in 2009, there have been several repeat honorees. Lisa Leslie of the Los Angeles Sparks earned the award in 2006, 2001, and 2004. Leslie joined the Houston Comets' Sheryl Swoopes as the only players in WNBA history to capture MVP honors three times. Two players have won the award twice in a career: Houston's Cynthia Cooper (1997, 1998) and Seattle's Lauren Jackson (2003, 2007). The others to capture MVP honors are Yolanda Griffith (then with Sacramento in 1999) and Los Angeles' Candace Parker (2008, when she became the first rookie in league history to earn the award).

Taurasi rewrote the WNBA scoring records in 2006 when she led the league with 25.3 points per contest, became the first WNBA player to top 800 points in a single season (860), and the single-season mark for three-point field-goals (121) and the single-game mark for points (47, a number later equaled by the Storm's Lauren Jackson in 2007).

There is only one player who has reached 6,000 points in her WNBA career. Lisa Leslie, who retired following the 2009 season, ranks at the top of the WNBA's all-time scoring leaders with 6,263 points. The players who have passed the 5,000 point plateau are Tina Thompson, Katie Smith. and Lauren Jackson.

Lauren Jackson became the youngest (26 years, 77 days) and fastest (209 games) to score her 4,000th career point on July 27, 2007. However, that record was broken when Diana Taurasi reached the same milestone on July 27, 2009 in just 197 games.

Sheryl Swoopes, who earned MVP and Defensive Player of the Year honors in 2000 and 2002, made WNBA history with the league's first triple-double (14 points, 15 rebounds, 10 assists) vs. the Detroit Shock on July 27, 1999.

WNBA Cares: Through the WNBA Cares initiative, the league is deeply committed to creating programs that improve the quality of life for all people, with a special emphasis on promoting a healthy lifestyle and positive body image, breast health awareness, youth and family development, and education. WNBA teams and players donate countless dollars and hours each year through league programs including Breast Health Awareness, WNBA Green Week, Go Red For Women, WNBA Fit, and Read to Achieve.
