

WORLD TEAM TENNIS PLAYOFFS

Gaters Eye WTT Title

The Golden Gaters have once again reached the WTT playoffs as they have done in each of the past three years. Again this season the Gaters trailed the Phoenix Racquets for the better part of the season finally losing the Western Division banner in a close race down the stretch.

The playoff structure this season has been altered making the Gaters chances of winning the WTT Championship all the more difficult. With four teams in each division in the playoffs, the team that ultimately wins the Championship will have to play three two out of three match series within a thirteen day time span. To achieve their goal the Gaters will have to play top, consistently good tennis under constant pressure.

First the Gaters face the San Diego Friars with Rod Laver and Cliff Drysdale, with whom McMillan and Company have played in three super-tiebreakers already this season. You couldn't ask for a more balanced or exciting match-up. Should the Gaters win the first round against the Friars, they will then take on the winner of the Phoenix-Sea-Port series.

In the Eastern Division the powerhouse Boston Lobsters and the 1976 WTT Championship team, the New York Apples, pose a formidable threat to the Gaters should they reach the final round. Boston and New York both fared well against the Gaters during the 1977 season winning a total of seven out of eight matches.

However, should the Gaters reach the finals, with everything on the line, anything can happen.

Boston Ends SeasonWith Best WTT Record

Though the Gaters lost all of the four matches that they played against the Boston Lobsters this season, no other team did much better. The Lobsters finished the '77 season with the best record in WTT, which was a complete reversal from their last place finish in '76.

With player/coach Roy Emerson, Tony Roche, Mike Estep, Martina Navratilova and Greer Stevens, the Lobsters were the first team in the league to clinch a playoff berth.


Their depth, coupled with the mercurial Martina Navratilova, who leads the league in singles, doubles and total offense, have proved the Lobsters to be the team to beat in the playoffs.

With Frew McMillan having led the Golden Gaters into the Playoffs for the third straight year, the 1975 Coach of the Year still has his work cut out for him. The Gaters this season are a revamped team that perhaps lacks the consistency of his squads of the past two years. Of course during the playoffs anything goes, and McMillan freely admits that much depends on the team all jelling at the same time.

"The outcome of our women's singles and doubles sets, particularly against a team such as Phoenix with Chris Evert or Boston with Martina Navratilova, is vital," McMillan said.

McMillan took command of the courts in addition to his coaching duties as he went on to lead the league in total offense combining successfully with Tom Okker and Francoise Durr in men's and mixed doubles. McMillan said, "I was fortunate to start playing extremely well soon after the Wimbledon break and managed to ride the crest of the wave throughout the rest of the regular season. Now with the playoffs approaching, I can only hope that I'll be able to maintain my current level of play.

Tom Okker also began to play inspired tennis in the last matches of the season. He twice defeated Ilie Nastase, and on August 9, before the largest Gater crowd ever (11,277) beat Bjorn Borg 7-6. McMillan commented, "Tom's play has been quite encouraging to the rest of the team. He plays with so much emotion, that when he wins, he sems to instill enthusiasm and confidence in everyone else on the team."

Have the big crowds that the Gaters have experienced this season been a boost to the team? "There is no question that all of us prefer to play before the big crowds, especially if they are at home. In the playoffs, the homecourt advantage is a significant one and could be the difference between winning and losing.

So, with McMillan at the helm, the Gaters once again will try to bring the WTT Title to the Bay Area.
