E. Stanley Kroenke OWNER

Mr. E. Stanley Kroenke was officially introduced as the owner of the Colorado Mammoth on July 9, 2002, and under his leadership, the Mammoth has become the model franchise in the National Lacrosse League.

In the team's first decade in Denver, the Mammoth has reached the postseason nine times. Colorado won the Champion's Cup on May 13, 2006 in Buffalo. N.Y.

Mr. Kroenke has been widely recognized as one of the top owners in professional sports, as well as a strong and committed leader throughout the community. Kroenke Sports & Entertainment, Mr. Kroenke's Denver-based company, also owns the National Basketball Association's Denver Nuggets, National Hockey League's Colorado Avalanche, Major League Soccer's Colorado Rapids and Pepsi Center. His teams have hosted the 2004 and 2009 NLL All-Star Games, the 2001 NHL All-Star Game, the 2005 NBA All-Star Game and the 2007 MLS All-Star Game, bringing some of the world's greatest athletes to Denver.

KSE's dedication to success has been evidenced by the consistent playoff runs of its teams. The Avalanche claimed its second Stanley Cup in June 2001, and the Rapids won the MLS Cup in 2010.

In February 2007, Mr. Kroenke purchased a significant stake in Arsenal FC. He is the controlling shareholder of London's storied football club. The initial investment came months after KSE and the Colorado Rapids formed a landmark marketing and strategic partnership with the famed Barclays Premier League club. The relationship has been further strengthened by KSE's acquisition of 83 percent shareholding in Arsenal Broadband Limited. In September 2008, Mr. Kroenke was appointed to the Arsenal board as a non-executive director.

In August 2010, National Football League owners unanimously approved Mr. Kroenke's bid to become principal owner of the St. Louis Rams. A native Missourian, Mr. Kroenke played a vital role in bringing the NFL back to St. Louis in 1995. Prior to becoming the majority owner of the Rams, he was the minority owner of the team. With his real estate development expertise, Mr. Kroenke was instrumental in the building of Rams Park, now known as the Russell Training Center.

Under Mr. Kroenke's direction, KSE completed three of the company's most ambitious projects to date. On April 7, 2007 KSE opened Dick's Sporting Goods Park. The state-of-the-art sports facility on more than 160 acres in Commerce City, Colo. seats 18,000 fans for field sports and up to 27,000 for concerts. The award-winning field at Dick's Sporting Goods Park has been heralded as "one of the finest pitches in the world" by numerous international players and coaches who have played at the complex.

In November 2008, the stadium hosted Colorado's first-ever World Cup qualifier between the USA and Guatemala. Dick's Sporting Goods Park also includes 24 surrounding playing fields for youth and adult recreational sports such as soccer, lacrosse and rugby. The complex anchors the 917-acre Prairie Gateway site that is a public-private partnership between KSE and Commerce City. The site is host to the Commerce City municipal hall, retail facilities, offices for the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service, and a visitors' center for the Rocky Mountain Arsenal Wildlife Refuge. The project has created hundreds of jobs in the community and is expected to generate thousands more as the growth continues.

Altitude Sports & Entertainment, a 24-hour regional television network began operation in September 2004, becoming the new television home for the Mammoth, Nuggets and Avalanche. Altitude also features other professional, collegiate and high school sporting events, as well as outdoors and lifestyle programming, entertainment and community interest coverage throughout the Rocky Mountain West.

TicketHorse became the official and exclusive ticket provider for both primary and secondary ticket sales for all KSE properties in July 2009.

One of KSE's primary focuses has been the Colorado community and civic causes. \$16 million in contributions have been made to Colorado charities through Kroenke Sports Charities and the teams' Community Funds.

KSE purchased the Paramount Theatre, a historic landmark in downtown Denver, in July 2002. The venerable venue remains a vibrant, multi-event facility where Denver residents and visitors enjoy a wide variety of entertainment ranging from classic concerts to family shows, dance productions, comedic performances and charitable events each year. Pepsi Center and the Paramount Theatre are home to more than 250 events annually including world renowned concerts such as Madonna, Celine Dion, U2 and Lady Gaga.

Peak Entertainment, LLC, a joint venture of Kroenke Sports Enterprises and AEG Live Rocky Mountains, opened 1STBANK Center together in March 2010. The multi-use arena accommodates up to 6,500 people for a range of events located in Broomfield, Colo. It was recently voted one of Colorado's top new concert venues.

Mr. Kroenke's enthusiasm and vision ensure that Denver will continue to be the top entertainment destination in the Rocky Mountain region for generations to come. Local media outlets have consistently named Mr. Kroenke one of the most significant people in the Denver arts and entertainment community, saying "No other person entertains more people more often."

In August of 2008, Pepsi Center played host to the Democratic National Convention. Tens of thousands of delegates, journalists, volunteers and patrons descended on Denver and the Pepsi Center for the Convention. The landmark event ranks as one of the most important in KSE and Colorado history.

Millions of people around the world watched the Convention, which city officials estimated boosted the local economy by nearly \$270 million.

Mr. Kroenke is chairman and owner of The Kroenke Group, a private real estate investment and development company with properties located throughout the United States and Canada.

Over the past two decades, he has built a reputation as one of the nation's leading real estate developers. One of the largest ranch property owners in North America, Mr. Kroenke's ownership stakes also includes the Screaming Eagle and Jonata vineyards.

Mr. Kroenke's current and former board and trustee memberships include Wal-Mart Stores, Inc., Central Bank Holding Company, Boone County National Bank, Community Investments Partnership of St. Louis, the College of the Ozarks, and the Missouri Basketball Hall of Fame. He is a member of St. Louis' Civic Progress, which provides support and leadership for various community improvements that promote economic development, education and quality of life. In February 2009, Mr. Kroenke was enshrined into the Missouri Sports Hall of Fame.

Mr. Kroenke holds undergraduate and graduate degrees from the University of Missouri. He and his wife, Ann, have a daughter, Whitney, an award winning documentary film producer; and a son, Josh, Governor and President of the Denver Nuggets and Governor of the Colorado Avalanche.

Jim Martin | President & CEO – KROENKE SPORTS & ENTERTAINMENT (KSE)

Jim Martin became President and CEO of Kroenke Sports & Entertainment in November of 2010. Martin oversees Kroenke Sports business and venue operations.

Martin first joined Kroenke Sports as President of Altitude Sports & Entertainment following successful stints at a number of major media companies. In the mid-1990s, he was the first Chief Operating Officer of FOX Sports Net, overseeing all aspects of that network's launch and operation. He was subsequently promoted to Executive Vice President, Head of Business Operations for FOX/Liberty Networks, which built, owned and operated a number of regional and national sports and entertainment television networks.

Prior to joining FOX, Martin was President of Regional Network Operations for Liberty Sports, managing Liberty Media Corporation's owned-and-operated regional networks and other sports network investments. Martin was Vice President and Chief Operating Officer of Liberty Media Corporation from 1991 through 1994.

A 1977 graduate of the University of Wyoming with a Bachelor of Science in Accounting, Martin graduated from the University of Notre Dame Law School in 1980. Martin currently serves on the Gold Crown Foundation Board of Directors and the Rocky Mountain USO Advisory Board. He also serves on the Arsenal Broadband board. Martin and his wife Jana have three grown children and are long-time Colorado residents.



Mike Benson | SR. VP, BUSINESS AFFAIRS & TREASURER - KSE

Michael Benson has been with the Kroenke Sports and Entertainment organization since 1996, including three years with its prior parent company, Ascent Entertainment Group. During his tenure with Ascent, Benson managed corporate finance, treasury and insurance. His resume also includes a stint in the finance and planning departments of Pulte Mortgage Corporation.

In addition to his executive duties at KSE, Benson is responsible for all treasury, cash management, risk management, 401(k), insurance, retail and human resources for the company. Additionally, he shoulders Executive Management responsibilities for InOvation Group, a Kroenke-owned Production and Stage Lighting Company and KSE Imprints, an apparel imprint and embroidery company. Recently, Benson has added responsibility for Kroenke-owned Colorado Rapids of the MLS and Colorado Mammoth of the National Lacrosse League.

Benson led Kroenke Sports' and Pepsi Center's efforts on the 2001 NHL All-Star festivities, the Grand Prix of Denver from 2002-2006 and financial aspects of the 2005 NBA All-Star game. Part of his executive duties in 2008 included negotiating and managing the contract between KSE and the Democratic National Convention.

Born in Eugene, OR, Benson holds a Bachelor of Science degree in finance from the University of Arizona (1991) and a Master of Science degree in finance from the University of Colorado (1996). He currently sits on the Board of Visit Denver where he served as its 2009 Chairman and on the Executive Committee of the Metro Denver Sports Commission. He and his wife, Laura, reside in Parker, CO with their three daughters, Carolyn, Meredith and Hailey.



Stephen Stieneker | SR. VP, GENERAL COUNSEL - KSE

Stephen L. Stieneker joined Kroenke Sports & Entertainment in 2005 as vice president and general counsel, overseeing all legal affairs for the Kroenke organization's sports teams and entertainment venues. He was promoted to his current position in 2011.

Stieneker received his law degree from the University of Virginia and his undergraduate degree in economics from Virginia Tech. Prior to joining KSE, he worked for Janus Capital Group as assistant general counsel, vice president of public affairs and chief administrative officer of investments.

Stieneker is a member of the Denver Zoo's board of trustees. He resides in Denver with his wife and three children.



COACHING STAFF



Bob Hamley | HEAD COACH

Bob Hamley enters his fourth season as head coach of the Colorado Mammoth. Previously, he served as head coach and general manager of the Arizona Sting and Edmonton Rush. Hamley guided the Sting to the Champion's Cup final in 2005 and 2007.

Following the 2005 campaign, Hamley received the Les Bartley NLL Coach of the Year Award. Just one day later, he was named the league's general manager of the year, becoming the first person in league history to win both awards.

Hamley is no stranger to the Mammoth organization. He was an assistant under former head coach Bob McMahon during the 2008 season, having initially joined the Mammoth following the Arizona Sting's suspension of operations. The Mammoth began that season 5-1 with Hamley behind the bench, but his tenure in Colorado was cut short when he accepted the head coach and general manager position with Edmonton.

In March of 2010, Hamley was hired once again by the Mammoth as head coach. Hamley looks to lead the Mammoth to another NLL championship in the 2013 season.



Ed Comeau | ASSISTANT COACH

Ed Comeau joined the Colorado Mammoth as an assistant coach in September, 2010. The 2013 season will be his third with the Mammoth organization and his 16th as a coach in the NLL. In his 15-year career, Comeau has a total of five Champion's Cup titles and has twice served as the head coach of the East Division in the NLL All-Star Game.

In 2008, Comeau assumed the dual role of head coach and general manager of the Titans organization where he served for two years. In his first season with the Titans, he was named the league's GM of the year.

His previous coaching experience was with the Rochester Knighthawks, spending two years as an assistant and three years as head coach. In 2007, his team set a franchise record finishing the regular season 14-2, winning its last 12 games in a row. The Knighthawks' winning streak continued into the playoffs as they won the league title and ran their winning streak to 15 straight games, the second-longest streak in league history. Following the season, Comeau was named the winner of the Les Bartley Award as the NLL's coach of the year.

He began his NLL career with the Ontario Raiders as an assistant coach, moving to Toronto when the franchise relocated after his first season. Comeau was with the Rock for five-plus seasons and won four championships during his tenure.

Comeau resides in Hamilton, Ontario with his wife, Tracy, and their twins, Alex and Spencer.

Sean Ferris | ASSISTANT COACH

Sean Ferris joined the Colorado Mammoth as an assistant coach in September, 2010. He spent the previous two seasons as an assistant coach with the Titans organization under Ed Comeau where his duties included coaching the defense, assisting with game planning, and scouting. Ferris joined the Titans staff after having worked under Comeau for four seasons in Rochester, beginning in 2004.

The Burlington, Ontario resident began his career with the Toronto Rock where he was head scout from 1999-2004. During his tenure, the Rock went 70-27 overall, captured six consecutive division titles, and won four NLL championships. He was also head scout for Team Canada when they won the 2003 World Indoor Lacrosse Championships and the 2004 Heritage Cup.

As a player, Sean won the '94 and '95 Ontario Field Lacrosse Championships with the Burlington Lakers. Prior to that, he won the President's Cup twice with the Fergus Thistles. Ferris also won the Ontario Lacrosse Association championship and the prestigious Mann Cup with the Six Nations Chiefs.

Dr. Ken Szarka PERFORMANCE COACH

Dr. Ken Szarka, in his fifth season with the Colorado Mammoth, has been in private practice for 14 years at the Integrated Health Centers in Centennial, CO. His multi-disciplinary practice offers chiropractic care, physical therapy, sports therapy as well as physicals, acupuncture, traditional Chinese medicine, massage therapy, nutritional therapy and behavioral health.

Born and raised in Calgary, Alberta, Szarka holds an undergraduate degree from the University of Calgary, where he also played football, from 1980-85. He received his Doctor of Chiropractic degree from Logan College of Chiropractic in Chesterfield, MO, where he was involved as a referee of field lacrosse at the high school and club levels.

Joel Raether is entering his fifth season with the Colorado Mammoth and has served as the assistant strength and conditioning coach for the University of Denver for a decade. A certified strength and conditioning specialist by the National Strength and Conditioning Association, Raether earned his bachelor's and master's degree in exercise science from the University of Nebraska-Kearney.

Raether has co-authored the books 101 Agility Drills and 101 Sand Bag Exercises and was also a contributing author to Fit Kids for Life. He has published numerous peer-reviewed research and journal articles and has presented regionally and nationally in the area of sports performance. He has coached numerous All-Americans and conference champions, individual and team national champions, and one Olympic medalist. Raether is engaged and resides in Denver.

Steve Govett | PRESIDENT, GENERAL MANAGER & GOVERNOR

Steve Govett, in his 11th season at the helm of the Colorado Mammoth organization, was instrumental in bringing the National Lacrosse League and the former Washington Power franchise to Colorado. Having spent time with the franchise in Washington, Govett has been able to build and maintain one of the most talented rosters and successful franchises in the NLL in his ten years in Denver.

Under Govett's leadership, the Mammoth has won three division titles, made nine playoff appearances and captured the 2006 NLL championship. The Mammoth has led the league in attendance four times, helping to grow downtown Denver's sports and entertainment economy. The team also has made a positive impact on area youth with various charitable donations and community outreach programs, including player clinics, school appearances and hospital visits.

In the fall of 2012, Govett was named the Vice President of New Business Development for Kroenke Sports & Entertainment. He is responsible to lead the evaluation, analysis and development of potential new business ventures for KSE.

In his early days as an executive, after two successful seasons as General Manager of the Philadelphia Wings, Govett joined the newly-formed Washington franchise as president and general manager in 2001. Govett led the Power to two winning seasons, the NLL semifinals in 2001 and 2002, and the East Division title in 2002 before the franchise relocated to Denver.

After the Mammoth compiled a league-best 13-3 record in 2004, Govett was named the NLL's Executive of the Year. Currently the Chairman of the League's Board of Governors, Govett works closely with the NLL Commissioner to ensure the long-term vitality of the league and its teams. A member of the league's properties and expansion committees, Govett has twice served as general manager of the U.S. world indoor lacrosse team. He was also general manager of Canada's gold medal-winning team at the 2007 world indoor championship, and served on the staff of the 2010 Team Canada Outdoor team. He is the general manager of Team Canada's Outdoor team that will compete in the 2014 FIL World Lacrosse Championships at Dick's Sporting Goods Park.

In October of 2009, Govett and his staff were instrumental in the creation of the NLL All-Star Series in Melbourne, Australia. After three years of planning and preparation, 32 NLL players made their way to Melbourne to compete in a two game series at Hisense Arena, home of the Australian Open.

Govett was a physical presence for the Philadelphia Wings from 1994-1998, collecting 26 goals, 23 assists and 115 penalty minutes in 36 regular-season games. During his five-year career, the Wings won three league championships (1994, 1995 and 1998). In 1999, Govett took the next step in his career when he combined his extensive lacrosse experience with his professional expertise. The result was a seasoned executive - the new Wings' general manager.

A native of Burnaby, British Columbia, Govett maintains dual citizenship in Canada and the United States, where he took the oath of citizenship on March 24, 2005. An avid golfer and youth lacrosse coach, he and his wife, Eileen, reside in Highlands Ranch, CO, with their two children, Mackenzie and Jake.

Don Sunblade MANAGER, LACROSS OPERATIONS

Don Sunblade, in his ninth year with the team, attended Metropolitan State College of Denver where he majored in sports industry operations and minored in marketing. Before graduating in 2005, he interned for the perennially-powerful Metro State men's basketball team, helping design and implement a marketing plan as well as assisting in game entertainment.

While attending college, Sunblade saw the Mammoth's first open tryout and immediately became a lacrosse fan. He interned with the Mammoth during the 2005 season before being hired later that year to assist the general manager and handle many of the team's day-to-day operations. Josh Gross began his career in the Mammoth front office in August, 2009 as the team's Director of Business Operations. He transitioned in August, 2012 to his current role as Sr. Director of Lacrosse Operations. Gross has been involved with the team since his Mammoth radio debut as sideline reporter for the 2005 season. Since then, he has served as the play-by-play announcer for internet and radio broadcasts, and assumed the role of TV play-by-play announcer for Altitude Sports & Entertainment prior to the 2007 season.

In his front office position, Gross oversees public and media relations, and is responsible for growing the Mammoth brand and the sport of lacrosse in the marketplace. He also manages the team's fan development initiatives.

A native of Bridgewater, N.J., Gross graduated magna cum laude with a broadcast journalism degree from the S.I. Newhouse School of Public Communications at Syracuse University.

Gross also serves as Sr. Director of Lacrosse Operations of NDP (National Development Program) Lacrosse, a division of the Kroenke Sports & Entertainment lacrosse department.

His career achievements also include a stint as the Director of Ticket Sales for the Boston Cannons of Major League Lacrosse, as well as ticket sales responsibilities for the now-defunct Colorado Crush of the Arena Football League.

Gross lists his career highlight as the opportunity to call the NLL Champion's Cup Final, a game in which the Mammoth won, in 2006. He resides in Denver with his wife, Natalia, and his son, Carter.

Mark Zaccone | ATHLETIC TRAINER

Mark Zaccone enters his second season as the Colorado Mammoth athletic trainer. A native of Ohio, Zaccone obtained his Bachelor's of Science Degree in Athletic Training from the University of Cincinnati. After an internship with the Colorado Rapids (Major League Soccer) in 2004, he moved to Denver and began working for Regis Jesuit High School as an athletic trainer.

Dr. Philip Stull, the team orthopedist for the Colorado Mammoth since its inaugural season, attended the medical school at Yale University. Following his Yale education, he completed his orthopedic residency at Columbia University in New York before finishing his training with a sports medicine fellowship at Aspen Valley Hospital in Aspen, CO.

Dr. Stull has practiced orthopedics in Denver since 1994 with Colorado Orthopedic Consultants. His emphasis remains sports medicine and specializes in knee and shoulder problems. He has published papers to his credit, and has lectured nationally about sports medicine issues. Dr. Stull is also the head physician for the Denver Outlaws Major League Lacrosse team.



Dr. Deb Jacobsen | TEAM DOCTOR

NLL Awards



2003 Most Valuable Player

Gary Gait's historic first season in Denver showed Colorado fans exactly why he is considered to be the best player in National Lacrosse League history. Gait carried the Mammoth in its inaugural season, smashing the single-season scoring record with 61 goals. He added 35 assists to finish third in overall league scoring with 96 points and was the centerpiece of the Mammoth offense that finished second in league scoring.



2004 Sportsmanship Award

Mammoth captain Gary Gait, who led the NLL with 55 goals and five game-winning goals, served just four penalties for eight penalty minutes in 16 games. The Mammoth was the third-least penalized team this season, averaging just 18.75 penalty minutes per game.



2005 Sportsmanship Award

Gary Gait won the Sportsmanship Award for the second consecutive season in 2005 after retiring as the National Lacrosse League's all-time leading scorer. Gait served just two penalties for four penalty minutes in 16 games, while finishing ninth in league scoring with 81 points. The Mammoth was the fourth-least penalized team in 2005, averaging 23.25 penalty minutes per game.



2003 Rookie of the Year

Brian Langtry quickly endeared himself to fans in Denver by scoring the overtime game-winner against the Toronto Rock in the Colorado Mammoth's first ever game on Jan. 3, 2003. He continued to delight fans of the fledging Mammoth during the 2003 season with his deadly shooting and fiery on-field persona. Langtry racked up 28 goals and 34 assists to place third on the team in scoring and led all NLL rookies with 62 points.



2004 Goaltender of the Year

Gee Nash was named the National Lacrosse League's top goaltender after posting a career-high 11 wins and backstopping his team to the league's best record. In his fifth NLL season Nash recorded a league-best .790 save percentage and posted the third-best goals against average (10.68) among regular starting goaltenders.



2008 Sportsmanship Award

The Mammoth's Dan Carey deservingly won the NLL 2008 Sportsmanship Award. The left-handed forward has played three seasons for the Mammoth and in his 43 career games; Carey has accumulated only 11 penalty minutes, none in 2008. Before suffering a season-ending injury in 2008, Carey scored 22 goals and 27 assists in 11 games. Admired by teammates and opponents alike, Carey was named to the 2008 All-Star team. The Mammoth was the 4th least penalized team in the National Lacrosse League in 2008, averaging 20.56 penalty minutes per game.





2012 Most Valuable Player

John Grant Jr. rewrote the NLL record books, setting a new single-season points record (116) despite missing two games. His 50 goals were tops in the NLL, and his 19 power-play assists were second-most. Grant scored his 500^{th} career goal and recorded his 1000^{th} career point and 1000^{th} career loose ball. He was a three-time NLL Player of the Month and four-time NLL Offensive Player of the Week.



2012 Rookie of the Year

Adam Jones, the third overall pick in the 2011 NLL Entry Draft, led all rookies in points (76) and assists (47). Both were franchise rookie records, as was his goal total (29). Jones was a three-time NLL Rookie of the Week and two-time NLL Rookie of the Month. He was the team's third-leading scorer.
