COACHES AND STAFF BIOS



CURT STYRES
Owner/General Manager

Over the past seven seasons, the Rochester Knighthawks have experienced their greatest period of success in the team's 21-year history. One of the big reasons for the Knighthawks continued excellence has been the arrival of Curt Styres.

The owner and general manager of the second oldest team in the National Lacrosse League purchased majority ownership of the Knighthawks in June of 2008. Styres immediately went to work overhauling the roster and making key additions to his management team and lacrosse operations staff. The result has been unprecedented success on and off the floor.

In 2016, he will enter his eighth season as the owner of the Knighthawks, and seventh as the team's general manager. Since his first season with the team in 2009, the Knighthawks have been the most consistent team in the nine-team NLL. Rochester has made the postseason in six of Styres' seven seasons and won a league-record three straight Champion's Cups from 2012-14.

His formula for success has been based on a family atmosphere and a culture of winning. Styres has surrounded himself with a Hall of Fame coaching staff, which is led by head coach Mike Hasen. Hasen is one of three Knighthawks Hall of Famers on the Rochester bench, joining assistant coaches Paul Day and Pat O'Toole. They are complemented by assistant coaches and rising stars Jason Johnson and Andy Secore. His lacrosse staff also includes Knighthawks Hall of Famer Jody Gage, who is the team's VP of Player Personnel. Former Knighthawks and future Hall of Famers Mike Accursi and Chris Driscoll have also been valuable assets to team operations and the scouting department.

The product on the floor has also benefited from Styres' keen eye for talent. With a solid core of players, led by team captain Sid Smith, the Knighthawks have become the dominant team of this decade. No team has won more Cups (3) or more playoff games (12) since 2010. The team has also won 18 league year-end awards and earned eight All-Pro honors. In 2014, Cody Jamieson became the second Knighthawk to capture the NLL MVP award and Matt Vinc won his league-record fifth Goalkeeper of the Year award in 2015. Styres won two of those awards, capturing NLL GM of the Year and Executive of the Year honors in 2011.

The team's success on the turf translated into success at the box office with an increase in ticket sales. In the summer of 2015, the Knighthawks added over 900 season ticket holders. Their greatest offseason increase has the team closing in on 3,000 season ticket holders for the first time since the late 90s. Last season, Rochester ended its regular season schedule with the two highest attended games of the season, drawing crowds of over 7,900 and 8,500 respectively.

This past season, the Knighthawks also made great strides to reach out to the community and its local heroes. One of the new policies was admitting military members, past and present, to all home games for free. Keeping with that theme, the Knighthawks put a twist on Fan Appreciation Night to end the season. The team instead held a Military Appreciation Night, which drew a season-high crowd of 8,535 and included veterans from WWII, Korea, Vietnam, Desert Storm, and Operation Enduring Freedom and Operation Iraqi Freedom. The team also raised funds for Veterans Count and Honor Flight Rochester through the sale of military T-shirts.

Under Styres, the team has become one of the most generous sports teams in Rochester. At the Knighthawks Annual Give Back charitable fundraising event, 21 charities received net proceeds for their causes through the sale of Knighthawks tickets. The K-Hawks also raised \$7,000 through their annual jersey auction to benefit Urology Associates of Rochester's mission of fighting prostate cancer. In

addition, the team donated tickets to dozens of local charities, including Strong Hospital, Happiness House, Big Brothers Big Sisters, American Lung Association, Golisano Children's Hospital and Catholic Charities.

The Knighthawks have continued to make strides in reaching their younger fans. In 2015 alone, Healthy Hawks and the "We Got Your Back" anti-bullying program engaged over 5,200 students at 30 school appearances. Healthy Hawks educates students on the importance of maintaining a healthy lifestyle, while the anti-bullying effort teaches kids the signs of bullying and where to go for help. Anti-bullying, which has been a cornerstone program since 2012, has reached over 15,000 kids over the last three seasons with forward Joe Walters serving as the spokesperson. In 2015, the team added Lacrosse 101 to their community roster to introduce the game to local kids.

The Knighthawks also launched their own lacrosse camps with Walters serving as the head instructor. Under his direction, the team took the camps in-house and ran two boys and one girls summer camp in 2015. The Knighthawks also held three box lacrosse specific camps during the season, which included a camp for kids in the Seneca Nation. The team continued to support Breaking Barriers Lacrosse, which offers an alternative to those who are unable to play in mainstream lacrosse. The program is the first adaptive lacrosse program in New York.

Styres' success should not surprise anyone, as he has become accustomed to building winning products and franchises. He began his first business back in 1991, owning a gas station and variety store. From there, he went on to become a founding partner in Grand River Enterprises in 1993. Currently, Grand River Enterprises is the largest native-owned company in Canada. It's the No. 1 exporter in Canada in its field and the seventh-largest in North America.

Driven by the need to give back to his community, Styres and his business partners founded the "Dreamcatcher Fund" to aid native youth in education and athletics. Thousands of people have been helped by the fund with over 1,100 applications coming in each year. He also built a school for kindergarten through 12th grade students in the Iroquois Lacrosse Arena (ILA). The ILA was built in 2004 with support of Styres. The \$7 million arena in Six Nations has hosted international and local sporting events, while producing numerous professional All-Pros and nearly a dozen championships.

Styres has also displayed his generosity to the Knighthawks' fanbase. That was especially true during the 2015 campaign, which was known as the Year of the Seventh Man. The season began with Styres presenting Paul Graham with an authentic NLL Championship Ring from the three-peat season. He made the presentation to the winner of the "Knighthawks' 7th Man Championship Ring Raffle" on the field during halftime of Rochester's home preseason game. On opening night, Styres also invited over a dozen season ticket holders to escort the Champion's Cup onto the turf for a special pregame ceremony.

To cap off the season, he once again chartered buses to a road playoff game. In a repeat of 2012, the Knighthawks booked fan buses to a playoff game in Toronto. Over 250 fans rode on the buses, along with several hundred more arriving from Rochester and southern Ontario, to cheer on the Knighthawks at the Air Canada Centre.

The 2016 campaign should be another exciting season in Rochester with Styres at the helm. Powered by his love and passion for the game of lacrosse, he has driven the growth of the sport throughout western New York, southern Ontario and his home in Six Nations. It is that same desire that has made the Knighthawks one of the most competitive and entertaining teams in Rochester.

PAUL GAIT
Vice President of Lacrosse

Paul Gait enters his sixth season as the Rochester Knighthawks Vice President of Lacrosse. In 2014, he won his fourth National Lacrosse League Championship with the Knighthawks, winning previous Champion's Cups with Rochester in 1997, 2012 and 2013.

In his role with the Knighthawks, he serves as a member of the senior management team, and works with the general manager to assure the overall successful management of all business and lacrosse operations. Further, Gait is the Knighthawks alternate governor and the primary liaison with the NLL on lacrosse operational matters.

His additional responsibilities include overseeing player recruitment, travel and practice schedules, preparing annual budgets for lacrosse operations, scouting and serving an integral role in ticket sales, corporate sales, marketing and community relations on behalf of the Knighthawks.

Prior to making the move to the front office, he served as the Knighthawks' head coach for two seasons (2009-10). During his tenure, he guided the Knighthawks to a 14-18 record and a berth in the 2009 NLL Playoffs. He was hired in December of 2008 as the franchise's fifth head coach.

On the field, Gait was one of the greatest players in Knighthawks and NLL history. In 2010, he was inducted into the team's hall of fame after leading Rochester to two finals in three seasons (1995-97). The National Lacrosse League Hall of Famer and 11-time All-Pro also helped the franchise win its first championship in 1997. Paul earned the team's MVP award that season as he completed his Knighthawks career with 87 goals and 58 assists in just 27 games.

Those three seasons were part of an unprecedented 13-year playing career that began in 1991 and ended in 2005. Gait played in 128 regular season games for teams in Detroit, Philadelphia, Rochester, Syracuse, Washington and Colorado. In Syracuse, he was also the Director of Player Personnel. He won titles in 1991 (Detroit), 1994 (Philadelphia) and 1997 (Rochester), and was named the league's MVP in 2002. He was an eight-time First Team All-Pro and a three-time Second Team All-Pro. He ranks ninth all-time in league history in goals (410), and finished his career with 712 points.

Gait led the league in goals in four seasons (1991, 1992, 1994, and 2002). He was also outstanding in the playoffs, scoring a record-setting eight goals in the 1994 Championship Game for the Philadelphia Wings, the most goals ever scored in a league championship game. Gait also holds the record for most career championship game goals with 23. After retiring following the 2002 season, Gait, made a brief comeback with the Colorado Mammoth in order to play again professionally with his brother Gary, who retired in 2005.

To go along with his three NLL titles, Gait captured an additional nine championships in his career. He earned a Minto Cup in 1998 with the Esquimalt-Victoria Legion, and won four Mann Cups: 1990 with Brooklin, 1994 and 1995 with Six Nations and 1999 with Victoria. In 2001, Gait helped the Long Island Lizards win the inaugural Major League Lacrosse championship. At the collegiate level, he earned First Team All-American honors from 1988 to 1990 and helped Syracuse win three straight national championships.

He was named the NCAA Tournament's Most Outstanding Player in 1989 and was named to the USILA North-South All-Star Game in 1990. Gait played for the Canadian National Team in the ILF World Championships in 1990, 1994, 1998 and 2002, earning All-World recognition in 1994. Lacrosse Magazine named him to its All-20th Century Team and the NCAA named him to its 25th Anniversary Team. In 2003-04, he was named to the Knighthawks' All-Time Team. In 2005, both brothers were inducted into the United States Lacrosse National Hall of Fame. In 2006, Paul and Gary were also among the five charter members to be voted into the National Lacrosse League Hall of Fame.

In November 2011, Gait joined Team 22 as its president and co-owner. Team 22, under the Under Armour® banner, designs, manufactures and distributes lacrosse equipment. Under Armour® stands as a world-wide developer, marketer, and distributor of branded performance apparel, footwear, and accessories. Gait added instant credibility to Team 22 after a remarkable playing career and a successful business career in the lacrosse equipment manufacturing industry. Gait has 20 years of industry experience, most recently serving as the president of deBeer and Gait Lacrosse. In 2013, the NLL named Team 22 as the league's official equipment supplier.

JODY GAGE

Vice President of Player Personnel

Jody Gage is the only person to grace the Hall of Fames for two Rochester professional sports teams: the Knighthawks and the Rochester Americans. Gage served as the Knighthawks general manager for 12 seasons and built the organization into a lacrosse dynasty (1997-2008). Rochester advanced to five championship games and won two titles during his tenure. In 2007, he assembled a Knighthawks team that won a league record 17 games and suffered only two losses. Rochester also won 15 straight games, which is the second most in NLL history, en route to the championship. Rochester won 12 straight games to close the regular season and tied for the best single-season record by any team after the NLL switched to the 16-game schedule.

He had a hand in drafting future superstars John Grant, Casey Powell, Curt Malawsky, Josh Sanderson and Colin Doyle. He also was a masterful GM when it came to trades, acquiring notable players such as Mike Accursi, Chris Schiller, Steve Toll and Shawn Williams during his tenure.

Gage was inducted into the Amerks Hall of Fame in 1999 and is only one of three players to have his number retired. He stands as the Amerks' all-time leader in games played, goals, assists and points. He also holds numerous team and American Hockey League records. He was inducted into the AHL Hall of Fame in 2006. After retiring from hockey, he moved into the front office where he still works for the Amerks Director of Strategic Planning. He was the team's general manager from 1997 to 2009 and was the assistant GM when the Amerks won their sixth Calder Cup in 1996.

In 2011, he returned to the field game as the general manager of the Major League Lacrosse Hamilton Nationals. Through the "best draft class in MLL history," free agent signings and trades, the Nats finished in a tie for second place with a 7-5 record. Hamilton earned its first playoff win in two seasons and advanced to the championship game, falling by one goal to the Boston Cannons. The Nationals returned to the MLL Championship Weekend in 2013.

Gage's first stint in the MLL was with Rochester Rattlers. In seven seasons, the Rattlers also advanced to the MLL Semifinals in 2001, 2004, 2005 and 2007, and captured the 2008 Steinfeld Cup.

Gage officially rejoined the Rochester Knighthawks management team on September 29, 2010, as the Vice President of Player Personnel. In this position, he works closely with Owner and General Manager Curt Styres and the scouting staff. Gage offers input into the day-to-day decision making for the Knighthawks team. He also remains a key point of contact for the Knighthawks on all team business matters in Rochester. In 2014, he became only the second person in team history to win all five Championships (1997, 2007, 2012-14), joining Tom Cincebox.

TED NOLAN
Special Adviser

Ted Nolan has been a member of the Rochester Knighthawks family for the past seven years. For five of those seasons, Nolan has served as the Knighthawks Special Adviser. Nolan joined Owner Curt Styres during the 2009-10 season, as he returned to Rochester to serve as the team's Vice President of Hockey Operations. In 2011, he took on his current role as the Special Adviser to the organization.

In 2012, he achieved two milestones as his son Jordan won the Stanley Cup with the Los Angeles Kings one month after the Knighthawks won the 2012 Champion's Cup. Nolan earned his second NLL Championship Ring in 2013, as the Knighthawks won back-to-back titles. In 2014, he celebrated two championships as Jordan won his second Stanley Cup with the Kings and Rochester made NLL history by winning its league-record third straight Champion's Cup.

It was a season to remember for Nolan, who not only coached the Latvian men's national ice hockey team at the 2014 Winter Olympics, but he returned to the National Hockey League. On November 13, 2013, Nolan was hired as the interim head coach of the Buffalo Sabres. In his second stint in Buffalo, he coached the Sabres for two seasons, 2013-14 and 2014-15.

Since his days in Rochester, Nolan has enjoyed success as a player, coach and humanitarian. His resume includes six seasons as a head coach in the National Hockey League, the Jack Adams Trophy as NHL Coach of the Year, a Calder Cup championship, a Memorial Cup title and numerous honors for his philanthropic efforts.

Nolan was born in Garden River First Nation just outside Sault Ste. Marie, Ontario, and played for the Soo Greyhounds of the Ontario Hockey League. The left winger was selected by the Detroit Red Wings in the fifth round (78th overall) of the 1978 NHL Amateur Draft. His pro career spanned eight seasons, most of them in the American Hockey League (1978-85). He played in 374 AHL games with teams in Adirondack, Rochester and Baltimore. During that time, Nolan also appeared in 78 NHL games between the Detroit Red Wings and Pittsburgh Penguins.

He broke into the pros with the Kansas City Red Wings of the Central Hockey League in 1978-79, before spending the next five seasons with the Adirondack Red Wings. In 1980-81, he was a member of the Red Wings' Calder Cup championship team. He appeared in 299 games with the Red Wings from 1979-84 and recorded 84 goals, 126 assists and 455 penalty minutes. Nolan played in 60 NHL games with Detroit and scored five goals, added 15 assists and collected 71 penalty minutes. While with the Detroit organization, he befriended another rising star, Jody Gage. The two played together for five seasons before Nolan departed for the Buffalo Sabres/Rochester Americans in 1984-85.

Nolan, a former captain with the Amerks, finished his only season in Rochester sixth on the team in points (62) and third in penalty minutes (152). He ended his playing career in 1985-86 as he split time with the AHL Baltimore Skipjacks and the NHL's Pittsburgh Penguins.

He returned to the Sault Ste. Marie Greyhounds as an assistant coach and then became head coach in 1988, as a mid-season replacement. He remained with the Greyhounds until the end of the 1994 season. Nolan led the Greyhounds to three consecutive Memorial Cup tournament berths, winning the Memorial Cup in 1993.

Nolan was promoted to the NHL following the 1993-94 season, taking an assistant job with the Hartford Whalers. The next season, he accepted the head coach coaching position with the Buffalo Sabres, where he had his best success. In his

second season in Buffalo (1995-97), he led the team to the Northeast Division title and a berth in the conference finals. After helping the Sabres to a 19-point improvement in the standings and the team's first division title in 16 years, he was rewarded by being named the NHL Coach of the Year.

He returned to competitive coaching after an eight-year absence as the head coach and director of hockey operations for the Moncton Wildcats of the Quebec Major Junior Hockey League. In 2005-06, he led Moncton to its first-ever President Cup as QMJHL champion, finishing first overall in the regular season at 52-15-0-2. The Wildcats advanced to the finals of the Memorial Cup where they finished runner-up to the Quebec Remparts. For his efforts, he was named the QMJHL All-Star head coach and the league's General Manager of the Year.

He returned to the professional ranks in 2006 with the NY Islanders after a nine-year layoff from coaching in the NHL and confounded experts by leading the team to the Stanley Cup Playoffs. In a March 2008 Sports Illustrated player survey, he was rated second to only Detroit's Mike Babcock as the coach players would most like to play for. In two seasons on Long Island, he guided the Islanders to a record of 73-68-0.

Away from the rink, Nolan has devoted himself to First Nations causes, including teaching hockey to First Nations children. His work in this area earned him numerous awards, including the National Aboriginal Achievement Award, the Sault Ste. Marie Medal of Merit, the Order of Ontario (1991), Sault Ste. Marie Kiwanis Citizen of the Year and in 1986 he was chosen as a role model in the National Native Alcohol and Drug Abuse Program. He has also received an honorary diploma for human relations from Niagara College (1997) and accepted an honorary doctorate degree in law from Laurentien University (2002).

Nolan is an active member in the Aboriginal community and in 2003 established the Ted Nolan Foundation in honor of his late mother, Rose. The Ted Nolan Foundation is "committed to the healing process to renew and revitalize the mind, body and spirit of young people." They are committed to helping train a new cadre of Aboriginal leaders today, to take their rightful place in Canadian society tomorrow. The foundation also helps develop programs at the community level for First Nations youth in communities no matter how isolated or poverty stricken. The Ted Nolan Foundation raises scholarship funds for First Nation women wishing to complete their education.

Ted and his wife Sandra reside in Garden River First Nation and are the proud parents of Brandon, a former player with the Carolina Hurricanes organization; and Jordan, a member of the Los Angeles Kings organization.

MIKE HASEN

Head Coach • Sixth Season

Head coach Mike Hasen enters the 2016 season after leading the Rochester Knighthawks to a fifth straight postseason appearance. In 2015, Hasen was once again a finalist for NLL Coach of the Year, following a 12-6 season and a return back to the East Division Finals. His defense was also the stingiest in the league, allowing a league-low 173 goals against.

In five seasons behind the Rochester bench, he has a 51-33 regular season record and a 12-5 postseason mark. From 2012-14, he also made National Lacrosse League history by winning three straight Champion's Cups. For his efforts the past several seasons, the Knighthawks voted Hasen the winner of the 2015 Wolf Pack Award, which goes to the person who has shown outstanding dedication and commitment to the team.

In 2014, Hasen led Rochester to the top of the East Division with a 14-4 record, which was the second best mark in the NLL. Rochester went 12-1 in the division and posted an 8-1 record at home. The Knighthawks allowed 167 goals, second-fewest in the league, and boasted two players in the league's top five for scoring, including the NLL's leading scorer. He capped off the season by defeating the Calgary Roughnecks in the NLL Championship Series.

In 2013, he became the first Rochester coach to lead his team to consecutive titles, following an 11-10 victory over the Washington Stealth in the Champion's Cup Finals. In 2012, he guided Rochester to its first NLL Championship since the 2007 season.

On September 14, 2010, Hasen became the club's sixth head coach. Prior to his promotion, he spent two seasons as an assistant under Paul Gait (2009-10). He moved behind the bench after a stellar 13-year playing career, which included nine seasons in Rochester (1999-2007).

In 2011, he made league history with his selection as the NLL Coach of the Year, becoming the first rookie head coach to win the Les Bartley Award. That season, the Knighthawks returned to the playoffs for the first time since the 2009 campaign. The team ended the regular season on a four-game road winning streak and finished in a three-way tie for first in the East Division at 10-6.

In February of 2011, Hasen was inducted into the Knighthawks Hall of Fame for his work as a player. He helped anchor the Rochester defense from 1999 to 2007, ending his career by winning the 2007 Champion's Cup. At the time of his retirement, he ranked fifth in games played (114), loose balls (575) and penalty minutes (188). He served as the team captain for five seasons (2002-03 to 2007). In his career, he played in 150 games and recorded 23 goals, 82 assists and 704 loose balls. He was also named the team MVP in 2003-04 and was a two-time winner of the team's Unsung Hero Award (2000-01 to 2001-02) and a three-time recipient of the Knighthawks' Best Defenseman honor.

Hasen was also named to the Canadian All-Star team for the inaugural NLL All-Star Game in 1999. Prior to arriving in Rochester, he played with the Buffalo Bandits from 1996 to 1999. He tallied 45 points (10+35) in four seasons with Buffalo and was honored as the Bandits' top defensive player in 1997. He was also selected the Unsung Hero of Buffalo's 1996 MILL championship team.

Hasen also excelled in the Ontario Lacrosse Association's Major Series. He was a member of the 2003 and 2004 OLA champions during his playing days. He also captained the Mann Cup champion Excelsiors in 1998 and 2002. Hasen won the Merv McKenzie Award as the Most Valuable Defensive Player four times. In the summer of 2008 and 2009, Hasen was the defensive coach for the OLA Senior "A" Brampton Excelsiors, as the team captured back-to-back Mann Cups.



Hasen was elevated to head coach of Brampton and in his first season, he led the Excelsiors to within one win of the 2010 Mann Cup Finals. In 2011, he capped off an amazing year by leading the third-place Brampton Excelsiors to a Major Series Lacrosse crown and the 2011 Mann Cup Championship. In 2015, he took the Peterborough Lakers to the Mann Cup. Later that summer, he coached Team England to a fifth-place finish at the FIL World Indoor Lacrosse Championship.

Jason Johnson enters his sixth season as an assistant coach with the National Lacrosse League's Rochester Knighthawks. In 2014, Johnson was a member of the coaching staff that won a league-record third straight NLL Championship. Besides working with the Knighthawks, he served as an assistant coach for the Hamilton Nationals. In five seasons (2009-13), he advanced to three Major League Lacrosse Championship Weekends and won the 2009 title.

Johnson has immersed himself in the sport as a professional coach and as the Arrow Express Sports Lacrosse Director. In 2015, he won a gold medal as an assistant coach with Team Ontario at the U15 field nationals. Later that summer, he was once again a scout for the Iroquois, but this time won a silver medal at the 2015 FIL World Indoor Lacrosse Championship. In October, Johnson worked alongside his daughter Tawnie, as an assistant coach, and led the Western Mustangs women's lacrosse team to their fifth straight Ontario University Athletics (OUA) championship.

In 2013, Johnson served as the head coach of the Team Iroquois midget box team, and guided the 15- to 16-year-olds to a silver medal at the STX Midget Lacrosse Championship of Canada. The previous summer, he led the Six Nations Bantams to the gold medal at the 2012 Provincials. Johnson, along with Curt Styres, received Six Nations Minor Lacrosse Association Coaching Staff of the Year honors after leading the Bantams to the Provincial Championship.

In the summer of 2012, Johnson worked as an assistant coach for the Iroquois Nationals at the U19 World Championships in Turku, Finland. The Iroquois won bronze and defeated Team USA in pool play to earn its first victory over the Americans in the tournament. In addition to the Iroquois team, he served as an assistant coach for the U16 Six Nations field team. He also worked as an assistant coach with the Iroquois Nationals at the Bowhunter Cup (2012-13). In 2014, he was a scout for the Iroquois Nationals and won a bronze medal at the 2014 FIL World Lacrosse Championship.

The much sought-after coach was the offensive coordinator coach for U19 Team Ontario at the 2011 Field Lacrosse National Championships. While working under Head Coach Clancy Almas, the team captured the gold in Burnaby, BC. Additionally, he was the head coach for the Six Nations U16 and U19 men's field teams. The U16 team won gold in 2011.

His resume also includes assistant coaching duties with the the Senior "A" Six Nations Chiefs (MSL) from 2008-09. In 2009, he was the head coach for the Six Nations U19 women's field teams as well. Johnson also assists with minor box teams throughout his community. In addition, he was a player/coach on the Six Nations Senior Men's Field Team in 2008 that won the Ontario Championship and the 2009 team that won the Canadian Field Nationals.

He was the offensive coach for the Six Nations Arrows from 2004 to 2006 and helped the team win three consecutive Ontario Championships and advance to three Minto Cup Finals. He was also the offensive coach at the Indoor World Games for the silver medalists: the Iroquois Nationals. Further, Johnson was an assistant coach for the Six Nations Arrows in 2009 and 2010.

As a player, Johnson spent his entire career in the Six Nations lacrosse system, working his way through minor, Junior "B", Junior "A", Senior "A" and the Cam-Am ranks. Johnson won two championships, capturing the 1992 Minto Cup and the 1994 Mann Cup. In his junior career, he notched 53 goals and 70 assists in 59 games. In his senior career, he recorded 27 goals and 36 assists in 68 games. He also collected 27 goals and 30 assists in 36 postseason contests. Johnson was drafted in the third round of the National Lacrosse League Entry Draft by the Syracuse Smash.

Paul Day enters his 18th season with the Rochester Knighthawks and sixth as one of the team's assistant coaches.

In 2014, he won his fourth National Lacrosse League Championship as a coach, which included three straight with the Knighthawks (2012-14).

It was the type of success Day had imagined when he returned to the team in 2011. Day had two previous tenures with the club, serving as the team's senior lacrosse advisor in 2009, and coaching Rochester for 11 seasons (1995-2005). He still remains the winningest head coach in team history with a 75-39 record.

Day served as Rochester's head coach for eight seasons (1998-2005) and worked as an assistant for three (1995-97). He was behind the bench for Rochester's first league championship in 1997. In eight seasons as head coach, he led Rochester to three appearances in the NLL championship game (1999, 2000 & 2003) and eight postseason berths. In 2003, he added assistant general manager to his title and the following season was named the NLL Les Bartley Coach of the Year. In 2001, he was named the NLL Coach of the Year by Inside Lacrosse. He still remains the winningest head coach in team history with a 75-39 record.

For three seasons (2006-08), he served as the head coach/general manager of the Edmonton Rush. The Peterborough, Ontario, native ranks third all-time in league history with 82 wins. In 2009, he was inducted into the Rochester Knighthawks Hall of Fame.

In the summer of 2010, he was the assistant coach for the Brampton Excelsiors of Major Series Lacrosse. In 2007, he was the general manager for Team Canada and won gold at the World Indoor Lacrosse Championship in Halifax. Four years later, he was one of the primary coaches for Team Canada, which won gold at the 2011 event. Day was named Team Canada's defensive assistant coach for the 2015 World Indoor Lacrosse Championship, and once again won a gold medal.

During his playing days, he was a member of the 1992 World Champion Buffalo Bandits. He also competed in the Canadian Professional League and played college lacrosse at Hobart in 1987-88.

Andy Secore is entering his fifth year as an assistant coach for the Rochester Knighthawks. In his four years in Rochester, the Knighthawks have advanced to the postseason four straight seasons and won three straight Champion's Cups (2012-14).

Before becoming an assistant with the Knighthawks, Secore played six seasons in the National Lacrosse League (2006 to 2011). In 75 career games, he recorded 95 goals, 150 assists and 255 loose balls. In six postseason games, he collected nine goals and 12 assists.

Secore was drafted with the 20th overall pick in the 2005 NLL Entry Draft by the Calgary Roughnecks and was then traded to the Arizona Sting. In his first two professional seasons with the Sting, he scored 10 goals and added 15 assists in 17 games. In 2007, his second season with the Sting, he reached the NLL Championship Game against the Knighthawks.

With the Minnesota Swarm in 2008, Secore registered career highs with 28 goals and 48 assists for 76 points, and was named an NLL All-Star. He set a career-high with eight points (4+4) in Minnesota's 14-13 win over Portland on 2/10/08. Secore played the final three seasons of his NLL career with the Edmonton Rush. In 44 games, he posted 57 goals and 87 assists. His best season with the Rush came in 2009, when he finished with 23 goals and 40 assists. The left-handed forward scored a career-best five goals in Edmonton's 16-12 win over Toronto on 3/28/09, tying his career-high with eight points.

Internationally, the Hamilton, Ontario native has won silver medals with the Iroquois Nationals at the 2007 and 2011 World Indoor Lacrosse Championship. He also won the 2012 Bowhunter Cup with the Iroquois, as they defeated Team USA at The Blue Cross Arena in Rochester. Secore served as an assistant coach for the Nationals at the 2013 Bowhunter Cup.

Prior to his career in the NLL, Secore spent most of his junior career with the Junior "A" Brampton Excelsiors. He played five seasons with Brampton from 2000 to 2004, and earned call-ups to Brampton's Major Series Excelsiors in 2003 and 2004. He finished third in the Ontario Lacrosse Association's Junior "A" circuit with 90 points (43+47). He then played his final junior season with the Six Nations Arrows, who were finalists for the Minto Cup. In 95 junior games, Secore totaled 105 goals and 135 assists. He won the Jim Veltman Trophy as the Ontario Lacrosse Association's Most Outstanding Junior "A" Player, and in 2004, he earned the Gaylord Powless Award for Sportsmanship.

Secore began his senior career in the Western Lacrosse Association with Coquitlam from 2006 to 2009, and closed his Canadian box career in 2010 with the Six Nations Chiefs. He was a candidate for the WLA's Rookie of the Year in 2006, finishing second on the Adanacs with 65 points (31+34).

From 2012-14, Secore moved behind the bench, working as an assistant coach for the Six Nations Junior "A" program. In 2014, he led the Arrows to an Ontario Championship, which was their third Minto Cup in team history.

PAT O'TOOLE

Assistant Coach • Sixth Season

Pat O'Toole enters his sixth season as one of the team's assistant coaches. During his tenure, Rochester has made the playoffs five straight seasons and won a league-record three straight Champion's Cups from 2012-14. It was his fifth NLL title and fourth with the Knighthawks.

The championship was his fourth as a coach after working on the Brampton Excelsiors' staff in 2011. While an assistant coach under Head Coach Mike Hasen, the Excelsiors captured the Mann Cup to give him his first title as a coach, to go along with four as a player. In 2015, he worked along Hasen as an assistant coach with Team England at the FIL World Lacrosse Championship.

O'Toole made a smooth transition to coaching after a Hall of Fame playing career. Known as one of the greatest goalies in team and league history, O'Toole announced his retirement on December 23, 2010. He made the announcement after playing 16 seasons of professional lacrosse, 12 of those in Rochester.

O'Toole played for three teams over his career: Rochester, Buffalo and New York (Saints). He was a workhorse in goal, logging 10,285 minutes while finishing second all-time in saves with 6,464. He won two championships, 1996 with Buffalo and 2007 with Rochester, and earned a record of 115-56. He also registered an 11.40 goals-against average and a .768 save percentage.

O'Toole finished his stint in Rochester as the franchise's all-time leader in wins (102) and saves (5,756). In 173 games, he recorded a 102-51 record, an 11.21 goals-against average and a .771 save percentage. He revolutionized the game as he became a legitimate scoring threat, netting three goals as a Rochester Knighthawk, which is the NLL record for goals by a goaltender. He also chipped in 136 assists, hitting teammates with memorable floor-length passes.

O'Toole guided the Knighthawks to their second NLL championship (2007), and is Rochester's all-time leader in postseason wins (9) and saves (644). Additionally, he guided the Knighthawks to Finals appearances in 1999, 2000 and 2003. O'Toole was one of the keys to Rochester's 17-2 championship season in 2007. He was popular amongst his teammates as he was three times voted the team's MVP. He was also a two-time All-Pro and the league's 2003 Goaltender of the Year. In 2013, he was named to the Knighthawks Hall of Fame, and the NLL Hall of Fame.

O'Toole was originally drafted by the New York Saints in 1995. He played for the Buffalo Bandits and was a member of the 1996 MILL champion Bandits team. That season, he led the MILL in save percentage in 1996 and was named the Bandits' Best Defensive Player. Further, he was MVP of the MILL Championship Game. O'Toole would then sign with the Knighthawks as a free agent on January 23, 1999 and the rest, they say, is history.

Stephen Lobsinger enters his sixth season behind the bench with the National Lacrosse League's Rochester Knighthawks. During his tenure with the team, Rochester has advanced to the postseason five times and won three Champion's Cups (2012-14).

Since 2005, he has worked with numerous competitive lacrosse teams, including the Kitchener-Waterloo Kodiaks of Major Series Lacrosse and the Chicago Shamrox of the NLL. His first two titles came when the KW Kodiaks won the 2005 President's Cup Senior "B" National Championship and the Toronto Nationals won the 2009 Major League Lacrosse Championship. He was also part of the 2013 and 2014 back-to-back Mann Cup champion Six Nations Chiefs.

Internationally, Lobsinger won a silver medal with Team Canada at the 2010 FIL World Field Lacrosse Championship. He has also captured three gold medals with Canada, earning his first at the 2011 FIL World Indoor Lacrosse Championship. Lobsinger then won back-to-back golds, winning championships at the 2014 FIL World Field Lacrosse Championship and at the World Indoor Lacrosse Championship.





MIKE ACCURSI

Team Operations/Assistant Coordinator • Third Season

Mike Accursi is entering his third season as the Rochester Knighthawks Team Operations/Assistant Coordinator after playing 17 seasons in the National Lacrosse League (1998-2014). In his current position, Accursi assists with the breakdown of visiting team tendencies to create strategies for upcoming games. Furthermore, he serves as a liaison between management and the players, which also includes mentoring the younger members of the team.

In 2014, he contributed on and off the field. After starting the season in an executive role, he made a triumphant return to the turf on February 1st, scoring one goal and adding one assist against Edmonton. Rochester went 3-1 with Accursi in the lineup, as he scored five times and collected one assist. In his second game back, he scored twice to help the Knighthawks defeat the Buffalo Bandits 9-6. His most important goal, however, was on March 1st in Denver, when he netted the game-winner in an 11-9 victory over Colorado. In March, he returned to the front office and two months later celebrated the team's historic third straight NLL Championship.

In seven seasons with Rochester, Accursi ranked third in assists (222) and points (364), and seventh in goals (142). In Knighthawks' playoff history, the three-time team assistant captain ranked second in goals (28) and third in points (43). He set the team record for most goals in a playoff game with seven against the Buffalo Bandits on April 23, 2005. His numbers and leadership ability place him among the top clutch playoff performers in team history.

In his NLL career, Accursi played for teams in Rochester, Buffalo, Syracuse, Ontario and Edmonton. In 17 seasons, he scored 391 goals, while adding 436 assists for 827 points in 237 games. In the postseason, he ranks fifth in the NLL in goals (58), seventh in games played (26) and points (99). Accursi is a five-time NLL champion. He won his first two Champion's Cups in back-to-back seasons, winning in 2007 with the Knighthawks and in 2008 with the Buffalo Bandits. He repeated that feat in 2013, as he helped Rochester win back-to-back titles for the first time in team history. He was a major part of the team's success in 2014 when the Knighthawks became the first team in the NLL to three-peat.

Accursi also won two Canadian Senior "A" Championships in his 14 seasons in the Ontario Lacrosse Association's Major Series. He captured the 2002 Mann Cup with the Brampton Excelsiors and the 2004 Mann Cup with the Peterborough Lakers. In 2004, he posted 36 goals and 28 assists for 64 points – MSL career highs – in only 19 games. As a junior player, he won the 1993 P.C.O. Trophy as the top rookie in the OLA's Junior "A" series. That year, he notched 44 goals and 50 assists for 94 points in 21 games with Burlington. Internationally, he played for Team Canada in the 1999 World Cup.

His previous coaching experience includes both the men's and women's teams at Brock University in St. Catharines. He was the head coach of the women's team from 1998-2002, and from 2002-04, he was the offensive coordinator for the men's team. The men's lacrosse team won the Canadian University Field Lacrosse Association Championship from 2002-04. Accursi has also coached the men's team at Holy Cross Secondary School, where he works as a school teacher. In 2014, he was an assistant coach for the St. Catharines Athletics Junior "A" squad. In the summer of 2015, he worked as an assistant coach for the Peterborough Lakers of Major Series Lacrosse.

Accursi graduated from Brock University with a Bachelor of Science degree. He earned his education degree from D'Youville College.

TOM CINCEBOX

Tom Cincebox enters his 21st season with the Rochester Knighthawks and eighth as the team's Director of Player Relations. For 13 seasons, he was one of the Knighthawks' assistant coaches, having joined the team in its second year of existence: 1996. He is only one of two men to work for all five Knighthawks championship teams (1997, 2007, 2012-14).

Cincebox also has one coaching win to his credit. On February 28, 1998, he was forced to lead the team against the first-place Baltimore Thunder due to league-wide immigration problems that prevented Canadian-born coaches and players from participating. Thus, the Knighthawks hit the floor without Head Coach Paul Day and a handful of players. That night, Cincebox -- with a team of recently signed players and American-born players -- pulled off one of the biggest upsets in team history, winning 15-14.

Cincebox played his college lacrosse at Nazareth from 1985-89 and was honored with the 1989 Nazareth Lacrosse Block "N" Award. After graduating, he worked as an assistant coach for the Golden Flyers from 1993-96 and was Chairman of the Nazareth Sports Hall of Fame. Further, he founded the Rochester Lacrosse Club and is active in the Rochester Chapter of the Lacrosse Foundation. In 1998, he was the recipient of the Monroe County Section V Lacrosse Man of the Year Award.

CHRIS DRISCOLL

Ontario Scout • Fifth Season

Chris Driscoll enters his fifth season as the Ontario Scout for the Rochester Knighthawks. In 2014, he won his sixth Champion's Cup and fourth with the Knighthawks. The 2016 campaign will also mark his 12th season in Rochester, which also includes serving as the team's color analyst for radio and TV games.

In 2015, he served as the head coach of the Junior "A" Kitchener-Waterloo Braves, while also coaching Team Ontario to a gold medal at the Midget Canadian Nationals. He also won a gold medal as an assistant coach for Team Ontario at the U15 field nationals. Then in September, Driscoll made his international coaching debut as an assistant coach with England Lacrosse at the 2015 FIL World Indoor Lacrosse Championship.

In December 2011, Rochester added one of the most accomplished players in National Lacrosse League history by signing Driscoll. The Fergus, Ontario, native played 19 seasons in the NLL. On February 5, 2010, he returned to Rochester for the second time in his career via a trade with the Buffalo Bandits. His retirement from professional lacrosse thus ended in the place where he played one of his first and his last NLL game.

In his professional career, he notched 240 goals, 378 assists and 1,035 loose balls in 234 games. He won three championships along the way: 1997, 2003 and 2005. It was in Rochester where he won his first championship. The Knighthawks defeated the Buffalo Bandits 15-12 at Marine Midland Arena to capture a title in only their third season of operation. Driscoll had one goal and two assists in the MILL championship game.

Driscoll collected 72 goals and 108 assists as a Knighthawk after arriving in Rochester in 1995. He was one of five players assigned to the expansion Knighthawks. The former Detroit Turbo was one of the founders of the team and helped establish the Western NY team as a premier franchise. From 1995 to 1999, he was a member of the four playoff teams and played in two MILL Finals with the Knighthawks.

After four years in Buffalo and two in New York, Driscoll continued to have success as he joined the Toronto Rock for parts of seven seasons (2003-09). In 2003, he was given the National Lacrosse League Sportsmanship Award and won the first of two NLL championships in three seasons with the Rock. In November 2008, he replaced the retired Jim Veltman to become only the second team captain in Rock history. In 2010, Driscoll returned to the Knighthawks, where he spent the final two seasons of his professional career. In 2011, he recorded 11 points to finish with 198 points as a Knighthawk.

CRAIG RYBCZYNSKI

Director of Communications/Broadcaster • 17th Season

Craig Rybczynski is in his 15th season as the radio and TV play-by-play broadcaster for the Rochester Knighthawks. He is the longest tenured broadcaster in National Lacrosse League history, and in 2013 established a league record by calling his 200th straight NLL broadcast.

Rybczynski also serves as the team's Director of Communications, a position he has held since 1999. His responsibilities include publications, social media and public, community and media relations. In 2006, he was named the National Lacrosse League's Public Relations Executive of the Year.

In 2015, he was a member of the media team for gold-medal winning Team Canada at the FIL World Indoor Lacrosse Championship. It was his second appearance at the Worlds, having previously worked as the Media Relations Manager for the United States National Team at the 2011 World Indoor Lacrosse Championship in Prague. 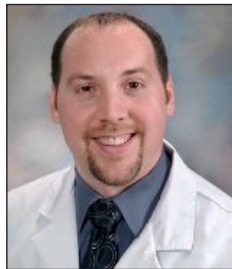

The downtown Blue Cross Arena at the Rochester War Memorial enters its 22nd season as the home of the National Lacrosse League Rochester Knighthawks in 2016. Last season, the arena on lacrosse game days was rebranded as Connors & Ferris Field at The Blue Cross Arena.

Opened to the public on October 27, 1955, as The Rochester War Memorial, it has since hosted two American Hockey League All-Star Games (1957, 2000), 16 Calder Cup Finals and one NLL All-Star Game in its history.

In addition, the War Memorial hosted its first professional game for the National Basketball Association's Rochester Royals on November 5, 1955.

The first hockey game played in the War Memorial took place later that month as the Buffalo Bisons faced off against the Montreal Canadiens on November 21st. Montreal's Maurice "Rocket" Richard scored the first goal at the War Memorial 54 seconds into the first period.

The Rochester War Memorial became known as The Blue Cross Arena after its \$40 million renovation was completed during the 1998-99 season. During the 2002-03 season, the \$1.25 million Constellation Video Board was installed to add the crown jewel to the downtown entertainment center.

The BCA has hosted four NLL Championship Games. The first was in 2003 and the second was in 2012. The Rochester Knighthawks won their third NLL Championship, and first on their home turf, defeating the Edmonton Rush 9-6 on May 19, 2012. Most recently, the Knighthawks won two games on May 31, 2015 to become the first team in NLL history to win three straight Champion's Cups.

Besides hosting NLL games, the arena also hosts major college basketball games, college and pro hockey games, cheerleading competitions, and youth lacrosse and hockey games.
