

SENIOR VICE PRESIDENT OF SAP CENTER AND SHARKS ICE

Jon Gustafson enters his second season under the new title, Senior Vice President of SAP Center and Sharks Ice. For the previous eight years, Gustafson held the position of Vice President, Sharks Ice LLC, Sharks Minor Holding (San Jose Barracuda) & SSE Merchandise.

In his role, Gustafson oversees all venues under the SSE umbrellas including all areas of operation for the Sharks Ice family of ice rinks, including Solar4America Ice at San Jose, Solar4America Ice at Fremont and Oakland Ice Center, operated by Sharks Ice and the SAP Center.

Gustafson also acts as the Governor for the San Jose Barracuda and Executive Committee member for the AHL, serving as the liaison between the Barracuda and the league.

Since 2000, Gustafson, 52, has served as Vice President and General Manager of the family of Sharks Ice rinks. Under his leadership, the operation has grown from one facility with two ice sheets to three facilities with seven ice sheets and increased revenues ten-fold. Gustafson has also been instrumental in the 200,000 square-foot expansion of Solar4America Ice at San Jose which will include a 4,200-seat arena for the Barracuda and is expected to be complete by the summer of 2022. In June of 2013, the Jr. Sharks youth ice hockey program, which was founded by Gustafson and operates out of Sharks Ice, was named as a USA Hockey Model Program, one of only a handful of programs in the U.S. to receive the honor.

Gustafson, who serves on the board of directors for USA Hockey, works closely with organizations such as USA Hockey, USHL, NAHL, ISI and USF to bring national and world hockey events to San Jose. In April of 2016, Sharks Ice hosted the 2016 USA Hockey Boys Tier 1 U-16 and U-18 National Championships, the latest in a long line of national events to select the facility as the home for their events. In 2009, Gustafson was named the International Ice Skating Institute's "Facility Operator of the Year."

From 1996-99, Gustafson served as general manager and vice president of operations for the San Jose Rhinos of Roller Hockey International (RHI). The team, which played their home games at SAP Center at San Jose, won the Murphy Cup as league champions in 1995 and Gustafson was named RHI "Executive of the Year" in 1999.

A former goaltender, Gustafson spent five seasons playing with various teams in the AHL, ECHL, CHL, WCHL and IHL. On April 15, 1992, he dressed as the back-up goaltender to Grant Fuhr for the Toronto Maple Leafs at Maple Leaf Gardens in a 4-2 win over the New York Rangers. ## BARRACUDA HOCKEY OPERATIONS



### ROY SOMMER

HEAD COACH

After joining the Sharks' coaching staff on Dec. 11, 2019 as an associate coach, the Oakland native returned to AHL in 2020-21, his 23rd season at the helm of the Sharks' top affiliate, and his 25th overall within the organization. In his 23 seasons as head coach in the AHL, all within the Sharks org, Sommer has compiled a 788-679-48-159 (W-L-T-OTL/SOL) record in the regular season and has reached the postseason 13 times, including a Conference Finals berth in 2017, the first of his career. Since the Sharks relocated their AHL affiliate to California in 2015, Sommer has guided his club to the playoffs in five of the team's six seasons. The Barracuda are the only team in the Pacific Division to accomplish that feat.

The San Jose Sharks dressed 26 players during the 2020-21 season that developed under Sommer's tutelage. In fact, 60 players have made their NHL debuts with the Sharks over the last 15 seasons – including current Sharks Kevin Labanc, Timo Meier, Logan Couture, Jeff Viel, Radim Simek, Joel Kellman, Dylan Gambrell and John Leonard.

In 2018-19, Sommer again worked his magic, propelling the Barracuda to their fourth-straight postseason appearance, despite being one of the AHL's youngest teams. In addition, Sommer was named the Pacific Division's coaching representative at the 2019 AHL All-Star Classic in Springfield, Mass. On February 1, 2019, Sommer collected his 750th AHL win when the Barracuda upended the Stockton Heat, 6-4, at Stockton Arena.

In 2017-18, Sommer became the first coach in AHL history to reach 700 wins when the Barracuda topped the Bakersfield Condors at Rabobank Arena in Bakersfield, 2-1, on Dec. 3, 2017. In addition, he led one of the AHL's youngest rosters to its fourth straight playoff appearance after an improbable six-game winning streak to end the regular season.

In 2016-17, Roy turned in arguably his best coaching performance of his illustrious career. Sommer guided one of the AHL's youngest rosters to a Conference Finals appearance along with a regular-season Conference Championship and the league's longest winning streak (14), culminating in his first Louis A.R. Pieri Memorial Award as the AHL's Outstanding Coach of the Year.

In 2015-16, Sommer picked up record breaking win 637 to surpass Fred "Bun" Cook (636 wins) for the most wins in AHL history in 4-2 win over the Ontario Reign on February 10, 2016 at the SAP Center at San Jose. He also surpassed Frank Mathers (1,256 games coached) for the most games coached in AHL history on March 26, 2014 in Worcester's 5-3 victory in Lewiston, ME over the Portland Pirates. Sommer has coached 1,679 AHL games – all with the SJ Sharks AHL affiliates. In total, he has coached 2,009 total games in the AHL and ECHL.

In 2011-12, Roy became just the 4th head coach in AHL history to reach the 500 wins plateau after a 3-2 shootout victory at Hershey on February 11, 2012.

In 2010-11, Sommer became just the 4th head coach in AHL history to reach the 1,000 games plateau after a 3-1 victory at Springfield on January 14, 2011 and seven players made their NHL debut with the San Jose Sharks.

In 2009-10, Sommer led Worcester to a franchise record 49 wins and captured the regular season Atlantic Division title. He won his 400th game as an AHL head coach after a 4-1 victory over Springfield at the DCU Center on Nov. 1, 2009.

As head coach for San Jose's top development team, Sommer has coached more than 100 players who've spent time in the National Hockey League, including forward Logan Couture, who was named the 2010-11 "Sharks Rookie of the Year."

Sommer, 64, began coaching San Jose's top development affiliates in 1998-99 with the AHL's Kentucky Thoroughblades. He coached the T-Blades for three seasons before San Jose relocated their AHL team to Cleveland.

In his first season with Kentucky, the Thoroughblades registered franchise records for most regular season wins (44), most road wins (21) and total points (98) in a season while posting the AHL's fifth-best record. This success came despite having 17 players promoted to the NHL during the season.

From 1999-2001, Sommer's club went 84-50-21-5 to capture two consecutive Mid-Atlantic Division titles and went to the Calder Cup Playoffs each season. Sommer's success was recognized during the

1999-00 season with his selection as the head coach for the Canadian All-Star Team, where his squad toppled PlanetUSA, 8-3. Before being named head coach of the Thoroughblades in 1998, Sommer spent two seasons (1996-98) as an assistant coach with the San Jose Sharks. With San Jose, Sommer was responsible for pre-scouting upcoming opponents for their offensive and defensive tendencies, line combinations and special-teams tactics. In addition, he assisted in running practices and provided special on-ice extended workouts with scratched players and those rehabilitating injuries.

Before Sommer joined San Jose, he was head coach of the ECHL's Richmond Renegades from 1991-96 and was named 1995-96 Coach of the Year after leading his team to a league best 46-11-13 mark and a league record 105 points in capturing the Brabham Cup (best regular season record). Sommer led the Renegades to the Riley Cup (league championship) in 1994-95 after posting a 41-20-7 regular season record. In addition, he served as head coach of the ECHL's East All-Star Team in 1994-95 and the North All-Star Team in 1995-96.

Sommer's additional ice hockey coaching experience includes assistant coaching stints with the Albany Choppers and Muskegon Lumberjacks of the International Hockey League and working with USA Hockey as an assistant coach at several evaluation camps for 16- and 17-year-old players.


In 1998, he served as head coach and general manager for the silver-medal winning Team USA (4-1-0 record) at the International Ice Hockey Federation In-Line Hockey World Championships in Anaheim. Sommer's squads won gold medals in each of the first two tournaments (1996 in St. Paul, Minn. and 1997 in Anaheim) and posted undefeated records each year. His three-year coaching mark at this prestigious tournament stands at 17-1-0.

The former Bay Area youth hockey player coached Roller Hockey International's San Jose Rhinos for three seasons (1994-96), including capturing the Murphy Cup (league championship) in 1995. In addition, Sommer served as head coach for RHI's 1996 Western Conference All-Star Team.

Before stepping behind the bench, Sommer played nine seasons of professional ice hockey. A sixth round selection by the Toronto Maple Leafs in 1977, Sommer played in the Leafs system as well as those of the St. Louis Blues, Edmonton Oilers, New Jersey Devils and Pittsburgh Penguins. The highlight of Sommer's NHL career came during the 1980-81 season when, as a teammate of Wayne Gretzky, Sommer scored a goal in his NHL debut with the Edmonton Oilers.

Sommer was captain of the Wichita Wind from 1980-83 and again with Muskegon in 1986-87. Sommer, who played left wing and center, was a member of the AHL Calder Cup Champion Maine Mariners in 1983-84 and helped lead Muskegon to the 1985-86 IHL title (Turner Cup). He played his junior hockey for the Spruce Grove Mets, which won the 1975 Centennial Cup, and for the Calgary Centennials. Sommer was a member of the United States National Team at the World Junior Championships in 1976-77.

Sommer resides in San Jose, CA. with his wife Melissa and their son, Marley.

## MICHAEL CHIASSON

ASSISTANT COACH

**M**ichael Chiasson enters his fourth season as an Assistant Coach for the Barracuda in 2021-22. On Dec. 11, 2019, following Roy Sommers' promotion to the Sharks, Chiasson and fellow Assistant Coach Jimmy Bonneau took over as Co-Coaches of the Barracuda, guiding the team through the final 33 games of the season, going 12-16-5, including a season-long six-game point streak (4-0-2-0) before the year was canceled due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

The 30-year-old previously worked as an amateur scout with the Sharks for two seasons before joining the Barracuda's coaching staff.

Chiasson played for Ämäl SK in Sweden's Division 2 league during the 2015-16 season, collecting 24 points (five goals, 19 assists) in 28 games. He played collegiately at the University of Michigan, recording three goals, 13 assists, 47 penalty minutes and a plus-14 rating in 86 games while studying Sport Management. He was drafted in the 3rd round, (31st overall) by the Omaha Lancers in the USHL Futures draft; he registered 27 points (seven goals, 20 assists) in 122 games.

A native of Grosse Pointe, Michigan, his father, Steve Chiasson, played 13 seasons in the NHL with the Detroit Red Wings, Calgary Flames and Carolina Hurricanes. Michael grew up in the greater Las Vegas area and that is still where his family resides.



## JIMMY BONNEAU

ASSISTANT COACH

**J**immy Bonneau enters his fourth season as an Assistant Coach for the Barracuda after taking over as a co-coach on Dec. 11, 2019, following Roy Sommers' promotion to the Sharks. The 36-year-old previously worked as a scout for two seasons with the Sharks, covering the National Hockey League and American Hockey League Eastern Conferences, before joining the Barracuda's coaching staff.

Bonneau, along with Michael Chiasson, guided the Barracuda through the final 33 games of the season in 2019-20, going 12-16-5, including a season-long six-game point streak (4-0-2) before the year was canceled due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

Bonneau played 11 seasons with various clubs in the AHL and ECHL. For four seasons, he played with the Worcester Sharks, including a stint as an alternate captain during the 2013-14 season, scoring five goals, nine assists and 435 penalty minutes in 155 games. He finished his AHL career with 30 points (11g, 19a) and 988 penalty minutes in 350 career games.

The native of Baie-Comeau, Quebec, enjoys his summers in Montreal and Prince Edward Island.



### JOHN McCARTHY

PROSPECT DEVELOPMENT COACH

2021-22 will mark John McCarthy's second season as a Prospect Development Coach for the Sharks, predominantly working for the Barracuda. On Dec. 27, 2019, the 35-year-old made his coaching debut with the Barracuda as an assistant coach against the Stockton Heat after announcing his retirement from pro hockey earlier in the day. On Dec. 10, McCarthy suffered an Ischemic stroke due to a previously undetected hole in his heart. Following swift medical attention from the team's medical staff and the physicians at Kaiser Permanente, McCarthy was stabilized and has made a complete recovery.

McCarthy, who was selected by the Sharks in the seventh round of the 2006 NHL Draft, holds all major Barracuda franchise records including games played (275), goals (62), assists (76), points (138), power-play goals (17), and shorthanded goals (5). He served as Barracuda team captain from 2016-20 and also served as team captain for the Worcester Sharks for the 2012-13 season.

In 577 career AHL games with Worcester, Chicago, and San Jose, he has collected 297 points (130 goals, 167 assists), 233 penalty minutes and a plus-62 rating.

He also posted 11 points (three goals, eight assists) in 27 playoff games with the Barracuda over the past four seasons.

In addition, McCarthy skated in 88 NHL games with the Sharks between 2009-2016, accumulating six points (three goals, three assists) and 22 penalty minutes.

In total, McCarthy appeared in 640 regular season games with San Jose's NHL and AHL franchises.

In 2018, McCarthy was selected to the United States Men's Olympic Ice Hockey Team, appearing in five games at the Pyeongchang Olympics.

Prior to his professional career, McCarthy spent four seasons at Boston University where he won a 2009 National Championship as one of the team's co-captains.



### DANY SABOURIN

GOALTENDING COACH


In 2021-22, Dany Sabourin, 41, enters his second season as Goaltending Development Coach for the Sharks, working mostly with their prospects and the Barracuda. Prior to this past year, Sabourin had been the goaltending coach for the QMJHL's Rouyn-Noranda Huskies where he coached Sharks 2018 draft pick Zachary Emond and helped guide the Huskies to the 2019 Memorial Cup.

A 1998 fourth round pick by the Calgary Flames, Sabourin played parts of 17 professional seasons in the ECHL, AHL, NHL, EBEL (Austria) and Ligue Magnus (France), with his final year coming in 2016-17 as a member of the Rouen Dragons (France). In 2005-06, the Val-d'OR, Quebec, Canada native won the AHL's Baz Bastien Memorial Award the league's best goaltender.

In 57 career NHL games between Calgary, Pittsburgh, and Vancouver, Sabourin went 18-25-4 with a 2.88 goals-against average and a .898 save percentage.

Sabourin lives with his wife, Cindy, his two daughters, Coralie and Raphaelle, and his two dogs, Sushi and Maki.





## NICK GIALDINI

VIDEO COACH AND HOCKEY OPERATIONS MANAGER

Nick Gialdini enters his sixth season as Video Coach and Hockey Operations Manager for the Barracuda after spending the previous three seasons assisting the Sharks scouting department in various capacities.

Gialdini, 31, joined the Sharks organization after playing hockey in the Jr. Sharks youth hockey system. He spent nine years as a youth hockey coach, most recently with the Jr. Sharks 18AAA team, and served as high school hockey coordinator for four years at Sharks Ice at San Jose.

Gialdini, a San Jose native, graduated from San Jose State University in 2016 where he played one season of club hockey, appearing in the ACHA Division 2 National Championships. Nick resides in San Jose with his wife Melissa and their son, Joshua.



## MIKE MURPHY

HEAD EQUIPMENT MANAGER

Mike Murphy begins his fourth season as the Head Equipment Manager of the San Jose Barracuda after serving as the team's Assistant Equipment Manager in 2016-17. Prior to joining the Barracuda, Murphy spent one season as the head equipment manager for the Macon Mayhem of the Southern Professional Hockey League (SPHL).

Murphy has a degree in Sports Management from the University of New England and a Master's Degree in Sports Administration from Canisius College.

While at Canisius (NCAA DI), Murphy was the hockey teams head equipment manager for a pair of seasons (2014-16) in a graduate assistantship role. In 2015-16, Mike also worked for the Buffalo Beauts of the National Women's Hockey League (NWHL) during the league's inaugural season.

Prior to his time at Canisius, Murphy spent one season at American International College (NCAA DI) as the hockey teams head equipment manager after earning his undergrad from the University of New England where he began his career while in school.



## WILL SHUKAIT

ASSISTANT EQUIPMENT MANAGER

San Jose native Will Shukait, 22, returns to the Barracuda in 2021-22 for his fourth season within the organization and first officially as the team's Assistant Equipment Manager.

Shukait played goalie within the San Jose Jr. Sharks youth program from the age of 10 until he was 17 and was even coached in his first season by Barracuda Video Coach and Operations Manager, Nick Gialdini.

Aside from working and traveling with the team, he is also a full-time student taking online courses at Arizona State University.



## WILL LEONARD

HEAD ATHLETIC TRAINER

San Jose native Will Leonard enters his fourth season with the Barracuda as the team's Head Athletic Trainer after serving as an intern with the Sharks under Ray Tufts in 2009-10. Prior to joining the Barracuda, Leonard worked at Notre Dame High school in downtown San Jose for four years, assisting all 10 of the school's 10 varsity sports. Following his internship with the Sharks, Will continued to help the organization during training camp and development camp.



## 2020-21 SEASON IN REVIEW

For the fifth time in the team's six-year history, the Barracuda reached the AHL playoffs in 2020-21, using 40 different skaters and four different goalies to get there. After wins over the Tucson Roadrunners, 2-1, and the Colorado Eagles, 5-1, in single-elimination play-in action, the Barracuda were eventually eliminated by the Henderson Silver Knights in a best-of-three Divisional Semifinal series (0-2) in Las Vegas.

After a delayed start to the 2020-21 AHL season due to COVID-19, the Barracuda was forced to conduct training camp in Arizona due to health and safety protocols implemented by Santa Clara County.

Originally set to play seven exhibition games, the team would only get through two periods of its sixth preseason game before it was canceled due to a positive COVID test on the team. Although it would turn out to be a false positive, the Barracuda was forced to quarantine in a Las Vegas hotel for two days before returning to Arizona. This resulted in the cancellation of the team's final exhibition game and the first regular-season game against Tucson on Fri., Feb. 5.

The Barracuda finally got the 2020-21 regular season underway on Sat., Feb. 6 at Tucson, ending a 333-day gap between games. Serving as the home team, the Barracuda dropped its first two outings of the seasons against the Roadrunners. Searching for their first win of the year, the team hit the road for a three-game set against the Texas Stars, marking the first matchup against the Dallas' affiliate since the 2018-19 season.

Days before the Barracuda arrived in the Lone Star State, Texas began to experience unseasonably freezing temperatures caused by a "polar vortex". The Barracuda would get through the first two games of the series on Fri., Feb. 12 and Sat., Feb. 13, with each team earning a 5-3 win. But the third game, which was pinned for Tues., Feb. 16, would be postponed as the weather continued to take a dramatic turn. Even the Dallas Stars, who were three hours north, were forced to postpone several games as the state experienced ongoing power issues caused by the weather. In an attempt to fly back to Arizona from Austin, the Barracuda loaded up the team bus and inched their way to the airport on the morning of Wed., Feb. 17, only to

have its flight canceled just minutes before the team arrived. Eventually, after arriving a week prior, the team was able to catch a flight out of Houston on Thurs., Feb. 18. ESPN's Emily Kaplan documented the "Barracuda's unforgettable road trip" and all that transpired over those seven days.

. . .

Scheduled to play three more games in Tucson before being able to return to San Jose for the first time all season, the Barracuda got word on their way to the Houston airport that the Roadrunners had multiple COVID cases, prompting the cancellation of the next three games, and in turn, the team was allowed to fly home to San Jose earlier than expected.

. . .

The Barracuda was scheduled to play their first game in San Jose on Thurs., Feb. 25 against the Bakersfield Condors but a positive COVID test on the Sharks forced the entire organization to temporarily suspend operations. So, on Sat., Feb. 27, after a 357-day layoff, the Barracuda finally played their first home game of the season, which was conducted at Solar4America Ice against the Ontario Reign. After allowing three first-period goals, the Barracuda would score the next six in the final two periods en route to a 6-3 win. In 2020-21, due to COVID protocols, the Barracuda split their home schedule between their practice facility, Solar4America Ice at San Jose, and the SAP Center at San Jose. On Tues., March 16, the Barracuda played their first game at the Shark Tank, falling 3-2 to the Condors in overtime.

. . .

Once the team returned to the Bay Area, the Barracuda went 6-0-1-1 in their first eight games on home ice and did not lose a game in regulation in San Jose until Tues., April 13, 7-2 vs. Texas.

. . .

At two different points during the season, the Barracuda won three games in a row in, including back-to-back wins against the Division's top two clubs, Henderson and Bakersfield, on Tues., April 27 and Fri., April 30.

. . .

The Barracuda's 7-5 win over the Silver Knights on April 30 saw several new franchise watermarks, including the team going a perfect five-for-five on the power play and Joel Kellman and Robbie Russo finishing with single-game team-highs in points (3+2=5) and assists (4). The hat trick for Kellman was the Barracuda's first since Dec. 12, 2019 (Trevor Carrick) and eighth in franchise history. Kellman was named CCM/AHL Player of the Week for the period ending on May 2, 2021, as he collected four goals and three assists in a three-game stretch.

In total, 21 different skaters appeared in at least one game with the Barracuda and the Sharks in 2020-21, the second-most ever and the most since the 1992-93 season (Kansas City Blades). In addition, six different players began the season in the AHL before making their NHL debuts.

. . .

After getting the call to the Sharks coaching staff in Dec. 2020, serving as an associate coach for the remainder of the year under Interim Head Coach Bob Boughner, Roy Sommer returned to the AHL in 2020-21, completing his record 23rd season. After guiding the Barracuda to a 15-15-4-2 record this past season, the all-time leader in games coached and wins in AHL history, is now 787-679-48-159 (W-L-T-OTL/SOL) lifetime. Each of those wins has come behind the bench of San Jose's AHL affiliate (Kentucky 1998-01, Cleveland 2001-06, Worcester 2006-15, San Jose 2015-present).

. . .

In his first season in San Jose, Jaycob Megna donned the "C" as the team's third captain in franchise history, replacing John McCarthy who retired due to health reasons the season prior after serving as team captain from 2016-19. Among team defensemen, Megna finished first on the team in shots (55), game-winning goals (1), unassisted goals (2), tied for first in plus/minus (+8), tied for third in goals (2), fourth in points (8) and fifth in assists (6).

In 2020-21, the Barracuda was one of the league's youngest rosters, with an average age of 22.60 years old. Younger than three different NCCA DI teams. 17 different rookies appeared in a game at various points in the season and Ozzy Wiesblatt (3/9/02) became the youngest player in franchise history to appear in a game when he made his AHL debut on Feb. 7, 2021 vs. Tucson and became the youngest player to score a goal on Feb. 13 at Texas.

. . .

The Barracuda will begin the 2021-22 season, their seventh season in San Jose, in October, playing out of the AHL's Pacific Division which will be comprised of nine teams starting next year [Abbotsford (Vancouver Canucks), Bakersfield (Edmonton Oilers), Colorado (Colorado Avalanche), Henderson (Vegas Golden Knights), Ontario (LA Kings), San Diego (Anaheim Ducks), Stockton (Calgary Flames) and Tucson (Arizona Coyotes).
