## CREDENTIALS

## Preseason/Regular Season Games

Media credentials are issued to working media only. All single-game credentials may be picked up at the desk located inside the Northwest Media Entrance of the AT\&T Center beginning two hours prior to tip-off. All credentials are nontransferable and any unauthorized use will subject bearer to ejection from the AT\&T Center and confiscation of the pass. NOTE: All personal items are subject to search upon entering the AT\&T Center.

Individual game credentials should be requested through the Stars Communications Department a minimum of 24 hours prior to game time or by 4 p.m. (CT) on Friday for all Saturday, Sunday and Monday contests.

Media members covering the Stars on a regular basis will be issued full-season credentials. Media with season credentials are still required to reserve seating for all games via phone (210-444-5738) or email (rsweat@attcenter.com). Reserved seating requests should be made to the communications office by the above mentioned deadline.

Single-game credentials will be issued on a space available basis. Credentials are good for admittance to the arena, media workroom, media hospitality and both team locker rooms.

## GAME NOTES AND STATISTICS

Game notes, rosters and stats are available in the press room two hours prior to game time. Statistics are distributed to the working media at the conclusion of each quarter as well as first half boxes and final boxes. Post-game notes and quotes are distributed following the game.

## INTERVIEWS

Interviews that need advance preparation or special accommodation should be arranged by contacting the Stars Communications Department. This includes all live television interviews for pre and post-game.

All photographers are required to wear a "PHOTO" credential to gain access to the arena floor. The photography areas of the AT\&T Center are located along the baselines of both ends of the court. Photographers are prohibited from entering the sideline areas in front of or behind the team benches and in front of press row. In addition, photographers are asked to observe WNBA rules for player escape routes - an open area approximately five feet on both sides of the basket.

## AT\&T CENTER ENTRANCE

The media entrance is located at the Northwest Media entrance of the AT\&T Center. All media members must enter the building through this entrance. WNBA and Stars season passes will be honored and single-game credentials will be available at the will call desk for pickup. The press doors open two hours prior to tip-off. For those media members who receive season parking privileges, the media parking is located adjacent to the Northeast corner of the stadium. Media covering Stars on a game-by-game basis can request a parking pass along with their single-game credential.

## HOSPITALITY

The media workroom and media hospitality room are located on the event level in the southeast corner of the AT\&T Center and are accessible only with a valid credential. Both rooms are open two hours prior to game time time. The professional intent of the media workroom is to provide a meeting and working area for writers, reporters, broadcasters and game personnel. Family members and guests will not be admitted. Any abuse of the media workroom and/or press privleges will result in forfeiture of credentials. The media workroom is equipped with electrical outlets and telephones. For additional phone needs please call Shane Skaggs at 210-444-5153.

## MEDIA SEATING

Reserved media seating has been designated at either the courtside press table or in the overflow press seating located on the Plaza Level in sections 101-103 and 126-28. All seats are reserved for each individual media member. Seating charts are posted at the media check-in desk and in the press room. Electrical outlets and telephones are placed on press row for your convenience. In addition, stat monitors, which also show the in-house TV feed, are also available on press row. If a media member is in need of an individual phone, please contact the Stars Communications Department for assistance. Media are asked to finish and file stories in the media workroom to facilitate changeover in the AT\&T Center.

## GAMED DAY ACCESS

Shootarounds: All shootarounds will be open to the media for the last 30 minutes of the workout. Interviews at the Antioch practice facility will all take place on the court as there is no locker room access at the practice facility. For road games, media should contact the Stars Communications Department to verify shootaround times and media access periods. Should the team not have a shootaround, it is not required to have a media "shootaround" interview session.

Pre-Game: The Stars locker room will be open for a 30-minute period that begins 90 minutes before tipoff.

Post-Game: Following a 10-minute cooling off period, head coach Vickie Johnson will be available to the media and the locker room will be open to the media for 30 minutes.

## OFF DAY ACCESS

Practice: All Stars practices are open to the media. Please check with the communications staff regarding open practice times for that day. No interviews will take place prior to practice without advance arrangements being made through the public relations department. All interviews will take place on the court at the Antioch practice facility.

All interview requests for San Antonio Stars players and staff should be directed to Communications Manager Rebecca Sweat. Interview requests will be accomodated per the WNBA Media Access Policies, listed above.

The two-time WNBA champion $(2003,2006)$ and 2003 WNBA Finals MVP joined the Stars following a 13-year professional career.

The Miami Sol selected Riley fifth overall in the 2001 WNBA Draft. After the Sol ceased operations, the Detroit Shock selected Riley in the 2003 dispersal draft. Riley led the Shock to two championships in 2003 and 2006. She was also named the 2003 WNBA Finals MVP and was voted to represent the Eastern Conference in the 2005 WNBAAll-Star Game.

Riley was traded to the Stars in 2007, where she played five seasons from 2007-11. In 2010, Riley was named the female recipient of the 17th Annual Henry P. Iba Citizen Athlete Award, an honor that recognizes positive role models who excel in their sport and show a desire to help others. In her final season with the Stars, Riley was named the co-winner of the Kim Perrot Sportsmanship Award along with Sue Bird.

In 2012, Riley signed with the Chicago Sky, where she played for one season before signing with the Atlanta Dream for the 2013 season. She announced her retirement in June of 2014.

Additionally, Riley earned an Olympic gold medal with USA Basketball at the 2004 Olympics in Athens.

Riley played for Notre Dame from 1997-2001 and led the school to the 2001 NCAA Championship. She received numerous accolades her senior season including Most Outstanding Player in the Final Four award, Naismith Player of the Year, Big East Player of the Year and Academic All-American of the Year.

Since her retirement, Riley has focused on initiatives off the court as an NBA Cares Ambassador as well as serving as a spokesperson for other organizations. She is involved in Nothing But Nets, which is a global grassroots campaign to raise awareness and funding to fight malaria, a leading cause of death among children in Africa. She is a national spokesperson for NoKidHungry, a campaign focused on ending child hunger in America, where one-in-five children are food insecure. Additionally, Riley co-founded Inspire Transformation, which takes a comprehensive approach to reducing the affects and instances of the AIDS pandemic in South Africa. She also returned to Notre Dame to earn an Executive MBA Degree from the Mendoza College of Business and graduated in May 2016.

Johnson was the first player in WNBA history to record 4,000 points, 1,000 rebounds and 1,000 assists in a career, and retired with 4,243 points, 1,641 rebounds and 1,205 career assists. She played 13 WNBA seasons, nine with the New York Liberty and four with the San Antonio Stars, retiring as the league's all-time leader in games $(410)$ and minutes played $(12,435)$. Johnson was one of 10 players voted to the Stars All-Decade Team in 2012, as part of the team's 10th season in San Antonio.

Johnson posted career averages of 10.3 points, 4.0 rebounds and 2.9 assists per game in 13 seasons in the WNBA, averaging double-digit points in seven seasons. She started all but two of her 410 career game and amassed a 159 games-started streak, which currently ranks eighth in WNBA history.

A native of Coushatta, La., Johnson was originally selected 12th overall by the New York Liberty in the WNBA Elite Draft on February 27, 1997 and became the first player in league history to play 300 games on July 7, 2006. She signed with San Antonio as a free agent on February 9, 2006, becoming the first building block of the Stars' 2008 Western Conference Champion squad. Johnson helped lead the Stars to their first WNBA Finals appearance and earned the Kim Perrot Sportsmanship Award following the 2008 season. Johnson, who also played professionally in Israel, France, Hungary and Turkey, retired from the WNBA following the 2009 season.

Johnson was a two-time All-American and Sun Belt Conference MVP at Louisiana Tech University. She led Louisiana Tech to the 1994 Final Four, was named Sun Belt Conference Player of the Year in 1995 and earned Louisiana Player of the Year honors in 1996. She finished her collegiate career with 1,891 career points and 831 rebounds and was inducted into the Louisiana Tech Hall of Fame in 2007.

## Tim Holt, Managing Directoro of San Antonio FC

Joined SS\&E in January 2106 ... serves as Managing Director of San Antonio FC (SAFC), where he is responsible for overseeing all aspects of the Spurs Sports \& Entertainment owned professional soccer club ... SAFC recently finished its inaugural season in the USL and hosts its games at the purpose-built Toyota Field ... before joining SAFC had a stint at Orlando City SC which he joined during its inaugural Major League Soccer (MLS) season as Vice President of Development ... prior to his time with Orlando City, served as an executive with the United Soccer League (USL) since 1999 including as its President from 2009-2015 ... in the previous decade, Holt served USL in the various capacities of Executive Vice President, Chief Operating Officer, and Director of Pro League Operations ... is active within the US Soccer Federation leadership serving numerous years on its Board of Directors, Lamar Hunt US Open Cup Committee, Professional Council, Appeals Committee, and Credentials Committee ... a long-time member of the National Soccer Coaches Association of America (NSCAA) and served as the Men's Pro representative on its Board of Directors until 2010 ... as a youth player, Holt was part of the respected FC DELCO youth club in suburban Philadelphia where, upon graduating from Penn State University, he returned to work for the club in the mid-1990s launching, coordinating, and operating a $200+$ team annual national youth soccer tournament ... holds a USSF national coaching license, and has coached at both the elite youth club and scholastic levels ... Holt lives in San Antonio with his wife Sara and children Jagger, Roman and Ellesyn.


## Established: 1973 AT\&T Center

In the summer of 1973, a group of local investors leased the Dallas Chaparrals and relocated the team to San Antonio. Midway through their first season in the Alamo City, the group purchased the team outright and the Spurs have been a mainstay in San Antonio culture ever since. The Silver and Black played their first three seasons in the ABA before joining the NBA in the summer of 1976, along with the Nets, Nuggets and Pacers.

Over the last 19 years, the Spurs have enjoyed a tremendous amount of success. Since Tim Duncan joined the team in 1997-98 the Spurs have captured five NBA Championships and have posted the best regular season winning percentage (.704, 1,005-423) of any team in the four major U.S. sports (MLB, NBA, NFL and NHL). During that time, San Antonio has posted the NBA's best record five times (1998-99, 2000-01, 2002-03, 2011-12 and 2013-14) and has won 11 division titles. The Spurs record during that span ranks as the best 18 -year run of any team in league history. San Antonio has also posted 50 -or-more wins in 16 consecutive seasons, the longest such streak in NBA history.

In September 2012, ESPN the Magazine name the Spurs the "Team of the Decade" in its annual Ultimate Standings survey. San Antonio has been named the best franchise in professional sports three times (2003, 2005 and 2014) and is the only franchise to rank in the Top 10 every year since ESPN introduced its annual survey in 2003.

The Spurs are led by head coach Gregg Popovich, who has been at the helm for the past 20 seasons. The longest tenured coach with the same team in all of the four major U.S. professional sports, Popovich holds the third-best winning percentage (minimum 250 games coached) in NBA history (.685, 1,022-470). His 1,022 victories with the Spurs ranks second all-time in NBA history for most wins with one team, behind only Jerry Sloan (Utah Jazz, 1,127).

On the court the Spurs are led by the trio of Tim Duncan, Tony Parker and Manu Ginobili, who have won four NBA titles together and have the most total wins (regular season and playoffs) as a trio in NBA history. ## Gregg Popovich, Head Coach

Entering his 21 st season as the Spurs head coach ... the longest tenured coach with the same team among the 122 NBA, NFL, NHL and MLB franchises ... has led the Spurs to five NBA Championships (1999, 2003, 2005, 2007 and 2014) ... one of five coaches in history with five-or-more NBA Championships (along with Phil Jackson, Red Auerbach, John Kundla and Pat Riley) ... he and Eric Spoelstra are the only two active coaches with multiple NBA titles ... finished the 2014-15 season with a career mark of 1,022-470 ... career winning percentage of 685 ranks third in NBA history (behind Jackson and Billy Cunningham) ... ranks ninth in NBA history in career victories (among active coaches trails only George Karl) ... his 1,022 wins with one team ranks second all-time in NBA history behind Jerry Sloan $(1,127) \ldots$ posted his 1,000 th career win at Indiana on February $9,2015 \ldots$ his 152 playoff wins rank third in NBA history (behind Jackson and Riley) and his playoff career winning percentage of 618 (152-94) is the third-best in league history ... named NBA Coach of the Year in 2003, 2012 and 2014 ... has led San Antonio to the NBA's best regular season record five times (1998-99, 2000-01, 2002-03, 2011-12 and 2013-14) ... the Western Conference All-Star coach in 2005, 2011 and 2013 ... the Spurs all-time leader in both regular season and playoff wins ... a 1970 graduate of the United States Air Force Academy with a degree in Soviet studies ... played four seasons at the Air Force Academy ... as a senior was the team's captain and leading scorer ... following his graduation in 1970 served his five-year military commitment ... during that time toured Eastern Europe and the Soviet Union as a member of the U.S. Armed Forces Team ... selected to represent the U.S. on the national AAU Team touring the Soviet Union ... in 1972 was the captain of the Armed Forces team, which won the AAU Championship ... earned an invitation to the 1972 U.S. Olympic Team Training Camp ... in 1973 returned to the Air Force Academy as an assistant coach ... spent six years at Air Force during which time he obtained his master's degree in physical education and sports sciences from the University of Denver ... in 1979 was named the head coach at Pomona-Pitzer in Claremont, California ... spent the next eight seasons at Pomona ... during the 1985-86 season led the team to its first conference championship in 68 years and to a berth in the NCAA Division III Tournament ... while at Pomona was an active member of the school's academic community, working as an associate professor, chairing the college's Student Life committee, serving on the Women's Commission and even - for one year - living in a dorm with his family ... moved to the NBA in July of 1988, joining the Spurs as an assistant coach as a member of Larry Brown's staff ... spent the next four seasons in San Antonio with a Spurs team that won a pair of Midwest Division titles ... in the summer of 1992 was named an assistant coach on Don Nelson's staff with Golden State
.. spent the next two seasons with the Warriors ... returned to San Antonio on May 31, 1994, as the Spurs executive vice president of basketball operations/general manager (served as GM for eight seasons before turning the job over to R.C. Buford on July 1, 2002) ... named the Spurs head coach in December of 1996 ... served as an assistant coach for USA Basketball's Men's Senior Team for three consecutive summers (at the 2002 World Basketball Championship, the 2003 FIBA America Men's Olympic Qualifying Tournament and the 2004 Olympic Games) ... a very active member of the San Antonio community ... in 1991 teamed with Frank Martin to create the Spurs Youth Basketball League ... today the league plays at 75 locations in San Antonio and through-out South Texas ... over 15,000 boys and girls, ages 7 to 16, played in the league in 2011-12 ... prior to every game, each participant takes a pledge, promising to remain drug and alcohol free while showing good sportsmanship and fair play ... the league was honored with a Daily Point of Light Award by President Bush in February of 1992... is involved in several charities in the San Antonio area including the San Antonio Food Bank, Roy Maas' Youth Alternatives, Boys and Girls Club and The Miracle League ... honored by the Air Force Academy with its Distinguished Graduate Award in 2007 ... he and his wife Erin have been blessed with two children, Micky and Jill.

## SAN ANTONIO RAMPAGE



## Established: 2002 AT\&T Center

The San Antonio Rampage completed their 15th consecutive season in the American Hockey League and the second as the top affiliate of the National Hockey League's Colorado Avalanche after the 2016-17 campaign... The Rampage and Avalanche inked a five-year deal before the start of the 2015-16 season, securing the partnership until the 202021 season... Before Colorado, the Silver and Black were previously affiliated with the Florida Panthers (2002-05 and 2011-15) and the Phoenix Coyotes (2005-11)... the Colorado Eagles of the East Coast Hockey League join the Rampage as an affiliate of the Avalanche after signing a new deal in the summer of 2015... San Antonio is one of 30 teams each season that hopes to play into early June and ultimately hoist the AHL's Calder Cup... Over the course of a 76 -game season, the Silver and Black face off against 15 different opponents, all within the Western Conference... The Rampage compete in the Pacific Division along with seven other teams, including their in-state rival the Texas Stars... San Antonio finished the season with a $27-42-5-2$ record and the 10th-best penalty-kill unit in the AHL... Throughout the season, the Rampage had 20 recalls to the Colorado Avalanche, including 12 different skaters and six NHL debuts... The season featured a handful of CCM/AHL accolades thanks to forwards Rocco Grimaldi and A.J. Greer, and goaltender Spencer Martin... Grimaldi became the fifth skater in franchise history to score 30 -or-more goals in a single season... Grimaldi's 55-point season moved the third-year professional into eighth on the all-time Rampage scoring list with 97 points (45g/52a)... Greer and Martin were both selected for the 2017 AHL All-Star Classic, the first time in franchise history that two rookie players were selected to represent the team... Martin is also the first Rampage goaltender to be selected for the classic in franchise history... Greer was selected as the winner of the Yanick Dupré Memorial Award as the 2016-17 IOA/American Specialty AHL Man of the Year, becoming the second Rampage player to win the award... In a battle against childhood cancer, the Rampage completed their eighth season of the Face Off Against Kids Cancer program... The children and their Rampage "buddies" participated in a series of events throughout the season, forming lasting relationships while raising awareness for childhood cancer in the San Antonio community... Since the inception of the program, the Rampage players and staff have befriended over 139 buddies and their families while raising more than $\$ 90,000$ for organizations that work to bring awareness and funds to the fight against pediatric cancer.

## Eric Veilleux, Head Coach

Eric Veilleux (VAY-you) finished his first season in the American Hockey League with the San Antonio Rampage, finishing 27-42-5-2 and falling short of a playoff bid. Veilleux, 44, spent the previous two seasons with the Norfolk Admirals, first as an assistant in the American Hockey League during the 2014-15 season and then as the head coach when the team moved to the ECHL for the 2015-16 campaign. A Quebec City, Que. native, Veilleux has spent the majority of his coaching career in the Quebec Major Junior Hockey League (QMJHL), where he accumulated 346 wins in 598 games with the Shawinigan Cataractes (2005-12) and Baie-Comeau Drakkar (2012-14), posting a .579 win percentage. Veilleux's teams made the playoffs in each of his nine seasons as a head coach in the QMJHL, advancing to the President's Cup Final three times, once with Shawinigan in 2009 and twice with Baie-Comeau in 2013 and 2014. In his final season with Shawinigan in 2012, he led the Cataractes to the franchise's first-ever Memorial Cup. After becoming the head coach of Baie-Comeau the following season, Veilleux coached the Drakkar to two consecutive finals appearances with a 46-20 record and a . 697 win percentage in 2013-14, earning the Ron Lapointe Trophy for the QMJHL's Coach of the Year. Prior to coaching, Veilleux played seven seasons in the AHL, a career that included three seasons with the Avalanche's AHL affiliate, the Cornwall Aces during the 1995-96 campaign and the Hershey Bears from 1996-98.


## Established: 2005 H-E-B Center at Cedar Park

The Austin Spurs are the NBA Development League single-affiliate of the San Antonio Spurs and are coached by Ken McDonald. The team has produced a total of 41 GATORADE Call-Ups since the 2005-06 season.

During the 2016-17 season the Spurs posted a 25-25 record. The team also produced two GATORADE Call-Ups in Hollis Thompson (New Orleans) and Patricio Garino (Orlando), in addition to a D-League All-Star in Cory Jefferson. San Antonio assigned guards Bryn Forbes and Dejounte Murray as well as forward Davis Bertans a combined 23 times to Austin throughout the course of the season.

The Spurs finished the 2015-16 season with a 30-22 record at the top of the Western Conference to qualify for the franchise's seventh NBA D-League Playoffs appearance. Austin fell to the Los Angeles D-Fenders in the Western Conference Semi-Finals following a first round win over the Rio Grande Valley Vipers. Throughout the season, the Spurs produce four GATORADE Call-Ups.

Austin compiled a 32-18 record for the 2014-15 season. The Spurs ousted the Bakersfield Jam 2-1 in the first round of the playoffs before falling 2-1 to the Santa Cruz Warriors in the Semi-Finals. Three players earned a total of four GATORADE Call-Ups during the season.

In the 2013-14 season, Brian Pauga was named General Manager of the Austin Spurs after Sean Marks joined the San Antonio Spurs coaching bench. Austin assistant Coach Ken McDonald was promoted to head coach following Taylor Jenks call-up to the Atlanta Hawks bench. Mike Miller and Anthony Carter joined the staff as assistant coaches. Flip Murray finished sixth in the D-League averaging 21.3 points per game. Courtney Fells earned a Honorable Mention award for the 2013-14 All D-League team. The Spurs assigned four players to the Austin Spurs over the course of the season. Austin finished the 2013-14 season with a 19-31 record.
Austin advanced to the 2012-13 NBA D-League semi-finals under Taylor Jenkins in his first year as head coach...the team finished the season posting a record of 29-25. The Spurs assigned guards Cory Joseph and Nando De Colo, and center Aron Baynes to Austin a combined 10 times during the season. Kawhi Leonard was also assigned once to the team during his injury rehab. Cory Joseph was named to the 2013 NBA D-League All-Star Prospects team and received Second Team, All D-League honors.

Austin enjoyed their best season in franchise history in 2011-12, highlighted by winning the franchise's first NBA D-League Championship. The Toros posted a franchise-best 33-17 record during the regular season and were a league-best 18-4 at on their home floor at the Cedar Park Center. Five Austin players received GATORADE Call-Ups during the season - Eric Dawson (San Antonio, twice), Justin Dentmon (San Antonio and Toronto), Lester Hudson (Cleveland and Memphis), Carldell Johnson (New Orleans) and Lance Thomas (New Orleans, twice). Dentmon was named NBA D-League Most Valuable Player for the 2011-12 season and was selected to the All-NBA D-League First Team. He was named NBA D-League Player of the Month in January and represented Austin in the 2012 NBA D-League All-Star Game. Dawson was named NBA D-League Impact Player of the Year and was selected to the All-NBA D-League Second Team.

Austin joined the D-League on May 4, 2005, when the Columbus Riverdragons moved from Georgia to Texas. Spurs Sports \& Entertainment purchased the team on June 28, 2007. Former Toros head coaches include the late Dennis Johnson (2005-07), who was inducted into the Basketball Hall of Fame in 2010. The Utah Jazz have two former Toros on the bench. Quin Snyder (2007-10) serves as head coach and is assisted by Brad Jones (2010-12). Taylor Jenkins accepted an assistant coach position with the Atlanta Hawks prior to the 2013-14 season.

The NBA D-League, founded in 2001, is the NBA's official minor league, featuring a record 22 teams with direct affiliations to NBA franchises for the 2016-17 season, the NBA D-League is a proven developer of talent. More than 25 percent of NBA players boast D-League experience and over 30 NBA coaches began their careers in the NBADL. ## Ken McDonald, Head Coach

Ken McDonald completed his fourth season as head coach of the Austin Spurs in 2016-17. In 2015-16 he lead the team to the Southwest Division title, the Western Conference Finals and a 30-20 regular-season record. He served as an assistant coach during the 2012-13 season with the Austin Toros before taking over as head coach for the 2013-14 season. McDonald has also served as head coach at Western Kentucky University (2008-11), where he led the team to the Sun Belt Regular Season Championship and Sun Belt Tournament Championship (2009). McDonald spent four seasons (2004-08) as an assistant coach at the University of Texas under Head Coach Rick Barnes, who he has considered his mentor during his coaching career. In addition to guiding the Longhorns to four straight NCAA Tournament appearances, he also helped the team reach a 106-35 (.752) record throughout the four seasons he was with the team, which is still ranked as the most victories in a four-year period in school history. McDonald has also served as an assistant coach at the University of Georgia (2003-04), Western Kentucky University (1998-2003) and Clemson University (1994-98). He graduated from Providence College, where he played shooting guard (1991-92), before playing professionally for the St. Paul Revelles in Ireland (1993-94). While playing at the Community College of Rhode Island (1989-90) prior to transferring to Providence, McDonald was a firstteam Junior College All-American and set school records for single-season scoring (754 points) and 3-pointers made in a game (9) and season (109). McDonald was born and raised in Providence, R.I. He has one daughter, Ella, who was born in 2008.

## Established: 2016 Toyota Field

San Antonio FC have entered their second season after posting a 10-12-8 record during the 2016 USL season...Key players such as Rafa Castillo, Matt Cardone and Greg Cochrane have returned, while impressive additions Kris Tyrpak, Sebastien Iberagha, Billy Forbes and Cyprian Hedrick join them. Darren Powell is now in his second season as head coach of SAFC and recorded his first win on 4/3/16 at Seattle thanks to a 3-0 victory over Sounders FC 2...SAFC midfielder Rafa Castillo forward Franck Tayou led the team with five goals apiece while Carlos Alvarez collected seven assists en route to a 10th place finish in the USL Western Conference standings. goalkeeper and San Antonio native Matt Cardone saved four of five penalty kicks he faced and was named Player of the Week on $8 / 30$, marking the first SAFC player to earn that honor.

In December of 2015 the City of San Antonio and Bexar County, in partnership with Spurs Sports \& Entertainment, announced their purchase of Toyota Field from local businessman Gordon Hartman. In January of 2016, Spurs Sports \& Entertainment announced their plans to field a USL franchise in the 2016 season, and were awarded the 31st franchise in the United Soccer League. That same day, "USL San Antonio" named Darren Powell as the club's very first head coach. Later that month, former USL President and current Vice President of Orlando City SC (MLS) was named as a Spurs Sports \& Entertainment Vice President and Managing Director of the SS\&E owned soccer team. On February 4, SS\&E announced the club name would be San Antonio FC, and also revealed the logo and meaning behind it. SAFC announced its first two partners, Nike and Toyota in February of 2016, revealing that Toyota Field would remain the stadium's name and all SAFC gear would be supplied by Nike. On February 2, San Antonio FC signed its first player ever, Carlos Alvarez, and began the process of putting together a squad to compete in the 2016 USL season starting in April of 2016. The club won its inaugural match 3-0 over Seattle Sounders FC 2 on April 3 and set a new Toyota Field attendance record on April 9 during San Antonio's home opener, drawing 8,466 fans. ## Darren Powell, Head Coach

Darren Powell is entering his second season as head coach of San Antonio FC. As the head of the technical staff, Powell oversees all on-field aspects of the SAFC first team and academy. 2017 will mark nearly 20 years of coaching for Powell.

In Powell's first season with San Antonio FC, the club went 10-12-8, narrowly missing the playoffs by just three points. Under Powell, the club won its inaugural USL match, and had 10 Team of the Week honorees as well as one Player of the Week (Matt Cardone). SAFC went 7-4-4 at Toyota Field in 2016 and only allowed multiple goals in a single USL match nine times.

In January of 2016, Darren Powell was introduced to San Antonio as the first ever head coach of the later named San Antonio FC. Powell became the face of a new franchise in San Antonio and began working towards putting his roster and staff together for the 2016 USL season.
Powell joined SAFC from MLS side Orlando City SC where he was the club's academy director.
Powell led all aspects of the Orlando City Academy from its inception after OCSC was awarded an MLS expansion spot. Powell would help develop the style of play between all age groups in the academy that would match the MLS first team.
Prior to his time with Orlando City, Powell was the head coach of Elon University since December 2004.
During Powell's tenure, the program produced 45 All-Southern Conference performers, four conference players of the year and two league freshmen of the year. Powell has been named the SoCon's Coach of the Year four times.

In 2013 the Powell-led Phoenix won 15 games and became only the third team in league history to capture three consecutive SoCon Tournament titles. Powell earned his second straight SoCon Coach of the Year accolade and fourth overall.

In 2012, Powell led the Phoenix to arguably its best season ever at the Division I level. The program won 15 games, including four against ranked competition, and captured the league's regular-season and tournament title for he first time in school history. Powell was rewarded as the SoCon's Coach of the Year for the third time in his career and led the maroon and gold to its second consecutive NCAA Tournament appearance
The 2010 squad battled a tough schedule on its way to an 8-6-5 overall ledger, the sixth consecutive winning season for the program. In 2009, Elon finished the year with a .500 or better record for the fifth consecutive year, earning a 10-8-2 mark that included a victory over ACC-foe Clemson. The Phoenix also advanced to the SoCon Tournament championship game for the first time in program history.
In 2008, Powell guided Elon to its first-ever NCAA Division I league title and a perfect 7-0-0 mark in conference play during the regular season. Powell was honored as the conference's top coach, his second such honor in four seasons with the Phoenix. Under Powell's leadership, the Elon program claimed its first-ever NCAA Division I national ranking in 2006.

Powell joined Elon after serving four seasons as an assistant coach at Southern Conference rival UNC Greensboro.
During Powell's four seasons at UNCG, the Spartan program posted a 55-26-3 mark and became the nation's top-ranked program during the regular season in 2004. Powell assisted in all aspects of the program, including recruiting, scheduling and academic development. Powell was honored as one of the top NCAA Division I assistant coaches by College Soccer News and coached three MLS players.
Prior to joining the Spartan staff, Powell headed the Greensboro College men's soccer program for three seasons, posting a 50-12-3 ledger. He led the Pride to the NCAA Division III finals in 1998 and Dixie Conference titles in 1998, 1999 and 2000.

Following a four-year collegiate career at UNC Greensboro, Powell played professionally for the Carolina Dynamo USISL team, the Raleigh Flyers A-League team and the Wilmington Hammerheads USISL team from 1995-1999. At UNCG, Powell helped the Spartans to two NCAA Tournament appearances in 1993 and 1994. He was a two-time captain, team MVP and All-South Region selection as well as a three-time All-Big South Conference honoree. Powell became the first Spartan player to score over 100 career points at the Division I level.

Powell graduated from UNC Greensboro in 1995 with a bachelor's degree in leisure studies. He and his wife, Elise, have two children - Naomi and Caleb.


## Built: 2002 <br> Stars Capacity: 9,888

The AT\&T Center opened in November of 2002 and is the premier entertainment venue in South Texas. The AT\&T Center was built by the initiatives of a public-private venture amongst Bexar County, the Coliseum Advisory Board, the San Antonio Livestock Show \& Rodeo and Spurs Sports \& Entertainment. The facility hosts four anchor tenants: the San Antonio Spurs (NBA), San Antonio Rampage (AHL), San Antonio Stars (WNBA) and the San Antonio Stock Show \& Rodeo. Additionally, the venue has attracted a multitude of concerts, family shows, special events and entertained in excess of 10 million guests through more than thousands of events. Aerosmith, Justin Bieber, Neil Diamond, Bon Jovi, Cirque du Soleil, The Eagles, Vicente Fernandez, Lady Gaga, Billy Joel \& Elton John, Madonna, Metallica, Red Hot Chili Peppers, Rihanna, The Rolling Stones, Shakira, Taylor Swift, Trans-Siberian Orchestra and WWE are just as sampling of the acts that have performed at the AT\&T Center.

In 2015, the AT\&T Center underwent a $\$ 110+$ million renovation to enhance the fan experience at all levels of the Bexar County-owned arena. Renovations to the AT\&T Center included all new seating arena-wide, along with infrastructure and technology improvements. Technology enhancements to the AT\&T Center were prevalent arena-wide with the installation of high definition televisions and LED signage throughout the arena. The addition of LED displays to the NE, SE and SW ticket towers give the exterior a striking new look and provide the ability to showcase game action, event highlights and promotional messaging.
