JOE HAERING - Pittsburgh Gladiators Head Coach

Like the Gladiators, Joe Haering is a charter member of Arenaball and a potential founding member of Tough Coaches Anonymous. A native Pittsburgher, he has coached the home team to consecutive winning seasons while compiling an overall indoor career mark of 10-10. An upbeat 4-2 record in '87 ended with a 45-16 loss to Denver in the ArenaBowl title game. Last season Pittsburgh finished 6-6 losing to Detroit, 34-25, in a playoff for ArenaBowl '88. His initial involvement in Arenaball came through "Mouse" Davis, an original AFL director and a fellow USFL coach at Denver and Jacksonville.

An accomplished defensive strategist, Haering is an enthusastic and aggressive competitor. Motivating at the collegiate level, he served as defensive coordinator at Kent State, offensive coordinator at Boston University, running backs coach at Kentucky and linebacker coach at his alma mater, Bucknell. A former scout for the NFL Rams and defensive coordinator for the USFL Pittsburgh Maulers, he seasoned his skills on the staffs of George Allen (USFL Chicago Blitz) and Walt Michaelis (NFL Jets).

PITTSBURGH GLADIATORS TEAM HISTORY

Pittsburgh's Gladiators are one of four original Arena Football teams (Chicago Bruisers, Denver Dynamite, Washington (DC) Commandos) and played and won the first-ever League contest, 48-46, over the Commandos on June 19, 1987 in the Pittsburgh Civic Arena. Leading the neophyte League in attendance that initial season, the Gladiators drew 12,856 per game, finished the year on top at 4-2, after a 4-0 start, but, alas, lost the inaugural ArenaBowl '87 championship game to Denver, 45-16, disappointing 13,232 Civic Arena fans. No first-year Gladiator watcher will ever forget the performance of '87 League MVP Russell Hairston, who led in virtually every offensive category scoring 18 TDs in just six games. He had six scores, an AFL record, in Denver on July 11, 1987.

In '88, Pittsburgh won their first three but lost five of their last six to finish 6-6. Advancing to an ArenaBowl playoff contest, they lost to the eventual League champion Detroit Drive, 34-25.
