

The Zeniths shoot for their second CBA championship in three years. Monroe "Pops" McTaw, Glenn Hagan, Larry Fogle, Jim Bradley and Coach Mauro Panaggio all were with the champion Zeniths two seasons ago, 1978-79. The Jets last won a crown in 1975-76, and bring a .526 winning percentage (playoffs) into this year's playoffs. Lehigh Valley's all-time record in Rochester is 1-7. The only victory came two seasons ago at the Dome, in game two of the semi-final playoffs, in overtime. The Z's all-time win-loss record at the Dome stands at 49-5. They've won their last twelve games in a row here!

# Jets

The Lehigh Valley Jets have completed their 23rd year in the CBA, second-best only to the Scranton Aces, who finished up their 27th season in 1980-81.

The Jets took the Southern Division flag last year, only to be swept by the Maine Lumberjacks in the first round of the playoffs. Lehigh Valley, known as the Allentown Jets until last season, have qualified for post-season play in 19 of 22 years! The team has claimed 10 first place finishes and five second-place posts in its history. The Zeniths eliminated Allentown in the 1978-79 playoffs, but only after a stunning loss at the Dome and a one-point victory on the road.

More than 75 players have had NBA or ABA experience with the Jets, including Major Jones, Hawthorne Wingo and Mike Riordan. Many Zeniths played for the Jets during their careers including Kevin Cluess, James "Fly" Williams, Larry Fogle, Al Smith and Tim Claxton.

Last season's CBA Rookie of the Year: Center Edgar Jones, went from the Jets to the NBA New Jersey Nets. Jet forward Carlos Terry, led the loop in field goal percentage a year ago with 61%, and was signed by the Washington Bullets. This year, Forward Clarence Kea has moved up to the big league, after inking a 10-day contract with the Dallas Mavericks. He becomes one of 21 CBA veterans now up in the NBA, the highest total ever of ex-players now up in the bigs.

The Jets won the league title four straight seasons from 1960-64, and logged the second-highest winning percentage in CBA history (.889) when they finished 24-3 in 1975-76!



# LARRY FOGLE

LARRY FOGLE, 2nd round draft by the New York Knicks in 1975, has been named the CBAs latest PLAYER OF THE WEEK! Larry exploded for an average of 32 points in the 4-game span, shooting 62% from the field! He led the Z's in scoring this year (27.1 per) and in rebounds (345), to continue as the club's all-time leader in both departments. Larry closed 1980-81 with 3430 career CBA points, good for a ranking of the 30th best scorer in the league's history. He owns the Zenith record for most field goals made in a playoff game (17), and is co-holder of the Z playoff point high with 43. Larry has played more CBA games than every other Zenith (171) which has included stops with the Allentown Jets, Shore Bullets and Long Island Ducks. He was one of three players to play in every Rochester game this season, and along with Coach Mauro Panaggio, Jim Bradley and Glenn Hagan, shoot for another Continental Basketball Association championship for the Z's, who took it all in 1978-79.
