MEDIA GUIDELINES

CREDENTIALS - Media credentials may be obtained for working media by faxing the Dorados a credential request on

business letterhead, or by emailing the request to media@doradosfootball.com, no later than 48 hours in advance of the game. Credentials must be worn at all times in the arena. Media members may not request autographs while working.

MEDIA PARKING – Media parking will be in the southwest lot of the arena by section 105. Media members must present a valid parking pass upon entering the lot. **If you do not have a Dodge Arena parking pass, you may have to pay to park.**

MEDIA ENTRANCE – Single game passes may be picked up at the will call window at the box office.

GENERAL INTERVIEWS – Players and coaches are available immediately following practice. Any other interviews should be coordinated through the Dorados media relations office.

GAME DAY INTERVIEW POLICY

All pre-game interviews may take place on the field up to 90 minutes prior to kickoff. For help in locating players or coaches for interviews, please contact any member of the Dorados staff.

POST GAME INTERVIEWS

There is a 10-minute cooling-off period after the game. Players are restricted to staying on the field for the post game autograph session. Media are allowed on the field during this time.

LOCKER ROOM ACCESS – Media members are requested to conduct interviews in the hallway area of the locker room. Cameras are not allowed in the locker room unless prior permission in granted. *The training room is off limits at all times. Unauthorized entry into the training area will result in revocation of credential privileges.*

BROADCAST LOCATIONS – Broadcast locations are on the catwalk on the south side of the arena. The catwalk atop the luxury boxes is accessible by the staircase located next to the pressbox entrance. Each location has two phone lines and high speed internet access.

PRESS BOX - The Press Box for working media is located in the Southwest end of the Dodge Arena above section 104.

LIVE SHOTS - Any media members seeking a live shot are encouraged to make arrangements at least 24 hours in advance.

GAME NOTES - Game notes, which contain player information, stats, rosters, etc, will be available prior to each game in the press box.

SPOTTERS – Any request for a spotter must be made well in advance.

PHOTOGRAPHERS - Photos may be shot anywhere within the Dodge Arena except in the locker room area. Television cameras are encouraged to shoot video on the catwalks located above the luxury boxes, or at any other location in the arena that does not obstruct fans' view. The catwalk atop the luxury boxes may be accessed by the staircase located next door to the pressbox entrance.

10 DUSTIN BELL K 6-2, 235 Born: 6/29/82 Hometown: 1st af2 season

College: Bell played at the University of Houston and was a three time semi-finalist for the Lou Groza Award presented annually to the nation's top college football placekicker...One of the top kickers in Conference USA and the nation... Extremely strong leg which routinely booms kickoffs through the end zone... handles punts, kickoffs and PAT/field goals... Finished second all-time in kick scoring with 226 points... Became just the third kicker (Roman Anderson and Mike Clendenen) to score at least 200 points in his career... concluded his career second in PATs (109), PATs attemptemd (115) and third in field goals made (39) ... finished his career second in field-goal percentage at .709 (39-55)...Was a three time USA Player of the Week and Special Teams Player of the Year.

High School: Played at Jersey Village High School...Also participated in Golf, Soccer and Cross Country...

College: Signed with Georgia Tech in 1995 and redshirted that year...Transferred to Georgia Southern after two years at Georgia Tech.

82 JOHN BRADLEY OL/DL 6-6, 280 Born: 2/8/78 Hometown: Tupelo, Miss. 3rd af2 season

af2: Bradley returns to the Dorados for his second season. He played last season under Kevin Guy and also under Guy with the Tennessee Valley Vipers in 2004. With the Vipers, he appeared in 13 games and collected 13.5 tackles (5 solo) and ranked second on the squad in sacks (2.5) and tied for third in tackles for a loss (2.5). Bradley scored a TD in his first professional game.

College: Prior to turning pro, he played collegially at Itawamba Community College (Tupelo, MS) and North Alabama (Florence, AL). While at Itawamba, a JUCO program which has produced Duce Staley and Joe Horn, Bradley played football and basketball and was a Second Team North Division member on the 1997 Mississippi JUCO All-State Team. He was on recruiting lists at both Mississippi State and Ole Miss and would have been in the same recruiting class as Eli Manning at Ole Miss, but chose to transfer to the University of North Alabama. Bradley redshirted in 2000 and served in a reserve role in 2001, appearing in 10 games. He had 3 receptions for 33 yards offensively and also returned 3 kickoffs. As a senior in 2002, Bradley primarily served as a blocker in UNA's offense but did contribute offensively with three receptions for 55 yards and two touchdowns. He was a backup on defense and had three assisted tackles, including an assisted sack, in 9 games.

Despite his injury, he still ranked seventh on the Vipers squad in tackles with 16.5 (10 solo) and third in pass breakups with 11. Bucknor also had 2 interceptions and a fumble recovery. Prior to Tennessee Valley, Bucknor attended NFL training camp with the Pittsburgh Steelers after completing a college career at Southern Arkansas in 2002. Bucknor's honors in 2002 included Second Team All-South Region, Third Team Football Gazette All-South Region, First Team All-Gulf South Conference and received the program's Outstanding Senior Athlete Award. In 33 games over his college career as a defensive back, Bucknor tallied 115 tackles, four interceptions and four pass breakups.

A team captain for the Lobos, Counter appeared in 50 games with the Lobos (starting in 34) over his career and racked up 122 career receptions for 2,101 yards (17.2 avg) and 14 touchdown receptions. The three time all-Mountain West Conference recipient leaves the Lobos ranking sixth on their all-time receptions list, fourth in career yardage and tied for fourth in TDs. Also leaves UNM as the only Lobo with two receptions of 80 or more yard, and also had six career 100-yard receiving games. Participated in the 2004 Las Vegas All-American Classic to close out his college career. Prior to New Mexico, the 23 year-old was a 1999 graduate of Lancaster High School. Counter was a First Team All-District receiver and team MVP, catching 46 passes for 746 yards and 10 touchdowns his senior year.

Career: Goodloe is seeking his first season of professional football. He completed his college career in 2001 at West Texas A&M in Canyon after beginning his college career at the University of Texas. The Spring Valley, California native was a two-year letterman at the University of Texas and played on the defensive line in 1996 and 1997 under the final years of the John Mackovic campaign. He was part of UT's Big 12 Championship squad in 1996, which beat Nebraska to compete in the 1997 Fiesta Bowl against Penn State. Goodloe transferred back home to San Diego State University and wound up quitting football, but returned to the gridiron in 2000 by enrolling to West Texas A&M. He tied for sixth on the Buffaloes squad with 36 tackles and had ten tackles for a loss (second on the team), including a team high five sacks. Goodloe closed out his college career in 2001 ranking tied for seventh on the Buffaloes squad in tackles (47) and tied for third on the team with 40 assisted tackles. West Texas A&M named Goodloe their Most Valuable Defensive Player in 2001.

Career Highlights: Jeter brings seven years of professional experience to the Dorados and spent 2004 in the Arena Football League (AFL) with the Detroit Fury. He appeared in 13 games with the Fury and had 3 tackles and a half (0.5) sack on defense. He also caught an 11-yard pass for his only offensive numbers. Jeter returns to the af2, where he played four seasons (2000-2003) with the Tennessee Valley Vipers, and returns under the guidance of head coach Kevin Guy, who coached Jeter in Tennessee Valley in 2002 and 2003. He began his Vipers tenure in 2000 after spending the 1999 season with the Mississippi Fire Dogs of the Indoor Professional Football League (IPFL) and played in six games before leaving to join the Saskatchewan Roughriders of the Canadian Football League (CFL). Jeter returned in 2001 and earned Second Team All-af2 honors after collecting 23.5 tackles and ranking ninth in the league in sacks with 9.5. In 2003 with the Vipers, Jeter served as both a lineman and a fullback/linebacker and registered 36 rushing yards off 11 caries and 30 receiving yards off 2 receptions, while also collecting 16.5 tackles on defense. Jeter ranked tied for 11th in the af2 in fumbles forced (3) in his final season (2003) with the Vipers. His overall defensive numbers with Tennessee Valley included 59 tackles (48 solo) in 52 games, and he ranks amongst the Vipers all-time leaders in sacks (14.0), fumbles recovered (7) and fumbles forced (11). The 28 year-old turned pro after a college career at the University of Alabama-Birmingham (UAB), where he was four-year letterwinner and three-year starter at nose guard. He finished his UAB career ranked second on the Blazers all-time list for games played and seventh on the all-time list for tackles. Jeter racked up 179 tackles (129 solo) at UAB and registered 36 tackles-for-loss for 131 yards (8 sacks).

He also serves as an assistant coach on the Bakersfield College wrestling team, which won the California Junior College State Championship in 2003 and 2004. He and his wife Sherrina are expecting their first child in July.

Frank Franz -- Assistant to the Offensive Coordinator/Strength & Conditioning

Franz returns to the Dorados for his second season with the Dorados after serving last season as an assistant coach and director of strength and conditioning. Franz attended McMurry University in Abilene where he excelled in football as an All-Conference quarterback and graduated with a BS in Education in 1998. In the spring of 1999, he began work at Texas State University as a Strength and Conditioning Coach and earned a Masters Degree in Exercise Science from Texas State in 2000. While there, Frank was responsible for designing and implementing strength and conditioning program for a variety of men's and women's NCAA Division I sports. During his time as a strength coach he helped to produce three NFL draft picks, a 1st round NBA selection, a 1st round MLB selection, and a National Championship Cheerleading Squad. In the fall of 2002 he began work as a varsity Football and Track Coach at Sharyland High School and helped guide the football team to a District Championship. Frank is currently the Director of Strength and Conditioning at Elite Performance in McAllen.

Spencer Conley -- Fullback/Linebacker Coach

Conley returns to the Dorados in a coaching role following his playing career. He played the majority of last season with the Tulsa Talons, then returned to the Dorados in late July but was injured before seeing any game action. He was a member of the first Dorados team in 2004 after spending the previous season with the af2's Albany Conquest. He set the af2 single game sack record in 2001 as a member of the Norfolk Nighthawks (later broken in 2004) and led every team he played for in sacks in three full seasons, finishing in the in top 10 in af2. In 2004, he was named to the Al-af2 Team and was a finalist for Lineman of the Year. He remains among all time leaders in af2 sacks. The 33-year-old Conley attended Trinity Valley Community College in Athens, Texas, but left early to take his game to the pro level. He turned pro in the Canadian Football League (CFL) with the San Antonio Texans in 1998 season, which was their only season in the CFL. Conley also appeared in one game in the Arena Football League during the 1994 season with the Fort Worth Cavalry. In 1998, Conley not only attended training camp with the San Francisco 49ers, but he won a Professional Indoor Football League (PIFL) championship with the Louisiana Bayou Beast.

Kelly Snell -- Defensive Backs Coach

Snell enters the coaching ranks after a successful playing career at the college and pro level. He won a Grey Cup with the CFL's B.C. Lions in 2000 and was a member of the AFL champion Grand Rapids Rampage in 2001. As a senior at Ferris State he was named one of ESPN's top 100 college players. As a sophomore he was a first team All American and was a second team All American as a junior. The native of White Cloud, Michigan, won the af2 Defensive Player of the Year with 15 INT's in 2002 with Tennessee Valley. His playing career also included stints with the Detroit Fury & Georgia Force (AFL) and Florida Firecats (af2).

RIO GRANDE VALLEY 42, LOUISVILLE 56

HIDALGO, **Tx** - The Louisville Fire opened up the 2005 af2 season scoring 27-unanswered points to scorch the Rio Grande Valley Dorados 56-42 in front of 5,011 fans Saturday night at Chase Field inside the Dodge Arena. The loss gave the Fire a 1-0 record to begin the season, while giving the Dorados a 0-1 record and handing Dorados new head coach Kevin Guy his first opening night loss (3-1) in his af2 coaching career.

The comeback was led by a trio of fourth quarter touchdown receptions by Fire offensive specialist Cesare Manning, who found the endzone five times on the night and earned Offensive Player of the Game honors with a game-high 10 receptions for 198 yards. The Dorados had a 42-29 lead with 1:46 remaining in the third quarter after Ben McCombs picked up his first af2 touchdown reception of his career, but the touchdown would end up being the final one for the Dorados on the night. The next offensive possession for the Dorados

led to a Craig Cole fumble, followed by two drives that combined for minus-two yards on eight plays.

Fire quarterback Matt Sauk, who spent the 2003 season playing under Guy Tennessee Valley, hit Manning for strikes of 25, 26 and 35 yards in the comeback march. He finished the night 18 of 25 for 280 yards and touchdowns. Meanwhile, it was night for Dorados quarterback Josh Kellett. He started the night 2 of 7 in the first quarter and tossed two of his four interceptions in the quarter. Kellett was 17 of 44 passing for 219 yards and three touchdowns in the game,

and resorted to most of his success on the ground. He set a singlegame franchise mark with two rushing touchdowns. Also finding success on the ground was fullback Chris Robinson for Rio Grande Valley. Robinson set the Dorados single-game rushing record with 35 yards on four carries, including a scamper of 22 yards.

Marguis Floyd earned the US Army Ironman of the game for the Dorados with a Dorados singlegame record of 140 receiving yards on six catches. He also led the Dorados with 6.5 tackles (5 solo). ADT Defensive Player of the Game honors went to Tony Stallings, who nabbed two of the Fire's four Arkee Thompson, interceptions. who co-led the Fire with three pass break-ups, registered the Fire's first interception of the game to extend all-time mark af2 interceptions to 28 in his career.



ESTERO, **FI** - The Rio Grande Valley Dorados made their first road venture of the season and their first trip ever to Florida, seeking a different result from their season opening loss at home, but the result was worse as the Dorados suffered a 63-30 loss to the defending af2 champion Florida Firecats.

The Dorados thought things couldn't get much worse after limiting themselves to 18 first-half points, but they produced only 12 in the second half. The team was never in sync and that was even after opening the game with a 8-0 lead after a batted ball at the line of scrimmage inside the Firecats own five yard line ended up in the hands of Travis McAlpine, who walked into the endzone. A 'Cats penalty on the extra point set up a Chris Robinson rush to convert the two-point conversion.

Rio Grande Valley's first defensive touchdown of the season opened the door for the Dorados to take control of the game early, but Dorados offense couldn't take advantage of the situation. They were unable to get any points on their first three drives and were unable to gain a first down until their fourth offensive drive, which ended up being their first offensive scoring drive with a nine-yard pass from Josh Kellett to rookie Dwight Counter. By that time, Florida had already posted 23 points, including a safety after tackling kicker Eric Houle in his own endzone once he recovered his own blocked kick.

Houle booted his first field goal of the season, with a 23 yard conversion, with 14-seconds remaining in the half to cut the halftime deficit to 11, trailing 29-18.

The second half started out similar to the first, but the Dorados started the half out with a little trickery. Houle attempted an onside kick, but the Firecats batted the ball into the stands to maintain possession. The Dorados defense made the stand, keeping the Firecats from scoring, but once again could not move the ball offensively. The Dorados, like the first half, were unable to score on their first three drives of the half. Rio Grande Valley tried to change things up in their second drive, placing rookie quarterback J.R. Davies under center, but a pass to Marquis Floyd was ripped away from Floyd's grasp by Brent Burnside for the interception to kill the drive.

Florida went on to register touchdowns on their final four possessions, two of which were scored in three plays combined. The Dorados only highlight came off a 45-yard strike from Kellett to Floyd with five minutes remaining in regulation. It was a one-play drive and the Dorados next possession ended up

being a one-play drive as well, but the touchdown was awarded to Florida after Davies re-entered the contest at quarterback and had the ball jarred free in the endzone and was recovered by Florida. The touchdown for Florida gave the 'Cats a 39-point lead (63-24). McAlpine scored a meaningless 16-yard catch in the endzone from Kellett as time expired to end the game with a 63-30 final.

Florida quarterback was near flawless, pleasing the 5,978 fans at Germain Arena with a 18 for 29 passing performance for 6 touchdowns and 244 yards. Three of the touchdowns were to Magic Benton, who claimed Offensive Player of the Game honors. Lineman Comone Fisher tallied two receptions for 28 yards as an eligible receiver, including a ten-yard touchdown, to claim US Army Ironman of the Game accolades. Fullback Steve Gorrie, an All-af2 fullback, broke the Dorados single-game record for opposing players with 40 rushing yards off 9 carries. Defensive specialist Roy Stabler for Florida earned the game's ADT Defensive Player of the Game

The Dorados were without receiver Craig Cole, who missed the trip due to injury, and relied on Floyd to produce most of the offensive production. Floyd registered eight catches for 111 yards to lead the Dorados.



BAKERSFIELD, CA - The play by the Rio Grande Valley Dorados was short and sweet and so was the end result, as the Dorados collected their first win of the season to improve to 1-2 and opened division play with a 40-32 road victory over the Bakersfield Blitz in front of 3,680 fans at Rabobank Arena in Bakersfield.

Dorados quarterback Josh Kellett, who earned Offensive Player of the Game honors, completed 18 of 28 passes for 144 yards, averaging 8 yards per pass. 74 of the 144 yards was to rookie offensive specialist Dwight Counter, who caught one of Kellett's three touchdown passes.

Bakersfield picked up a couple of key first quarter plays to build a 14-0 advantage through the opening quarter. On Bakersfield's opening drive, Blitz starting quarterback Chad Elliott was pressured and heaved up a prayer that was answered by a diving Eric Mahanke for a 23 yard touchdown. They scored on their second drive with a 7-yard touchdown pass to Nathan Munson after the Dorados turned the ball over on a fumble to end their opening possession.

Chris Robinson single handedly got the Dorados back in the contest on the opening play of the second quarter by sacking Elliott in the endzone after the Dorados couldn't convert on a fourth and goal situation to end

the first quarter. The safety by Robinson was the Dorados first safety in franchise history. Counter returned the ensuing kickoff 45 yards to the Blitz 12 yard line to start the drive and Robinson registered a 12yard touchdown run to cut the deficit to 14-10. The kickers closed out the first half with a series of field goals. Houle, who set the single-game franchise record with 3 field goals, nailed a 23 and 44-yard field goal for the Dorados, while Bakersfield's Dan Burnett converted a career-high 49yard attempt as time expired to give the Blitz a 24-16 halftime lead.

Rio Grande Valley took over in the third quarter, out scoring the Blitz 17-0 in the quarter with touchdown strikes to Marquis Floyd (19 yards) and Dwight Counter (7 yards) by Kellett and a 24 yard field goal by Houle. The Dorados were able to shutout the Blitz in the quarter by defensive pressure on Jason Thomas,

who entered the game as the Blitz QB in the second quarter, and an interception by Floyd. Floyd collected two interceptions in the game to claim the ADT Defensive Player of the Game honors.

An eight-yard touchdown pass from Kellett to Travis McAlpine built the Dorados lead to 40-24 before the Blitz were able to stop the Dorados 24-0 run with a 24 yard touchdown pass to Rennard Reynolds with just over five minutes remaining to cut the Dorados lead to 40-32. The Blitz had a chance to tie the game after an interception by Alex Wallace in the closing moments, but a great goal line defensive stand prevented Bakersfield's comeback bid


Ben McCombs was an animal in his Bakerfield return. The former member of the Blitz registered 3 tackles (1 solo), a half-sack, and two pass deflections. The US Army Ironman of the Game was issued to Robinson. He led the Dorados in tackles with 3.5 and registered two sacks on the defensive side of the ball, while rushing for a Dorados franchise single-game high 44 yards off 8 carries.

HIDALGO. Tx - They say defense wins championships and in a Monday night high scoring offensive af2 contest in front of 4,516 fans at Chase Field inside Dodge Arena that saw what tied as the sixth highest point production in league history, it was a defensive play that sealed the Bossier-Shreveport Battle Wings 77-69 victory over the Rio Grande Valley Dorados.

Battle Wings lineman Kendal Shello, who earned ADT Defensive Player of the Game honors with two sacks, two pass breakups and three quarterback hurries, registered his final sack by hunting down a scrambling Josh Kellett at the 15 yard line as time expired to keep the Dorados from attempting to get in position for a two-point conversion attempt to eventually tie the game.

It was one of few defensive highlights in the game, which saw 146 points scored and 648 yards of combined total offense.

The Dorados started out the contest with a 14-0 advantage and registered touchdowns on their first six offensive drives. Bossier-Shreveport stayed in check after a fumble on their opening possession and tallied touchdowns on five consecutive drives of their own and also received a 56-yard kickoff return for a touchdown by Bo Smith.

The touchdown for Smith was one of six on the night. Smith, who just fell short of career singlegame highs in touchdowns (seven) and points (36), earned US Army Ironman of the Game honors after producing 278 all-purpose yards with 116 coming off six receptions (five of which were touchdowns) and 162 coming off of specials teams (kickoff

Smith put on a show with Dorados rookie offensive

specialist Dwight Counter during the second quarter, which saw the teams combine for Counter produced three 66 points. touchdowns in the second quarter and ended the night claiming the Offensive Player of the Game with 10 catches for 4 touchdowns (both tied single-game franchise record) and a franchise singlegame record 188 yards, including a 34-yard touchdown reception as time expired to give the Dorados a 46-41 halftime lead. He also produced 282 all-purpose yards (94 off kickoff returns).

The second half was a seesaw battle, but an injury to Dorados deep snapper Kyle Rasmussen turned the Dorados special teams into a nightmare and cost the Dorados several points. Dorados kicker Eric Houle was 4 for 6 in PATs and an additional two PAT attempts were missed on bad snaps.

Dorados quarterback Josh Kellett had spectacular performance, throwing for a franchise single-game best 396 yards falling just four yards shy of 400 and 21 yards shy of his career best. He completed 27 of 42 passes and a franchise best 8 touchdowns. Kellett also rushed in a touchdown on the ground to get in the scoring on nine of the Dorados touchdowns.

He had no problem getting the 77 yards needed coming into the game to surpass the 5,000 yard passing mark in his af2 career.

Kellett's only downfall came late in the game, when a deflected pass ended up in the hands of 'Wings linebacker Clint Schexnayder. possession, along with a fumble by Marquis Floyd in the Dorados first possession of the second half, allowed Bossier to maintain the lead late in the fourth quarter. Rio Grande Valley never trailed more than eight points late in the game and had an opportunity to tie the game after a 21-yard touchdown pass to Counter with 32-seconds remaining, but Houle shanked the extra point attempt giving the 'Wings a 70-69 advantage. The Dorados attempted an onside kick, but former Dorado McKinley Bowie recovered the ball. Bowie recovered all three onside kicks attempted by the Dorados. Battle Wings quarterback Matt Hicks, who was 16 of 27 for 250 yards and 8 touchdowns, could have ended the game by falling to the turf, but he scampered 12 yards into the endzone purposely untouched with 24seconds remaining. If he goes down prior to the endzone, the clock would have run out, but since he scored, it gave the Dorados an opportunity to score a touchdown and attempt a two-point conversion. The opportunity ended on Shello's sack as the Dorados were driving downfield in the closing seconds.

Bossier-Shreveport's win gives them their first win of the season, ending a four-game winless streak on the season and an eight-game winless streak dating back from last season. Ironically, their last win came on June 18, 2004 against Rio Grande Valley.



HIDALGO, Tx - The Rio Grande Valley Dorados registered their first home win of the season and remained perfect in division play (2-0) rebounding back from a 32-13 halftime deficit to defeat the San Diego Riptide 51-45 in front of a vocal 4,540 fans Saturday night at Chase Field inside the Dodge Arena.

San Diego trailed the Dorados 7-3 after the first quarter but then outscored the Dorados 29-6 in the second quarter, tallying 22 consecutive points to close the half. After a Jeff Macrea one-yard rushing touchdown to give the Riptide a 16-13 lead early in the second quarter, the Dorados offense went three-and-out, forcing Eric Houle to attempt a 48 yard field goal. Asi Faoa blocked Houle's attempt and the ball landed out of bounds through the endzone, resulting in a safety. The Riptide scored on the ensuing kickoff from the Dorados with a 24-yard strike from Kane Claunch, making his San Diego return at quarterback, to receiver Nakoa McElrath to increase the 'Tide lead to 25-13. The Dorados next drive fell short, and a turnover on downs gave the Riptide an opportunity to produce a touchdown off a two-yard run by Anthony Griffin with twoseconds remaining in the half.

The Dorados then mounted their comeback march in the third quarter, just as they did the last time San Diego Head Coach Sean Ponder was at Dodge Arena. Last season,

coaching the Wichita Stealth on 7/3/04, Ponder and the Stealth had a 28-14 lead at the half but ended up losing the contest 49-34. Marquis Floyd, who earned ADT Defensive Player of the Game honors with an interception, tallied a pair of offensive touchdowns in the third quarter with a 6-yard and 36-yard reception. Rio Grande Valley went on to score 28 consecutive points in the second half with a rushing touchdown by Chris Robinson and a 20-yard pass from Josh Kellett to Travis McAlpine, building the Dorados lead to 41-32.

San Diego ended their drought of three consecutive scoreless drives on the ensuing drive with a 40-yard pass from Claunch to McElrath with 7:21 remaining in the game to cut their deficit to 41-38. Rio Grande Valley bounced back on the next drive with a 22-yard touchdown pass to Craig Cole from Kellett and then received an interception by Floyd. The interception by Floyd gave the

Dorados the ball with 1:17 remaining at the San Diego five yard line with a 48-38 lead, but an interception by John Amaro Jr. on the first play gave the Riptide life. Claunch hit Rvan Smith with a 24-vard touchdown pass with 42-seconds left and then limited the Dorados to a 32-yard field goal by Eric Houle with 27-seconds remaining after an unsuccessful onside kick. San Diego received the ball with 23-seconds remaining and an opportunity to tie the game with a touchdown, trailing 51-45. Claunch took the 'Tide 19 yards on four plays to the Rio Grande Valley 21 yard line, but his final pass sailed through the endzone incomplete as time expired and the Dorados held onto the win.


Arena football is known for its air game, but this game featured a lot of ground play. The game saw 24 rushing attempts (16 by Rio Grande Valley) and five rushing touchdowns (three by San Diego). Josh Kellett was 16 of 31 passing for 222 yards and 5 touchdowns to earn the Offensive Player of the Game. Claunch was 19 of 40 for 264 yards with three touchdowns and a pair of interceptions for the Riptide. The US Army Ironman of the Game was Chris Robinson, who registered a rushing touchdown on offense and six tackles on defense, including an interception and 1.5 tackles for a loss.

Fresno, CA - The Rio Grande Valley Dorados lost both of their defensive specialists Saturday night to injury in an af2 battle against the West Division leading Central Valley Coyotes in front of 2,256 at Selland Arena, but the Dorados defense forced three turnovers in the fourth quarter and rallied to score 33 points in the quarter to defeat the Coyotes 61-51.

Dorados defensive specialist Carl Bucknor, who ironically fell to injury in the sixth game of last season, suffered a foot injury early in the contest, and their other defensive specialist, Kevin Brown injured his leg in the third quarter. The injuries forced the Dorados to place newly acquired John Jefferson and Marquis Floyd at the defensive specialist position, forcing Floyd out of the Dorados offense.

Entering the fourth quarter trailing 29-28, the Dorados recovered a fumble by Coyotes guarterback Juston Wood and converted it into a two-yard touchdown run by Kellett with 7:31 remaining. It was one of two fourth quarter rushing touchdowns in the contest for Kellett to tie his own single-game franchise mark. ADT Defensive Player of the Game Ben McCombs placed heavy pressure onto Wood throughout the game, but the pressure in the fourth quarter forced him to toss some errant throws and two of them ended up being intercepted by Travis McAlpine, who garnered US Army Ironman of the Game honors with 10 catches for 105 yards and two interceptions. The ten receptions ties the Dorados single-game franchise high. The two interceptions were two of three interceptions the Dorados grabbed in the game. Early in the second half, Deorrick Henry grabbed an interception and returned it 35 yards for a touchdown.

Craig Cole and Kellett supplied the offense in the Dorados productive fourth quarter. Outside of Kellett's two rushing scores, he completed three touchdown passes in the quarter to Cole, who ended the night tying a single-game franchise mark with 4 touchdowns. His first touchdown gave the Dorados a 14-

7 lead with 4:41 remaining in the opening quarter after Floyd caught a 23 yard touchdown pass with 11:16 remaining in the quarter for Rio Grande Valley and Offensive Player of the Game DeRonn Finley scored his first of four eventual touchdowns 5:26 later.

The Dorados offense hit a dry spell after that and closed the first half unsuccessful in four consecutive offensive series, including a goaline stand by the Coyotes. Central Valley collected a 24-yard touchdown pass from Wood to Wes Borba with 9:54 remaining in the second quarter and a 26-yard field goal by John Gockman with 11.8-seconds remaining in the half to give the Coyotes a 16-14 halftime lead.

Rio Grande Valley improved their record to 3-1 when trailing at the half, while handing the Coyotes their first loss (3-1) when leading at the half. The Dorados also picked up their first win in franchise history when allowing more than 50-points in a game (1-8), as Finley grabbed his fourth touchdown catch as time expired.


Kellett was 20 of 33 for 230-yards for Rio Grande Valley, throwing for five touchdowns and rushing for two.

HIDALGO, Tx - Norman Mason, playing in his first game with the Rio Grande Valley Dorados, registered his second interception of the game in his own endzone with just under ten-seconds remaining in the contest to preserve a 52-49 victory over the Wilkes-Barre Scranton Pioneers Saturday night in front of 4,392 fans at Chase Field / Dodge Arena. The win over the #6 ranked Pioneers, which was the Dorados first ever (1-7) against a non-division opponent, gives the Dorados a 4-3 record and also places them with a franchise best three-game winning streak. The contest was the first ever match-up in arenafootball2 history between recipients of the af2's Coach of the Year honor, as Dorados Head Coach Kevin Guy was a previous winner and Wilkes-Barre/Scranton's Les Moss won the honor last season.

Mason, who earned ADT Defensive Player of the Game honors, was acquired by the Dorados on Thursday and ironically had a two-interception performance the last time he was in the Rio Grande Valley, but it came last season as a member of the Wichita Stealth. His pair of interceptions was the only flaws in the quarterback performance of Wilkes-Barre/Scranton's Kyle Rowley, who was 30 of 47 for 271 yards and 6 touchdowns. Four of his touchdowns were to rookie JR Thomas. The Pioneers offensive specialist hauled in a game-high 11 catches for 124 yards, but couldn't steal the spotlight away from Offensive Player of the Game award winner Josh Kellett. The Dorados guarterback was 18 of 33 for 263 yards and 3 touchdowns in the air, while also running in a score and gaining 11 yards off two rushes. performance placed him as the Dorados all-time single-season and career leader in pass attempts (245), completions (132) and passing yards (1647).

Heading into the contest, the Dorados were 3-1 when trailing at the half and had not won a game when leading at halftime. Dorados took advantage of a fumble by Jason Morris, who attended training camp with the Dorados, and Mason's first interception of the contest by gaining ten points off the turnovers. The ten points, registered by a 24-yard touchdown reception by Dwight Counter and a 26-yard field goal by Eric Houle, helped build a 24-10 lead with 3:38 remaining in the second Wilkes-Barre/Scranton's Thomie . Venisee cut into the Dorados lead with a four-yard touchdown catch with 21-seconds remaining in the half, but the Dorados had enough time for Eric Houle to boot a 17yard field goal as time expired in the half to give the Dorados a 27-17 lead.

Opening the second-half with the ball, the Pioneers did exactly what they needed to get back into the contest. Rowley hit Jurron Kelly for a seven-yard touchdown reception on the opening drive of the half and the Pioneers defense forced the Dorados to go three-and-out on their following possession. Rowley completed a 16-yard pass to Thomas with 8:35 remaining in the third quarter to give the Pioneers their first lead of the game 30-27.

The scoring was back-and-fourth from that

point with the Dorados getting a franchise singlegame best two blocked kicks on David Davis' extra point attempts to eventually turning out to be a difference in the game. Houle kicked his franchise tying-high third field of the contest from 32 yards with 50-seconds remaining to give the Dorados a 44-43 lead. The Pioneers answered back with 37seconds remaining with Morris tallying a five-yard touchdown run. Thomas was tackled short of the endzone on a screen pass for the two-point conversion and the Pioneers lead was held to 49-44. An unsuccessful on-side kick attempt by the Pioneers gave the Dorados first-and-goal. Dorados offensive specialist Craig Cole registered his 50th career af2 touchdown reception from sixyards with 28-seconds remaining and Travis McAlpine's two-point conversion gave the Dorados a 52-49 lead. The lead would stand, as the Pioneers drove down to the Dorados 15 yard-line before Mason's heroics.



ALBANY, Ga - The Rio Grande Valley Dorados overcame a scoreless first half with 31 fourth quarter points to eventually hold off the South Georgia Wildcats 39-37 in arenafootball2 action Saturday night in front of 6,112 fans at the Albany Civic Center

The scoreless first half for the Dorados was just their second in franchise history and it was highlighted by 13 consecutive incomplete passes by Josh Kellett. South Georgia could not get their offense going as well in the half. Former University of Colorado quarterback Bobby Pesavento of South Georgia completed a 42-yard touchdown pass to Kevin Beard, who was playing in his first game, on Pesavento's first pass attempt to open the game with a 7-0 lead, but then turned the ball over twice (fumble, interception) in the half. Matt Burstein, who earned Offensive Player of the Game honors, tallied the half's only other touchdown by catching a 13-yard pass from a scrambling Pesavento with 6:17 remaining in the half to place the 'Cats with a 14-0 lead. Kellett stumbled into his own endzone on a snap from his own two yard line with fourseconds remaining in the half to give the Wildcats a 16-0 halftime lead.

After going nowhere on their opening second half possession, Rio Grande Valley got a break that led to a boost of confidence. Dorados defensive specialist Norman Mason, who played two games earlier in the season for South Georgia, picked off Pesavento for a second time in the game and the Dorados converted the turnover with a Dave Morrill four-yard rushing touchdown with 6:59 remaining in the third quarter to end the longest scoreless drought in Dorados history. Dorados Coach Kevin Guy then used a little trickery on the PAT, by pitching the kick-fake to John Bradley, who walked in the endzone unattended to cut the 'Cats lead to

16-8. The Dorados defensive forced the Wildcats to turn the ball over on downs on the ensuing possession and then used the rushing skills of Chris Robinson to power them into the endzone with a one-yard run just 53-seconds into the final quarter. Travis McAlpine ran in the two-point conversion to tie the contest 16-16. Mason tied a franchise record and clinched the ADT Defensive Player of the Game on the next series with his third interception of the game and his fifth in the last two games. Rio Grande Valley took their first lead of the game with 11:14 remaining on a trick play the had Kellett toss a lateral pass to Marquis Floyd, who fired a 23-yard completion to tight end Ben McCombs for a touchdown and a 23-16 lead.

It was a see saw battle from there, as Travis McAlpine's 46-yard touchdown catch from Kellett answered Torrey Day's 21-yard touchdown catch from Pesavento to give the Dorados a 30-23 edge. The ensuing kickoff from Eric Houle of the Dorados hit the upright and bounced around the turf before eventually being recovered by Norman Mason to give the Dorados possession. It led to a Houle 30-yard field goal for his league-leading tenth field goal of the season.

The Wildcats scored on their next drive with an 18-yard connection from Pesavento to Burstein with 3:03 remaining to get cut the Dorados lead to 33-30. Rio Grande Valley answered with an 18yard touchdown of their own, as Kellett found Floyd deep in the corner of the endzone. Houle's PAT was blocked and the Dorados lead was held to

The missed PAT made things interesting, as South Georgia made it a two-point game with a 38-yard pass from Pesavento to Chris McKinney with 24seconds remaining. Montrail Pittman recovered Wes Virgilio's onside kick attempt for the 'Cats, giving them an opportunity to win the game with a drive starting at their own 14 yard line. Only penalties moved the ball towards the Wildcats endzone and three consecutive incomplete passes by Pesavento led to a 39-yard field goal attempt to seal the 'Cats win, but Virgilio, who entered the contest 0 for 4 on the season in field goal attempts, sent the kick wide-right and Mason clinched the net-return to seal the Dorados fourth consecutive win and their first road win in franchise history against a non-division opponent.

Rio Grande Valley fought through adversity to improve their record to 4-0 when trailing at the half. They suffered 18 penalties (for 128 yards) to South Georgia's five. Kellett was 18 for 42 passing for 187 yards and 2 touchdowns and completed his third consecutive game without an South Georgia's Bobby interception thrown. Pesavento was 14 for 36 in passing with 5 touchdowns and 254 yards. Pesavento's three interceptions thrown placed him with a leaguehigh 13 on the year. Floyd earned US Army Ironman of the Game honors with a game-high eight receptions for 69 yards and a touchdown. He also had his first career touchdown pass in the contest and three tackles.

OKLAHOMA CITY, Ok - The Oklahoma City Yard Dawgz forced seven Rio Grande Valley Dorados turnovers to runaway with a 59-35 win Saturday night in front of 5,111 at the Ford Center, ending the Dorados franchise-high four game winning streak.

It was a sign of a long night to come for the Dorados when their first play from scrimmage resulted in a fumble by Dwight Counter. They eventually had three turnovers in the first half (all fumbles), but were still in the contest. Dorados quarterback Josh Kellett was 13 for 20 in the first half and touchdown passes to Travis McAlpine, Marquis Floyd and two to Dwight Counter allowed the Dorados to keep pace with the outstanding first half display by Yard Dawgz quarterback Craig Strickland, who tossed four touchdowns in the half.

The Dorados, trailing 26-24 at the half, were not able to improve their 4-1 record when trailing at the half. The offense gained 12 yards on their

first play of the second half, but could not produce another play of positive yardage until five-minutes less than remained the in game. Norman Mason and Counter fumbled consecutive kickoff returns and Kellett tossed a pair of interceptions to Oklahoma City's **Jeromy** Flowers. Kellett's first interception thrown ended a span of 132 passes without an interception. While Dorados were turning the ball over, the 'Dawgz were scoring. Oklahoma City scored in their first six drives with four touchdowns and a pair of field goals by Jason Ball. They even received production quarterback Josh Stewart after Strickland was ejected along with Chuck Little of the 'Dawgz and Antoine Murphy Gathan McGinnis after a posttouchdown scuffle.

Oklahoma City was led offensively by Offensive Player of the Game Jarrail Jackson, who caught 11 passes for 178 yards. In the quarterback department, Strickland finished 18 of 25 with interceptions, 6 touchdowns and 233 yards. His fill-in Stewart finished 5 of 7 with 2 touchdowns and 75 yards, while Kellett finished 18 of 34 with 4 touchdowns and 2 interceptions and 182 yards in the losing cause. BJ Barre was named the US Army Ironman of the Game and Jeromy Flowers was awarded the ADT Defensive Player of the Game with his two interceptions.

HIDALGO, Tx - The Rio Grande Valley Dorados had their streak of nine consecutive touchdown scoring drives snapped in the closing seconds of their Saturday night af2 contest with the West Division leading Tulsa Talons, but it was snapped by a 38-yard field goal by Eric Houle with 2.2 seconds remaining to give the Dorados a 65-64 victory in front of an exuberant 5,002 fans at Chase Field/Dodge Arena. The win improves the Dorados record this season to 6-4 and extends their home winning streak to a franchise high three games and their division record to 4-0.

The start of the contest gave the Dorados bad flashbacks to their previous game, which was filled with seven turnovers, after quarterback Josh Kellett tossed an interception on their second play from scrimmage. The Talons were able to capitalize off the turnover and build a 14-0 advantage with a four-yard tight end pass to Josh McMillan. Rio Grande Valley was able to get on track on their next possession with a 36-yard touchdown drive that had four passes to Dwight Counter for 35 of the yards, capped by an eight-yard touchdown pass from Kellett. The touchdown drive not only placed the Dorados on the board and trailing 14-7, but it started a series of nine consecutive touchdown drives for the Dorados.

Tulsa's offense was in full gear as well and they opened the contest by scoring touchdowns in their first six offensive drives. In the first half, Tulsa quarterback Josh Blankenship fired three touchdown passes to Donovan Morgan, including an opening fourth down pass of 42 yards. Tulsa found success on fourth down conversions, going 3 for 4, with all three conversions finding the endzone. Blankenship also hit Toby Moeves for a 42-yard touchdown reception in the first half. The crucial first half scoring drive for the Dorados came in the final

minute of the half. The Dorados went 40 yards in three plays in a span of 12 seconds to find Marquis Floyd with an 11-yard touchdown reception as five seconds remained in the half to cut the Talons lead to 41-35 at the half.

The Dorados opened the second half on offense and Floyd gave the Dorados their first lead of the game with a seven-yard touchdown catch from Kellett to place the score at 42-41. Tulsa turned the ball over on downs in their next possession and the Dorados took advantage of it by cashing in with a 20-yard touchdown catch by Counter from Kellett. The Dorados attempted to go for the two-point conversion to build a nine point lead, but the plan backfired as Travis McAlpine fumbled the ball and Tulsa scooped it up and worked a couple laterals before Nick Davis took the ball the distance for the returned PAT two points, placed the Dorados lead at 48-43.

Play continued back and forth, as Ahmad Willis' one-yard touchdown run to give them a 50-48 lead was answered by Chris Robinson's four-yard touchdown run to regain the Dorados lead 55-50. Tulsa's Donovan Morgan picked up a pair of fourth quarter touchdown receptions from Blankenship, surrounding Floyd's 38-yard

touchdown catch, setting up the Dorados final drive. Clock management and penalties forced the Dorados into a fourth down and 13 situation and Eric Houle, who was 8 for 8 on the night in PATs trotted onto the field to attempt his first field goal of the game. The boot was right down the middle for his league leading 13th field goal of the season.

Tulsa had one chance remaining, as 2.2 seconds remained, but Donovan Morgan's kick return ended at the Rio Grande Valley 20 yard-line after he was finally tackled down by McAlpine to seal the win. It was the first time Houle and the Dorados have had a game decided by a kick of their own in franchise history. It was also their first one-point win in franchise history and the win improved their record to 5-2 when trailing at halftime

Both quarterbacks finished with some flashy numbers, as Kellett finished was 330 yards passing off a 26 for 37 passing performance for seven touchdowns, while Blankenship was 24 for 40 passing for 325 yards and 8 touchdowns. The Offensive Player of the Game was a coin toss, but eventually issued to Dwight Counter, who broke franchise single-game records in receptions (18) and receiving yards with 217, while tying the mark for touchdowns with four. His numbers edged out Tulsa's Donovan Morgan, who caught 10 passes for 145 yards and five touchdowns. Tulsa's Aleric Clark, who had 114 all-purpose yards and 3.5 tackles claimed US Army Ironman of the Game, while Dorados rookie Pierre Thomas earned ADT Defensive Player of the Game accolades after leading the squad in tackles with 7, including a tackle for a loss.



HIDALGO, Tx - The Rio Grande Valley Dorados improved their record to 6-2 when trailing at halftime, as they went on a 27-0 run to defeat the Central Valley Coyotes 55-36 Saturday night to the delight of 4,525 fans at Chase Field inside the Dodge Arena. The win extends the Dorados home winning streak to a franchise best four games and improves their overall record to 7-4, which is one win more than garnered during their inaugural season last year (6-10).

The 27-0 run began late in the second quarter while the Dorados were trailing 29-14 due to a pair of Coyotes touchdown passes from Juston Wood to Wes Borba. With 2:38 remaining in the first half, Josh Kellett, who completed his first six consecutive passes to start the game, tossed a 12-yard touchdown pass to Dwight Counter. A Travis McAlpine failed extra point attempt kept the Dorados from cutting into the 29-20 deficit.

Rio Grande Valley started the second half on offense just as they did the first half, by going to Marquis Floyd. Floyd caught a pair of touchdown passes in the first half and caught his third touchdown pass on the Dorados opening drive of the second half with a 13-yard catch to place the Dorados within two points (29-27). The Dorados defense came out with vengeance in the second half, as Gathan McGinnis and Deorrick Henry each sacked Wood on the Coyotes opening drive, forcing John Gockman to attempt a 63-yard field goal attempt. Gockman decided to pooch the kick and he lifted the ball to the Rio Grande Valley ten yard line, where Counter awaited. Counter

caught the ball in stride and scampered 40 yards for the first missed field goal return for a touchdown in franchise history. The touchdown return gave the Dorados a 34-29 lead and one they wouldn't give back.

Norman Mason registered his sixth interception of the season on the ensuing Coyotes drive, leading to the first touchdown reception by Xavier Patterson as a member of the Dorados (seven-yard catch from Kellett). Patterson's touchdown built the Dorados lead to 41-29. Central Valley finally stopped the bleeding with a one-yard rushing touchdown by Wood with 9:55 remaining in regulation.

Kellett answered back with a one-yard rushing touchdown of his own to place the Dorados lead to 48-36. Central Valley faced a must-score drive on the ensuing possession, but dropped passes led to a turnover on downs and the Dorados got the ball back with 1:56 remaining. With point total tiebreakers that exist in the af2 playoff seeding system, the Dorados made the decision to keep plugging away offensively.

Marquis Floyd became the sixth Dorados member to tie the franchise's single-game mark for points and touchdowns in a game by tallying his fourth touchdown of the game with a three-yard touchdown rush to end the game's scoring.

Floyd claimed US Army Ironman of the Game honors in the contest by grabbing two of the Dorados franchise single-game best four interceptions, while also leading the Dorados in receiving with seven catches for 73 yards and in rushing with five yards off two carries. The Offensive Player of the Game was issued to Josh Kellett, who set a franchise single-game record with a 76.5% passing percentage after completing 26 of 34 passes for 241 yards. He found the endzone five times in the air, once on the ground and did not throw an interception. The ADT Defensive Player of the Game for a second consecutive week was awarded to Pierre Thomas, who led the game in tackles with 10.5 and also picked up an interception. Dorados kicker Eric Houle collected 2 tackles in the game and was also 7 for 7 in PATs, placing him with 18 consecutive successful PATs. In the loss, Wood was 19 of 35 for 212 yards and threw four interceptions and touchdowns. His top receiver was George Williams, who caught seven passes for 109 yards.



San Diego, CA- San Diego is known for its full share of sun, but there must have been a full moon overlooking the ipayOne Center Saturday night, as Gathan McGinnis recovered a loose ball off an Eric Houle 33-yard missed field goal attempt in the endzone as time expired to overcome the Rio Grande Valley Dorados 13-point fourth quarter deficit and gain a 65-58 victory over the San Diego Riptide to move into first place of the National Conference's West Division. The Dorados never led until the end and the win improves the Dorados overall record to 8-4, their division record to 6-0 and their record when trailing at the half to 7-2.

The epic ending came in a wild fourth quarter which saw both teams combine for 46 points. The Dorados trailed 58-49 with under 90-seconds remaining and quarterback Josh Kellett tossed his second interception of the game, giving San Diego possession at their own After the interception, a water bottle was ten yard line. thrown towards the official and a penalty flag was thrown. The official called a personal foul against the Dorados bench, but the Dorados bench was up in arms in a plead of innocence, pointing to the stands. discussion ensued with both team's head coaches, and the officials overturned the penalty, moving the ball from the 20 yard line back to the ten. The decision paid dividends for the Dorados, as on the very next play, Riptide emergency quarterback Ryan Smith fumbled the ball in his own endzone while trying to scramble away from Chris Robinson and Curtis Jeter. The ball ended up bouncing through the endzone, resulting in a Dorados safety and a 58-51 deficit. The Dorados received the following kickoff and cashed in with a Chris Robinson six-yard rushing touchdown with 48-seconds remaining to tie the contest 58-58.

Riptide kickoff return man Steve Gonzalez had his way with the Dorados kickoff team, earning the US Army Ironman of the Game honor with 267 return yards off 8 returns. It was the second most in af2 history, coming up one yard short of the af2's all-time record, but of all the long returns, it will possibly be his final return that will overshadow his 57-yard touchdown return in the first half. On the kickoff following Robinson's touchdown, Gonzalez returned the ball 30

yards and had his mind set towards the endzone, but Curtis Jeter swiped the ball loose from the grasp of Gonzales and it landed in the hands of Dorados WR/DB Travis McAlpine with 42-seconds remaining. The Dorados, at their own 20 yard line, then gave the Riptide the ball right back after the third fumbled snap of the game ended up being recovered by the 'Tide at the Dorados 17 yard-line with 38-seconds remaining. San Diego was unsuccessful in three plays and they marched out Kimo Naehu to attempt a 31-yard field goal. The kick sailed wide right and went out-of-play giving the Dorados back the ball on their own five yard line with 20 seconds remaining. The Dorados ran four plays to push the ball to the Riptide 18 yard line, and with less than five-seconds remaining, Eric Houle marched onto the field for the game winning kick. The attempt sailed wide right, but as it came off the netting as a live ball, San Diego's return crew couldn't obtain the ball and it bounced right to McGinnis, who stumbled in from the three-vard line to garner the Dorados win.

Smith was serving as quarterback for the Riptide after starting quarterback Kane Claunch was injured on Jeff Macrea's two-yard touchdown run in the first quarter that gave the 'Tide an opening 14-0 lead. Claunch had injured his leg while trying to escape Jeter, who had a hold of Claunch's leg with an offensive lineman on him at the time of the handoff. He was the only quarterback listed on

the team's active roster and his injury forced them to rely on Smith, who is an everyday wide receiver/defensive back and had not appeared as a quarterback since his early college career. Smith's first series led to a fumble which was recovered by Kyle Rasmussen and returned eight yards for the Dorados opening score. Xavier Patterson picked up the Dorados first offensively produced touchdown on the Dorados next offensive possession and it would be the only one of the half. The second quarter was a kicking display, as Eric Houle nailed a 40 and 25-yard field goal and Naehu was successful from 30 and 28-

Rio Grande Valley trailed 28-20 to begin the second half and they were unable to cut into the deficit after an interception by Trevor Misipeka led to a Matt Guardia one-yard touchdown run for San Diego. Smith began warming up in the second half and threw all three of his touchdown passes in the half, including a 30-yard touchdown catch by Nakoa McElrath. The Dorados maintained the pace in the second half by grabbing a pair of one-play scoring drives from Marquis Floyd. Kellett, who was honored with the game's Offensive Player of the Game award, connected on those one-play drives with a 45-yard touchdown and a 30-yard touchdown to Floyd.

Kellett finished the game with 282 passing yards, completing 24 of 36 his passes and finding the endzone four times. He found Floyd eight times for 126 yards and three touchdowns in the game. Ryan Smith was 9 of 23 for 126 yards and three touchdowns in his quarterback debut. San Diego's Maurice Taylor registered 6.5 tackles and a pass deflection to claim the ADT Defensive Player of the Game. received production defensively from McGinnis and Rasmussen. McGinnis tallied 3.5 tackles, a sack and 2 forced fumbles to go along with his game winning Rasmussen assisted with 3 tackles, two pass deflections and his eight-yard touchdown fumble return. The game was marred by a combined 10 turnovers between the two clubs, as the Dorados were able to gain the win despite five turnovers (3 fumbles and 2 interceptions).

BOSSIER CITY, La - The Rio Grande Valley Dorados went into the French influenced state of Louisiana and registered a 66-52 win in Canadian fashion, as Canadian born quarterback J.R. Davies drove the Dorados to a victory over the Bossier-Shreveport Battle in his first professional start. The win improves the Dorados record to 9-4, keeping them in first place in the West Division, and places the Dorados one step closer in their goal of a return trip to Bossier City's CenturyTel Center, which is the host location of The 2005 ArenaCup.

Davies, a rookie out of Canada's Simon Fraser University, wears a special af2 label as an International Player since he is from Port Moody, British Columbia. His performance was a special one for him and the Dorados as well, as he earned Offensive Player of the Game honors by completing 23 of 34 passes for 263 yards and 5 touchdowns. He opened the contest completing his first five passes and helped the Dorados bust out a 21-3 first quarter lead with a pair of touchdown tosses to Dwight Counter and a game high 40-yard scoring pass to Deorrick Henry.

Rio Grande Valley received a franchise best 26-yard touchdown run by Chris Robinson in the second quarter eventually built a 35-15 lead in quarter, but then the tide turned in favor of the Battle Wings. After a four-yard touchdown pass from Brent Rawls to Adrian Burnette with 20-seconds remaining in the half, the Battle Wings ensuing kickoff hit off the netting-iron and was recovered by the 'Wings at the one-yard line. Rawls rushing score from a yard out placed the Battle Wings deficit to 35-29 with 14seconds remaining in the half. Eric Houle ended up closing the half with a franchise high 50-yard field goal as time expired to place the halftime lead to 38-29.

The halftime lead, which was only the fourth halftime lead for the Dorados this season, would end up evaporating in the third quarter by Brian Hazelwood 21-yard field goal and a Reggie Perkins 10-yard touchdown catch that tied the score 38-38. The Dorados came

right back with a 14-yard touchdown pass to Marquis Floyd, but Eric Houle missed the PAT, which ended his career high streak of consecutive PATs at 30, to hold the Dorados lead to 44-38. That allowed the Battle Wings to take a 45-44 lead after a 38-yard touchdown pass to Chris Highshaw with 9:28 remaining.

The Dorados picked up some key defensive plays the rest of the way and three rushing touchdowns to pull the game out. Robinson, who was named US Army Ironman of the Game, had two of the rushing touchdowns while Darvell Bivens picked up his first of the season. The Dorados registered a franchise high four as a team. Curtis Jeter collected his first interception of his 64-game career on the game's final play to clinch the victory.

Rio Grande Valley's defense forced three interceptions in the game and held the Bossier-Shreveport 0 for 6 on third down conversions. They held Rawls to 15 completions on 37 attempts.

Tulsa, OK - The Rio Grande Valley Dorados have been able to overcome many first half deficits this season, but Saturday night in front of 5,980 fans at the Tulsa Convention Center, the Dorados were unable to rebound from a 27-0 deficit and were defeated by the Tulsa Talons 58-49. The loss not only drops the Dorados overall record to 9-5, but it places the Talons in sole possession of first place, dropping the Dorados to second in the National Conference's West Division, and prevents the Dorados from clinching a playoff spot this week and ends a four-game winning streak.

The Talons built their 27-0 lead by four touchdown passes from Josh Blankenship, who found Donovan Morgan for six yards, Robert Reed for 16, Aleric Clark for three yards and Morgan once again for 15 yard scores. The Dorados, who were held scoreless in their first three drives due to a fumble and a pair of turnover-on-downs, were finally able to get on the board with 10:47 remaining in the second quarter with a two-yard touchdown run by quarterback Josh Kellett. David Carlton missed a 33-yard field goal on the ensuing drive for the Talons, giving the Dorados their first defensive stop of the game, and they were able to take advantage of the stop by garnering a 12-yard touchdown reception from Deorrick Henry. The touchdown by Henry, with 2:41 remaining in the first half, was one of four touchdowns scored between the two teams in the final three minutes of the first half. The Dorados attempted onside kick was unsuccessful, leading Tulsa to convert a short offensive drive with a five-yard touchdown catch by Morgan with 1:09 remaining to build a 34-14 lead. Rio Grande Valley responded with a one-play drive on the next offensive play with a 39-yard pass from Kellett to Counter with 35-seconds remaining, but an unsuccessful two-point conversion kept the Tulsa lead to 34-20. The Dorados needed a defensive

stop in the closing moments of the half, but Tulsa was able to score in two plays with Morgan catching a 23-yard pass for his fourth touchdown of the half. It left 14-seconds on the clock and the Dorados couldn't muster up any additional points in the half and trailed 41-20 at the half.

Coming in with a 7-2 record when trailing at the half, the Dorados attempted a comeback as they have many times this season. Marquis Floyd caught an 18-yard touchdown catch on the Dorados opening second half possession and then Dorados lineman Gathan McGinnis forced his af2 coleading fifth forced fumble of the season with a hit on Blankenship, giving the Dorados the ball. Floyd hauled in a 39yard touchdown catch on the next play from Kellett to cut the Tulsa lead to 41-34 with just over five minutes remaining in the third quarter. The Dorados held Tulsa to a 41-yard field goal by Carlton on their next drive and then Kellett registered his second two-yard rushing touchdown of the game to cut the deficit to 44-41 with 11:45 remaining in the game. Blankenship found Morgan for a fifth touchdown on the ensuing drive with an eight yard catch with 7:31 remaining to extend the lead to 51-41. Clark intercepted Kellett to stop the Dorados on their following drive, but the

Dorados were able to get the ball back without any damage as McGinnis collected his second sack of the game by tackling Blankenship on fourth Kellett went to Floyd for his third down. touchdown of the game by completing a 16-yard strike with 56-seconds remaining. McAlpine's twopoint conversion run cut the Talons lead to 51-49. Eric Houle's onside kick attempt went out of bounds and the Talons took over with a possession beginning from the Dorados 12 yard line. Blankenship ran three consecutive times, converting a first down by inches on third down, and then plunged in the endzone from two-yards out with nine-seconds remaining to give the Talons a 58-49 lead. Rio Grande Valley received the ball for the final nine seconds needing at least eight points to force a third tie breaker (for playoff purposes if the two clubs happen to end the season with identical records) since the Dorados won by one point in the previous meeting of the season, but incomplete passes closed out the game and the Dorados dropped to 0-5 all-time in the Sooner State.

Morgan claimed Offensive Player of the Game honors with ten receptions for 125 yards and five touchdowns. His ten catches were over half of the 17 thrown by Blankenship in the game. Blankenship was 17 of 32 for 224 yards and seven touchdowns. His counterpart, Kellett, was 25 of 37 (67.6%) in passing for 327 yards and five touchdowns. Three of his touchdowns were to Floyd, who caught ten passes for 158 yards. A pair of Texas A&M/Kingsville products claimed the additional game awards, as Clark earned US Army Ironman of the game accolades and former Dorado Nick Davis was awarded the ADT Defensive Player of the Game.



HIDALGO, Tx - The Rio Grande Valley Dorados were involved in a fight with some canines Saturday night in arenafootball2 action, resulting in good news and bad news. The Dorados suffered their worse home loss in franchise history with a 71-40 loss to the Oklahoma City Yard Dawgz in front of a disappointed 5,519 fans at Chase Field/Dodge Arena, but the fans can rest easy knowing that the Dorados clinched their first playoff spot in club history due to the Central Valley Coyotes 69-57 loss to the Memphis Xplorers.

Oklahoma City set the tone of the game by stopping the Dorados on a fourth down and goal-to-go opportunity from the one yard line on the Dorados opening drive. Rio Grande Valley fell behind early and couldn't get anything going to catch the Yard Dawgz, who were led by the precise arm of quarterback Craig Strickland. The Yard Dawgz tallied scores on their first six drives and Strickland completed his first six passes of the game to open the game. Strickland, who finished the night as the Offensive Player of the Game by completing 17 of 22 passes (77.2%) for 242 yards and six touchdowns, did not throw his second incomplete pass until late in the third quarter.

The 'Dawgs signal caller shared the wealth in the first half, completing touchdown passes to Al Hunt (five yards), Brandon Daniels (30 yards) and Jarrail Jackson (28 yards). Oklahoma City's other first half scores came on behalf of a 28-yard field goal by AJ Haglund and a fumble recovery by Cliff Holloman, who was recovering their own fumble from the one-yard line. The Dorados tried to keep pace in the first half, with

touchdowns from Dwight Counter (five yard pass from Josh Kellett), Marquis Floyd (2 yard run) and Stephan Lewis (11 yard pass from Kellett), and went into the locker room after the first half trailing 31-21.

Rio Grande Valley kicked off to begin the second half and the 'Dawgz continued right where they left off from the first half. Strickland hit Daniels for a 17-yard touchdown pass to open the third quarter and then found Jackson for a 13-yard touchdown pass to build a 44-21 third quarter lead. The 'Dawgz defense did their part as well, keeping the Dorados off the scoreboard for the entire third quarter. It was just the third time this season the Dorados went scoreless in the third period of play.

They did open the fourth quarter scoring with Kellett connecting with Floyd for a season leading 48-yard touchdown reception to cut the deficit to 44-28. Teams began trading scores, as Floyd caught a five-yard touchdown pass to answer Strickland's one-yard touchdown run, but the Dorados were unable to

answer Jackson's nine-yard touchdown catch. Kellett fumbled the ball in his own endzone and it was gobbled up by Curtis Bolden, who was a lineman that began the season in camp with the Dorados, with 4:15 remaining. That closed Kellett's night with 265 yards off an 18 of 36 (50%) passing performance with four touchdowns thrown. It snapped a streak of four consecutive games in which he had completed at least 66% of his passes. J.R. Davies came in the rest of the way for the Dorados, going three-of-six for 28 yards and a seven-yard touchdown to Floyd. Oklahoma City closed their scoring with a five-yard touchdown run by Walter Taylor.

Oklahoma City ended the game with three rushing touchdowns and eight rushing attempts for 46 yards. Jarrail Jackson, who leads the af2 in all-purpose yards, finished the night as the games' all-purpose yards leader with 209 yards. Daniels led the 'Dawgz in receiving with 110 yards off a pair of touchdowns. Floyd earned US Army Ironman of the Game honors with a game high 149 yards receiving off seven catches and four touchdowns. (3 receiving and a rushing touchdown). The ADT Defensive Player of the Game accolade was presented to Rickie Davis, who had four tackles, a tackle for a loss and a pair of pass breakups.



HIDALGO, Tx - The Rio Grande Valley Dorados closed out the regular season by jumping out to a franchise best 17-0 lead and cruised to a 38-27 victory over the Bakersfield Blitz to end the regular season with a 10-6 record.

The 5,153 fans in attendance were able to watch the Dorados lead from start to finish Saturday night. Rio Grande Valley produced their biggest margin to ever start a game as Marquis Floyd hauled in a 15-yard reception on the opening drive, Eric Houle nailed a 33-yard field goal and quarterback Josh Kellett scampered in with a four-yard rush to get the Dorados out to a 17-0 lead. The lead was directed by the Dorados play on defense. Bakersfield quarterback Neal Sharma, in for the suspended Jason Thomas, received the start under center, but could not get anything going early for the Blitz. The first eight plays on offense involved six incomplete passes and two lost fumbles. Their first play of positive vardage came in the second quarter, with a 33-yard touchdown pass from Sharma to Nathan Munson. The score would be the only marker in the second period and the Dorados held a 17-7 halftime lead.

The second half was a near carbon copy of the first half. After each team exchanged scores on opening possessions of the half, the Dorados began to capitalize off Blitz turnovers. The Dorados forced eight turnovers overall in the game, with four interceptions (split in a pair by Kevin Brown and the ADT Defensive Player of the Game Pierre Thomas) and four fumble recoveries. Floyd registered a pair of third quarter touchdowns, as he picked up a one-yard rushing touchdown and a 21-yard pass reception. Xavier Patterson also garnered a one-yard rushing touchdown in the quarter, which gave the Dorados their third rushing touchdown of the game to tie a single-game record.

Leading 38-14 heading into the fourth quarter, the Dorados suffered a turnover of their own. One play after Kevin Brown recorded his second interception of the game, the Dorados fumbled

from their own one yard line and Nick Onaindia recovered the fumble and rolled into the endzone for the score. Bakersfield closed the game's scoring with a 10-yard touchdown pass from Sharma to Harbert Briscoe with 27-seconds remaining.

Josh Kellett closed out the regular season with an 16 for 31 passing performance for 172 yards and a pair of touchdowns. The 172 yards places Kellett over the 8-K plateau with 8,014 career passing yards. 74 of the passing yards in the contest were directed to Floyd, who claimed the Offensive Player of the Game honor with a pair of receiving touchdowns and a rushing tally for a three-touchdown night. Stephan Lewis, playing in just his third game, filled in for Dwight Counter as the offensive specialist and filled in admirably with a game high seven receptions for 57 yards.



including the final scoring drive, which was a pass by WR/DB Marquis Floyd to tight end John Bradley for a 21-yard touchdown.





Southhaven, Miss.- The Rio Grande Valley Dorados led the arenafootball2 postseason in turnover margin heading into the game, but the Memphis Xplorers, who led the regular season in the department, forced five turnovers to claim the National Conference Championship 64-49 in front of 3.473 at the Desoto Civic Center.

The first turnover came on the Dorados first play from scrimmage, as Sale Key intercepted a Josh Kellett pass and went untouched for a five yard touchdown return. RGV eventually bounced back and with a trio of touchdown passes to Dwight Counter, including receptions of 41 and 38 yards, and built a 36-23 lead. The first half included five lead changes, but the Dorados were able to take the halftime lead into the locker room after forcing the Xplorers to fumble away the ball late in the second quarter.

Memphis fumbled away the ball on their first play of the third quarter, but the Dorados couldnt take advantage of the opportunity, as Kellett tossed an interception, which was the first of four second half turnovers by the Dorados. Memphis forced interceptions on the Dorados first two second-half possessions to shutout the Dorados in the quarter, and went on to close the quarter with a 37-36 lead after Xplorers quarterback Brian Jones connected with Kevin Prentice for a 25-yard touchdown and then plunged in for a one-yard touchdown run. Rio Grande

Valley finally got on the board in the second half early in the fourth quarter as Marquis Floyd caught a four-yard pass from Kellett to give the Dorados a 43-37 lead. The lead was the seventh lead change of the game, but unfortunately for the Dorados, the lead would not last.

On the Dorados possession that followed Jones' four-yard touchdown pass to Prentiss to give the Xplorers a 44-43 lead, Marquis Floyd caught a pass and hopped past several defenders midfield, but was hit while trying to extend the 19-yard reception and fumbled the ball away. Memphis recovered to gain possession and then drove down the field with Jones hitting Prentiss for yet another touchdown catch, which built the Memphis lead to 51-43. Rio Grande Valley was within one point after a 39-yard pass from Kellett to Counter for Counter's fourth touchdown, but the two-point



Schedule: 184 Regular Season Games (March 30-July 29, 2006)

Playoffs: Six teams from each the American and National Conference qualify for the playoffs. The six qualifying teams in each conference consist of the two division champions and four Wild Cards, determined by best overall record. Seeding in each conference is based on overall record, with the top two seeds in each conference reserved for the division champions, regardless of record. In the First Round (August 4-6), the two division winners in each conference receive a bye. The top-seeded Wild Card team hosts the lowest-seeded Wild Card team, while the No. 2 seeded Wild Card team hosts the No. 3 seeded Wild Card team. In the Second Round (August 11-13), the division winners who had byes in the First Round host the winners from the First Round. The top seeded division champion plays the lowest seeded team advancing from the First Round, while the secondseeded division winner plays the other winner from the First Round. The winners of the Second Round will meet for the Conference Championships on the weekend of August 18-20. For this round seeding no longer matters, meaning the team with the better overall record hosts the Conference Championship. The winners of the Conference Championships face off in the 2006 ArenaCup on August 26 or 27 at the CenturyTel Center in Shreveport, 2006 Dorados Media Guide, Version1

Tiebreaking Procedures

If, at the end of the regular season, two or more clubs in the same division are tied with identical won-lost percentages, the following steps will be taken to determine rank.

Two Clubs

- 1. Head-to-head (best won-lost percentage in games among clubs).
- If teams split head-to-head games, the next tiebreaker will be the point differential in those two games.
- 3. Best won-lost percentage in common games, if applicable
- 4. Strength of schedule (strength up).

Three or More Clubs

- If two clubs remain tied after a third club is eliminated during any step, tiebreaker reverts to step 1 of the two-club format.
- If one team wins multiple-team tiebreaker to advance to playoff round, remaining teams revert to step 1 of the two-club format.
- All teams must have played head-to-head for step 1 to be utilized in a multiple-team tie.
- 1. Head-to-head (best won-lost percentage in games among clubs).
- 2. Best won-lost percentage in common games, if applicable.
- 3. Strength of schedule (strength up).
- 4. Coin flip.

Roster Limits

Teams are prohibited, from the first day the league allows the assignment of a player until the first league-sanctioned cutdown date, from having more than 35 players on their rosters. Players on the following lists will be considered eligible to be counted for the 35-man roster: active list, injured reserve, suspended list, left squad, refused to report and physically unable to perform. Teams will be required to reduce their active lists to 19-players by 2:00 p.m. (CST) on the Monday preceding the first weekend of the regular season. The 19-player active list will remain in effect for the remainder of the regular season. In the playoffs and ArenaCup, teams may have a 20-man active roster. Each team will maintain a 19-man active and a three-man taxi-squad roster during the regular season. Every club must dress 19 players for each game.

International Players

Teams are allowed an additional two international players on the inactive roster, and may have 20 players on the active roster if one player is of international status.

Waivers

Teams may not re-assign a player during the period beginning at 12:01 a.m. (CST) following that team's final game and ending at 12:01 a.m. (CST) on the first day of the assigning period.

Trades

A trade is a transaction involving two or more teams resulting in the exchange of rights of a player(s). At no time may cash be involved in any trade. The "Trade Period" will begin on the Monday following the ArenaCup -- and will end at 4:00 PM (CT) on the Wednesday at the mid-point in the season (May 31, 2006). Future considerations must be completed by 4:00 pm (CT) on July 1, 2006. Upon reporting to his new team, each traded player must pass the physical given by his new team. Failure to pass the physical and/or failure to report will nullify the trade.

Reserve Lists

The reserve list of each team consists of the following categories: retired, refused to report, left squad, injured reserve, injured exemption, League suspended, team suspended, exemptions, international and physically unable to perform.

Injured Reserve

A player who is placed on the short-term injured reserve list must be deactivated for a minimum of two (2) weeks. Preseason weeks will not count against that total. A player placed on long-term injured reserve must be deactivated for a minimum of 30 days. Teams activating players from their injured reserve list must do so no less than 24 hours prior to that team's game.

commissioner david baker/president jerry kurz



COMMISSIONER DAVID BAKER

C. David Baker has excelled in the one area that most accurately measures a commissioner's success: growth.

Under Baker's leadership, the AFL has expanded from 14 teams to 18, migrated numerous teams from small- and mediumsized markets to larger ones, increased team values from \$400,000 to nearly \$20 million, entered into an innovative

network-television agreement with NBC Sports, created a developmental league – arenafootball2 (af2) – and improved the quality and commitment of AFL ownership by incorporating numerous NFL, NBA and NHL owners. In January, Baker will guide the AFL through its 20th season, which will feature expansion teams in Utah and Kansas City.

In 2005, more than 1.7 million fans attended AFL games, averaging nearly 13,000 per game. AFL attendance has grown 41 percent since 2001.

Baker has also overseen an unprecedented era of corporate support for the AFL. Blue-chip brands such as Nike, Upper Deck, Champs Sports, U.S. Army and ADT Security are AFL partners. In 2006, EA Sports will produce their first-ever AFL video game.

On March 5, 2002, NBC Sports and the AFL jointly announced an industry changing multi-year broadcast partnership. Beginning in 2003, NBC televised AFL regular-season games every Sunday, all postseason games and the ArenaBowl. In 2004, the AFL and NBC Sports extended their broadcast partnership through 2006. Fox Sports Net became an AFL broadcaster televising regional games in 2005 and will continue in 2006.

The quality of ownership in the AFL has grown dramatically during Baker's tenure with many current owners operating other major-league teams, including eight NFL owners who operate current teams or the rights to future teams. The Nashville Kats, operated by Tennessee Titans owner Bud Adams, took the field in 2005, and Arthur Blank, owner of the Atlanta Falcons, assumed control of the Georgia Force. Celebrity owners such as Jon Bon Jovi (Philadelphia Soul), John Elway (Colorado Crush), Mike Ditka (Chicago Rush) and Tim McGraw (Nashville Kats) are equally committed to the AFL's growth.

Baker was named the AFL's fourth Commissioner in November of 1996, following one season as chairman of the AFL's Board of Directors. His first order of business was to draft the League's first-ever Mission Statement as well as the Fans' Bill of Rights, each unprecedented in professional sports and taught annually at the AFL's "Arena Football University." The documents are also applied to and appended to all players, coaches and staff contracts. The Fans' Bill of Rights, adopted by the AFL Board of Directors, is a list of 10 truths that the AFL holds to be self-evident. Fans are within their rights to expect, among other things, a "wholesome environment" in which to take in an "affordable," "total entertainment experience."

It is fitting, perhaps, for this former 6-foot-9 power forward at the University of California-Irvine, whose roots began in Possum Trot, Mississippi, before stretching to California, that his physical size matches his vision as the biggest Commissioner in sports.

Following college at UC-Irvine from 1971-75 and two seasons playing pro basketball in Europe, Baker attended Pepperdine School of Law where he graduated with honors and served as Editor-in-Chief of the Law Review. Baker, 52, is a former Mayor of Irvine, California and the proud father of two sons, Benjamin and Sam.



PRESIDENT JERRY KURZ

Certainly no stranger to the game of Arena Football, Kurz is entering his second season as af2 President. As one of the founding members of Gridiron Enterprises Inc., the charter member of the Arena Football League, Kurz is only exceeded in AFL tenure by Jim Foster, the creator of Arena Football.

As one of the game's founding fathers, Kurz has had an instrumental role in the growth of Arena Football League over the past 20 years. Now directly in charge of af2, Kurz plans to use that same vision and passion to cultivate af2 into the premier developmental football league in the country.

In his short time as chief of af2, Kurz has already solidified the future growth potential of the league by securing a core of quality operators and adding several new teams that begin play in 2006. Thanks to Kurz's efforts, this year the league welcomes back one of its original franchises, the Tennessee Valley Vipers, and proudly introduces three new members – two from the state of Washington (Everett Hawks, Spokane Shock) and one from California (Stockton Lightning).

Kurz also serves as the AFL's Vice President of International Development, responsible for the League's intenational exposure, growth and expansion.

He directly supervises the international players in the AFL and af2 and administers the H3 Visa program established in 2002 to develop foreign-born players. He has planned and executed all international games of the Arena Football League and continues to plan and lead the AFL's international expansion efforts. In an effort to increase the international talent in the league, Kurz adopted a rule in af2 prior to the 2005 season that allows teams to dress an extra player if that player is of international origin.

Kurz is a graduate of the University of Oklahoma where he was a member of the 1967 Big Eight Championship team and the 1968 Orange Bowl Championship team. He has been a player, a coach, a general manager and an owner in the football community. As a team owner, he has served on the Executive, the Legal, the Rules and Competition and the Negotiating Committees as well as serving on the Management Council. He is also a member of three football Hall of Fames including being a member of the first class of the Arena Football Hall of Fame.

He and his wife Kathryn have one son, Matthew, a college football player at Indiana University, and reside in Glenview, Illinois.

RULES OF THE GAME


THE FIELD

- An indoor padded surface 85-feet wide and 50yards long with eight-yard end zones.
- Goal posts are nine-feet wide with a crossbar height of 15 feet (NFL goal posts are 18-1/2-feet wide with the crossbar at 10 feet).
- The goal-side rebound nets are 30-feet wide by 32-feet high. The bottoms of the nets are eight feet above the ground.
- Sideline barriers are 48inches high and made of high-density foam rubber.

THE EQUIPMENT

The official football is the same size and weight as the National Football League ball. Each ball is manufactured by Spalding, a division of Russell Corporation.

ARENA FOOTBALL LEAGUE



THE PLAYERS AND FORMATIONS

- Eight players on the field; 19-man active roster; 3-man inactive roster.
- Players play offense and defense with the exception of the kicker, quarterback, offensive specialist (the kick returner on defense) and two defensive specialists.
- Substitution: All non-specialists may substitute only once during each quarter.
- Four (4) offensive players must line up on the line of scrimmage.
- Three (3) defensive players must be down linemen (in a three- or four-point stance). One linebacker may blitz on either side of the center. Alignment is two (2) or more yards off the line of scrimmage. No stunting or twisting.
- Offensive motion: One receiver may go in forward motion before the snap

TIMING

- Four 15-minute quarters with a 15-minute halftime.
- The clock stops for out-of-bounds plays or incomplete passes only in the last minute of each half or when the referee deems it necessary for penalties, injuries or timeouts.
- Each team is allowed three (3) timeouts per half.

MOVEMENT OF THE BALL AND SCORING

- Four (4) downs are allowed to advance the ball ten (10) yards for a first down, or to score.
- Six (6) points for a touchdown.
- One (1) point for a conversion by place kick after a touchdown, two (2) points for a conversion by drop kick and two (2) points for a successful run or pass after a touchdown.
- Three (3) points for a field goal by placement or four (4) points for a field goal by drop kick.
- Two (2) points for a safety.

KICKING

- Kickoffs are from the goal line. Kickers may use a one-inch tee.
- Punting is illegal. On fourth down, a team may go for a first down, touchdown or field goal.
- The receiving team may field any kickoff or missed field goal that rebounds off the net
- Any untouched kickoff which goes out of bounds will be placed at the 20-yard line or the place where it went out of bounds, whichever is more advantageous to the receiving team.

PASSING

Passing rules in Arena Football are the same as outdoor NCAA Football, in which
receivers must have one foot inbounds. A unique exception involves the rebound
nets. A forward pass that rebounds off of the end zone net is a live ball and is in
play until it touches the playing surface.

OVERTIME RULES

Overtime periods are 15 minutes during the regular season and the playoffs. Each team gets one possession to score. If, after each team has had one possession, one team is ahead, that team wins. If the teams are tied after each has had a possession, the next team to score wins.

GLOSSARY OF ARENA FOOTBALL TERMS

<u>Ball in the Stands</u> – When a ball is thrown or bounces into the seats surrounding the playing field, the "lucky" fan that catches the ball, keeps it. Although no official statistic has been recorded, it is estimated that the league gives away 15 to 20 balls per game.

<u>Defensive Specialists</u> – A pair of players, substituted for the quarterback and offensive specialist, who are the best "cover-men" on the team. Usually assigned to the opponents' best receiver and offensive specialist.

<u>Drop Kick</u> – A field goal that is drop-kicked through the uprights is worth 4 points. An extra point attempt that is drop-kicked is worth 2 points.

Ironman –Signifies participants playing both offense and defense.

<u>"Mac and Jack" Linebackers</u> – "Mac" may rush the QB straight-on, without stunting, twisting or drop-back coverage. "Jack" must stay within an imaginary box behind the line of scrimmage. Either linebacker may cover the fullback or tight end, but double-teaming is illegal. "Mac" typically plays fullback on offense while "Jack" plays wide receiver.

<u>Offensive Motion</u> – Unlike stadium-played football, one offensive back may go into forward motion prior to the snap of the ball.

<u>Offensive Specialist</u> – This player, substituted for one of the defensive specialists, usually plays wide receiver and kick returner. Simply one of the most dangerous players on the field, the offensive specialist typically is the first option on offense.

<u>Offensive & Defensive Line Specialists</u> – For the 2006 season, the af2 will allow a line specialist on Offense & Defense. The line specialists may line up at any of the three down lineman positions on either side of the ball. The line specialists would be governed by current substitution rules for specialists.

Rebound Nets – Goal-side rebound nets extend outward from each upright. The nets are approximately 30-feet wide by 32-feet high and extend to 40-feet above the playing surface. The bottom bars of the frames are positioned eight feet above the surface. Nets are stretched taut so a missed kick attempt will rebound off the net and back into the field of play. A ball is live when it caroms off the net.

<u>Sideline Barriers</u> – Similar to the sideboards that surround a hockey rink, the sideline barrier encircles the playing surface. The barrier is made of a high-density foam pad, measuring three inches thick. The sideline barriers are one to three feet beyond the field perimeter.

<u>Stunting or Twisting</u> – When a defensive lineman is rushing the passer, no "stunting" or "twisting" is allowed. In other words, linemen are required to power past offensive linemen straight-on, without using Reggie White-like moves.

<u>Tight End</u> —One offensive lineman must declare himself a tight end prior to the snap simply by raising his arm and "declaring" himself a tight end.

<u>Two-Way Players</u> – One of the primary "throwback" features of the Arena Football League and af2 is the fact that the game features eight-on-eight, single-platoon football, where six players on each team must play both offense and defense with limited substitutions.
